INTRODUCTION.

THE following work is what its title indicates, "A Statistical History of the Maine Conference." It does not profess to be a History of Maine Methodism that has been written by an abler hand—a hand now silent in death. Dr. Stephen Allen has laid Methodism in Maine under great obligations to him for the very extended and able history of "Methodism in Maine."

While we may at the present time suggest many instances in which the work might have been improved by a different arrangement and less profuse in some respects, yet it is doubtful if these critics could have done better had they written the work. At any rate, it forms a valuable basis from which a future historian may, perhaps, write a more popular and more readable history of "Maine Methodism." It is a sad comment on the intelligence and enterprise of Maine Methodists that that work should remain in such quantities unsold upon the hands of the widow, who needs the avails of the unsold copies to pay for its publication, as also for her support. I am told that there are some one thousand copies, or more, remaining unsold. I confess that in view of the treatment which that work received, I enter upon this enterprise with timidity. The compilation of this work has been a very onerous and difficult one. I have waded through a sea of figures, if I may be allowed the illustration. I have gathered my statistics almost entirely from the returns found in the Minutes of the Conference. All who have had experience in these matters know how reliable they are (?). And yet I think they are generally correct. I know it is said that "figures wont lie." "That depends." If figures are properly placed, and in a proper relation to each other, they wont lie. Otherwise they are very unreliable. Yet, I think the reader may depend upon the statistics, as here compiled, as being sufficiently reliable for all practical purposes. In presenting the returns of the number of members from each circuit and station, I have relied entirely upon the returns as made by the Pastors to the several Conferences. As I have said in my introduction to that chapter, there is discrepancy from year to year which is not at all chargeable to any

neglect or want of faithfulness of the Pastor, but generally by circumstances beyond his control.

In presenting the salaries or receipts of the Pastors, it will be seen that there were no returns prior to the publishing of our Conference Minutes. In making the return, I have embraced all he reported to the Steward of the Conference, as received, without separating the sums of quarterage house rents, table expenses, etc., which, prior to 1850, were embraced in the returns. I included what was paid the Presiding Elders and Bishops in the same column to save space. All of the benevolences raised upon the charge I have included in the same column, except what was paid for building and repairing churches, paying debts on church property, current expenses, etc., which are embraced in another item. There may be some other items which may not be embraced under this head, but generally *all* is embraced. In the annual summing up I have not included missionary money in that which is embraced in the General Missions, but have presented that in a separate chapter. The Sabbath School Report is also in a separate chapter.

I have prefaced each chapter with brief explanatory notes. I acknowledge my indebtedness to all who have assisted me in this work. I thank the Conference for their kindness in loaning me the Minutes of the Conference, which I had not. I own the Bound Minutes of all the Conferences from 1793 to 1845, and the Minutes of the Maine Conferences from 1830 to the present time. I have continued the statistics to 1892. I have been aided considerably by referring to the "Maine Methodism," by Dr. Allen, for which I tender thanks.

I now present this very difficult work to the consideration of a candid public, praying that it may do good. I here present the statistics of Maine Methodism within the reach of those who may desire information upon this subject, and who may, perhaps, thank their unworthy brother for his labor and painstaking at the age of nearly 86 years. That I shall be criticised and perhaps found fault with by some, is possible, but I shall bear it patiently and say God bless you brother. Perhaps you could have done better. Try it hereafter, as you perhaps may have an opportunity to continue the work after I have gone away.

A STATISTICAL HISTORY OF THE MAINE CONFERENCE

CHAPTER I.

This chapter explains itself. It was judged best to present this chapter taken from the Methodist Year Book for 1891, giving a very interesting account as it does of the origin of the M. E. Church in this country. As the Bishop is the first and most important officer in our Church, this chapter presents the names of all the Bishops in our Church, when born, the conference from which they were taken, or entered the ministry, and the year when and where they died, etc.

ORIGIN OF THE METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH WITH ITS BISHOPS.

The origin of American Methodism is a fascinating chapter in Church history. In 1766 Philip Embury, a Wesleyan local preacher from Ireland, established preaching in New York and founded a society. The same year Captain Thomas Webb, of the British Army, held services in New York. Robert Strawbridge, an Irish local preacher, commenced preaching in Maryland about the same period, and founded some societies there. The first Methodist Church, in America, situated in John Street, New York, was dedicated in 1768. Richard Boardman and Joseph Pilmoor, two English itinerants, came to America in 1769 by Mr. Wesley's direction. They were the first Methodist traveling preachers in America, and have been followed by an itinerant ministry whose numbers, sacrifices and success, are unequaled in denominational history. In 1771 Francis Asbury and Richard Wright came from England for the

itinerant work. The divine purpose in such a movement is reverently stated in the Episcopal Address, as contained in the Methodist Discipline: "We believe that God's design in raising up the Methodist Episcopal Church in America was to reform the continent and spread scriptural holiness over these lands. As a proof hereof we have seen since that time a great and glorious work of God extending throughout all the United States and Territories, and throughout the British possessions in North America; and the planting of successful missions in South America and in Mexico. Moreover, the Methodist Episcopal Church, in its organic form as well as spiritual power, has been successfully planted in Africa, Asia, and Europe, and God has given her great prosperity in those countries."

Organization.—The Methodist Episcopal Church was formally organized at the Baltimore "Christmas Conference" of 1784, under the presidency of Thomas Coke, LL.D., who had lately arrived from England, as the representative of Mr. Wesley. Some 60 itinerant preachers were in attendance. Francis Asbury was the ordained Bishop. The general summaries of that year reported 14,988 members and 83 itinerant ministers. Many local preachers were also in the field, as valuable assistants to the itinerants; and it is estimated that there were already more than 60 chapels, exceedingly small and plain.

Doctrines.—The Church is Arminian in its theology. Its doctrines are contained in the twenty-five Articles of Religion, Wesley's writings, and other standard works.

Government.—The General Conference, as the supreme legislative body of the Church, meets quadrennially. Clerical and lay delegates compose its membership. It has "full power to make rules and regulations," subject to certain limitations. The Bishops interpret law when required in their administration as presiding officers in Annual Conferences. Specific powers are also given to the Annual, District, and Quarterly Conferences, to the Leaders' and Stewards' meeting, and to the Official Board.

Ministry.—The Methodist Episcopal Church lays particular emphasis on the divine call to preach. It judges its applicants by their "gifts, grace, and usefulness." Candidates are admitted into the Annual Conference by vote of these bodies, and are successively ordained deacons and elders. The Methodist ministry may remain in the same station but five years successively. They are appointed by the Bishops at the Annual Conferences, and are supported as directed in the Discipline.

Worship.—In Sabbath services, Sunday-schools, sacraments, and prayer-meetings Methodism resembles other denominations. In the class-meeting and love-feast it is peculiar. Methodism has ever been evangelistic; under the divine blessing it has witnessed extensive revivals, with a phenomenal increase, and was never more vigorous or prosperous in all departments of its work.

BISHOPS.

Methodism holds the Episcopacy to be an *office*, not an *order*. Bishops may consequently resign, as did Bishop Hamline. They were first termed Superintendents, in harmony with the counsels of Mr. Wesley. On the revision of the Discipline, in 1787, the title was changed to Bishop.

How Constituted.—A Bishop is constituted by election of the General Conference and the laying on of the hands of three Bishops, or at least one Bishop and two Elders.

Duties.—Bishops preside over the General and Annual Conferences, ordain to the ministry, station preachers, and in general oversee the temporal and spiritual interests of the Church. They travel through the connection at large.

Missionary Bishops.—These are elected for specified foreign mission fields. They have full episcopal powers; but their jurisdiction is limited to the fields for which they are elected.

Residences.—The list of episcopal residences is fixed by the General Conference. By direction of that body the assignment of Bishops to the specified localities has been by choice, in the order of seniority in office.

Support.—The salaries of the Bishops, their traveling expenses, and the comfortable support of non-effective Bishops, widows, and children, are estimated by the Book Committee and apportioned among the Annual Conferences. The amounts collected on these apportionments are forwarded quarterly, when practicable, to the Treasurer of the Episcopal Fund. The salaries of the effective Bishops, during the present quadrennium, are fixed at \$3,500, with an allowance for house-rent. *Treasurer of Episcopal Fund*, Homer Eaton, D.D., 150 Fifth Avenue, New York; *Assistant Treasurer*, William P. Stowe, D.D., 57 Washington Street, Chicago, Ill.

Meetings.—The semi-annual meetings of the Bishops, for arranging official work, are held in May and November. *Secretary of the Board*, Bishop Andrews.

Succession in Office.—The number of Bishops in the Methodist Episcopal Church has been variable, according to the necessities of the work. At no period since the consecration of Francis Asbury has American Methodism been without episcopal supervision. Altogether there have been forty-six Bishops since the organization of the Church in 1784. The Episcopal Board was never so large as during the present quadrennium; it now numbers eighteen, including two Missionary Bishops. The following is the completed list of Bishops from 1784 to 1891:

CHAPTER II.

THE NAMES OF THOSE WHO COMPOSED THE MAINE CONFERENCE WHEN SET OFF FROM THE NEW ENGLAND CONFERENCE IN 1824, AND WHAT BECAME OF THEM.

Previously to the General Conference in 1824, all of the Societies and Preachers in Maine belonged to and were included in the New England Conference. At this General Conference (viz., 1824), which met in Baltimore, the preachers and members embraced in Maine were set off in a separate Conference called the Maine Conference. The following were the boundaries of the Maine Conference, viz.:

The Maine Conference shall include all the State of Maine, and that part of the State of New Hampshire lying east of the White Hills and north of the waters of the Ossipee Lake.

The following are the names of the brethren who composed that Conference, which held its first session in Gardiner, July 7, 1825. Bishop Enoch George, presiding, and Oliver Beal, secretary:

[NOTE.—The first numbers show the year when they were admitted to the Conference. East Maine Conference means that they were embraced in the number that formed that Conference in the Division in 1848. The Conferences met together for the last time in 1847. In 1848 the Conference met separately.]



CHAPTER III.

This chapter contains the names of all the circuits and stations in the territory now embraced in the Maine Conference. It does not include any in the East Maine Conference.

To refresh our memory we will describe the boundary of the Maine Conference: "The Maine Conference shall include that part of the State of Maine west of the Kennebec River from its mouth to the great bend below Skowhegan, and of a line running thence north to the State line, including Skowhegan and Augusta and that part of the town of Winslow north of the Sebasticook River, and also that part of New Hampshire east of the White Hills and north of the waters of the Ossipee Lake and the town of Gorham, N. H."

This chapter contains also the names of the preacher or preachers stationed each year on the several circuits and stations from the year 1794 to 1892; the number of members returned by him each year. The returns to the Conference embraces the year ending with Conference to which the return is made. To illustrate, the returns of 1890 are in the minute of 1891. This chapter contains the salary paid; this was not reported before the Conference of 1841. This chapter also contains the amount paid the Presiding Elders and Bishops, also the amount raised for the various benevolences. There is not embraced in this the amount paid for building and repairing churches and parsonages, nor for current expenses, but only those benevolences which are provided in the Discipline. In reporting accurately the names of the circuits and stations there is a difficulty, for sometimes the name is changed embracing the same territory and the subsequent year changed back again. Previously to 1856 the Discipline fixed the salary of the preacher. The quarterage for a married, traveling, supernumerary, superannuated preacher and Bishop was two hundred dollars and traveling expenses, this embraced his moving expenses, and for each child of such preacher under seven years old, sixteen dollars, and over seven and under fourteen, twenty-four dollars. And in addition to that, the Quarterly Conference appointed a committee to estimate the amount necessary for house rent, table expenses and fuel; this meant light or tallow candles (oil if they used it) as well as firewood. This together with the quarterage constituted the salary.

The sum of all these, and not the different items, is reported as salary. It will be seen that from year to year there is in the return of members sometimes a gain, sometimes a loss, in the same station. There are several reasons for loss, such as deaths, removals, etc. But in some cases the preacher returns the names of all he finds upon the church records, though a number may have been gone for a long while, "left without a certificate," etc. The next preacher coming to the charge together with the Official Board revise the records and leave off all that they don't know about; hence a loss. In this case the preacher may appear to disadvantage, when it is not his fault at all. Again there is sometimes a great difference in the amount of salary paid from the same charge from year to year. Some may say, "Why is this? The brother is not popular," etc. Now let no one judge, for we do not know the circumstances. A great change may take place in the financial condition of a charge in a single year. Then, again, the circumstances of the preacher's family may differ. In all these things let the kind reader exercise charity. There is also quite a difference in the amount reported for benevolences from year to year; in some years a falling off, in the next an increase. As we do not understand the circumstances in the case, of course we cannot account for this difference. I have not given the footings in the following tables in this chapter. The reader can do the adding if he is curious to do so.

AUGUSTA.

CHAPTER VII.

In this chapter is presented the year, the number of members, the number of probationers, the number of local preachers; then the several numbers combined give the number of members each year. We present the estimates for the year; that is, the aggregate which the committee on the preachers' salaries say the pastors are entitled to, or in other words the sum which the several circuits and stations agreed to pay their pastors. The next column presents the amount actually received during the year. The next column presents the deficiency, or the amount that was not paid according to agreement. The next column presents the highest salary paid each year; the next, the smallest salary paid. In some years there is a very small salary reported. This was undoubtedly paid to a local preacher for services a part of the year. The next column is the average salary during the year. The next column is the average amount paid by each member; but as there were others, not members, who assisted in the support of the preacher, this does not give accurately what each member paid. Some members did not pay anything, and others doubtless paid more than the average. There is no report prior to 1840. Prior to 1848, when the Conferences met separately, the estimate embraces the whole state, including both Conferences. The last three columns need no explanation. The footing, it will be seen, gives the estimates, receipts, and deficiencies, and the number of deaths and baptisms. The amount of estimates for the years embraced is \$2,473,535; the sum actually paid, \$2,287,725; number of adults baptized, 20,435; number of infants baptized, 2,032; number of deaths, 7,768.

This includes the whole state until the division, and then in the Maine Conference since the division. We could not well separate what was raised in that part of the state embraced in the East Maine Conference before the division, from the whole amount raised during that period.

CHAPTER X.

SUPERANNUATES, ETC.

This chapter shows what has been raised and paid to the superannuated preachers, the widows and orphans of deceased preachers, and to make up the allowances of those preachers who had not obtained a support on their circuits. It commences with 1848 and gives what was raised the previous year, that is from 1847, when the Conferences met together. Previously to this, that is from 1836, when the returns were first made, to 1848 as above, both Conferences had paid for the above purposes some \$14,000. Previously to 1852 the Book Concern made regular dividends, and the Bishops as well as the superannuates were paid by the stewards of Conferences. From 1852 to 1882, or the Conference year of 1881 and 1882, there was, with the exception of 1863 and 1864, no appropriation from the Book Concern, and the Bishops as well as other expenses of the church, such as General Conference expenses, etc., were paid from the funds of the Book Concern, or, as some have contended, were paid by the appropriations that should have been made to the superannuates, etc. From 1882 until this date there has been a regular Episcopal Fund, and the salaries of the Bishops have been paid by the several circuits and stations. These funds are invested by said Trustees and the income appropriated as above stated. The Preachers' Aid Society is also an incorporated body, holding funds contributed for the above purposes. The Charter Fund is a fund contributed by bequests and other sources for the above purposes through the entire M. E. Church North, and is held by Trustees, incorporated by the Legislature of Pennsylvania, the interest of which is divided among the several annual Conferences according to their number.




CHAPTER XIII.

EDUCATION.

Methodism had its birth in a college. Not only did it receive its name there, but its founder was a fellow of Lincoln College, Oxford, and during his whole life was a promoter of the cause of education. Soon after Methodism was planted in this country, Bishops Coke and Asbury turned their attention to this subject, and "Cokesbury College" in the South was originated. Although the enterprise failed by the burning of the building, yet this did not discourage the friends of the cause. As Methodism was introduced into New England it brought with it the purpose of introducing as soon as possible to their people the means of education. As soon as the circumstances would allow, a Seminary of learning was established at Newmarket, N. H., which was afterwards removed to Wilbraham, Mass.


Methodism in Maine for the first thirty years was a struggle. The older denominations preoccupied the ground and had established their academies and colleges. We were in no condition to carry out our wishes in this direction. The first Methodist school in this state was established by Elihu Robinson, a very devoted class leader of Augusta. He and his wife, who was a very intelligent and pious lady, commenced a school in their own house. It was a religious boarding-school. In the meantime Luther Sampson, a wealthy farmer of Readfield, had his mind called to the same subject. Having no knowledge of Mr. Robinson's school at Augusta, Mr. Sampson originated an enterprise which resulted finally, after various changes, in what is now the Maine Wesleyan Seminary and Female College at Kent's Hill, Readfield.

It is not my design in this chapter to present a history of this enterprise in its various changes and the result of these changes. The late Rev. Stephen Allen, D.D., in his "History of Maine



VIEW OF PRESENT SEMINARY BUILDINGS.


Methodism," has given a very full account of that enterprise. I present the above to show the contrast between the past and the present, in accordance with the designs of this work. I herewith present a view of the old Seminary building, the first one erected.



THE FIRST SEMINARY BUILDING.

The building, it will be seen, was three stories with a basement story on the west end. It was of brick; the walls were but eight inches thick. The Rev. Mark Trafton, D.D., who spent quite a while in this school, describes the internal arrangement as follows: "It stood well back from the road, with front door in the center, opening into the hall, which ran through the building with door on the back side. The west end had a basement kitchen, where our 'hash' was warmed; the only fire in the building was there. Over that on the first floor was the eating room. Then across the hall, east, was a school-room, filling the whole space and seated with wooden benches. On the second floor was a recitation room, filling the whole space. East of the hall was another study room; no private rooms for students. The third floor was our dormitory, with little cross-legged, canvas-bottom bedsteads running all around the room."

In one corner of this room was the principal's room. An old Dutch clock, creaking, told off the hours. Among the most sad memories of my life is the first night I tried to sleep in that cold room. The walls of all the building were just as the brick-layers left them, no furring, no plastering; the glass in the windows, as I recollect, was poor, 7 x 9 panes. The whole thing was as plain as its projector, Father Sampson." I think Mr. Robinson, above named, was the architect and superintended the building. This description is as Dr. Trafton knew it, when it was first built. It was subsequently changed somewhat and made more comfortable.


We here present the likeness of Rev. Charles F. Allen, D.D., who was teacher in this building in 1839, 1841 to 1843, the only gentleman teacher now living of the thirty male principals and teachers or professors. There is only one lady teacher now living who was connected with the school prior to 1845, when the building was taken down; that is Miss Sarah Scott, now Mrs. John Ware, of Waterville, who was preceptress in 1839.

We here present a view of the buildings as they now are: Bearce Hall and Deering Chapel, Blethen Hall or President's House, the splendid Sampson Hall or Boarding-house, heated throughout by steam. The reader will here see the contrast between the old and the present buildings.


BEARCE HALL AND DEERING CHAPEL.

SAMPSON HALL.




The next building erected, following the first Seminary building, was the "Mansion," built for a boarding-house and students' rooms. This was built by money collected by Rev. G. F. Cox and James Dinsmore, Esq., as agents. This building is still standing and is

occupied mainly by self-boarders. We have no view of this to present. The first building became unsafe, so that in order to carry forward the school another building became a necessity. In 1844 Rev. D. B. Randall was employed as an agent, and through his instrumentality a building was erected at a cost of some four thousand dollars. This building stood mostly on the site now occupied by Bearce Hall. We have no view of this building. The next building to be erected was Sampson Hall. This was built through the

agency of the very worthy and indefatigable agent, Rev. Stephen Allen, D.D., whose likeness we here present. This building was deemed an absolute necessity for the progress of the school. Under the circumstances, no other man than Brother Allen had the ability, patience, tact, and perseverance to accomplish such a Herculean task; yet by the blessing of God upon his labors it was accomplished, and is a monument to his worth more enduring than that of marble. This building with its convenient dormitories, as we said, warmed by steam, is admirably adapted to the purposes of its erection. The students' rooms are light and pleasant, well ventilated, and provided with all necessary furniture, including first-class spring beds.




REV. STEPHEN ALLEN, D.D.

In the dining hall teachers and steward sit at the same table with the students, which is furnished with an abundant supply of well-cooked and nutritious food.

The next building is the beautiful and convenient Bearce Hall and Deering Chapel. Dr. Stephen Allen and Dr. Torsey were in-

strumental in obtaining the funds for the erection of this building. The funds were contributed mainly by Samuel R. Bearce, of Lewiston, and Hon. William Deering, now of Evanston, Ill.

I present these views of the buildings at Kent's Hill to show the contrast between the past and the present, and also the great work which the Methodists of Maine and their friends have done for the cause of education in the State. The East Maine Conference has also its institution of learning, the "East Maine Conference Seminary," under the charge of President A. F. Chase, Ph.D., an alumnus of the Maine Wesleyan Seminary and of Wesleyan University. This institution is in a very flourishing condition. This educational work cost something, and I herewith present, though imperfectly, what has been raised in the state for the cause of education. I am unable to state what has been raised for the erection and support of the "East Maine Conference Seminary." It is but justice to state, also, that a part of the sums which I here present was paid by members and friends of our church now embraced in the East Maine Conference. The State has also, from time to time, donated something to the Seminary; the amount I am not able to state.

The following is a summary of what has been contributed for the cause of education in the State by the Methodists and their friends. As I said, this is not perfect, for I have not the means by which I can state with perfect accuracy the sums; but I think the following is substantially correct:



CHAPTER XIV.

CHURCH PROPERTY.


When Methodism was first introduced into Maine by Jesse Lee, in 1793, of course we had no churches or parsonages. The first ministers preached wherever they could find a place. Sometimes, though seldom, they were invited to occupy the churches or meeting-houses of other denominations. They preached mostly in the dwellings of those who invited them, sometimes in school-houses, sometimes in barns, in the grove, in the street, or wherever they could find a place. As the work increased and the membership multiplied, they came to feel the need of a place of worship of their own. The first church edifice, if it could be called such, was built in Readfield, and was dedicated by Jesse Lee, June 21, 1795. Here it is.




FIRST METHODIST CHURCH BUILT IN MAINE.

It stood on the hill between what is now Readfield Depot and East Readfield. It occupied a site about ten rods from the main road on a cross road leading north from the main road. It was, as


we see, a very plain edifice, perhaps 40 x 30, without any outside finish only boarded and clapboarded, no inside finish, seated with plain benches possibly without backs. Of course the view given above is imaginary, but judging from the meeting-houses with which I was familiar I think the likeness is quite correct. The people worshiped in this house until about 1827, when it was moved down to the main road, enlarged, pews put in, painted, and made very comfortable. This house was rededicated by Rev. Stephen Lovell. Later, through the generosity of the late Hon. Joseph A. Sanborn, then doing business at East Readfield, the house was again repaired and a bell tower added, in which was placed a beautiful toned bell. This is the meeting-house now standing on the hill, the prominent landmark as the traveler passes between Augusta and Readfield Corner. It is the same old house, for the timbers of the old house are in this house. The Methodists at Monmouth commenced a meeting-house about the same time, but the Readfield house was finished and dedicated first. I have preached in the Monmouth house, which I have no doubt was very like the Readfield house.

I present the views of the above churches to show the contrast and improvement in church architecture.

Of course we had no parsonages in those early days. The minister, if married, was obliged to live anywhere he could find a tenement, and frequently to move during the year. The author of this work occupied three different houses the first year of his wedded life. I herewith present the number of churches and parsonages, with estimated value of the same, together with the amount paid for repairs on churches, the furnishing and repairs of parsonages, and current expenses, that is for sexton, fuel, lights, etc., viz.: One hundred and forty churches, valued at \$630,200; seventy-eight parsonages, valued at \$115,350. Paid indebtedness and repairs on churches and parsonages, furnishing parsonages, and current expenses from and including 1884, when these returns were first made, up to and including 1892, \$298,229.





CHAPTER XX.

CONCLUSION.

"Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter."

We have in the preceding pages presented largely statistics. We have seen Methodism grow in Maine from 318, in 1794, to nearly 23,000* members, the largest denomination in the state except the Roman Catholics. They number their whole population, while the Protestants number only their actual church membership, not the members of their congregations. To our members here reported add the members of our church who have died in the Lord (20,435 since 1856, when deaths were first reported). Add also the thousands who have "removed," for in nearly every state in the Union are found those who were converted and joined the M. E. Church in Maine. Add also the thousands, who, converted at our altar, have united with other churches (for I never knew another church to refuse to admit to membership a candidate because he was converted in a Methodist meeting), and we can have some idea of the number who have been converted through the instrumentality of the Methodists in Maine. In view of this, it will be well to remember that the Congregationalists were in Maine nearly two hundred years before Jesse Lee came to the state; that they were the state church; that their ministers were settled by vote of the town and their salary was assessed upon all the people the same as a tax for any other municipal purpose, and the property of the Methodists, as well as others, was taxed to support the ministers of the "standing order"; that the Baptists had an existence nearly one hundred years before Lee came; that the Free Will Baptists had formed churches here nearly thirteen years before Lee came. We have seen Methodism grow from a poor, despised few to its present condition, commanding, deserving, and receiving the respect and confidence of all good men of all creeds. We have seen arise and grow through our influence two of the most popular and successful institutions of learning of their grade in the state. There have been contributed for the cause of education, in connection with the Maine Wesleyan Seminary and

Female College, \$270,306.46. This Institution has sent out from its halls between fifteen and twenty thousand educated young men and women into every department of active life. Besides what has been done for the cause by the East Maine Conference, we have seen that there has been contributed for the advancement of the cause of Christ in the state, through its various channels of activity, \$4,135,057.09. We have seen that since Jesse Lee came to the state, a lonely wanderer, there have been connected with the Conferences in the state 628 ministers, besides the hundreds of local preachers.

This is the external view. "By what agency and power has this been accomplished?" This is a very proper question. We will endeavor to answer it. It is not in the fact that there was in the state a remarkable degree of spirituality in the churches favorable to such results. On the contrary, there was both in the ministry and membership a sad lack of this. The worship consisted of a cold, formal service. There were some noble exceptions, *but they were exceptions*. The doctrine preached was Calvinism in its pure form, "unconditional election and reprobation" and a limited atonement. It was not in the fact that when the Methodists entered the state they were joyfully received and heartily welcomed, but on the contrary they were persecuted with great virulence; they were called "wolves in sheep's clothing." The resident ministers publicly and privately warned their people not to receive these "Methodist heretics." Sermons were preached and books written against them. But Methodism has produced a great change in this regard. It has modified the doctrine, so that Calvinism, having had orders from "head-quarters" to retreat, no longer occupies the ground. A very great fraternal spirit exists among the churches of the present day.

Prof. Austin Phelps, in an article in the *Congregationalist* of March 11, 1886, says: "Methodism saved the Anglican Church from extinction. It was a reinforcement of Apostolic Christianity. It has been a stout ally of those who have labored to exterminate from the popular notion of Christianity the faction of a limited atonement and the servitude of the human will. Methodism cut the knot. Wesley and his associates denied the limitation of the atoning sacrifice by a divine decree. The most triumphant way of proving any doctrine involved in human duty is to use it. This Methodism has done for the doctrine of human freedom through the whole of her triumphant history."

It was not the perfect character of the organization of the Methodist system. It is one of the most perfect organizations in exist-

ence. Applied to any merely intellectual or financial enterprise or political movement, its efficiency would be pre-eminent. But Methodism did not come to Maine to move the intellect merely, to establish a political party, or to make money. It came to save men.

"What then?" We answer the agency is found in the divinely called, the ability, energy, and perseverance of her ministry. Men who were engaged in this work did not take it up as a trade or profession, or to make money. The great sacrifices endured and the small salaries received forbid this thought. They were divinely appointed to this work. They were "inwardly moved by the Holy Ghost to take upon themselves the office and work of the ministry." They were men of ability, though not generally from the curriculum of scholastic life; yet they were not unlearned. In the possession of a large share of common sense, they knew how to adapt themselves to the condition and wants of the people. They were converted men. They knew God, and hence from a deep experience of the things of God they were prepared to tell others about God. They preached what they felt, and their hearers felt the same power. They preached the Gospel, not "Evolution" or the "Higher Criticism." The people came for bread and they got it, not a stone. Lee and his coadjutors and followers went like flaming heralds through the state, preaching the Gospel of the Grace of God, and the word was confirmed "with signs following." This is the character and these the qualifications of those who planted Methodism in Maine, and by whose agency the church has arrived at its present state of prosperity and success. Methodism is said to be "Christianity in earnest." It is religion set on fire by the Holy Spirit. While the intellect has been cultivated and the social condition improved, the main work has been its spiritual manifestation. "God raised up the people called Methodists to spread scriptural holiness over the lands."

Methodism cannot live upon popularity. Its great numbers, its wealth, its education, its social position, cannot give it permanency. The presence of a pure spiritual power is absolutely necessary to its existence. This has been present in all its history. There have been in the history of Methodism in Maine some remarkable instances of the outpouring of the divine Spirit. Their Quarterly Meetings were seasons of great power. The members used to travel sometimes fifteen or twenty miles to attend Quarterly Meeting. At a Quarterly Meeting held in Durham in 1804* there was a remarkable manifestation of divine power, and it resulted in a great revival, in

which over one hundred were added to the church. Other Quarterly Meetings in different circuits were also seasons of great power. The Camp-meetings at times were meetings of great power; sometimes one hundred or more were converted at a single meeting. At a Camp-meeting held at Dresden in 1830, more than one hundred were converted, sixty on Friday night, the last night of the meeting. The "Protracted Meetings" were also seasons of great interest. At Mercer, a meeting that continued over thirty days, afternoon and evening, resulted in the conversion of one hundred or more; also at Winthrop, at Saccarappa, and other places hundreds were saved.

We have seen in these pages the rise and progress of Methodism in the whole state from 1793 to 1847, the time of the division of the Conference, and in the Maine Conference from the latter date to and including 1892, one hundred years. The Maine Conference was organized but three years before I came to the state, in 1828. I have been therefore personally familiar with many of the events described in these pages. Methodism in Maine has also done its part, at least, in the general prosperity of the state. It has been abreast, if not in advance, in all the reforms in the state, notably the temperance reform. In speaking of what Methodism has done, I would not overlook the Christian activity and success of other Christian denominations. Their work, too, is cheerfully acknowledged and commended. The Lord God make us a thousand times as many more as we are.
