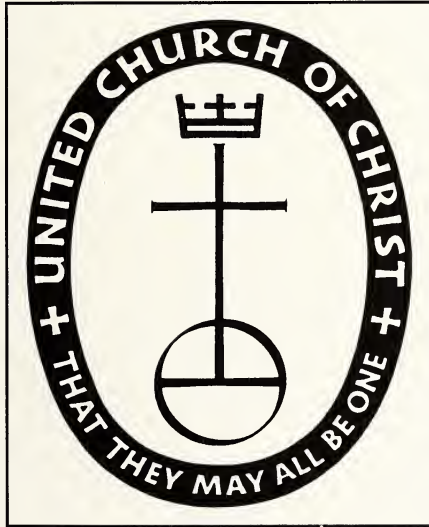

A CALL TO SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

The Council for Health and Human Service Ministries of the United Church of Christ hereby asks the Conferences of the denomination to take seriously the need for health care reform and not only to consider the issues, but also to take specific action. Each conference is asked to consider that:

1. Whereas: We are called and instructed by Jesus Christ to be in the world as servants, reaching out to persons and society, restoring them to wholeness, and
2. Whereas: Followers of Jesus acknowledge him as both the one who healed and the one who heals, and that his church is to be about the same ministry, and
3. Whereas: Eighty religious groups have joined together to call for health care reform espousing twelve working principles directed towards the

commitment to enact legislation that provides universal access to health care, and

4. Whereas: The General Synod of the United Church of Christ has named health care reform as a priority for the well being of our society as well as affirming health care as a right and mutual responsibility of all people, and
5. Whereas: The Council of Health and Human Service Ministries of the United Church of Christ, representing over 300 agencies related to the United Church of Christ, delivering health care and human services to many thousands of persons, while also employing several thousand providers of care for whom the provision of affordable health care insurance has become an increasingly impossible financial burden, has endorsed the principles developed by the Interreligious Health Care Access Campaign, and
6. Whereas: Some persons and groups of our society deny that any health care crisis exists, which the Council for Health and Human Service Ministries emphatically rejects as unsupported by the mass of experience and evidence,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED: That the Council for Health and Human Service Ministries asks each Conference of the United Church of Christ to adopt the following actions:

ACTIONS: That the Conference call on the members of its congregations to support universal access to comprehensive health care for all persons, which includes early intervention through primary care,
That the Conference urge the members of their congregations to contact their members of Congress and urge them to vigorously support health care reform which includes universal coverage modeled after the principles set forth by the Interreligious Health Care Access Campaign, and

That the Conference, distribute copies of the IHAC twelve working principles to the congregations to help stimulate creative discussion on the need for health care reform and encourage members to become actively involved in the process of enacting appropriate legislation at this critical time.

VOTE 11: To table the Resolution "A Call to Social Responsibility". (vote failed)

VOTE 12: To accept the substitute motion: That the Southern Conference affirm the concept of universal health care for all God's people.

VOTE 13: To accept amenities resolution submitted by Dr. Rollin Russell as follows:

Be it resolved that the Southern Conference expresses its sincere appreciation to:

- The Western North Carolina Association and its churches for hosting our Annual Meeting;
- The Rev. Alan Miller, our Associate Conference Minister, for the good work he has done in preparing for this meeting;

- Ms. Jo Carpenter for her tireless work on our behalf;
- The Planning Committee which designed this Annual Meeting and its inspiring program;
- Catawba College for its outstanding hospitality in providing our meeting facilities, our meals and lodging, and enabling us to have a successful and enjoyable meeting;
- The officers of the conference for conducting an efficient and effective meeting;
- The worship planners and leaders for lifting our hearts in praise and thanksgiving.

THE EVANGELISM AWARDS were presented by Rev. Jay Whitley to New Hope UCC, Norfolk, VA; Laodicea UCC, Raleigh, NC; Beck's; UCC, Lexington, NC.

REPORT OF THE INTERIM ASSOCIATE CONFERENCE MINISTER FOR THE EASTERN VIRGINIA ASSOCIATION UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST

Grace and Peace Unto you!

OCTOBER 5, 1993**

The Western North Carolina Association Twenty-Sixth Annual Meeting was held October 5, 1993 at Beck's United Church of Christ, Lexington, NC. The theme of the meeting was: "With These Gifts." The meeting began at 9:00 a.m. with registration. Opening worship began at 9:45 a.m. The Rev. Ervin E. Milton of the Office for Church Life and Leadership of the United Church of Christ, delivered the sermon. The sacrament of Holy Communion was celebrated. The offering from this service, which amounted to \$448.20. was given to the WNCA Student Scholarship Fund.

The business was called to order at 10:45 a.m. by Mr. David Roberts, President of the WNCA. Mr. Roberts defined the bar of the house as the entire sanctuary, reminded everyone that they must be wearing a delegate badge in order to vote, appointed the Dr. G. Melvin Palmer as the Parliamentarian, announced that the WNCA Board of Directors would act as the Business Committee for the meeting, and that any resolutions to be brought before the body must be given to a member of the Business Committee before 12:00 noon. Such business would be considered in the afternoon session under "Other Business." Mr. Roberts then presented the tentative agenda with the following change for adoption. Under the "Second Business Session," the "*Make A Difference*" Campaign update would be given just before the WNCA Associate Conference Minister's "State of the Association" Address. Motion by Mr. George Cannon, seconded, to adopt the Agenda with the noted changes. Motion passed.

Rev. Eric Disher, pastor of Beck's United Church of Christ, extended a welcome to the Association members on behalf of the church.

Rev. Alan C. Miller, WNCA Associate Conference Minister, introduced the guests present for the meeting: Dr. Rollin Russell, Conference Minister for the Southern Conference; Rev. Raymond Hargrove, Associate Southern Conference Minister; Rev. Yvonne Beasley, Associate Southern Conference Minister; Mrs. Josephine Carpenter, WNCA Office Secretary; Rev. Elaine Sipe, WNCA vice-president; Mr. Roger Younts, WNCA Treasurer; Mrs. Margie Weavil, President WNCA Church Women; Mr. John Yeates, President WNCA Churchmen's Fellowship; Rev. Ervin Milton, Southeast Regional Director for the Office for Church Life and Leadership; Rev. Donald Flick, Executive Director United Church Retirement Homes; Dr. Lee Jessup, Director of Development for United Church Retirement Homes; Rev. Clarence Stumb, Executive Director Johns River Camp; Dr. Walstein Sunder, Church Development Consultant for Elon Homes for Children; Dr. Carroll Bartholomew, WNCA Director for the "*Make A Difference*" Campaign; and of special note: Mrs. Brenda James, member of St. Stephen UCC, Greensboro, and Mrs. Cynthia Buckwell, member of Bethel UCC, Mt. Pleasant, both of

whom were honored for their church work by the Coordinating Center for Women at the 1993 General Synod meeting in St. Louis, Missouri.

Rev. Elaine Sipe, Acting Secretary, presented the minutes of the 1992 WNCA Annual Meeting. Motion was made by Mr. E. C. Moore, seconded, to approve the minutes and to receive the reports of the Commissions and Board for the past year. Motion passed. SEE:

Mr. Roger Younts, WNCA Treasurer, presented the Treasurer's Report and the Proposed Budget for 1994. (**EXHIBITS 10 & 11**) Motion was made by Mr. George Cannon, seconded, to receive the Treasurer's Report. Motion passed. President David Roberts thanked Roger Younts for his four years of dedicated service, and presented him with a gift on behalf of the Association.

President David Roberts presented the Registrar's Report, and declared that a quorum was present. The attendance was as follows: 76 lay delegates, 82 clergy, and 43 visitors for a total of 201.

At this point special recognition was given to the Rev. Mark W. Andes, the Rev. Weldon T. Madren, and the Rev. Edgar C. Torrence who were all celebrating the 50th Anniversary of their ordinations.

Dr. Rollin Russell, Conference Minister for the Southern Conference, was called upon for remarks. Dr. Russell brought our attention to a number of items to celebrate: new church starts in the Conference, the intern program with the Evangelical Church of the Rhineland, and the development of the Black Lake Retreat Center. In addition, Dr. Russell noted that the Rev. Dorcas Lohr had resigned from the Conference Staff to take a position on the Penn Central Conference Staff, and he gave an update on the search for a new Associate Conference Minister for the Eastern Virginia Association. President David Roberts and Associate Conference Minister Alan Miller gave a report on the efforts of both the Conference Board of Directors and the WNCA Board of Directors to evaluate the effectiveness of our current organizational structure over the past year. For a summary of this report, SEE **EXHIBIT 12**. Following the presentation, there was time for questions and answers. In particular, questions were raised about where the work required for Outdoor Ministries would be done. It was explained that this would be done by the Conference's Church Life & Education Commission, which would be made up of representatives from each of the Associations' Church Life & Education Commissions; and

that the Staff work required for Outdoor Ministries would be done by the Rev. Clarence Stumb, Executive Director of Johns River Camp. There was also concern about how the work done formerly by the Christian Social Ministries Commission would be carried out under the new model. It was noted that the model being proposed was an experimental model, and that the Board would like two years to experiment with this model and to evaluate its effectiveness before they recommended any changes to the WNCA Constitution and Bylaws. A motion was made and seconded to give the WNCA Board permission to experiment with the recommended model, to evaluate its effectiveness, and to report back to the Association. Rev. Bill Smith made a motion to amend the original motion to change the name of the "Church Life & Education Commission" in the recommended model to: "Church Life, Education, & Social Ministries Commission." The amendment was seconded, voted upon, and defeated. The original motion was voted upon and passed.

Rev. Philip Myers, Chairperson of the WNCA Nominating Committee presented the Nominating Committee's Report. (**EXHIBIT 13**) Rev. Myers pointed out that the Committee's report reflected the model suggested in the Restructuring Report (**EXHIBIT 12**). Rev. Myers announced the following names for nomination that were not available at the time of the printing of the report:

for Vice-President: Ms. Margaret Byrd, Winston-Salem, NC
for Treasurer: Rev. Van Grimes, Newton, NC
for Church Life & Education Commission, Class of '94: Rev. Anne Abernethy-Wepner, Newton, NC

President David Roberts opened the floor for additional nominations. The only other nomination offered was that of Dr. Melvin Palmer for the Stewardship & Mission Commission, Class of '95. Mr. George Cannon made a motion, seconded, that nominations be closed. The motion passed. As there were no contested offices, President David Roberts instructed the Secretary to cast a unanimous ballot for those nominated.

At this point, following some announcements, the meeting adjourned for lunch. The delegates were reminded to pick up and fill out Annual Meeting evaluation forms. The Rev. Eric Disher offered grace.

The meeting reconvened at 1:00 p.m. Associate Conference Minister Alan Miller introduced the video: "With These Gifts," produced by the Office for Church Life & Leadership. The video highlights various expressions of lay ministry in local churches within the United Church of Christ: Upon watching the video, the delegates broke into small groups so that they could share ideas and celebrate the ministries that were taking place in their local churches. An optional study group was held in the sanctuary for those who wanted to learn more about General Synod 19. The session was led by WNCA members who attended the General Synod meeting this past July in St. Louis, Missouri.

At 2:30 p.m. the meeting reconvened in the sanctuary. President David Roberts called upon Dr. Lee Jessup, Director of Development for United Church Retirement Homes, to give an update regarding their work. Dr. Jessup reported on plans for expansion at the

Piedmont Center site, on the progress of the Eastern Virginia project, and that the Retirement Homes was searching for a person to be a Director of Human Resources.

At this point, Dr. Carroll Bartholomew and Dr. Rollin Russell gave a progress report on the "Make-A-Difference" Campaign. A video was shown, and it was reported that advance gifts look encouraging and that local churches are starting to form committees to conduct the campaign throughout their congregations.

Rev. Alan C. Miller, WNCA Associate Conference Minister, gave a "State of the Association" Address. **(EXHIBITS 2 & 3)** The theme of the address was leadership. Rev. Miller noted the Biblical emphasis placed upon leadership and then went on to recognize leaders in our midst: first by presenting a gift to WNCA retiring President David Roberts, thanking him for his dedicated leadership over the past two years, and then by introducing pastors new to the Association and noting pastoral transitions within the Association. Rev. Miller concluded his address by challenging the Association to make clergy compensation a priority over the coming year.

President David Roberts entertained a motion by Mr. George Cannon and seconded by Mrs. Brenda James to adopt the 1993-1994 WNCA Budget. Rev. Harold Holste offered an amendment to increase the budgeted amount for "Student Summer Service" from \$1,000.00 to \$1,300.00 This increased the overall budget from \$20,850.00 to \$21,150.00. The amendment was seconded and passed. The budget was then voted upon and adopted as amended.

Rev. Alan Miller reminded WNCA Board and Commission members that the annual reorganizational meeting was scheduled for Saturday, November 6, 1993, 9:30 a.m., at First United Church of Christ, Salisbury, NC. Installation of new Officers, Board members, and Commission members followed.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:30 p.m.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT WESTERN NORTH CAROLINA ASSOCIATION 1993

Serving as President of the Western North Carolina Association during 1993 has been somewhat easier for me than it was during 1992. There are several reasons for this remark.

First, 1992 began with the new Associate Conference Minister, Rev. Alan Miller, taking responsibility for the Association's activity in replacement for the retirement of Rev. Richard Cheek. The early part of 1992 was busy for me in scheduling and attending

receptions for Rev. Alan Miller in each of the five program districts in the Western North Carolina Association, and in trying to help Alan and his family to get settled in and comfortable in their new setting, while learning his way around the Association.

Second, the business session of the Fall 1991 Association Meeting had resulted in the establishment of a Forum Planning Committee to study issues raised concerning the General Synod resolution affirming the ordination of gay, lesbian, and bisexual persons, and theological concerns expressed at the 1991 Annual Meeting. 1992 was a busy time for me as Chairman of the Forum Planning Committee in meetings, in planning Forums, and in attending them. The action taken at the 1992 Annual Meeting of the Association resulted in the acceptance of the resolution offered by the Forum Planning Committee, along with the dissolution of said committee.

1993 has been easier for me because Alan Miller is securely entrenched in his new job as Associate Conference Minister of the Western North Carolina Association, and is doing a great job for us. Also, the Forum Planning Committee work is complete and does not require my time and attention. The Association office is running smoothly and our secretary, Ms. Jo Carpenter, is getting proficient with the new computer system installed earlier this past year, and the new copier gives many options for improving communications from the Association office. The spirit of harmony and goodwill seems to permeate the Association, and the local churches seem rather comfortable with the ways things seem to be going.

From my viewpoint, the general condition of the Western North Carolina Association during 1993 is basically good. The association is blessed with many good committed ordained ministers and lay leaders. The Association office is performing well, and the Spirit of God blows through many of our Congregations. Much remains to be done, there is a world to bear witness to, but much is being done. I offer my sincere heartfelt thanks to all those persons who are offering ministry in the communities across Western North Carolina, and I send to everyone my best wishes.

ASSOCIATE CONFERENCE MINISTER'S REPORT
WESTERN NORTH CAROLINA ASSOCIATION

“God said, ‘I will be with you; and this shall be a sign for you that it is I who sent you: when you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall worship God on this mountain.’” (Exodus 3:12)

Ever since God first called Abraham followed by Moses, the judges, the prophets, and the apostles, it has been clear that God calls leaders to lead the people of God. God calls leaders to identify the presence of God and to articulate the vision of the Kingdom of God: to

proclaim hope and possibility, to announce judgment and forgiveness, to offer comfort and assurance, to prophetically challenge the status quo, and to organize the people for mission. It is through leaders, sent by God, that the people are led to a new place where they can gather to meet and worship God. It is because of the importance of this biblical heritage that I have identified **LEADERSHIP** as the number one priority of the Association.

Due to a number of issues (which I raised last year), namely the current high rate of retirement of UCC clergy, the bias against women clergy, the dwindling size of seminary enrollment, and the lack of good network and support systems for local church pastors, I am concerned that if we do not respond quickly and constructively, our churches (and thus our Association) could be on the verge of a leadership vacuum.

THIS PAST YEAR has seen some progress:

1. Three women have been called as pastors of churches. All seem to be enjoying a great deal of acceptance, effectiveness, and success. This is just a beginning; there is still much to do, BUT, now we have local churches who can share their positive experiences with other local churches who are searching for pastors.
2. Twenty congregations have been introduced to and have had some training about starting a local church Pastoral Relations Committee. This training has come through either classes offered at program district leadership training schools, or by working one-on-one with local church councils and consistories. The purpose of such a committee is to build a support system for the pastor and to enhance communication between pastor and parish.
3. There was good attendance at the 1993 Southern Conference Ministers' Retreat where the theme was: "Clergy Self-Care," emphasizing strategies and resources for ministers to use in taking better care of themselves.

BUT THERE IS STILL MUCH TO DO, I have identified three areas where I plan to concentrate my efforts:

#1 CLERGY COMPENSATION - In 1992, of the 39 Conferences of the United Church of Christ, the average salary of Southern Conference pastors ranked 36th. As I visit with local churches to discuss the issue of clergy compensation, I am often told by the local leadership that their inability to pay an equitable salary is a funding problem - "There's not enough money to pay the pastor!" (I find this interesting as often these same churches have 10's of thousands, some even 100's of thousands, of dollars in savings accounts, endowment funds, and cemetery funds.) This is not a funding problem, it is a stewardship problem! Too often we have not understood the stewardship of leadership. Too often our churches view the pastor's salary as administrative or overhead expense, rather than as dollars spent on the ministry of leadership. The pastor is not merely an administrator, she/he is a highly trained professional, a missionary sent to your community. I am sure that our current levels of compensation are affecting our ability to attract pastors to our Association and to encourage our seminarians to "come back home" after graduation.

#2 RECRUITMENT OF SEMINARIANS - It is imperative that we develop new strategies for both recruiting students and for supporting our students during their seminary years. Currently, the Church & Ministry Commission is looking at a new program for providing mentors for our students.

#3 PASTORAL CARE OF PASTORS - Due to the number of pastors in our Association, the physical size of the Association, and the conflicting "hats" that I am often called upon to wear (i.e. - confidant vs. placement officer), it is impossible for anyone in this office to effectively be "pastor to all the pastors" of the Association. HOWEVER, it is still the responsibility of this office to see that this important ministry of "pastor to pastors" is in place. Currently, I am working with the Church & Ministry Commission on an eight component program for providing more effective pastoral care for our pastors and their families. As these efforts begin to take shape, we will be providing additional information.

The Southern Conference and the Western North Carolina Association have had a wonderful legacy due to the great leaders and saints that had the foresight and courage to call us into existence, and then to lead the way. We owe it to them, to the future of our churches, and to the Kingdom of God to continue the good work they have begun, and that means insuring that our churches will have just as fine leadership in the future as they have enjoyed in the past.

May God bless us and continue to be our vision.

The Commission has spent the last year working on several of the short and long range goals it had set during the previous year. One of those short range goals was to identify Black churches that could potentially support a "full-time" ministry. The Commission has identified five potential churches.

The Commission Coordinator and Church Development staff person have met with the pastor and several lay leaders of three of the five churches. The long-term goal is to work with each of these churches in planning and implementing a five-year strategy of development. Part of the strategy will include helping churches do a self-assessment, community assessment as well as leadership and stewardship development.

At least 1/4 of the Black churches in the Western North Carolina Association participated in the Black Church Development resource/training sessions held in December. Dorsett's Chapel United Church of Christ was the host church. Those churches represented were: Dorsett's Chapel UCC, Spencer; Mt. Zion UCC, Rockingham; New Emmanuel UCC, Charlotte; First UCC, Concord; St. Stephen UCC, Greensboro; First Congregational UCC, Asheboro; Wentz-Memorial, Winston-Salem and Emmanuel UCC, Greensboro. The session focused upon stewardship development and featured both National and Conference leadership.

The Commission plans to continue to work with churches who are moving towards "full-time" ministry. We also plan to work at increasing the participation of local churches and their pastors in the life of the Association as well as the Conference. The Commission is grateful to God for the life and service rendered to this church by the late Mrs. Roberta Vanderburg.

CHURCH AND MINISTRY COMMISSION
WESTERN NORTH CAROLINA

The Church and Ministry Commission is charged with the responsibility of (1) implementing the standards for ministry as stated in the MANUAL ON MINISTRY of the UCC; (2) receiving students in care according to the MANUAL ON MINISTRY; (3) providing for a comprehensive course of study for those who seek to enter ministry by an alternate route; (4) providing on-going continuing education programs for persons seeking to qualify for ministry in the UCC; (5) reviewing current standing of non-parish clergy for the purpose of continuing their standing or leave of absence; (6) encouraging local Church and Ministry or Pastoral Relations committees to review the pastors' compensation annually and providing the congregations with a scale of adequate benefits for pastors; (7) seeking to recruit persons in full-time Christian service; (8) reviewing requests from any congregations desiring to unite with the United Church of Christ through the Western North Carolina Association; (9) awarding financial aid to students for ministry in colleges and seminaries; (10) interviewing candidates for ordination and approving them for an Ecclesiastical Council; (11) assisting in the ordination of candidates who have been recommended by an Ecclesiastical Council and who have received a call to a specific ministry; (12) acting on the transfer of ministerial standing of pastors into the Western North Carolina Association.

The Commission is also prepared to assume a mediation role in cases of complaints lodged against clergy by congregations or individuals. The role will be administered justly and compassionately to all parties concerned.

The Commission reminds the Association of a policy adopted several years ago requiring pastors serving churches in the Association to attend the annual Association meetings or to present, in writing, a valid excuse for their absence.

We call to the attention of the local Church and Ministry and Budget committees, the importance of providing adequate compensation for pastors - cash salary, insurance, retirement, continuing education and travel. Your pastors are called, well-trained and highly motivated persons. The pastors, the Association, the Conference and the United Church of Christ have all invested considerable money, time and energy in equipping them for ministry. If you do not pay them sufficiently to relieve them of the worry of how they will repay education loans and meet their current bills, you are not taking advantage of them as full-time church leaders. You insult them and you embarrass yourselves if you force them to take moonlighting jobs to make ends meet. Show them and yourselves some respect in the level at which you pay your pastors. The Association office can supply you with a

handbook to help you determine what is fair compensation based on the pastor's training and years of service. If you say, "We can't afford to pay what the scale recommends." you are saying that you cannot afford to be the Church. You can afford what you as a congregation think is important. If you think the pastor is not important, ask a congregation which is vacant how important one is.

We pose a final question to challenge you to consider your part in recruiting candidates for ministry - "Has your church raised up as many pastors as you have used up?"

First, the GOOD NEWS: 21 churches met or exceeded the 1992 Challenge Goal. The challenge goal is the amount the Commission challenged the churches for Our Churches Wider Mission. Also, 54 churches met or exceeded what they accepted as their own goal. We salute these 75 churches.

Second, we encourage the 20 churches who failed to meet their own 1992 OCWM goals to work harder in the year 1993 and 1994.

Third, we ask the 21 churches who did not give any OCWM moneys in 1992 to reconsider their commitment to the larger church in 1993 and 1994.

Fourth, we are happy to report the total giving for the 1992 Western North Carolina Association Our Churches Wider Mission was \$268,759.00 slightly lower than the 1991 total of \$280,747.46 a drop of 4.28%.

Fifth, the 1992 OCWM giving to the Conference by the three associations was \$568,813.00 compared to the 1991 OCWM \$585,374.85 a drop of 2.8%.

Sixth, the 1993 Report as of September 1st indicates encouraging news. We have received reports from 54 churches with commitments of \$177,388 compared to 1992 \$170,129 a 4.2% increase.

know that the flat economy has hurt our giving in the local churches and the controversy over social issues taken by the General Synod have also hurt our giving. But we need to remember we need to continue to support the work of our own Southern Conference. The conference and the associations deliver most of the support and the services that the local churches need through the Conference staff, commissions and boards. The Southern Conference passed on to the national Our Churches Wider Mission 15% in 1992.

Your Commission has met four times during the year, I have attended all of the Conference Stewardship Committee meetings and the Association Board of Director meetings.

I ask each church to accept the 1994 challenge goal for OCWM mailed to you in September 1993. Church Treasurers please remit your church's OCWM on a monthly basis. If we work together for OCWM growth in every church, we will be able to increase God's mission in North Carolina, Virginia and around the world.

EXHIBIT 12

A PROPOSED MODEL FOR RESTRUCTURING THE ASSOCIATION'S PROGRAMMATIC ORGANIZATION

PART 1 - RATIONALE

The fact that we are even considering restructuring "how" we do ministry is an acknowledgment that any organizational structure is simply a tool to help us accomplish our mission; it is not an end in itself. Thus, because people, times, and situations change we constantly need to critique the tool to see if that which served us well in the past still serves us well in the new day and circumstances in which we find ourselves. Several realities of our time call us to re-look at our current structure:

1. SOCIOLOGICAL CHANGES: John Naisbitt predicted it in his 1982 best seller, Megatrends, and it is happening. American society is moving from centralization to decentralization, or to say it another way, the emphasis is shifting from the wider body to the local situation. Within the realm of church programming this phenomenon has surfaced as diminished attendance at conference and association-wide activities and better attendance at district or local activities. In the Western NC Association, we have witnessed this change through the popularity of the District Leadership Training Schools versus the number of Association sponsored events that have had to be canceled due to a lack of registrants.

2. STAFF CUTBACKS: Due to the reduction of financial resources, particularly in 1992, the size of the Conference Staff has been reduced. Even though the commissions are staffed and chaired by volunteers, much of their activity or degree of success is often dependent upon the presence of a resource person in the form of Conference Staff. Thus reduced Staff often means reduced activity.

3. NON-FUNCTIONING COMMISSIONS: A number of the commissions are experiencing a variety of roadblocks, including:

- a.) Limited or no Staff support (as mentioned in #2 above).
- b.) Inability to recruit volunteer leadership
- c.) And possibly the biggest dilemma, LACK OF CLEAR MISSION. Thus the commissions often gather to "think up" programs. This type of programmatic approach often results in low levels of response by our local churches as they do not feel that the events offered are a need of their particular local situation.

The result of all these factors is to disillusion dedicated volunteers about the effectiveness and purpose of the larger body, and to create a nightmare of the Association's Nominating Committee. Commission members often give up entire Saturdays, driving long distances to commission meetings that either: a.) lack focus, or b.) whose carefully planned events end up being canceled due to a lack of registrants. Likewise, the Nominating Committee is faced with the annual challenge of filling constitutionally mandated positions for commissions that are either not meeting or are not effective. The result: a decline in morale and a waste of valuable volunteer time, energy, and resources.

PART II - A PROPOSED MODEL: "Needs Driven Programming"

The proposed model reduces our current list of commissions from seven:

- Black Church Development
- Church Life and Leadership
- Church and Ministry
- Christian Education
- Christian Social Ministry
- Evangelism
- Stewardship

to a more streamlined list of four commissions:

- Church Development, Black Church Life, & Evangelism
- Church and Ministry
- Church Life and Education
- Stewardship and Mission

The major difference is that the work of Christian Education Commission, the Church Life and Leadership Commission, and the Christian Social Ministries Commission would be unified under the heading of: **Church Life and Education**; and the work of the Black Church Development Commission and the Evangelism Commission would be unified under the heading of: **Church Development, Black Church Life, and Evangelism**.

These new commissions would operate under three premises:

1. That all ministry and programming begins with education.

2. That these commissions are program councils that are "needs driven." In other words, these groups would be a "think tanks" that listen to the needs and requests of our local churches, and then design programs that speak directly to those needs. As such most of their work would be through task forces or resource persons recruited to respond to the identified needs. Upon completion of their tasks, the task force and/or resource persons would be thanked and disbanded. The only exception to this model might be certain annual tasks that the Christian Education Commission now performs that needs to be carried out each year.

3. That currently the most effective settings for delivering program are through:
 - a. going directly to the local church.
 - b. the District Leadership Training Schools.
 - c. meeting with clusters of local churches that have similar needs.

EXHIBIT 15 CHURCHMEN'S FELLOWSHIP OF THE WESTERN NORTH CAROLINA

The Twenty-fourth Annual Meeting of the Western North Carolina Association of the Churchmen's Fellowship was held at Blowing Rock Assembly Grounds on August 27, 28, and 29, 1993.

The theme for the program this year was "A Theology of the Church."

Friday evening we were welcomed to a very delicious roast beef dinner, followed by an ice cream bar. Karl Hayes from the Guilford-Rockingham District led our vespers. His topic was "What Does it Mean to us to Witness?" Scripture Acts 1:1-8, and group singing led by Charles Walker.

Our Saturday morning session began with a welcome by President John Yeattes and BRAG Executive Director Eric Johnson. Devotions were led by Rev. Marion Smith from the Randolph District. The topic being "Needs For Good and Dedicated Men to Shore up the Work of God." Scripture - Ezekiel 22:3

Dr. Peter Schmiechen started our program on "A Theology of the Church" with a speech on "The Church's Only Treasure." He named this treasure the Grace of God. It is a gift given to everyone. He went on to discuss the fact that life is built on doing, that world problems will not let us rest, that anger and conflict are in the church as well as in the world. He declared that baptism is the only requirement of church membership. He stated that the church is called upon to preach Grace first, this gift from God to all, and that we

should be gracious to one another. He posed some thought provoking questions about the Church: Is it only for white people? Is there any spirituality in it today? Is it merely a social organization with a declining membership of 25% over the last twenty years? Following his message a number of questions concerning these and other issues brought on a lively and lengthy discussion among the entire group assembled.

After lunch the business meeting was called to order. Minutes of the 1992 annual meeting were read and approved. The Treasurer's report showed a balance of \$4,629.73 and the Mission Loan Fund amounted to \$105,456.02. Reports were received from the following:

The Mission Loan Fund needed a member to replace Thoren West, deceased. Rev. Marion Smith was elected to this position.

Karl Hayes gave an up-date on their present activities and future plans.

Rev. Clarence Stumb, Director of Johns River Camp, reported on camps in 1993 and thanked the Western Association Churchmen's Fellowship for exceeding their pledge of \$4,000.00. He told of their need for a commercial dishwasher and challenged us to support the project to purchase one for \$8,000.00. A motion was made to take \$2,000.00 from the Mission Loan Fund for this project. It was approved. In another motion it was suggested that each Churchmen's Fellowship be challenged to give \$2.00 per member for one year to the dishwasher project, which would be in addition to the regular \$3.00 dues (Feb. 1994 deadline). The motion also passed.

Rev. Marion Smith - Pastoral Advisor

Our 1994 annual meeting will be held at BRAG on August 26-28.

Rev. Rosser Clapp had an impressive Installation Service following the banquet. Then Dr. Schmiechen spoke on "The Household of God." He said the church is the household of God and then went on to speak of what it means to be living in the grace of God. He also spoke of the conflicts in church and the ways we should deal with them.

On Sunday morning Ike Young of the Davidson District taught the Sunday School lesson. Dr. Schmiechen, with the assistance of Rev. Clapp, led our Worship Service at the "Little White Church." The sermon topic was "It Shall Not Be So Among You," based on the scripture Mark 10:35-45. Communion was then served to all attending.

Lunch at BRAG concluded our meeting.

Heartfelt thanks go to Rev. Alan Miller, Associate Conference Minister, for helping plan our retreat and for securing the services of Dr. Peter Schmiechen, President of Lancaster Theological Seminary, as the keynoter for our meeting.

THE HISTORICAL ARCHIVES
WESTERN NORTH CAROLINA

The Historical Archives is maintained in the Library of Catawba College in Salisbury NC. It operates under the direction of the Southern Chapter of the Evangelical and Reformed Historical Society, which is a branch of the national Evangelical and Reformed Historical Society, which comes under the umbrella of the Historical Council of the United Church of Christ. The archives is overseen by Ms. Jacquelyn Sims, a trained archivist on the staff of the Catawba College Library. We employ her services on a part-time basis.

The purpose of the archives is to collect, catalog and make available information on official records and historical materials in the churches and institutions in the Western North Carolina Association. It offers suggestions to local churches on how to maintain their records and artifacts, and what to keep and what to throw away.

The Southern Chapter of the Evangelical and Reformed Historical Society holds a meeting in the Association in connection with a significant anniversary of a church or institution. This year (1993) our meeting is planned for Spoon's Chapel United Church of Christ, near Asheboro.

Another thing the Southern Chapter does is to sponsor a historical bus tour to some point of historical significance in the United Church of Christ. Often it is arranged to coincide with the national meeting of the Evangelical and reformed Historical Society. Next week (October 12-19) forty-five people will travel to the meeting in Chicago.

Mrs. Sims reports that her priority is in retrieving and arranging materials produced by the churches and official church bodies (primarily in North Carolina) that were a part of the Reformed Church in the U.S. and the Evangelical and Reformed Church. She says "Because the overwhelming majority of our requests are genealogical in nature, I have also spent some time cataloging books and binding periodicals that deal with the history of the churches during this period. Mrs. Erlene Caldwell, library technical assistant in the technical services department at the Catawba College Library, assists by typing the cards of the cataloged items. Duplicate cards have been produced for each item and eventually these cards will be available at Lancaster (Pennsylvania, where the UCC Archives is located) and at the main catalog at the Catawba Library. Some information has been set up in a vertical file arrangement. A NAME FILE, consisting of ministers and others engaged in the work of the church, a PLACE FILE, consisting primarily of UCC churches in North Carolina that were a part of the Reformed (and Evangelical and Reformed Church, and a DENOMINATION FILE, consisting of bulletins, clippings, directories etc. have been set up. We also have records of some of the auxiliary organizations such as the Woman's Missionary Society/Women's Guild. These records are being processed."

We have a number of items that relate to the history of the UCC as a whole and items that related to the history of the Southern Conference. Mrs. Kaye Schellhase, Archivist of the United Church of Christ, has met with the Property and Conservation Committee of the

Southern Conference and with Ms. Sims and with her counterpart at Elon College, Mrs. Diane Gill, to see how best to handle UCC materials without losing any in the cracks and without duplication. Mrs. Schellhase suggests that one way to avoid crowding of already over-crowded archives is for local churches to keep their records at home and give us a list of what they have.

A Pre-Association service of worship was held on Friday, October 15, 1993 at 7:30 p.m. at the Laodicea United Church of Christ, Raleigh, NC. Rev. Walter Gibson, pastor of Christian Home UCC, Apex, NC, the worship leader and choirs from ENCA churches were participants in the service of thanksgiving and praise. Rev. G. Wesley Raney, III, is pastor of Laodicea UCC.

The Twenty-seventh Annual Meeting of the ENCA of the Southern Conference was held at Emmanuel UCC on Saturday, October 16, 1993. The Association gathered for worship as the Rev. Yvonne Beasley announced the Call to worship. Music was provided by the Sanford District Choir and the preacher was Rev. Dr. Barry Brandon, pastor of Beacher Memorial UCC, New Orleans, LA. The sermon title was "Cultivating What Remains." The message which was inspiring, challenging and provocative was a reflection on the theme of the meeting, "God Working Through Us," a call to membership growth and evangelism.

On the same survey will be a place to list speakers who offer expertise on topics that might be of interest to local churches. From this survey, an associational Speaker's Bureau will be established (health care, Habitat for Humanity, child/spouse abuse, aging, parents, etc.).

Display of Church Life and Leadership materials at the October 16 ENC meeting will be arranged by the Owl's Nest UCC Book and Gift Shop in Hillsborough. Persons wishing to make special requests for items to be stocked should contact Louise Tate at 644-0303, Tuesday through Saturday.

Ideas Sharing: Decided to create a list of "things that work" by soliciting ideas already proven successful in local churches. Examples:

- *Prayer Family of the Week (feature in the bulletin and on the bulletin board).
- *Family and Friends Day (focus on inviting guests for worship).
- *Challenge each person to increase giving by 10% of the amount already being given.
- *"Sharing Ideas" list to be published in conference newsletter.
- *Prayer Partners for college/service/shut-ins.
- *Goods/Services Auction (fund raiser: sells goods and services such as lawn mowing, car washing, baby sitting, window washing, legal services, garden tilling, boat rides, dinner parties, etc.)
- *Group-sponsored fellowship. Ask each major group of the church to sponsor a fellowship meal and activity.
- *Ten-friend rally. Each captain of a team asks ten friends to contribute toward a fund raiser.

Ideas will be publicized at ENC and Delegates will be given a form to list any other ideas they might have. These ideas will be published in the Conference newsletter.

REPORT OF THE ASSOCIATE CONFERENCE MINISTER

To God be the glory for our shared ministry and life together. I am grateful to have the privilege and opportunity to be in ministry in the ENCA and with you. Your many acts of kindness, prayers and support during the past year have been received as expressions of God's grace and I thank you.

This has been an eventful year in that we have strived to address some specific priorities established by our Board of Directors. We realized early in the year that some congregations are regularly visited and resourced by staff and Conference leaders. Others, however, have at times felt alienated and need of fellowship and support. They were identified and over the course of several weeks, I have met with the pastors and leaders. The programmatic thrust has included the introduction of UCC resources, stewardship education, adoption of a constitution and leadership development.

We are currently planning to conduct leadership schools in each of the six program districts so that resources will be more accessible to congregations. The Commissions will be anxious to hear for you and to know how we may be of assistance to your congregation.

Much of my time has been spent in support of the Make A Difference Campaign. The cluster directors and Conference leaders have conducted informational gatherings through the Association. I strongly encourage you to support this effort to strengthen the ministry of our Church with your personal gift. We are making significant progress and hope that you are planning to make a pledge to this campaign.

Each of the ministeriums have discussed the Association Clergy Sexual Misconduct Policy. Resources are available in the Association office for pastors and congregations who would like to engage in discussion of ethics in ministry.

You will note in the statistical report that Turners Chapel UCC, Sanford, NC removed its membership from the Association. We are saddened that this decision was made by the pastor and congregation. This is a valued church with a rich and long history. Founded in 1873, it has been served by faithful pastors who with the congregation have contributed so much to our life. Let us keep this church in our prayers and hold its members in our hearts as they seek to do the will of God.

There are presently twelve vacant churches. We are pleased to work with churches seeking a pastor and continue to recommend Interim Ministry. Churches have responded favorably to this initiative and it seems to have enhanced their search process.

Lastly, I want to say a word about the projections of 1993-94. (1) We are proposing an increase in our budget of \$1,000.00 for a total of \$5,000.00 for educational assistance. This will enable us to offer aid to the increasing number of persons pursuing theological education. (2) The separate line item for retired ministry will strengthen our work with those who have labored on our behalf and have so much to share with us. (3) Faith Works - Hopefully, we can assist persons, particularly youth in attending this National church gathering in 1994 and will encourage participation. (4) Churches may contribute to the Church Development Fund so that we can assist new and renewed church growth projects. This is a new fund established last year. Some congregations have already pledged support for 1993-94.

I close with a world of special thanks to the members of the Board of Directors and Commissions. The outgoing officers have given outstanding leadership and with Kenneth Register, our president, have been a joy to work with. We are all indebted to Ken for the experience, wisdom and compassion that he brings to every aspect of our ministry. Now I look forward to the new leadership and our journey of faith. I am excited about the future and the God who holds it and each one of us.

ANNUAL REPORT ENC CHURCH WOMEN

The ENC Church Women began their 1992-93 program year with Fall Enrichment at Long's Chapel UCC in Burlington on September 26, 1992 Attendance was over 75 and an offering of \$420.00 was collected for school children in the war-torn country of Angola.

In October, several ENC-CW officers attended a leadership training event at the Betsy-Jeff Penn 4-H Center in Reidsville. Emma Dorsett, our ENC-CW secretary at the time

gave an interesting report on her experiences at the Women's Biennial Assembly in Cleveland. I did a segment on peacemaking.

The Church Women of Southern Conference Expanded Board met at Hillsborough UCC in March, and all of us were pleased to meet in this beautiful location. Rev. Kaye Crawford, pastor of the church, told us some of its history and its plans for the future.

Women's Summer Conference was held in June at Catawba College, and ENC-CW was especially proud of its first vice-president, Pat McGhee, who presented an inspiring "morning watch" devotional for the group. During this meeting I did an overview of the new program materials published by the Coordinating Center for Women. The packet "Living Waters," differs from what we've had in the past, but we like what we've seen thus far.

The Triangle District in ENC-CW held a district meeting on August 8 at Hillsborough UCC. The group was rather small but accomplished much. Thanks to District Representative Rebecca Young for organizing this event.

We began our 1993-94 program year with Fall Enrichment on Saturday, September 25. The location was First UCC in Cary, and the keynote speaker was Rev. Yvonne Beasley, who had recently returned from visiting women in South Africa. We focused onto projects this year — an offering for the N.C. Caring Program for Children and a collection of beginner reading books for N.C.'s Even Start Literacy Program.

Five women from ENC attended the Southeast Regional Meeting for UCC women. It was held October 8-10 in Biloxi, Mississippi. The theme was "Bones of Faith," and the keynote speaker was Rev. Joyce Myers-Brown. While in Biloxi, we had an opportunity to visit the Back Bay Mission.

I mailed two newsletters in 1993 - one in the Spring, before Summer Conference, and one in late summer, before Fall Enrichment. Some of these letters were returned because the addresses are no longer correct. Please make sure that the conference office has an updated list of all your church officers, including your women's contact. That list should also contain accurate home addresses and, if possible, telephone numbers.

Thank you for your support of the ENC Church Women in 1992-93. I hope we all work together for an even better year in 93-94. Blessings to each of you.

The Nominating Committee Report was given by Faye Humphrey. Three officers were nominated: President, Susie Keele; First vice-president, Cynthia Buckwell; and Secretary, Ginny Bunn (second term). The report was approved, and these women were elected by acclamation.

President Humphrey referred to her report in the Yearbook. Faye has served us faithfully as President of CWSC for four years and was presented a Life Membership and a beautiful bell by Susie Keele and Carol Diehl. Following this, Faye installed the officers in a beautiful ceremony which was taken from the Program Resources packet.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
