The purpose of the Episcopal Churchwomen of St. Philip's Parish, as stated in our By-laws, is to share more fully in the mission of the whole Church through worship, study, fellowship, stewardship and service.

Every woman parishioner of St. Philip's is automatically a member of the Episcopal Churchwomen organization. Several chapters, which meet monthly, are composed of smaller groups within the organization through which a woman can fulfill her personal commitment to the mission of the Church --

Through worship - monthly devotionals at the chapter meetings, plus a weekday service in the Church, and special retreats.

Through study - the educational program of the chapters is varied from year to year, ranging from Bible study to current issues.

Through fellowship - the chapter meetings provide a time for friendship, plus the social coffee hours after Sunday services, and other special dinners, etc., throughout the year.

Through stewardship - the women of St. Philip's help in maintaining the whole Church, financially and physically, and in addition have special programs of their own of stewardship to all God's people.

Through service - there is an infinite need for service to our parish, to the diocese, to the community, and programs are available to help us fill these needs.

All of these, and more, are part of the life and commitment of the churchwomen of St. Philip's.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

1985-86 will be a year of fellowship for the Episcopal Churchwomen. With the opening of the Urban Ministries Center, we will be reacquainting ourselves with, as well as helping to renovate, the Parish House, while simultaneously making a commitment to the parking lot in the Urban Ministries Center.

In our chapters, we will study the first half of the Book of Genesis. This choice is in response to the expressed need for meaningful Bible study among the churchwomen. We'll be using a provocative and interesting series of lessons which is being loaned to us by the Duke Divinity School.

The traditional St. Philip's Bazaar will be on Saturday this year. We hope to keep the aspects which have made our bazaar unique while adding new features which will give it a broader appeal.

Throughout the fall, we will reconsider our service projects, both the budget items and such areas of service as material aid and the collection of periodicals. We need to decide how our energies and talents can be channeled most effectively. Our annual meeting will address the question of how our funds can be best spent.

Again, 1985-86 will be a year of fellowship, of rattling around in our new surroundings, and of re-defining our parish life.

BY - LAWS

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be The Episcopal Churchwomen of St. Philip's Parish, a branch of the Episcopal Churchwomen of the Diocese of North Carolina.

ARTICLE 2 - PURPOSE

The purpose of this organization shall be to enable the Episcopal Churchwomen of St. Philip's Parish through worship, study, fellowship, stewardship, and service - to share more fully in the mission of the whole Church.

ARTICLE 3 - MEMBERSHIP AND DUES

Section 1. The membership of this organization shall be composed of all the wome of St. Philip's Parish.

Section 2. The amount of annual pledges for individual members shall be voluntary.

ARTICLE 4 - OFFICERS AND ELECTION

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall be: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Secretary of Devotional Life, Secretary of Christian Education, Secretary of Christian Social Ministries, Secretary of Missions, Secretary of Material Aid, Chairman of St. Margaret's Guild, and United Thank Offering Custodian.

Section 2. A Vice President shall be elected in the even years for a term of two years and automatically become President at the end of her term for two years. All other officers shall be elected for a term

of two years and no officer shall serve more than two terms in succession. The President may not succeed herself. The following officers shall be elected in the even years: Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary of Secretary of Christian Education, Secretary of Missions, and Chairman of St. Margaret's Guild. The following officers shall be elected in the odd years: Secretary, Secretary of Devotional Life, Secretary of Christian Social Ministries, Secretary of Material Aid, and United Thank Offering Custodian.

Section 3. Nominations for officers shall be made by a nominating committee of not less than three nor more than five, appointed by the President. At least one member other than the President should sit on the Executive Board. The committee may ask for suggested candidates from the rector or any other member. The permission of the candidate to be placed on the slate must be secured.

The Nominating Committee shall present at the annual meeting one candidate for each office to be filled. Additional candidates may be nominated from the floor with the consent of the nominee. Voting may be by ballot or acclamation, and the majority of those present shall rule.

In addition, the Nominating Committee shall be responsible for securing a Bazaar Committee Chairman and Pansy Sale Chairman. The committee shall assist the President in choosing delegates to the Diocesan Annual Meeting and delegates to conferences.

Section 4. A vacancy occurring in office shall be filled by the Executive Board or the President, except that if the office of President should become vacant, the Vice-President shall succeed her immediately to serve the remainder of the current

term and to succeed to her own term of two years without regard to the limitation in Article 4, Section 2.

ARTICLE 5 - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall have general oversight of all work and shall appoint a Year Book Editor and all committees unless otherwise provided for. She shall appoint Delegates to the Diocesan annual meeting and delegates to conferences with the assistance of the Nominating committee. She shall be a member ex officio of committees and all chapters. She shall represent the Episcopal Churchwomen to St. Philip's vestry or shall appoint a representative to represent them. She shall call all meetings of the Executive Board. There shall be not less than three meetings a year. The President shall call a meeting of the Executive Board and all committee chairmen in order to plan the work for the coming year as soon after her installation as feasible. She shall serve as delegate to the ECW Diocesan Annual meeting. She shall serve one year on the Executive Board immediately following her term of office.

Section 2. The Vice-President shall assist the President and shall perform the duties of the President in her absence. She shall attend all meetings of the Executive Board and at least one meeting of the vestry. She shall become President at the end of her term for two years.

Section 3. The Secretary shall record all proceedings of all regular meetings and executive board meetings. She shall conduct all correspondence, and shall aid the President in compiling her annual report

if called upon. She shall preserve all records of the Episcopal Churchwomen and shall record all changes in the By-laws, and shall notify Board members of Executive Board meetings.

Section 4. The Treasurer shall receive all monies except the United Thank Offering, and shall disburse the same in accordance with the adopted budget, or as directed by the Executive Board, making a report of the same to the annual Meeting. She shall submit a report or receipts and disbursements to each Executive Board meeting and to the Treasurer of each Chapter. She shall have the books professionally audited annually. She shall be Chairman of the Finance Committee. The Treasurer's report as audited shall be published in the ECW annual year-book.

Section 5. The Secretary of Devotional Life shall plan and promote the worship program of the Episcopal Churchwomen. She shall plan a worship program to be used at all meetings of Chapters during the year, at the Annual Meeting, and at all other meetings of the Episcopal Churchwomen that may be held. She shall encourage participation in Quiet Days, Diocesan Retreats, and such other worship services that may be planned by the Convocation and Diocese.

Section 6. The Secretary of Christian Education shall promote and stimulate educational work of the Episcopal Churchwomen. She shall plan a program to be used by the Episcopal Churchwomen and Chapters during the year, and shall act as advisor in all matters of Christian Education.

Section 7. The Secretary of Dhriatian Social Ministries shall cooperate with the Christian Social Ministries Department of the Convocation and Diocese in

promotion of their plans and programs. In conference with the President and Rector, she shall plan a local program in keeping with the needs of the church and community. She shall inform the Secretary of Material Aid of requests for material aid. She shall be a member of the Finance Committee.

Section 8. The Secretary of Missions shall maintain and encourage interest in our Diocesan affiliated missionaries and in our Christian mission throughout the world. She shall inform the Secretary of Material Aid of any requests she receives for Material Aid. She shall be a member of the Finance Committee.

Section 9. The Secretary of Material Aid shall plan and conduct the Spring and Fall Ingathering of used clothing and household articles. She shall consult with the Secretary of Christian Social Ministries and Missions in allocating the same. She shall handle other requests for material aid as needed.

Section 10. The custodian of the United Thank Offering shall plan for the Ingathering of the Offering in the Fall and ^Spring at the designated times. As soon as the Offering is received she shall remit it to the convocation treasurer of the United Thank Offering.

ARTICLE 6 - CHAPTERS

Section 1. The Episcopal Churchwomen shall be divided into small groups called CHAPTERS. There shall be enough chapters to make the groups small enough to work together effectively. The Chapters shall be called by the names of Saints.

Section 2. The personnel of the chapters shall be determined at the discretion of the President.

Section 3. The Chapter Chairmen shall be appointed by the President and shall serve on the Executive Board.

ARTICLE 7 - Standing Committees

The Episcopal Churchwomen shall have the following Standing Committees: Christian Ministries and College Work, Housekeeping, Special Correspondent, Periodicals, Nursery, Membership, Hospitality, Sunday Social Hour, Coupons, Nominating and Year-book Editor. Chairmen of these committees shall be appointed by the President, except as noted in Article 4, Section 3.

ARTICLE 8 - ST. MARGARET'S GUILD

The Ways and Means organization of the Episcopal Churchwomen shall be called St. Margaret's Guild, and shall be composed of the General Chairman, the Bazaar Chairman and the Chairman of Pansy Sales. They shall be responsible for all money raising projects of the Episcopal Churchwomen.

ARTICLE 9 - FINANCE COMMITTEE

The Finance Committee members are: the Treasurer (chairman), the President, Secretary of Christian Social Ministries, Secretary of Missions, the Vice-President and the Immediate Past Treasurer. They shall propose a budget for the year to be approved by the Executive Board before being presented to the membership, This budget, when approved, shall be published in the ECW annual yearbook. They shall be responsible for keeping a reserve fund equal to one year's total budget. They shall be responsible for the allocations of surplus funds. This committee may consult with the rector regarding needs in the church and the community.

ARTICLE 10 - EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1. The Executive Board shall consist of all elected officers, the chairmen of Standing Committees and Chapter Chairmen. The retiring President shall remain on the Board for one year as an ex-officio member. The Chairman of the Altar Guild shall be an ex-officio member.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the Executive Board to transact any business that may arise between the Annual meetings of the Episcopal Churchwomen, and such other business as may be delegated to it by the Episcopal Churchwomen. It shall pass on an annual budget presented by the Finance Committee and submit it to the Episcopal Churchwomen for approval and ratification.

Section 3. The Executive Board shall meet at the call of the President for not less than three meetings during the year. The President shall act as Chairman of the Executive Board and shall preside at all meetings. A simple majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE 11 - EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

There shall be an Executive Committee composed of the officers listed in Article 4, Section 1, which shall meet at the call of the President with powers assigned to it by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE 12 - MEETINGS

Section 1. All Chapters shall meet once a month except during the months of June, July and August.

Section 2. There shall be an Annual Meeting of the General membership during the year.

Section 3. A meeting of the Episcopal Churchwomen may be called by the President of Executive Board as the need arises.

ARTICLE 13 - AMENDMENTS

The By-laws may be amended by Annual Meeting or a called meeting of the ECW or Chapter meetings, provided the proposed amendment has been previously made available to the membership and a written copy filed with the Secretary.

ARTICLE 14 - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Robert's Rules of Order shall be a guide to the Parliamentary Procedure of this organization. A Parliamentarian may be appointed by the President if advisable.

THE PARISH BANNER

The first parish in Durham was founded in 1880 by Bishop Cheshire who was in deacon's orders at the time.

Bishop Cheshire's arms were three fusils on a cross bar. Upon these arms are imposed the symbols of the patron, St. Philip, Deacon, who is known chiefly for baptising the Ethiopian eunuch. His symbols are the DALMATIC, the vestment peculiar to a deacon, and the SHELL, symbol of baptism.

Philip the Deacon is known also as Philip the Evangelist to distinguish him from Philip the Apostle who was one of the Twelve. This Philip was one of seven deacons whose appointment is recorded in Acts 6. Concerned to proclaim the Gospel to the Gentiles, he was successful in winning over the Samaritans from belief in the sorceries of Simon Magus to Christianity (Acts 8:9-13). After the conversion and baptism of the Ethiopian eunuch (Acts 8:26-39) Philip went on a missionary tour from Ashdod northwards. He settled at Caesarea, with his four daughters who were noted for prophetic powers, and there he gave hospitality to St. Paul (Acts 21:8). Uncertainty shrouds the latter years of Philip. One tradition makes him Bishop of Tralles, in Lydia.
