

## DAILY PROCEEDINGS

---

The seventy-fifth session of the North Carolina Annual Conference convened in St. George Church, Maxton, North Carolina, Thursday, September 28, 1933, at 10:00 a. m., Bishop Wilbur P. Thirkield presiding.

The Bishop expressed his sincere sympathy for Bishop and Mrs. Wallace E. Brown, absent on account of an automobile accident, and his joy in the renewed fellowship with the brethren of the Conference.

After a few moments of silent prayer, Hymn 2, "Come, Thou Almighty King," was sung.

The Bishop read from the Discipline, paragraph 145-146, John Wesley's rule for deportment at Conference, and offered prayer.

Bishop Thirkield requested the District Superintendents and the pastor of the entertaining church, Rev. P. I. Wells, to assist in the administration of the Holy Communion.

On a question of privilege, R. G. Morris presented a resolution expressing the sympathy of the Conference for Bishop and Mrs. Brown in their recent automobile accident.

On motion by R. W. Winchester, the resolution was approved by a standing vote and ordered sent to Bishop Brown.

R. G. Morris gave a brief sketch of Bishop Thirkield's unique relation to the Negro race and congratulated the Conference on having him as presiding Bishop.

By request of the Bishop, the Secretary of the last Conference called the roll. The following are recorded as present:

Question 31—"Who have died?" The names of G. T. Foley, J. C. Addie, Daniel Brooks, M. C. Laughlin were called. The Conference stood and sang "There is a Land that is Fairer than Day." Prayer was offered by the Bishop.

CONFERENCE ORGANIZATION. On motion of R. W. Winchester, W. E. Hairston was elected Secretary, and on his nomination, C. W. Perry and W. C. Scarborough were elected Assistant Secretaries.

The Treasurer, N. J. Pass, nominated as his assistants, D. L. Thomas, J. W. Wells, P. J. Cook, J. W. Hall, L. A. Brown and L. W. Hedrick.

The Statistician, P. I. Wells, nominated as his assistants, G. W. Patterson, H. C. Gannaway, J. B. Meekins and E. I. S. Swan.

On motion of R. J. Shipp, the main floor of the church was established as the Conference bar.

On motion of R. W. Winchester, P. A. Taylor was elected reporter to the Christian Advocate, Southwestern Edition.

WELCOME ADDRESSES: Bishop Thirkield introduced Mr. W. H. Hasty, Mayor of Maxton, who brought greetings on behalf of the city. W. T. Lomax eloquently responded. R. C. Scriven welcomed the Conference on behalf of the ministers of Maxton. C. W. Perry fittingly responded. Miss L. M. Hayes gave a welcome address on behalf of the local church. The Bishop made an appropriate response.

Rev. P. I. Wells introduced the following visitors: Mr. McKinnon, who brought greetings from 1,000 school children of Maxton; Rev. Clegg, pastor of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, who gave a brief welcome address.

The Memorial Service was deferred until Friday morning.

On motion of R. N. Brooks, G. M. Phelps was elected to represent the Christian Advocate, Southwestern Edition.

R. W. Winchester moved that the Cabinet nominate the Nominating Committee for the Standing Committees. The following were named: G. M. Phelps, R. F. McCallum and P. I. Wells.

On motion of R. N. Brooks a committee was appointed to report on the State of the Church. The Cabinet appointed the following, viz.: R. N. Brooks, H. L. Ashe, R. G. Morris.

A communication from Dr. Allan MacRossie was read by the Secretary. Conference ordered a response.

Announcements were made and the session stood adjourned.

Benediction by Bishop Thirkield.

#### THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The Conference was called to order at 2:30 p. m. by Bishop Thirkield. Hymn 196, "Breathe on me Breath of God," was sung. H. L. Ashe led in prayer.

In the Statistical session the Treasurer and Statistician received in open Conference the statistics from the pastors.

Representing the Board of Pensions and Relief, Dr. S. H. Sweeney was introduced and made the following report:

The names of the District Superintendents were called and their characters were passed, and each in turn reported that there was nothing against any Effective Elder in his respective district.

R. W. Winchester, W. M. Wells, District Superintendents of the Greensboro and Laurinburg Districts, respectively, reported the work of their districts.

Question 16—"Who have been Received on Credentials and from what Churches?" Samuel Laughlin from the A. M. E. Zion Church, as a Deacon in Studies of Third Year.

Question 36—"Who have been permitted to Withdraw under Charges or Complaints?"

On motion of W. M. Wells, A. S. McGowan was permitted to withdraw.

G. H. Caldwell, J. E. Brower, District Superintendents of the Western and Winston Districts, respectively, reported the work of their districts.

Question 33—"Who have been Located?" A. M. Robertson was given notice of Location.

Mr. A. L. Betts, representing the Book Concern, was introduced and made remarks.

On motion of S. F. B. Peace, the address of Dr. Burnett was changed from 4:30 to 4:00 p. m.

Conference business session adjourned.

4:00 p. m. Anniversary, Board of Home Missions and Church Extension. R. B. McRae presided. Dr. Burnett delivered the address.

8:00 p. m. Anniversary of the Board of Education, President David D. Jones presiding. Address by Dr. M. J. Holmes; music by Bennett College for Women quartette.

### FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

The Conference was called to order at 9:00 a. m. by Bishop Thirkield. Hymns 334 and 551 were sung. W. R. Ziegler led in prayer.

The Journals of the morning and afternoon sessions of the previous day were read and approved.

Question 40—On the recommendation of the Committee on Conference Relation, W. R. Ziegler, R. J. Shipp and D. H. Kearse were granted the Retired Relation.

The characters of men in Detached Service were passed. By request of the Bishop, the Conference sung the "Gloria Patri."

G. H. Caldwell read a communication from Mr. C. F. Eggleston concerning the Sesqui-Centennial Celebration. The Cabinet was ordered to appoint a committee. The following were appointed, viz.: R. N. Brooks, Marshall McCallum and W. E. Hairston.

G. H. Caldwell read a communication from the president of the Alumni Association of Bennett College, and moved that a response be made pledging support. The motion prevailed.

The Conference passed to the Memorial Service.

S. F. B. Peace, Chairman of the Committee on Memoirs, presided. Hymn 526, "Come, Ye Disconsolate," was sung. Marcus Mundy offered prayer.

An appreciative characterization was given of Daniel Brooks, G. T. Foley, M. C. Laughlin, J. C. Addie and Mrs. Ellison, by H. L. Ashe, W. R. Ziegler, J. C. Rush, H. C. Gannaway and G. M. Phelps, respectively. In memory of Mrs. William Chavis Hymn 593, "Servant of God, Well Done," was sung. Bishop Thirkield offered prayer.

Question 17—"Who have been Received on Trial?"

- (a) In Studies of First Year: R. C. Sharpe.
- (c) Exempt from Course of Study under Seminary Rule: W. S. McLeod, also elected Deacon.

Question 18—"Who have been Continued on Trial?"

- (a) In Studies of First Year: J. W. Mickle.
- (b) In Studies of Second Year: W. J. Cameron, J. H. Ledwell and Coy Williams.

Question 21—S. H. Pressley was continued in Studies in Third Year.

Question 22—D. A. Hill was advanced to Studies of Fourth Year.

Question 23—J. H. Foye and K. L. Jackson were graduated from Course of Study. Thomas H. Wooten was elected to Elder's Orders under Seminary Rule.

Communications from Bishop Brown were read by Bishop Thirkield, R. W. Winchester and R. G. Morris.

S. A. Peeler presented the report of the Conference Board of Home Missions and Church Extension which was, on motion, adopted.

On motion of H. L. Ashe the present order of Conference entertainment was reaffirmed.

Dr. H. C. Seidel, Superintendent Sager-Brown Home, Baldwin, La., was introduced and vividly appraised the work of the Woman's Home Missionary Society.

Dr. M. J. Holmes, representing the World Service Commission, clarified indiscriminate designation of gifts and urged loyalty to the total benevolent program of the Church.

Dr. O. R. Davis, representing the Board of Foreign Missions, was introduced.

On motion of R. N. Brooks, consideration of Gammon Theological Seminary was made the Order of the Day for Saturday 9:30 a. m.



Dr. D. D. Jones was introduced and made a timely address on the work of Bennett College for Women.

Mrs. D. D. Jones was introduced and spoke briefly.

Following general announcements the Conference adjourned.

### FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The Lay Conference and Annual Conference, seated in joint session, met at 2:00 p. m., Bishop Thirkield in the chair. Hymns, "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms," and "Breathe on Me Breath of God," were sung. J. A. McRae, president of the Lay Conference, offered prayer. The Bishop addressed the duly organized, united body in words of welcome to the Laymen, and stated clearly the duties of each group.

The Disciplinary Questions of the United Sessions were called.

(1) Officers of the Lay Conference are: President, J. A. McRae; Secretary, Mrs. Cora E. Hunter; Treasurer, G. W. Allen.

(2) It was stated that the Conference has a Board of Trustees as required by state law.

The list of bonded officials was read:

S. A. Peeler, Treasurer Trustee Board, \$1,000.

N. J. Pass, Conference Treasurer, \$1,000.

On motion, the Cabinet appointed the following as committee on Annual Conference Benevolences: R. T. Weatherby, S. A. Peeler, J. A. McRae, G. M. Phelps and R. B. McRae.

After the announcements, business session adjourned.

3:00 p. m. Anniversary of the Board of Temperance, Prohibition and Public Morals. J. A. McRae presided. Dr. A. R. Howard delivered the address.

4:00 p. m. Laymen's Program. Theme: "Lay Activity in the Back-to-Church Movement."

8:00 p. m. Anniversary of the Board of Foreign Missions. Address by Dr. O. R. Davis.

### SATURDAY MORNING SESSION

Devotional service was conducted by W. R. Ziegler, Hymns 196 and 551 were sung. T. C. Frazier and W. T. Lomax offered prayer.

The Journal of Friday was read and approved. At the suggestion of the Bishop the Conference voted to make the Journal the official record of the Conference.

On recommendation of Committee on Conference Relations, W. S. Winston and W. H. Blackmon were accepted as Supply Pastors. Ira Friend was elected Local Deacon. J. W. Mickle left without appointment to attend school.

On motion of H. L. Ashe, C. G. Bynum was continued on Trial and advanced to Studies of Second Year.

R. G. Morris presented the report of Board of Stewards, which on motion was approved.

The Conference voted to accept the invitation given by B. L. Burge, to hold the 1934 session in Lenoir.

On motion of W. M. Wells, Conference voted to adhere to Disciplinary plan for support of District Superintendents. The motion prevailed.

R. N. Brooks moved that Conference elect a Conference Program Committee. The motion prevailed. The following were elected: R. N. Brooks, R. G. Morris, S. A. Peeler, Secretary of Conference and pastor-host.

W. M. Wells moved that the Treasurer return report B properly signed to the pastors. The motion prevailed.

A motion by G. H. Caldwell was duly carried that all delinquent reports be added to the reports of Treasurer and Statistician.

The Order of the Day was taken up and Gammon Theological Seminary was represented by R. N. Brooks in a masterful address.

R. G. Morris moved that two per cent World Service giving be designated to Gammon Theological Seminary. The motion prevailed.

A Gammon Alumni Association was organized. President, H. L. Ashe; Secretary, R. G. Morris; Treasurer, G. H. Caldwell. Membership fees collected, \$33.00.

R. W. Winchester presented the following resolution which was regularly adopted:

“Whereas, the members of the North Carolina Conference voted in the last session to refund the Board of Trustees for a loan of \$565.00, and,

Whereas, the members subscribed an amount adequate to make this refund; and

Whereas, on account of the shortness of the Conference year and the increased depression, we have not been able to collect sufficient funds to meet the obligation;

Therefore, Resolved, that the time for the payment of these subscriptions be deferred until next Conference year."

**Annual Conference Benevolence, Bennett College for Women**

In view of the fact that the Board of Education is recommending that the Annual Conference benevolences be revived for the colleges, and in view of the fact that many of the Conferences have revived this offering with great success:

Be it resolved, that the North Carolina Annual Conference set as its goal for Bennett College for Women \$3,000 for the current year, this amount to be secured from former pledges and from free-will offering. The apportionment to the charges and the day for the offering is to be set by the District Superintendents.

The report of Committee on Nominations was read and approved.

R. D. Bethea presented a resolution, which was adopted.

Reports from the following committees were read and approved: World Service, Pensions and Relief, Worship and Music, Education, Evangelism and State of the Church.

The reports of the Treasurer and Statistician were presented and adopted.

The reports of the Board of Trustees and Board of Ministerial Training were read and approved.

A motion prevailed that the Cabinet and Secretary constitute the Publishing Committee.

N. J. Pass was elected Treasurer, and P. I. Wells Statistician, for the ensuing year.

A motion prevailed that after Sunday morning service, Ordination Service, the reading of Complimentary Resolutions and the reading of Appointments, the seventy-fifth session of the Conference should adjourn.

H. L. Ashe and J. C. Rush were appointed to examine and approve Journal for session of Saturday.

Bishop Thirkield gave a remarkable address, reviewing his fifty years of service in the South. His reminiscences shed a flood of light on many early interracial problems.

## HISTORICAL VIEW

From the organization of Methodism in America, the work in North Carolina was continued in Virginia and afterwards in the Virginia and South Carolina Conferences. In the year 1836, the General Conference set up in North Carolina. Its first session opened as a part of the Virginia Conference, but when it adjourned there were two Conferences. Facts from the first ninety sessions are gleaned from the General Minutes from the Conference Journal for those years, which is now in custody of the North Carolina Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South.

At the Conference of December 4, 1844, there were 19,495 white members and 3,190 colored. Without consulting the wisdom of the latter, nearly the whole membership became part of a new church, organized in May, 1845, and called the Methodist Episcopal Church, South. Some of the colored members entered the A. M. E. Church, some the Colored M. E. Church of America, but thousands turned gladly to the bosom of the old Methodist Episcopal Church as it returned to the State after the Civil War.

Between the years 1844, when the Church was separated over the slave question, and 1865, when at the close of the War the M. E. Church returned to shepherd its scattering flock in North Carolina, there was no session of the North Carolina Conference.

From the North Carolina Conference the Blue Ridge was formed with twelve preachers, 2,839 members and probationers, and 41 church edifices.
