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James Floyd Jordan

The 1981 Annual of Brushy Mountain Baptist Association is dedicated jointly to the Reverend N. C. Teague and to the loving memory of Brother James Floyd Jordan. The 1964 Annual of the Association was dedicated to Brother Jordan and contains a biographical sketch covering the first seventy-three years of his life.

Brother J. F. Jordan was called home to be with his Lord on April 30, 1981 — twenty four days short of his ninetieth birthday. He remained active, alert, interested, and involved in the life of his community, church, and of Brushy Mountain Baptist Association right up to the final moments of his earthly life. His service to the Association included sixteen years as clerk, two years as Associational Sunday School Superintendent, twenty-three years as historian, and twenty-six years as a trustee of the Association. He had been instrumental in organizing churches and in bringing them into cooperative relationship with the Association. His leadership was instrumental in securing the Associational Director of Missions' residence and the Associational office building.

The daily walk of Brother J. F. Jordan with the Lord, his keen interest in the spiritual life of Wilkes County, and his service to the churches of Brushy Mountain Baptist Association are a legacy beyond price. We commemorate his home-going with thanksgiving for his stature as a Christian gentleman and as a dedicated and useful Baptist layman.

The 1981 Annual of the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association is dedicated jointly to two very dear persons. The Reverend N. C. Teague is one of those. The 1969 Annual of this Association was dedicated to Brother Teague and contains an accurate and fairly extensive biographical sketch of his life and ministry. We attempt only to update that information.

On January 6, 1977 Brother Teague's life-long help-mate, Mrs. Mozelle Teague passed to her reward. She brought to their combined ministry effort missionary training received at Carver School of Missions, now integrated into Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. She served alongside Brother Teague, doing noble work in Sunday School and WMU programming.

N. C. Teague at age 82 has been 57 years in the gospel ministry — 41 as pastor and 16 as interim and supply pastor. He has served 13 churches in an interim capacity since his retirement August 1, 1965. For fifteen years he has served as a Director on the Wilkes Senior Citizens Council and was a member of the Wilkes Community College task force which developed Mulberry Senior Citizens Center. He continues to be an active member of the Wilkes Senior Citizen Club and of Moravian Falls Good Neighbor Club.

The ministry and life of this noble man of God has touched the lives of a host of people in Northwestern North Carolina. This area of our state is a better place because of his ministry.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE

We, the Baptist Churches of the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association, unite according to the plan and for the purpose and work of New Testament churches in our world, and to this end to cooperate to the fullest extent possible with the State and Southern Baptist Convention, according to the following articles:

ARTICLE I—NAME

This body shall be known as the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association of North Carolina.

ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

It shall be the purpose of this association to consider and promote measures for increasing the harmony, the knowledge and the spiritual life of the churches and for developing and directing their energies and their contributions in the advancement of Christ's kingdom throughout the earth, always in harmony with the teachings of the New Testament. This association shall be an auxiliary to the North Carolina Baptist State Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention in all their missionary, educational and benevolent work.

It shall be the purpose of the Association (1) to provide the mutual encouragement and fellowship of member churches through the definition and practice of Baptist distinctives (2) to consistently seek to confront everyone in our area with the claims of Christ on his/her life; (3) to encourage and facilitate church growth and development; (4) to promote participation in

missions and ministries on the foreign field, in the homeland, in the state, and in the area of the association; (5) to provide services to the churches as needed and desired; (6) to provide an additional channel by which member churches may participate in the Southern Baptist Convention.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1. The association shall be composed of cooperating Baptist churches desiring to affiliate with it. Any church desiring to become a member of the association shall present through messengers chosen for that purpose, its request for membership on APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP provided in the minutes along with a UNIFORM ASSOCIATIONAL LETTER provided by the clerk at any annual session of the body. The Moderator shall refer the church to the Committee on Membership for study and investigation. The church maintains for the year the status of associate membership until the committee makes its recommendation. If favorable, it will be received into full membership with all the rights and privileges at the next annual session. If the association then votes to receive the church, the moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the messengers.

SECTION 2. The Association shall be sole judge of its membership and may receive churches, or reject churches, according to its Constitution and Bylaws. Member churches may withdraw from the Association as they desire. Any church in the Association which fails to cooperate with the Association shall be contacted by a committee appointed by the Coordinating Council of the Association to determine the intentions of the church regarding its remaining in the Association.

A cooperating church shall be defined as one which sends an annual report to the Association and messengers to Associational meetings, and contributes to the financial program of the Association.

SECTION 3. The Association shall withdraw fellowship from any church in its membership which shall be found to be disorderly in faith and practice, but not until written charges are brought against it, which charges shall have been authorized by the official act of the church offering the same. Thereafter, any such charges shall be carefully considered by the Association.

ARTICLE IV—MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The Association shall meet quarterly on the Monday after the first Sunday in January, April, and July. In October the Association shall meet on Monday and Tuesday after the first Sunday.

SECTION 2. Special meetings may be called by the Moderator provided two weeks notice is given to the member churches.

SECTION 3. In case of emergency, the Coordinating Council shall have the authority to change the time and/or place of meetings, and shall be responsible for providing churches with sufficient notice of change.

SECTION 4. Each church is entitled to 10 messengers. Churches with more than 500 members are entitled to an additional messenger for each 100 members more than the initial 500. Messengers shall be elected annually for

all Associational meetings. It is suggested that at least 5 of the messengers be leaders of individual church organizations.

ARTICLE V—AUTHORITY

While independent and sovereign in its own sphere, the Association does not claim, and will never attempt to exercise any authority over any other Baptist body, whether church or auxiliary organization.

ARTICLE VI—OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTION

SECTION 1. The officers of the Association shall be Moderator, Vice Moderator I, Vice Moderator II, Vice Moderator III, Vice Moderator IV, Clerk, Treasurer, Music Director, Auditor, Historian, Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, Woman's Missionary Union Director, and Brotherhood Director.

SECTION 2. The officers of the Association shall be elected at the April meeting of the Association for a term of one year. Officers shall be contacted and nominated by the Committee on Nominations (Bylaw IV, Section 7).

SECTION 3. Officers shall assume their duties at the close of the April meeting and serve until the next April meeting, or until their successors are elected.

SECTION 4. Any person having served two terms as Moderator shall be ineligible for re-election for a period of two years.

ARTICLE VII—TRUSTEES AND THEIR ELECTION

There shall be three Trustees of the Association, one of whom should be an attorney. Trustees shall be elected for an indefinite term and shall serve at the pleasure of the Association.

ARTICLE VIII—THE COORDINATING COUNCIL

The Coordinating Council shall be composed of the Moderator, the four Vice Moderators, and the Director of Missions. The Coordinating Council shall be responsible for coordinating and directing all the work of the Association, including Long Range Planning. It shall meet monthly and, when appropriate, make reports and recommendations to the Association at scheduled meetings. The Director of Missions shall serve as Chairman of the Coordinating Council.

ARTICLE IX—COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. The Association shall have the following standing Committees, with terms of office being from the close of the April meeting through the following April meeting:

- A. To be nominated by the Committee on Committees and elected at the April meeting:

1. Committee on Personnel (Bylaw IV, Section 1)
2. Committee on Missions (Bylaw IV, Section 2)
3. Committee on Evangelism (Bylaw IV, Section 3)
4. Committee on Finance (Bylaw IV, Section 4)
5. Committee on Ordinations (Bylaw IV, Section 5)
6. Committee on Memorials (Bylaw IV, Section 6)
7. Committee on Nominations (Bylaw IV, Section 7)
8. Committee on Constitution (Bylaw IV, Section 8)
9. Committee on Membership (Bylaw IV, Section 9)
10. Committee on Properties (Bylaw IV, Section 14)
11. Committee on Calendar (Bylaw IV, Section 15)

B. To be appointed by the Moderator at the April meeting:

1. Committee on Committees (Bylaw IV, Section 10)
2. Committee on Enrollment (Bylaw IV, Section 13)

SECTION 2. The following committees shall be appointed by the Moderator at least 30 days prior to the October meeting to serve during the October meeting:

1. Committee on Place and Preacher (Bylaws IV, Section 11)
2. Committee on Resolutions (Bylaw IV, Section 12)

ARTICLE X—GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 1. The employment of a Director of Missions shall follow the procedure outlined in Bylaw VI, Section 1, with the understanding that said person be extended an indefinite call and that a period of 30 days notice be given by either the missionary or the association in the event of termination of such employment.

SECTION 2. The Director of Missions, shall be empowered to procure and supervise necessary secretarial and janitorial personnel for the proper operation and maintenance of the associational office, provided that funds for the hiring and salary of such personnel have been included within the current year's budget.

SECTION 3. All questions of order not herein provided for shall be decided according to ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER, Revised.

SECTION 4. Amendments to this Constitution may be made at any annual session upon vote of two-thirds of the members present, provided that such amendments be presented on the first day of the annual session and voted upon the second day.

SECTION 5. ROTATING OF COMMITTEES. One-third of each committee shall be elected to serve a period of three years. Committees or parts of committees, composed of organizational heads shall not be subject to rotation. No member shall succeed himself. Vacancies occurring during the year may be filled immediately by the Coordinating Council.

SECTION 6. SPECIAL ADVISORS. The Moderator and Director of Missions will serve on all committees of the association as special advisors.

BYLAWS

BYLAW I GENERAL

SECTION 1. The association shall convene as provided by the constitution (Article IV, Section 1).

SECTION 2. Each session of the association shall be opened with religious exercise.

SECTION 3. A majority of the members present shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business except the matter of making changes in the Constitution.

SECTION 4. Any member wishing to speak shall rise and address the Moderator, shall confine himself strictly to the question under consideration, and avoid the use of unnecessary personalities.

SECTION 5. The members shall observe toward the officers and towards one another such courtesies as are becoming to Christians.

SECTION 6. The annual associational year, for the purpose of reporting statistical information shall be September 1 to August 31, inclusive.

BYLAW II ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

The organizational structure of the Association shall be divided into five Task Groups. Each Task Group shall meet quarterly and make reports to the Coordinating Council as needed.

SECTION 1. Task Group I, "Associational Administration," shall be composed of the Moderator, Clerk, Trustees, Treasurer, and Committees on Personnel, Finance, and Properties. Task Group I shall oversee all administrative functions of the Association, including employing and/or discharging staff personnel, budget planning, and use and maintenance of Associational property and equipment.

SECTION 2. Task Group II, "Fellowship and Mutual Care," shall be composed of Vice Moderator I, Committees on Membership, Ordination, and Memorials, the President of the Pastor's Conference of the Association, and the General Board Representative. Task Group II shall seek to enrich fellowship within and between churches in the Association and it shall be responsible for planning the January meeting of the Association.

SECTION 3. Task Group III, "Evangelism and Outreach," shall be composed of Vice Moderator II, and the Evangelism Committee. It shall be responsible for planning and promoting evangelism and outreach. It shall also plan the April meeting of the Association.

SECTION 4. Task Group IV, "Church Growth and Training," shall be composed of Vice Moderator III, Associational Directors of Music, Sunday School, Church Training, Brotherhood, and Woman's Missionary Union. It shall be the responsibility of Task Group IV to coordinate leadership training and to encourage church growth. It shall also be responsible for planning the annual calendar and the July meeting of the Association.

SECTION 5. Task Group V, "Associational Ministries," shall be composed of Vice Moderator IV, and the Committee on Missions. It shall seek to dis-

cover, implement, and maintain Associational ministries. It shall also be responsible for planning the October meeting of the Association, including the preparation of a printed program which shall be sent to all persons on the program and to all pastors at least 30 days prior to the October meeting. It shall, in the opening session of the October meeting of the Association, present the printed program for adoption.

BYLAW III DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. Moderator

The Moderator shall preside during meetings of the Association according to the Constitution and Bylaws, serve on the Coordinating Council as Moderator of Task Group I, appoint Committee on Committees, Place and Preachers, Resolutions, and Enrollment. The Moderator shall serve also as Ex-Officio member of all other committees.

SECTION 2. Vice Moderator I

Vice Moderator I shall preside in the absence, or at the pleasure, of the Moderator. In addition, Vice Moderator I shall serve on the Coordinating Council as Moderator of Task Group II.

SECTION 3. Vice Moderator II

Vice Moderator II shall serve on the Coordinating Council as Moderator of Task Group III.

SECTION 4. Vice Moderator III

Vice Moderator III shall serve on the Coordinating Council as Moderator of Task Group IV.

SECTION 5. Vice Moderator IV

Vice Moderator IV shall serve on the Coordinating Council as Moderator of Task Group V.

SECTION 6. Clerk

The Clerk shall provide annual report forms at least 30 days before the October meeting, distribute at the October meeting copies of a digest of these reports, make an accurate record of the proceedings of the Association, supervise the printing and distribution of minutes, records, and other documents of the Association, and serve also as secretary of the Coordinating Council.

SECTION 7. Treasurer

The Treasurer shall receive and bank all funds of the Association in the name of the Association; disburse the same upon instructions from the Association, its Coordinating Council, or as designated in the budget; render an accurate report of receipts and disbursements and distribute same at the October meeting; give an oral report at each quarterly meeting; and keep books available and up to date for examination.

The Treasurer shall serve as a member of the Committees on Finance and Missions.

The Chairman of the Committee on Finance shall have the authority to act for the Treasurer in the event the Treasurer is incapacitated.

SECTION 8. Music Director

The Music Director shall be in charge of the music program of the Association during and between Associational meetings.

SECTION 9. Auditor

The Auditor shall, at the close of the fiscal year, make an audit of the Treasurer's records.

SECTION 10. Historian

The Historian, in his sole discretion, shall collect facts of interest to the Association and the cooperating churches, and shall make a report to each annual session of the association.

SECTION 11. Organizational Directors

Associational Directors of the Sunday School, Church Training, Brotherhood, and Woman's Missionary Union shall be in charge of their respective organizations during their tenure of service.

BYLAW IV DUTIES OF COMMITTEES**SECTION 1. Committee on Personnel**

The Committee on Personnel shall be composed of six members, each of whom will serve a tenure of three years, with two members rotating off the Committee each year. The Committee will prepare and update, as necessary, position descriptions of all Associational staff personnel, excluding the Director of Missions whose responsibilities are described in Bylaw VI. It shall survey the need for additional staff positions; recruit, interview, and recommend to the Association or its Coordinating Council new employed personnel; and, when necessary, recommend to the Coordinating Council the termination of employment of staff personnel. The Committee shall review annually salaries and benefits, and make recommendations to the Finance Committee. It shall review at least annually the performance of each employee, receive any grievance, and otherwise seek to promote harmonious relationships between all employees of the Association.

SECTION 2. Committee on Missions

(1) The Committee on Missions shall be composed of one representative each from Associational Brotherhood, Woman's Missionary Union, the Treasurer, the Director of each Associational ministry, and three additional members elected by the Association to serve three years on a rotating basis. It shall work with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of the Association, and lead and assist in organizing new churches and in beginning new mission stations.

(2) Upon request, the Committee on Missions shall advise any group seeking to organize a new church. The Committee will be available to any church desiring assistance with problems.

(3) When without a Director of Missions this Committee shall seek out and recommend to the Association or its Coordinating Council for election a new Director of Missions according to Bylaw VI, Section 1.

SECTION 3. Committee on Evangelism

The Committee on Evangelism, composed of three members, shall promote the work of Evangelism within the Association in cooperation with the State Department of Evangelism. All plans and programs shall be subject to approval by the Association or its Coordinating Council. The Evangelism Committee shall be chaired by the Director of Evangelism who will also serve as Vice-Moderator III.

SECTION 4. Committee on Finance

A. The Committee on Finance, composed of six members and the Treasurer, shall study the Association's financial needs for an adequate program, prepare and present a budget to the Association for the following year, devise and develop plans for securing the cooperation of churches in providing funds to meet the budget, and make a written report at the October meeting.

B. In the event it becomes necessary to borrow funds for current operating expenses of the Association, the Committee on Finance is authorized to instruct the Trustees to secure by loan an amount not to exceed 10% of the annual budget for a period not to exceed 90 days, and to renew the loan as needed.

SECTION 5. Committee on Ordinations

The Committee on Ordinations, composed of seven ministers, shall, when requested by a member church, assist with the examination and ordination of candidates for the Gospel Ministry. Churches wishing to ordain ministers are requested to place their candidates before the committee at least thirty days prior to the date set for ordination for examination on the following principles:

- a. Christian experience or conversion
- b. Call to the ministry
- c. Attitude toward denominational work and objects
- d. Support of denominational causes
- e. Moral and spiritual fitness
- f. Doctrinal beliefs
- g. Knowledge of the Bible

Candidates are to be ordained with the assistance of this committee only when they are serving a church or churches as pastor or having been called as pastor of a Baptist church of like faith and practice with those member churches of this association.

No candidate for ordination shall be considered by the committee who has not been a member of a cooperating church for at least one year.

Candidates are to be urged to prepare themselves for the ministry as far as possible in Baptist institutions of Higher Learning.

This committee shall not recommend any candidate for ordination whom they feel will not bring honor and esteem to the Lord, to Southern Baptists and to the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association.

Recommendations will be made by the committee to the church where the candidate holds membership. The committee will assist the church in the ordination service at a time convenient to the church and to the members of the committee if such assistance is desired.

SECTION 6. Committee on Memorials

The Committee on Memorials, composed of three members, shall bring a report at the October meeting and lead in a memorial service in memory of those reported by the churches as deceased since the last annual meeting.

SECTION 7. Committee on Nominations

The Committee on Nominations, composed of seven members, shall contact and nominate at the April meeting of the Association the officers and

trustees of the Association according to Article VI and VII of the Constitution.

SECTION 8. Committee on Constitution

The Committee on Constitution, composed of five members, shall be available to study any changes or revisions in the Constitution, and to make recommendations as needed to keep the Constitution in line with the policies and programs of the Association.

SECTION 9. Committee on Membership

The Committee on Membership, composed of five members, shall perform the duties as set forth in the Constitution, Article III.

SECTION 10. Committee on Committees

The Committee on Committees, composed of seven members, shall be appointed as set forth in the Constitution (Article IX, Section 1), and shall nominate persons to be elected by the Association to serve on all standing Committees.

SECTION 11. Committee on Place and Preachers

The Committee on Place and Preachers, composed of three members, shall receive or solicit invitations for the place or places for meetings of the Association, and shall recommend the places. It shall also recommend the Preachers and alternates for the annual sermons.

SECTION 12. Committee on Resolutions

The Committee on Resolutions, composed of three members, shall draw up and present to the Association at the October meeting resolutions of appreciation and any other resolutions it may deem expedient.

SECTION 13. Committee on Enrollment

The Committee on Enrollment, composed of five members, shall prepare for and direct the enrollment of messengers at all sessions of Associational meetings. Each messenger shall be enrolled only once during the October meeting. This Committee shall be prepared to report on enrollment when called for during meetings.

SECTION 14. Properties Committee

The Properties Committee, composed of three members, shall be responsible for the maintenance of all properties owned or leased by the Association or its Trustees.

SECTION 15. The Calendar Committee

The Calendar Committee shall be composed of the following Associational officers: Director of Missions, Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, W.M.U. Director, Brotherhood Director, Director of Music Ministry, and president of the Ministers Conference. This committee shall prepare an associational calendar for the year, and present same to the annual meeting, for adoption. This calendar shall be included in the annual.

BYLAW V TRUSTEES

The legal title to all real and personal property of the Association shall be vested in the trustees and their successors in such office. The said trustees may convey said property legal instruments pursuant to resolutions adopted and approved by the Association or its Coordinating Council. They shall han-

handle all legal matters of the Association under the direction of the said Association or its Coordinating Council. See Article VII of the Constitution.

BYLAW VI DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS

SECTION 1. The Director of Missions shall be elected upon a recommendation of the Committee on Missions, and by vote of the Association at a regularly scheduled meeting. The relationship between the Association and its Director of Missions may be terminated following a reasonable notice given by either party.

SECTION 2. The Director of Missions shall promote the work and witness of the Association and Denomination, cooperating with the churches, their pastors and officers, and Associational committees and organizations.

A. He shall be responsible for planning, promoting, and executing the ministry of the Association in cooperation with the Coordinating Council and the Committee on Missions.

B. He shall serve as Chairman of the Coordinating Council, and make an annual report to the Association at the October meeting.

C. He shall be an ex-officio member of all committees of the Association, serving in an advisory and/or resource capacity.

D. He shall seek to visit each church in the Association in order to:

- (1) Enrich Christian fellowship among the churches.
- (2) Encourage and strengthen the ministry of the churches.
- (3) Enhance the cooperative relationship between the churches and the Association.

E. He shall, when necessary, conduct surveys or inquiries in order to determine specific needs for ministry within the area of the Association.

F. He shall, upon request, provide a list of qualified persons who may be considered by churches seeking pastors.

G. He shall have full administrative responsibility for all personnel employed by the Association.

SECTION 3.

A. The Director of Missions is entitled to two weeks vacation annually. Upon completion of five years service, the Director of Missions shall be entitled to three weeks annual vacation. Vacation is to be taken within the calendar year, and it is not accumulative.

B. The Director of Missions is entitled to 30 days sick leave per calendar year, sick leave is not to be taken as vacation, and it is not accumulative.

C. The Director of Missions is entitled to four weeks per calendar year which he may use at his discretion for personal enrichment, professional development, and speaking engagements or revivals outside the Association. This time is not accumulative.

SECTION 4. Should there occur at any time a grievance on the part of the Association or the Director of Missions, either party may consult with the Moderator and Chairmen of the Missions and Personnel Committees.

BYLAW VII ANNUAL REPORTS

Persons who are to bring reports to the October meeting of the Association shall present the same to the Director of Missions or Clerk two weeks prior

to the October meeting in order for these to be included in the Book of Reports.

BYLAW VIII AMENDMENTS

Amendments to the Bylaws may be made at any session of the October meeting of the Association when presented in writing and approved by a majority of the messengers present and voting.

PROCEEDINGS

of the One Hundred Tenth Annual Meeting

1. The 110th annual meeting of the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association was called to order by the moderator, Rev. Rex Shumate, at 4 p.m. on October 5, 1981 at Pilgrim Baptist Church.

2. Associational Music Director Craig Little led the congregation in singing "When We All Get To Heaven" with Mrs. Pat Faw at the piano and Mrs. Gwen Stinson at the organ.

6. The moderator appointed the Nominating Committee for 1982-83 as follows: Paul Holbrook, chairman, Ray Wellborn, and Tam Hutchinson, Jr. Mr. Shumate also appointed the Committee on Committees to be made up of Larry Farthing, chairman; Mrs. Elizabeth Billings; L. Clate Miller; Mrs. Carol Brown; Wayne Greer; Jeff Walsh; and Eddie Minton.

7. The Constitution Committee Report was presented by Chairman Larry Michael and accepted as printed on page 18 BOR. He recommended the adoption of the proposed new constitution and bylaws a copy of which was given to each person present. The Director of Missions, with the use of overhead transparencies, explained various aspects of the proposed new organizational structure. A vote on the adoption of the new constitution and bylaws will be taken during the second day session on Tuesday.

8. The history of Pilgrim Church from 1963-1981 (page 3 BOR) was given by Associational Historian Madge Sturdivant.

9. Historical events in the churches (page 5 BOR) was read by Associational Clerk Norma Jean Wood.

10. The Evangelism Report (page 17 BOR) was given by Rev. Bob Wilson for Rev. I. V. Couch who is ill. He reported that average attendance for the Wilkes Evangelism Crusade August 9-15 was 4,000 each night and 120 decisions were reported. Mr. Wilson also called attention to the "Here's Hope" project with simultaneous revivals planned for 1982.

12. Rev. Paul Shoupe gave the School of Christian Studies Report (page 19 BOR) and announced a Seminary Extension Course "Great Doctrines of the Bible" to be offered beginning October 6.

Area Missionary Jim Lambert expressed appreciation for what the association and Mr. Shoupe is doing in Seminary Extension work.

13. Special music was presented by an ensemble made up of members of various churches under the direction of Craig Little. They sang "God is Worthy" and "Go in My Father's Name" accompanied by Vernon Mitchell at the piano and Mrs. Gwen Stinson at the organ.

14. Rev. William Pardue, pastor of Roaring River Church, brought a message from II Timothy concerning getting "Back to the Basics" of New Testament Christianity.

15. The meeting was adjourned for the evening meal.

16. The session was reconvened with a congregational hymn "Standing on the Promises."

17. Pilgrim Church Pastor Rex Eldreth expressed greetings to the messengers.

18. Devotions were given by Rev. James Weaver, pastor of Gordon Baptist Church.

19. The following pastors who had come into the association during the past year were introduced: Rev. James Weaver, Rev. and Mrs. Elliott Hayes, Interim Pastor Richard Kirk, Rev. John Miller, Rev. and Mrs. Jack Rose, Rev. Leon Church, Rev. Charles Edwards and Rev. Billy Felts. Not present was Rev. Hobert Key.

20. The moderator presented to Dr. and Mrs. Bill McKinney a plaque and a cash gift of \$1338.18 from the churches in appreciation for his five years as Director of Missions in the Brushy Mountain Association.

Mr. Shumate also presented a gift of a component stereo set from some of the pastors to Mrs. Norma Jean Wood, associational office secretary/clerk/treasurer for six years.

21. The treasurer's report was given by Norma Jean Wood and adopted as printed on page 12, BOR.

22. Manson Alley gave the Finance Committee Report. The budget for 1981-82 was adopted as printed on page 13 BOR.

23. A video tape was shown with information on activities of North Carolina Missions.

24. The Sunday School Report (page 14 BOR) was given by Rev. Philip Stone. He called attention to a worker training clinic on October 13-14 and presented certificates to Gordon Baptist Church for the highest enrollment growth and Moravian Falls Church for the highest average attendance increase during the past year.

25. Mrs. Linda Church gave the Church Training Report (page 15 BOR) and announced a workshop for Church Training leaders on November 9. She also presented certificates for outstanding Church Training work to Wilkesboro and New Hope Baptist Churches.

26. The Brotherhood Report (page 15 BOR) was given by Max Freeman. He presented certificates to Charlie Cain from Cub Creek Church, Larry Prevette from Roaring River Church, and Bill Brady from Wilkesboro Church from outstanding Brotherhood work.

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

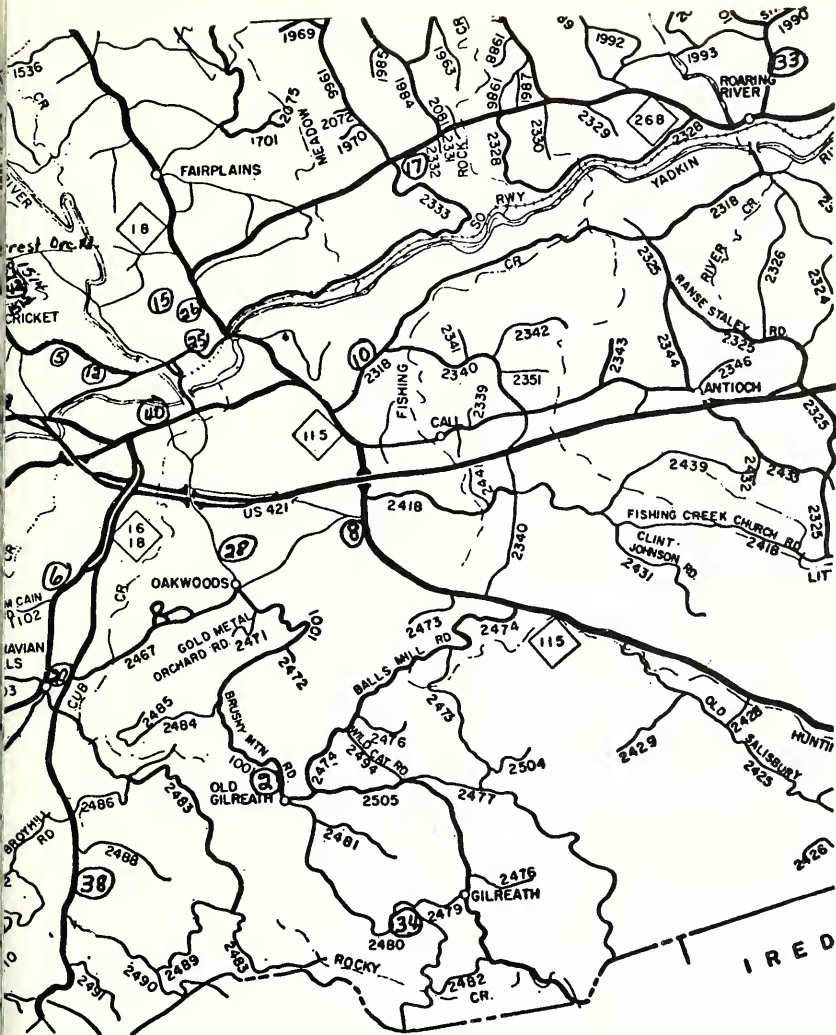
The Resolutions Committee did not receive any resolutions for consideration from the Association or member churches. Therefore, be it resolved:

STEWARDSHIP REPORT

Stewardship has received a new motivation since 1976-77 when the BOLD MISSION THRUST was introduced. Many churches and associations have committed themselves to making it a reality. Change of lifestyle to fit into an expanded program has gripped the lives of many individuals. The figures in COOPERATIVE PROGRAM increase tell the story.

What specific action are we taking as an association, and what are we willing to undertake?

During the past year total receipts of the 41 churches in Brushy Mountain Association were \$1,855,499. These churches gave \$126,395 to the Cooperative Program and \$37,651 to Associational Missions. The total mission giving was \$285,583.

We are in process of organizing associational functions to do a more effective job of associational ministries and missions. To meet these challenges each church must develop its own Christian Stewards. The Stewardship Commission of the Southern Baptist Convention provides leadership and practical aids for this development. The theme this year is "Witness to the World Through My Church."

We recommend that every church:

1. Give something through the Cooperative Program for Bold Mission Thrust support.
2. Increase the percentage of its total budget income given through the Cooperative Program.
3. Increase the percentage of total budget income for the support of associational missions.

Do we have the will and commitment and persistence to follow through on what Southern Baptists have challenged us with? It's all in the Great Commission! This is the day for action.

SCHOOL OF CHRISTIAN STUDIES REPORT

During the past year more than 10,000 persons enrolled in one or more Seminary Extension programs throughout the United States. This surpassed the enrollment of all six Southern Baptist seminaries. In North Carolina, the enrollment was 2,300. These people studied primarily in 75 centers throughout the state. Some of them enrolled in the Independent Study Institute. They enjoyed selecting courses in the Basic Curriculum Series and the College-Level Curriculum.

As a part of our state missions program, North Carolina Baptists help underwrite the cost of study with Seminary Extension through the Cooperative Program budget. This subsidy helps keep the cost per course within a range

every student can afford. It also helps to explain why our state has enjoyed the largest Seminary Extension program in the United States for the seventh consecutive year.

Last year General Baptists accounted for 1,026 registrations in Seminary Extension. Also, classes are held for prison inmates in Woman's Prison, Raleigh, Columbus County, Buncombe County, and Orange County. Plans are almost complete for a class in Central Prison, Raleigh. During the two years this program has existed inmates have registered in 50 courses through the Independent Study Institute. Students have enrolled in 12 prisons.

In our Association *Old Testament Survey I* was offered last fall with seven enrolled.

Our School of Christian Studies will offer **GREAT DOCTRINES OF THE BIBLE** this fall. This is a Basic Curriculum course requiring no exams and is offered to all age groups. Mrs. Sherry Stone will teach the Junior High through College group; Dr. Bill McKinney, all other lay-people; and Paul Shoupe, the ministers. The cost is \$10.00 and only the Study Guide will be used.

All three groups will meet at Oakwoods Church beginning Tuesday, October 6, and continuing nine consecutive Tuesday nights through December 1 at 7:00 P. M.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE

We, the Baptist Churches of the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association, unite according to the plan and for the purpose and work of New Testament churches in our world, and to this end to cooperate to the fullest extent possible with the State and Southern Baptist Convention, according to the following articles:

ARTICLE I—NAME

This body shall be known as the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association of North Carolina.

ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

It shall be the purpose of this association to consider and promote measures for increasing the harmony, the knowledge and the spiritual life of the churches and for developing and directing their energies and their contributions in the advancement of Christ's kingdom throughout the earth, always in harmony with the teachings of the New Testament. This association shall be an auxiliary to the North Carolina Baptist State Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention in all their missionary, educational and benevolent work.

It shall be the purpose of the Association (1) to provide the mutual encouragement and fellowship of member churches through the definition and practice of Baptist distinctives (2) to consistently seek to confront everyone in our area with the claims of Christ on his/her life; (3) to encourage and facilitate church growth and development; (4) to promote participation in missions and ministries on the foreign field, in the homeland, in the state, and in the area of the association; (5) to provide services to the churches as needed and desired; (6) to provide an additional channel by which member churches may participate in the Southern Baptist Convention.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1. The association shall be composed of cooperating Baptist churches desiring to affiliate with it. Any church desiring to become a member of the association shall present through messengers chosen for that purpose, its request for membership on APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP provided in the minutes along with a UNIFORM ASSOCIATIONAL LETTER provided by the clerk at any annual session of the body. The Moderator shall refer the church to the Committee on Membership for study and investigation. The church maintains for the year the status of associate membership until the committee makes its recommendation. If favorable, it will be received into full membership with all the rights and privileges at the next annual session. If the association then votes to receive the church, the moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the messengers.

SECTION 2. The Association shall be sole judge of its membership and may receive churches, or reject churches, according to its Constitution and Bylaws.

Member churches may withdraw from the Association as they desire. Any church in the Association which fails to cooperate with the Association shall be contacted by a committee appointed by the Coordinating Council of the Association to determine the intentions of the church regarding its remaining in the Association.

A cooperating church shall be defined as one which sends an annual report to the Association and messengers to Associational meetings, and contributes to the financial program of the Association.

SECTION 3. The Association shall withdraw fellowship from any church in its membership which shall be found to be disorderly in faith and practice, but not until written charges are brought against it, which charges shall have been authorized by the official act of the church offering the same. Thereafter, any such charges shall be carefully considered by the Association.

ARTICLE IV—MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The Association shall meet quarterly on the Monday after the first Sunday in January, April, and July. In October the Association shall meet on Monday and Tuesday after the first Sunday.

SECTION 2. Special meetings may be called by the Moderator provided two weeks notice is given to the member churches.

SECTION 3. In case of emergency, the Coordinating Council shall have the authority to change the time and/or place of meetings, and shall be responsible for providing churches with sufficient notice of change.

SECTION 4. Each church is entitled to 10 messengers. Churches with more than 500 members are entitled to an additional messenger for each 100 members more than the initial 500. Messengers shall be elected annually for all Associational meetings. It is suggested that at least 5 of the messengers be leaders of individual church organizations.

ARTICLE V—AUTHORITY

While independent and sovereign in its own sphere, the Association does not claim, and will never attempt to exercise any authority over any other Baptist body, whether church or auxiliary organization.

ARTICLE VI—OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTION

SECTION 1. The officers of the Association shall be Moderator, Vice Moderator I, Vice Moderator II, Vice Moderator III, Vice Moderator IV, Clerk, Treasurer, Music Director, Auditor, Historian, Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, Woman's Missionary Union Director, and Brotherhood Director.

SECTION 2. The officers of the Association shall be elected at the April meeting of the Association for a term of one year. Officers shall be contacted and nominated by the Committee on Nominations (Bylaw IV, Section 7).

SECTION 3. Officers shall assume their duties at the close of the April meeting and serve until the next April meeting, or until their successors are elected.

SECTION 4. Any person having served two terms as Moderator shall be ineligible for re-election for a period of two years.

ARTICLE VII—TRUSTEES AND THEIR ELECTION

There shall be three Trustees of the Association, one of whom should be an attorney. Trustees shall be elected for an indefinite term and shall serve at the pleasure of the Association.

ARTICLE VIII—THE COORDINATING COUNCIL

The Coordinating Council shall be composed of the Moderator, the four Vice Moderators, and the Director of Missions. The Coordinating Council shall be responsible for coordinating and directing all the work of the Association, including Long Range Planning. It shall meet monthly and, when appropriate, make reports and recommendations to the Association at scheduled meetings. The Director of Missions shall serve as Chairman of the Coordinating Council.

ARTICLE IX—COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. The Association shall have the following standing Committees with terms of office being from the close of the April meeting through the following April meeting:

- A. To be nominated by the Committee on Committees and elected at the April meeting:
 1. Committee on Personnel (Bylaw IV, Section 1)
 2. Committee on Missions (Bylaw IV, Section 2)
 3. Committee on Evangelism (Bylaw IV, Section 3)
 4. Committee on Finance (Bylaw IV, Section 4)
 5. Committee on Ordinations (Bylaw IV, Section 5)
 6. Committee on Memorials (Bylaw IV, Section 6)
 7. Committee on Nominations (Bylaw IV, Section 7)
 8. Committee on Constitution (Bylaw IV, Section 8)
 9. Committee on Membership (Bylaw IV, Section 9)
 10. Committee on Properties (Bylaw IV, Section 14)
 11. Committee on Calendar (Bylaw IV, Section 15)
- B. To be appointed by the Moderator at the April meeting:
 1. Committee on Committees (Bylaw IV, Section 10)
 2. Committee on Enrollment (Bylaw IV, Section 13)

SECTION 2. The following committees shall be appointed by the Moderator at least 30 days prior to the October meeting to serve during the October meeting:

1. Committee on Place and Preacher (Bylaws IV, Section 11)
2. Committee on Resolutions (Bylaw IV, Section 12)

ARTICLE X—GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 1. The employment of a Director of Missions shall follow the procedure outlined in Bylaw VI, Section 1, with the understanding that said person be extended an indefinite call and that a period of 30 days notice be given by either the missions or the association in the event of termination of such employment.

SECTION 2. The Director of Missions, shall be empowered to procure and supervise necessary secretarial and janitorial personnel for the proper opera-

tion and maintenance of the associational office, provided that funds for the hiring and salary of such personnel have been included within the current year's budget.

SECTION 3. All questions of order not herein provided for shall be decided according to ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER, Revised.

SECTION 4. Amendments to this Constitution may be made at any annual session upon vote of two-thirds of the members present, provided that such amendments be presented on the first day of the annual session and voted upon the second day.

SECTION 5. ROTATING OF COMMITTEES. One-third of each committee shall be elected to serve a period of three years. Committees or parts of committees, composed of organizational heads shall not be subject to rotation. No member shall succeed himself. Vacancies occurring during the year may be filled immediately by the Coordinating Council.

SECTION 6. SPECIAL ADVISORS. The Moderator and Director of Missions will serve on all committees of the association as special advisors.

BYLAWS

BYLAW I GENERAL

SECTION 1. The association shall convene as provided by the constitution (Article IV, Section I).

SECTION 2. Each session of the association shall be opened with religious exercise.

SECTION 3. A majority of the members present shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business except the matter of making changes in the Constitution.

SECTION 4. Any member wishing to speak shall rise and address the Moderator, shall confine himself strictly to the question under consideration, and avoid the use of unnecessary personalities.

SECTION 5. The members shall observe toward the officers and towards one another such courtesies as are becoming to Christians.

SECTION 6. The annual associational year, for the purpose of reporting statistical information shall be September 1 to August 31, inclusive.

BYLAW II ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

The organizational structure of the Association shall be divided into five Task Groups. Each Task Group shall meet quarterly and make reports to the Coordinating Council as needed.

SECTION 1. Task Group I, "Associational Administration," shall be composed of the Moderator, Clerk, Trustees, Treasurer, and Committees on Personnel, Finance, and Properties. Task Group I shall oversee all administrative functions of the Association, including employing and/or discharging staff personnel budget planning, and use and maintenance of Associational property and equipment.

SECTION 2. Task Group II, "Fellowship and Mutual Care," shall be composed of Vice Moderator I, Committees on Membership, Ordination, and Memorials, the President of the Pastor's Conference of the Association, and the General Board Representative. Task Group II shall seek to enrich fellowship

within and between churches in the Association and it shall be responsible for planning the January meeting of the Association.

SECTION 3. Task Group III, "Evangelism and Outreach," shall be composed of Vice Moderator II, and the Evangelism Committee. It shall be responsible for planning and promoting evangelism and outreach. It shall also plan the April meeting of the Association.

SECTION 4. Task Group IV, "Church Growth and Training," shall be composed of Vice Moderator III, Associational Directors of Music, Sunday School, Church Training, Brotherhood and Woman's Missionary Union. It shall be the responsibility of Task Group IV to coordinate leadership training and to encourage church growth. It shall also be responsible for planning and annual calendar and the July meeting of the Association.

SECTION 5. Task Group V, "Associational Ministries," shall be composed of Vice Moderator IV, and the Committee on Missions. It shall seek to discover, implement, and maintain Associational ministries. It shall also be responsible for planning the October meeting of the Association, including the preparation of a printed program which shall be sent to all persons on the program and to all pastors at least 30 days prior to the October meeting. It shall, in the opening session of the October meeting of the Association, present the printed program for adoption.

BYLAW III DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. Moderator

The Moderator shall preside during meetings of the Association according to the Constitution and Bylaws, serve on the Coordinating Council as Moderator of Task Group I, appoint Committee on Committees, Place and Preachers, Resolutions, and Enrollment. The Moderator shall serve also as Ex-Officio member of all other committees.

SECTION 2. Vice Moderator I

Vice Moderator I shall preside in the absence, or at the pleasure, of the Moderator. In addition, Vice Moderator I shall serve on the Coordinating Council as Moderator of Task Group II.

SECTION 3. Vice Moderator II

Vice Moderator II shall serve on the Coordinating Council as Moderator of Task Group III.

SECTION 4. Vice Moderator III

Vice Moderator III shall serve on the Coordinating Council as Moderator of Task Group IV.

SECTION 5. Vice Moderator IV

Vice Moderator IV shall serve on the Coordinating Council as Moderator of Task Group V.

SECTION 6. Clerk

The Clerk shall provide annual report forms at least 30 days before the October meeting, distribute at the October meeting copies of a digest of these reports, make an accurate record of the proceedings of the Association, supervise the printing and distribution of minutes, records, and other documents of the Association, and serve also as secretary of the Coordinating Council.

SECTION 7. Treasurer

The Treasurer shall receive and bank all funds of the Association in the name of the Association; disburse the same upon instructions from the

Association, its Coordinating Council, or as designated in the budget; render an accurate report of receipts and disbursements and distribute same at the October meeting; give an oral report at each quarterly meeting; and keep books available and up to date for examination.

The Treasurer shall serve as a member of the Committees on Finance and Missions.

The Chairman of the Committee on Finance shall have the authority to act for the Treasurer in the event the Treasurer is incapacitated.

SECTION 8. Music Director

The Music Director shall be in charge of the music program of the Association during and between Associational meetings.

SECTION 9. Auditor

The Auditor shall, at the close of the fiscal year, make an audit of the Treasurer's records.

SECTION 10. Historian

The Historian, in his sole discretion, shall collect facts of interest to the Association and the cooperating churches, and shall make a report to each annual session of the association.

SECTION 11. Organizational Directors

Associational Directors of the Sunday School, Church Training, Brotherhood, and Woman's Missionary Union shall be in charge of their respective organizations during their tenure of service.

BYLAW IV DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. Committee on Personnel

The Committee on Personnel shall be composed of six members, each of whom will serve a tenure of three years, with two members rotating off the Committee each year. The Committee will prepare and update, as necessary, position descriptions of all Associational staff personnel, excluding the Director of Missions whose responsibilities are described by Bylaw VI. It shall survey the need for additional staff positions; recruit, interview, and recommend to the Association or its Coordinating Council new employed personnel; and, when necessary, recommend to the Coordinating Council the termination of employment of staff personnel. The Committee shall review annually salaries and benefits, and make recommendations to the Finance Committee. It shall review at least annually the performance of each employee, receive any grievance, and otherwise seek to promote harmonious relationships between all employees of the Association.

SECTION 2. Committee on Missions

(1) The Committee on Missions shall be composed of one representative each from Associational Brotherhood, Woman's Missionary Union, the Treasurer, the Director of each Associational ministry, and three additional members elected by the Association to serve three years on a rotating basis. It shall work with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of the Association, and lead and assist in organizing new churches and in beginning new mission stations.

(2) Upon request, the Committee on Missions shall advise any group seeking to organize a new church. The Committee will be available to any church desiring assistance with problems.

(3) When without a Director of Missions this Committee shall seek out and

recommend to the Association or its Coordinating Council for election a new Director of Missions according to Bylaw VI, Section 1.

SECTION 3. Committee on Evangelism

The Committee on Evangelism, composed of three members, shall promote the work of Evangelism within the Association in cooperation with the State Department of Evangelism. All plans and programs shall be subject to approval by the Association or its Coordinating Council. The Evangelism Committee shall be chaired by the Director of Evangelism who will also serve as Vice-Moderator III.

SECTION 4. Committee on Finance

A. The Committee on Finance, composed of six members and the Treasurer, shall study the Association's financial needs for an adequate program, prepare and present a budget to the Association for the following year, devise and develop plans for securing the cooperation of churches in providing funds to meet the budget, and make a written report at the October meeting.

B. In the event it becomes necessary to borrow funds for current operating expenses of the Association, the Committee on Finance is authorized to instruct the Trustees to secure by loan an amount not to exceed 10% of the annual budget for a period not to exceed 90 days, and to renew the loan as needed.

SECTION 5. Committee on Ordinations

The Committee on Ordinations, composed of seven ministers, shall, when requested by a member church, assist with the examination and ordination of candidates for the Gospel Ministry. Churches wishing to ordain ministers are requested to place their candidates before the committee at least thirty days prior to the date set for ordination for examination on the following principles:

- a. Christian experience or conversion
- b. Call to the ministry
- c. Attitude toward denominational work and objects
- d. Support of denominational causes
- e. Moral and spiritual fitness
- f. Doctrinal beliefs
- g. Knowledge of the Bible

Candidates are to be ordained with the assistance of this committee only when they are serving a church or churches as pastor or having been called as pastor of a Baptist church of like faith and practice with those member churches of this association.

No candidate for ordination shall be considered by the committee who has not been a member of a cooperating church for at least one year.

Candidates are to be urged to prepare themselves for the ministry as far as possible in Baptist institutions of Higher Learning.

This committee shall not recommend any candidate for ordination whom they feel will not bring honor and esteem to the Lord, to Southern Baptists and to the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association.

Recommendations will be made by the committee to the church where the candidate holds membership. The committee will assist the church in the ordination service at a time convenient to the church and to the members of the committee if such assistance is desired.

SECTION 6. Committee on Memorials

The Committee on Memorials, composed of three members, shall bring a report at the October meeting and lead in a memorial service in memory of those reported by the churches as deceased since the last annual meeting.

SECTION 7. Committee on Nominations

The Committee on Nominations, composed of seven members, shall contact and nominate at the April meeting of the Association the officers and trustees of the Association according to Article VI and VII of the Constitution.

SECTION 8. Committee on Constitution

The Committee on Constitution, composed of five members, shall be available to study any changes or revisions in the Constitution, and to make recommendations as needed to keep the Constitution in line with the policies and programs of the Association.

SECTION 9. Committee on Membership

The Committee on Membership, composed of five members, shall perform the duties as set forth in the Constitution, Article III.

SECTION 10. Committee on Committees

The Committee on Committees, composed of seven members, shall be appointed as set forth in the Constitution (Article IX, Section 1), and shall nominate persons to be elected by the Association to serve on all standing Committees.

SECTION 11. Committee on Place and Preachers

The Committee on Place and Preachers, composed of three members, shall receive or solicit invitations for the place or places for meetings of the Association, and shall recommend the places. It shall also recommend the Preachers and alternates for the annual sermons.

SECTION 12. Committee on Resolutions

The Committee on Resolutions, composed of three members, shall draw up and present to the Association at the October meeting resolutions of appreciation and any other resolutions it may deem expedient.

SECTION 13. Committee on Enrollment

The Committee on Enrollment, composed of five members, shall prepare for and direct the enrollment of messengers at all sessions of Associational meetings. Each messenger shall be enrolled only once during the October meeting. This Committee shall be prepared to report on enrollment when called for during meetings.

SECTION 14. Properties Committee

The Properties Committee, composed of three members, shall be responsible for the maintenance of all properties owned or leased by the Association or its Trustees.

SECTION 15. The Calendar Committee

The Calendar Committee shall be composed of the following Associational officers: Director of Missions, Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, W.M.U. Director, Brotherhood Director, Director of Music Ministry, and president of the Ministers Conference. This committee shall prepare an associational calendar for the year, and present same to the annual meeting, for adoption. This calendar shall be included in the annual.

BYLAW V TRUSTEES

The legal title to all real and personal property of the Association shall be vested in the trustees and their successors in such office. The said trustees may convey said property legal instruments pursuant to resolutions adopted and approved by the Association or its Coordinating Council. They shall handle all legal matters of the Association under the direction of the said Association or its Coordinating Council. See Article VII of the Constitution.

BYLAW VI DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS

SECTION 1. The Director of Missions shall be elected upon a recommendation of the Committee on Missions, and by vote of the Association at a regularly scheduled meeting. The relationship between the Association and its Director of Missions may be terminated following a reasonable notice given by either party.

SECTION 2. The Director of Missions shall promote the work and witness of the Association and Denomination, cooperating with the churches, their pastors and officers, and Associational committees and organizations.

A. He shall be responsible for planning, promoting, and executing the ministry of the Association in cooperation with the Coordinating Council and the Committee on Missions.

B. He shall serve as Chairman of the Coordinating Council, and make an annual report to the Association at the October meeting.

C. He shall be an ex-officio member of all committees of the Association, serving in an advisory and/or resource capacity.

D. He shall seek to visit each church in the Association in order to:

- (1) Enrich Christian fellowship among the churches.
- (2) Encourage and strengthen the ministry of the churches.
- (3) Enhance the cooperative relationship between the churches and the Association.

E. He shall, when necessary, conduct surveys or inquiries in order to determine specific needs for ministry within the area of the Association.

F. He shall, upon request, provide a list of qualified persons who may be considered by churches seeking pastors.

G. He shall have full administrative responsibility for all personnel employed by the Association.

SECTION 3.

A. The Director of Missions is entitled to two weeks vacation annually. Upon completion of five years service, the Director of Missions shall be entitled to three weeks annual vacation. Vacation is to be taken within the calendar year, and it is not accumulative.

B. The Director of Missions is entitled to 30 days sick leave per calendar year, sick leave is not to be taken as vacation, and it is not accumulative.

C. The Director of Missions is entitled to four weeks per calendar year which he may use at his discretion for personal enrichment, professional development, and speaking engagements or revivals outside the Association. This time is not accumulative.

SECTION 4. Should there occur at any time a grievance on the part of the Association or the Director of Missions, either party may consult with the Moderator and Chairmen of the Missions and Personnel Committees.

BYLAW VII ANNUAL REPORTS

Persons who are to bring reports to the October meeting of the Association shall present the same to the Director of Missions or Clerk two weeks prior to the October meeting in order for these to be included in the Book of Reports.

BYLAW VIII AMENDMENTS

Amendments to the Bylaws may be made at any session of the October meeting of the Association when presented in writing and approved by a majority of the messengers present and voting.

PROCEEDINGS

of the One Hundred Eleventh Annual Meeting

1. The 111th annual meeting of the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association was called to order by the Moderator Rev. Rex Shumate, at 4 p.m. on October 4, 1982 at Little Rock Baptist Church.

2. Little Rock Music Director, Mrs. Jenny Motsinger, led the congregation in singing "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms" accompanied by Mrs. Pat Faw at the organ and Craig Little at the piano.

3. Rev. Elliott Hayes, pastor of Little Rock Baptist Church, extended welcome to the messengers.

4. The devotional period was led by Rev. Jack Calloway, pastor of Moravian Falls Baptist Church. Scripture was Ephesians 4, emphasizing "working together and sharing together in love."

5. Rev. Gwyn Blackburn made the motion, seconded by Elliott Hayes, that the order of business be adopted as printed in the Book of Reports. The motion carried.

6. The moderator announced the following members of the Enrollment Committee which had been appointed previously and are serving today: Mrs. Frances Woodie, Mrs. Evelyn Brannock, Mrs. Pearl Parlier, Mrs. Travis Baker, and Mrs. Leonard Porter.

7. Committee Reports

A. Attention was called to the Evangelism Committee Report by Rev. Dean Dillard and the Missions Committee Report by Rev. Bill Pardue.

B. The Ordination Committee Report was given by Rev. Al Andrews. Jack Hartley from Hinshaw Street Church and Phil Billings from Wilkesboro Church were examined and recommended for ordination. Both have since been ordained and are serving as pastors.

C. Director of Missions, Bill McKinney, discussed the need for fine-tuning the new constitution and by-laws and asked that suggestions for changes be given to the Constitution Committee which will be meeting soon.

D. Dr. McKinney also presented the Properties Committee Report in the absence of Robert Wood and the Calendar Committee Report, calling attention to the Sunday School Enlargement Campaign planned for October 1983.

E. The Committee on Dedication of Annuals Report was read by the moderator. It recommended the annual be dedicated to Mr. Ellihu Sloan, who has served for seventeen years as director of music at First Baptist Church and eleven years as associational music director.

F. Motion that all these reports be accepted as printed in the Book of Reports was made by Rev. Gwyn Blackburn, seconded, and passed.

8. Mrs. Madge Sturdivant presented the histories of Little Rock Baptist Church and North Wilkesboro First Baptist Church.

9. Children's Homes Representative, Donna Lail, spoke to that report. Slides on the foster home program and the new film "You Needed Me" are available by contacting Miss Lail.

10. A period of special prayer was held for Ellihu Sloan and others who are ill.

11. The moderator called attention to his report in the Book of Reports and reminded messengers of the quarterly associational meetings with business sessions at each.

12. The congregation joined in singing "There Shall be Showers of Blessing."

13. Special music was presented by Mrs. Nancy Land who sang "Looking Through His Eyes".

14. Rev. Horace Moree, pastor of Walnut Grove Baptist Church, brought a message from Romans chapters one and two, concerning the gospel: what it has done, is doing, and will do.

15. Benediction and thanks for the food was spoken by Rev. Latt Beshears.

16. Evening meal.

17. The session was reconvened at 7:30 p.m. by Missions Committee Chairman Bill Pardue who thanked the host church for its gracious hospitality.

18. The congregational hymn "To God Be The Glory" was led by Associational Music Director, Craig Little.

19. Evening devotions were brought by Rev. Dean Dillard with scripture from I John I.

20. Associational Clerk, Norma Jean Wood, presented certificates of recognition to honor clerks for 1982 (listed elsewhere in this book).

21. Pastors new to the association this year were introduced: Rev. Jack Calloway and Rev. Lawrence Goodman; interim pastors: Rev. Latt Beshears and Rev. W. A. Honeycutt.

22. Business Session:

A. The Nominating Committee Report was given by Max Freeman. Nominated were: Richard Cardwell, Brotherhood Director; Bill Brady, R. A. Director; Beth Huie, G. A. Director; and Katie Morris, Mission Friends Director. Mr. Freeman moved that these be accepted, Dean Dillard seconded, and the motion carried.

B. The Committee on Committees Report was presented by Chairman Larry Farthing. There were no changes since the April meeting.

C. Associational treasurer, Norma Jean Wood, gave the treasurer's report. It was accepted as printed in the Book of Reports.

D. The Finance Committee Report was given by chairman, Manson Alley. He announced a new phase two budget of \$12,500.00 to fund the West Virginia Mission effort, making the total proposed budget for 1982-83 \$57,335.00. Mr. Alley's motion for adoption of the budget was seconded and passed.

E. The moderator announced that application for membership in the association has been received from Poplar Grove Baptist Church (formerly Moravian Falls Mission). Monroe German moved that the church be received as an associate member under watch care of the association. After several seconds, the motion passed. The application was referred to the Membership Committee for study and investigation as specified in the association's constitution. The committee will make its recommendation and the final vote will be taken at the next annual meeting.

F. The floor was opened for other nominations for officers and committee members, but none were made.

23. Director of Missions, Bill McKinney, introduced a video cassette presentation on North Carolina Missions and urged that churches make use of the audio visual equipment available at the associational office.

24. The congregation joined in singing the hymn "Jesus Saves."

25. Special music was presented by a choir made up of members of the churches in the association and led by Craig Little, accompanied by Vernon Mitchell at the piano and Larry Keesler at the organ. They sang "Because He Lives," "Jacob's Ladder," and "When the Roll is Called Up Yonder."

26. Cleve Wilkie, a co-ordinator of the Mountain State 200 project, spoke and showed slides of this mission effort in West Virginia.

27. The benediction was voiced by Rev. W. A. Honeycutt

SECOND DAY

28. Missions Committee Chairman, Bill Pardue, called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. on October 5 at First Baptist Church, North Wilkesboro.

29. Craig Little led the congregation in singing "Love Lifted Me."

30. Welcome was extended by Rev. Bill Rogers, pastor of First Baptist Church. Mr. Rogers also expressed appreciation from Ellihu Sloan and his family for the dedication of the annual.

31. Rev. Lawrence Goodman brought devotions from Matt. 16:16.

32. Miscellaneous Business:

A. Rev. Paul Shoupe spoke to the Seminary Extension Report and announced fall courses to begin on October 12.

B. A motion was made by Rev. Hunter Church that since the 1981 Area-wide Crusade budget was oversubscribed by about \$6,000.00, the Director of Missions be asked to contact the Crusade Steering Committee and ask that this money be committed to missions, preferably the West Virginia Mission effort. This motion was seconded by Rev. Fellman Cheek and passed.

C. The total amount received for the Antigua Medical Fund was \$6,339.25. The amount needed for the project (transportation and medical treatment for two children from Antigua) was \$3,799.43, leaving a balance of \$2,539.82. Rev. Jack Calloway made the motion that \$1817.00 of this amount be used to pay travel expenses for Director of Missions, Bill McKinney's, preaching mission trip to south Chile October 20-November 5; and the balance allocated to the West Virginia effort. Rev. Lawrence Goodman seconded and the motion carried.

33. Special music was again presented by the associational choir which sang "Family of God Medley," "Finally Home," and "When The Roll is Called Up Yonder."

34. Rev. Fellman Cheek, pastor of Calvary Baptist Church, brought a message concerning "some things it is going to take to have Bold Missions," using scripture from I Corinthians.

35. Director of Missions, Bill McKinney, expressed appreciation for the gift last year which made possible his and Mrs. McKinney's trip to England to see their new granddaughter and for the provision for his trip to Chile.

Mr. McKinney called attention to the Director of Missions' report in the Book of Reports and relinquished the time allotted for his message which will be used on the Saturday radio program.

36. The Resolutions Report was given by Bill McKinney for Colin Shumaker. It was adopted as presented.

38. The Memorials Committee Report, honoring the memory of church members who had died during the past year, was given by Charles Proffit.

39. Evangelism Director, Rev. Dean Dillard, recognized those in Brushy

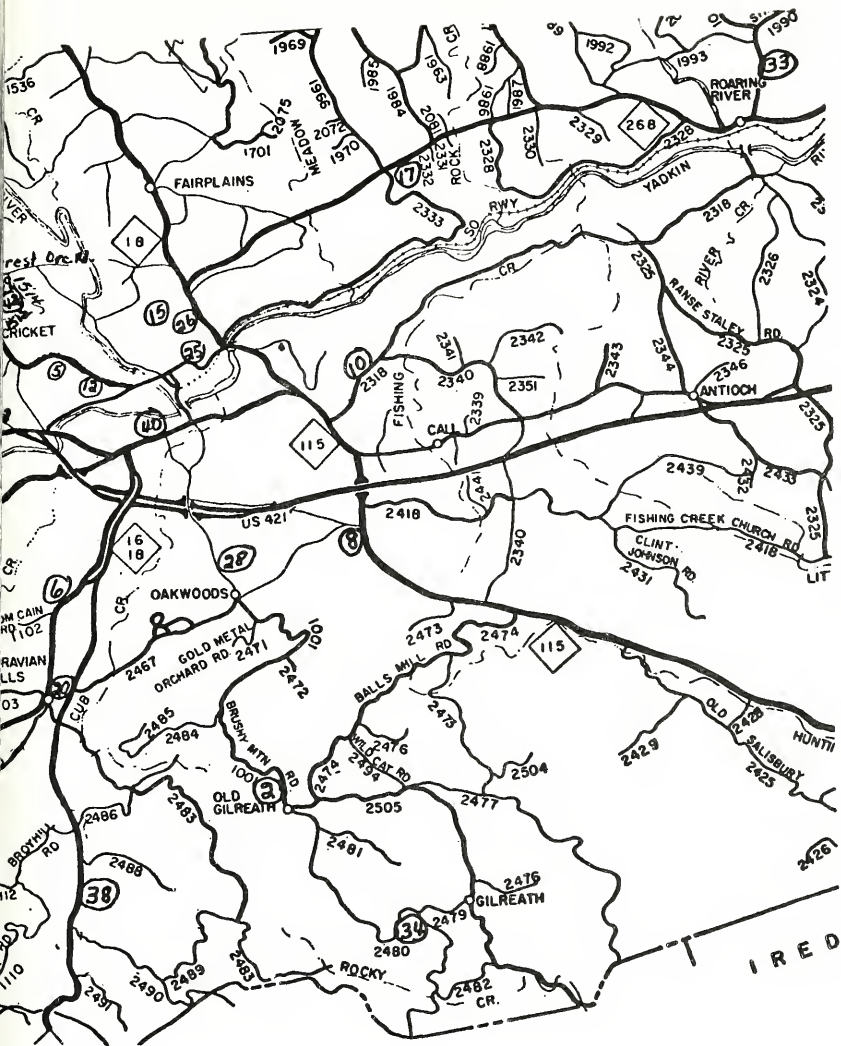

DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS' REPORT

Thank you for the privilege of serving you as your Director of Missions. This has been my sixth year to serve in this capacity, and it has been in many ways one of the busiest and most rewarding of my entire ministry. Statistics cannot tell the story, so I will refrain from listing the many meetings, conferences, phone calls, preaching opportunities, and other opportunities you have given me. I want to express appreciation for the cooperation which has come from the moderator and vice-moderators, from the pastors, and from others in the association. We have had excellent financial support and a very serviceable team of workers this year.

The activities of the Association for which I am most grateful include: the privilege of teaching in our School of Christian Studies, the joy of working and praying toward the Here's Hope joint evangelistic services, the challenge and privilege of counseling many troubled individuals and couples, the privilege of working with a number of pastor-search committees, and the joy of being involved in our mission commitment in West Virginia. SCHOOL OF CHRISTIAN STUDIES REPORT

Please consult last year's annual concerning introductory information pertaining to Seminary Extension Programs throughout the United States and North Carolina: 1) In the United States - more than 10,000 persons enrolled in one or more programs during the last two years; 2) In North Carolina - the enrollment was more than 2,300 for the same period, studying in approximately 75 centers.

In our Association GREAT DOCTRINES OF THE BIBLE (BS-4) was offered last fall with a total of 25 enrolled. One session for laity was taught by Dr. W. C. McKinney, Jr. and a second session taught by W. Paul Shoupe for ministers. This was a Basic Curriculum Course. In the spring semester THE BOOK OF ACTS (NT 0174) was offered with a total of 12 enrolled. This was a College-Level Curriculum Course. The sessions and teachers were the same as above, one for laity and one for ministers.

This fall, course offerings are as follows:

BS 1 UNDERSTANDING THE BIBLE: An introduction to Bible study, including a study of the meaning of biblical inspiration, the nature of the Bible, principles of interpretation, the general structure of the Bible, and methods and resources of Bible Study. The cost is \$10.00. The teacher is W. Paul Shoupe. This is a Basic Curriculum Course.

AC 76 FAMILY LIFE TODAY: A study of the family from a Christian perspective, with attention to biblical and contemporary patterns of family life. Christian teachings are applied to such issues as family communication, conflict, finances, divorce, sexuality, and worship in the home. The cost is \$10.00. The teacher is William B. Rogers. This is also a Basic Curriculum Course. There will be no exams in either course.

The sessions will meet each Tuesday evening at Wilkesboro Baptist Church, 7:00 - 9:00 P.M. beginning October 12th and continuing through December 7th.

HISTORY OF MORAVIAN FALLS BAPTIST CHURCH 1958 -1983

This has been an active period in the life of Moravian Falls Baptist Church in both the program of the church and in the building extension. The church program includes Sunday morning and evening worship service, a full-graded Sunday School, W.M.U. Organization including a Brotherhood for the men and R. A.'s for the boys. Recently, they began to have a fourth Wednesday night supper with all the mission groups meeting. A Good Neighbors Club was started in 1978 for Senior Citizens. They have a meal and worship period together once a month.

On January 1, 1967 Jim Hall was ordained by the church into the ministry.

In 1967 a strip of land adjoining the church property was purchased. A lot was purchased on Cemetery Road and a parsonage was constructed for the minister and his family. In 1973 a note burning service was held when the parsonage debt was paid. In 1978 more land was added to the church property.

In 1982 the mission church on Germantown Road was voted to become a Southern Baptist Church, Poplar Grove Baptist Church. The first pastor was C. J. Poole, the present pastor Rom Shumate.

In 1975 the Moravian Falls Church building was renovated and remodeled, the heating system was replaced, and the new additions were dedicated.

On April 12, 1981 a Church Constitution and By-Laws was adopted.

In 1981 the church body voted to construct an educational building, fellowship hall, kitchen and rest rooms. This was completed in March 1982 and dedicated in 1983. In November of 1982 the educational building was equipped and furnished and in 1983 the parking lot was paved.

In 1983 youth and children of the church were winners in the State Bible Drill and Speakers Tournament. Homecoming Day this year observed dedication of the fellowship hall and educational building with the choir giving the cantata "Going Home".

Pastors of Moravian Falls Church during this period included: Dean Minton, 1949-1951; C. J. Poole, 1952-1957; J. C. McQueen, 1957-1962; Clarence Eden, 1962-1966; E. W. McMurray, 1967-1979; Dwayne Kuykendall, 1980-1981; and Jack Calloway, 1982-present.

Interim pastors were: N. C. Teague, Jack Boston, and Richard Kirk.

Rev. N. C. Teague, a retired minister who lives in the Moravian Falls Community, has been a great help in all areas of church work.

HISTORY OF MILLERS CREEK BAPTIST CHURCH 1959 - 1983

Millers Creek Baptist Church was organized December 6, 1959 with 26 charter members. This year the membership is around 400.

A sanctuary was constructed in 1962. In 1972 six class rooms, an office, and rest rooms were added to the property.

In March 1981 the old Millers Creek Elementary School property was purchased. The gymnasium is being used for youth activities. In 1983 the church voted to renovate the old school building and utilize those facilities in the expansion of the church's membership and ministries.

Millers Creek Church has, from its inception, been mission-minded and is now third largest in financial support of the associational program.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE

We, the Baptist Churches of the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association, unite according to the plan and for the purpose and work of New Testament churches in our world. To this end and according to the following articles, we cooperate to the fullest extent possible with the State and Southern Baptist Convention and subscribe to the principles of the 1963 Baptist Faith and Message statement.

ARTICLE I — NAME

This body shall be known as the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association of North Carolina.

ARTICLE II — PURPOSE

It shall be the purpose of this association to consider and promote measures for increasing the harmony, the knowledge and the spiritual life of the churches and for developing and directing their energies and their contributions in the advancement of Christ's kingdom throughout the earth, always in harmony with the teachings of the New Testament. This association shall be an auxiliary of the North Carolina Baptist State Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention in all their missionary, educational and benevolent work.

It shall be the purpose of the Association (1) to provide the mutual encouragement and fellowship of member churches through the definition and practice of Baptist distinctives; (2) to consistently seek to confront everyone in our area with the claims of Christ on his/her life; (3) to encourage and facilitate church growth and development; (4) to promote participation in missions and ministries on the foreign field, in the homeland, in the state, and in the area of the association; (5) to provide services to the churches as needed and desired; (6) to provide an additional channel by which member churches may participate in the Southern Baptist Convention.

ARTICLE III — MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1. The Association shall be composed of cooperating Baptist churches desiring to affiliate with it. Any church desiring to become a member of the Association shall present, through messengers chosen for that purpose, its request for membership on APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP provided in the minutes along with a UNIFORM ASSOCIATIONAL LETTER provided by the clerk at any annual session of the body. The Moderator shall refer the church to the Committee on Membership for study and investigation. The church maintains for the year the status of associate membership until the committee makes its recommendation. If favorable, it will be received into full membership with all the rights and privileges at the next annual session. If the Association then votes to receive the church, the moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the messengers.

SECTION 2. The Association shall be sole judge of its membership and may receive churches, or reject churches, according to its Constitution and Bylaws. Member churches may withdraw from the Association as they desire. Any church in the Association which fails to cooperate with the Association shall, upon the recommendation of the Coordinating Council of the Association, be contacted by the Membership Committee to determine the intentions of the church regarding its remaining in the Association.

A cooperating church shall be defined as one which sends an annual report to the Association and messengers to Associational meetings, and contributes to the financial program of the Association.

SECTION 3. The Association shall withdraw fellowship from any church in its membership which shall be found to be disorderly in faith and practice, but not until written charges are brought against it, which charges shall have been authorized by the official act of the church offering the same, or by the Membership Committee of the Association. Thereafter, any such charges shall be carefully considered by the Association.

ARTICLE IV — MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The Association shall meet quarterly on the Monday after the first Sunday in January, April, and July. In October the Association shall meet on Monday and Tuesday after the first Sunday.

SECTION 2. The Moderator shall call a meeting of the pastor and one representative from each church approximately thirty days prior to any quarterly Associational meeting at which business is to be considered for the purpose of publicizing and discussing such matters as may be presented for vote at the Associational meeting. Special meetings may be called by the Moderator provided two weeks notice is given to the member churches.

SECTION 3. In case of emergency, the Coordinating Council shall have the authority to change the time and/or place of meetings, and shall be responsible for providing churches with sufficient notice of change.

SECTION 4. Each church is entitled to be represented by its pastor, other ordained ministers holding membership in the church, and such additional messengers as will permit a total of 10 messengers. Churches with more than 500 members are entitled to an additional messenger for each 100 members more than the initial 500. Messengers shall be elected annually for all Associational meetings. It is suggested that at least 5 of the messengers be leaders of individual church organizations.

ARTICLE V — AUTHORITY

While independent and sovereign in its own sphere, the Association does not claim, and will never attempt to exercise any authority over any other Baptist body, whether church or auxiliary organization.

ARTICLE VI — OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTION

SECTION I. The officers of the Association shall be: Moderator (who shall also serve as Chairman of Group I — Associational Administration); Vice-Moderator (who shall also serve as Chairman of Group II — Fellowship and Mutual Care); Group Chairman III (Evangelism and Outreach); Group

Chairman IV (Church Growth and Training); Group Chairman V (Associational Ministries); Clerk, Treasurer, Music Director, Auditor, Historian, Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, Woman's Missionary Union Director, Brotherhood Director, and School of Christian Studies Director.

SECTION 2. The officers of the Association shall be elected at the April meeting of the Association for a term of one year. Officers shall be contacted and nominated by the Committee on Nominations (Bylaw IV, Section 7).

SECTION 3. Officers shall assume their duties at the close of the October meeting and serve until the next October meeting, or until their successors are elected.

SECTION 4. Any person having served two terms as Moderator shall be ineligible for re-election for a period of two years.

ARTICLE VII — TRUSTEES AND THEIR ELECTION

There shall be three Trustees of the Association, one of whom should be an attorney. Trustess shall be elected for an indefinite term and shall serve at the pleasure of the Association.

ARTICLE VIII — THE COORDINATING COUNCIL

The Coordinating Council shall be composed of the Moderator, the four Group Chairmen, and the Director of Missions. The Coordinating Council shall be responsible for coordinating and directing all the work of the Association, including Long Range Planning. It shall meet monthly and, when appropriate, make reports and recommendations to the Association at scheduled meetings. The Moderator shall serve as Chairman of the Coordinating Council.

ARTICLE IX — COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. The Association shall have the following standing Committees with terms of office being from the close of the October meeting through the following October meeting:

A. To be nominated by the Committee on Committees and elected at the April meeting:

1. Committee on Personnel (Bylaw IV, Section 1)
2. Committee on Missions (Bylaw IV, Section 2)
3. Committee on Evangelism (Bylaw IV, Section 3)
4. Committee on Finance (Bylaw IV, Section 4)
5. Committee on Ordinations (Bylaw IV, Section 5)
6. Committee on Memorials (Bylaw IV, Section 6)
7. Committee on Nominations (Bylaw IV, Section 7)
8. Committee on Constitution (Bylaw IV, Section 8)
9. Committee on Membership (Bylaw IV, Section 9)
10. Committee on Properties (Bylaw IV, Section 14)
11. Committee on Calendar (Bylaw IV, Section 15)
12. School of Christian Studies Committee (Bylaw IV, Section 16)

B. To be appointed by the Moderator at the April meeting:

1. Committee on Committees (Bylaw IV, Section 10)
2. Committee on Enrollment (Bylaw IV, Section 13)

SECTION 2. The following committees shall be appointed by the Moderator at least 30 days prior to the October meeting to serve during the October meeting:

1. Committee on Place and Preacher (Bylaw IV, Section 11)
2. Committee on Resolutions (Bylaw IV, Section 12)

ARTICLE X — GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 1. The employment of a Director of Missions shall follow the procedure outlined in Bylaw VI, Section 1, with the understanding that said person be extended an indefinite call and that a period of reasonable notice be given by either the missionary or the Association in the event of termination of such employment.

SECTION 2. The Director of Missions shall be empowered to procure and supervise necessary secretarial and janitorial personnel for the proper operation and maintenance of the Associational office, provided that funds for the hiring and salary of such personnel have been included within the current year's budget.

SECTION 3. All questions of order not herein provided for shall be decided according to ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER, Revised.

SECTION 4. Amendments to this Constitution may be made at any annual session upon vote of two-thirds of the members present, provided that such amendments be presented on the first day of the annual session and voted upon the second day.

SECTION 5. ROTATING OF COMMITTEES. One-third of each committee shall be elected to serve a period of three years. Committees or parts of committees, composed of organizational heads shall not be subject to rotation. No member shall succeed himself for more than one additional term. Vacancies occurring during the year may be filled immediately by the Coordinating Council.

SECTION 6. SPECIAL ADVISORS. The Moderator and Director of Missions will serve on all committees of the Association as special advisors.

BYLAWS

BYLAW I GENERAL

SECTION 1. The Association shall convene as provided by the Constitution (Article IV, Section 1).

SECTION 2. Each session of the Association shall be opened with religious exercise.

SECTION 3. A majority of the members present shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business except the matter of making changes in the Constitution.

SECTION 4. Any member wishing to speak shall rise and address the Moderator, shall confine himself strictly to the question under consideration, and avoid the use of unnecessary personalities.

SECTION 5. The members shall observe toward the officers and towards one another such courtesies as are becoming to Christians.

SECTION 6. The annual Associational year, for the purpose of reporting statistical information, shall be September 1 to August 31, inclusive.

BYLAW II ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

The organizational structure of the Association shall be divided into five Task Groups. Each Task Group shall meet quarterly and make reports to the Coordinating Council as needed.

SECTION 1. Task Group I, "Associational Administration," shall be composed of the Moderator, Clerk, Trustees, Treasurer, and Committees on Personnel, Finance, and Properties. Task Group I shall oversee all administrative functions of the Association, including employing and/or discharging staff personnel, budget planning, and use and maintenance of Associational property and equipment.

SECTION 2. Task Group II, "Fellowship and Mutual Care," shall be composed of the Vice Moderator, Committees on Membership, Ordination, and Memorials, the President of the Pastor's Conference of the Association, and the General Board Representative. Task Group II shall seek to enrich fellowship within and between churches in the Association and it shall be responsible for planning the January meeting of the Association.

SECTION 3. Task Group III, "Evangelism and Outreach," shall be composed of Group Chairman III and the Evangelism Committee. It shall be responsible for planning and promoting evangelism and outreach. It shall also plan the April meeting of the Association. The Director of Evangelism shall serve as Chairman of this group.

SECTION 4. Task Group IV, "Church Growth and Training," shall be composed of Group Chairman IV, Associational Directors of Music, Sunday School, Church Training, Brotherhood and Woman's Missionary Union. It shall be the responsibility of Task Group IV to coordinate leadership training and to encourage church growth. It shall also be responsible for planning an annual calendar and the July meeting of the Association.

SECTION 5. Task Group V, "Associational Ministries," shall be composed of Group Chairman V, and the Committee on Missions. It shall seek to discover, implement, and maintain Associational ministries. It shall also be responsible for planning the October meeting of the Association, including the preparation of a printed program which shall be sent to all persons on the program and to all pastors at least 30 days prior to the October meeting. It shall, in the opening session of the October meeting of the Association, present the printed program for adoption.

BYLAW III DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. Moderator

The Moderator shall preside during meetings of the Association according to the Constitution and Bylaws, serve on the Coordinating Council as Moderator of Task Group I, appoint Committee on Committees, Place and Preachers, Resolutions, and Enrollment. The Moderator shall serve also as Ex-Officio member of all other committees.

SECTION 2. Vice Moderator

The Vice Moderator shall preside in the absence, or at the pleasure, of the Moderator. In addition, the Vice Moderator shall serve on the Coordinating Council Representing Task Group II.

SECTION 3. Group Chairman III

Group Chairman III shall serve on the Coordinating Council representing Task Group III.

SECTION 4. Group Chairman IV

Group Chairman IV shall serve on the Coordinating Council representing Task Group IV.

SECTION 5. Group Chairman V

Group Chairman V shall serve on the Coordinating Council representing Task Group V.

SECTION 6. Clerk

The Clerk shall provide annual report forms at least 30 days before the October meeting, distribute at the October meeting copies of a digest of these reports, make an accurate record of the proceedings of the Association, supervise the printing and distribution of minutes, records, and other documents of the Association, and serve also as secretary of the Coordinating Council.

SECTION 7. Treasurer

The Treasurer shall receive and bank all funds of the Association in the name of the Association; disburse the same upon instructions from the Association, its Coordinating Council, or as designated in the budget; render an accurate report of receipts and disbursements and distribute same at the October meeting; give an oral report at each quarterly meeting; and keep books available and up to date for examination.

The Treasurer shall serve as a member of the Committees on Finance and Missions.

The Chairman of the Committee on Finance shall have the authority to act for the Treasurer in the event the Treasurer is incapacitated.

SECTION 8. Music Director

The Music Director shall be in charge of the music program of the Association during and between Associational meetings.

SECTION 9. Auditor

The Auditor shall, at the close of the fiscal year, make an audit of the Treasurer's records.

SECTION 10. Historian

The Historian, in his sole discretion, shall collect facts of interest to the Association and the cooperating churches, and shall make a report to each annual session of the association.

SECTION 11. Organizational Directors

Associational Directors of the Sunday School, Church Training, Brotherhood, and Woman's Missionary Union shall be in charge of their respective organizations during their tenure of service.

BYLAW IV DUTIES OF COMMITTEES**SECTION 1. Committee on Personnel**

The Committee on Personnel shall be composed of six members, each of whom will serve a tenure of three years, with two members rotating off the Committee each year. The Committee will prepare and update, as necessary,

position descriptions of all Associational staff personnel, excluding the Director of Missions whose responsibilities are described by Bylaw VI. It shall survey the need for additional staff positions; recruit, interview, and recommend to the Association or its Coordinating Council new employed personnel; and, when necessary, recommend to the Coordinating Council the termination of employment of staff personnel. The Committee shall review annually salaries and benefits, and make recommendations to the Finance Committee. It shall review at least annually the performance of each employee, receive any grievance, and otherwise seek to promote harmonious relationships between all employees of the Association.

SECTION 2. Committee on Missions

(1) The Committee on Missions shall be composed of one representative each from Associational Brotherhood, Woman's Missionary Union, the Treasurer, the Director of each Associational ministry, and three additional members elected by the Association to serve three years on a rotating basis. It shall work with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of the Association, and lead and assist in organizing new churches and in beginning new mission stations.

(2) Upon request, the Committee on Missions shall advise any group seeking to organize a new church. The Committee will be available to any church desiring assistance with problems.

(3) When without a Director of Missions this Committee shall seek out and recommend to the Association or its Coordinating Council for election a new Director of Missions according to Bylaws VI, Section 1.

SECTION 3. Committee on Evangelism

The Committee on Evangelism, composed of three members, shall promote the work of Evangelism within the Association in cooperation with the State Department of Evangelism. All plans and programs shall be subject to approval by the Association or its Coordinating Council. The Evangelism Committee shall be chaired by the Director of Evangelism who will also serve as Group Chairman III.

SECTION 4. Committee on Finance

A. The Committee on Finance, composed of six members and the Treasurer, shall study the Association's financial needs for an adequate program, prepare and present a budget to the Association for the following year, devise and develop plans for securing the cooperation of churches in providing funds to meet the budget, and make a written report at the October meeting.

B. In the event it becomes necessary to borrow funds for current operating expenses of the Association, the Committee on Finance is authorized to instruct the Trustees to secure by loan an amount not to exceed 10% of the annual budget for a period not to exceed 90 days, and to renew the loan as needed.

SECTION 5. Committee on Ordinations

The Committee on Ordinations, composed of seven ministers, shall when requested by a member church, assist with the examination and ordination of candidates for the Gospel Ministry. Churches wishing to ordain ministers are requested to place their candidates before the committee at least thirty days prior to the date set for ordination for examination on the following principles:

- a. Christian experience or conversion
- b. Call to the ministry
- c. Attitude toward denominational work and objects
- d. Support of denominational causes

- e. Moral and spiritual fitness
- f. Doctrinal beliefs
- g. Knowledge of the Bible

Candidates are to be ordained with the assistance of this committee only when they are serving a church or churches as pastor or having been called as pastor of a Baptist church of like faith and practice with those member churches of this association.

No candidate for ordination shall be considered by the committee who has not been a member of a cooperating church for at least one year. The committee shall consider only male members for ordination.

Candidates are to be urged to prepare themselves for the ministry as far as possible in Baptist institutions of Higher Learning.

This committee shall not recommend any candidate for ordination whom they feel will not bring honor and esteem to the Lord, to Southern Baptists and to the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association.

Recommendations will be made by the committee to the church where the candidate holds membership. The committee will assist the church in the ordination service at a time convenient to the church and to the members of the committee if such assistance is desired.

SECTION 6. Committee on Memorials

The Committee on Memorials, composed of three members, shall bring a report at the October meeting and lead in a memorial service in memory of those reported by the churches as deceased since the last annual meeting.

SECTION 7. Committee on Nominations

The Committee on Nominations, composed of seven members, shall contact and nominate at the April meeting of the Association the officers and trustees of the Association according to Article VI and VII of the Constitution.

SECTION 8. Committee on Constitution

The Committee on Constitution, composed of five members, shall be available to study any changes or revisions in the Constitution, and to make recommendations as needed to keep the Constitution in line with the policies and programs of the Association.

SECTION 9. Committee on Membership

The Committee on Membership, composed of five members, shall perform the duties as set forth in the Constitution, Article III.

SECTION 10. Committee on Committees

The Committee on Committees, composed of seven members, shall be appointed as set forth in the Constitution (Article IX, Section 1), and shall nominate persons to be elected by the Association to serve on all standing Committees.

SECTION 11. Committee on Place and Preachers

The Committee on Place and Preachers, composed of three members, shall receive or solicit invitations for the place or places for meetings of the Association, and shall recommend the places. It shall also recommend the Preachers and alternates for the annual sermons.

SECTION 12. Committee on Resolutions

The Committee on Resolutions, composed of three members, shall draw up and present to the Association at the October meeting resolutions of appreciation and any other resolutions it may deem expedient.

SECTION 13. Committee on Enrollment

The Committee on Enrollment, composed of five members, shall prepare for and direct the enrollment of messengers at all sessions of Associational meetings. Each messenger shall be enrolled only once during the October meeting. This Committee shall be prepared to report on enrollment when called for during meetings.

SECTION 14. Properties Committee

The Properties Committee, composed of three members, shall be responsible for the maintenance of all properties owned or leased by the Association or its Trustees.

SECTION 15. The Calendar Committee

The Calendar Committee shall be composed of the following Associational officers: Director of Missions, Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, W.M.U. Director, Brotherhood Director, Director of Music Ministry, and president of the Ministers Conference. This committee shall prepare an associational calendar for the year, and present same to the annual meeting, for adoption. This calendar shall be included in the annual.

SECTION 16. School of Christian Studies Committee

The School of Christian Studies Committee shall work with the Director of the School of Christian Studies to plan, promote, and implement the offering of such courses of study as will meet the needs of pastors and lay-persons in the areas of biblical studies, historical theology, Baptist life, church administration, Christian education, and pastoral training.

BYLAW V TRUSTEES

The legal title to all real and personal property of the Association shall be vested in the trustees and their successors in such office. The said trustees may convey said property legal instruments pursuant to resolutions adopted and approved by the Association or its Coordinating Council. They shall handle all legal matters of the Association under the direction of the said Association or its Coordinating Council. See Article VII of the Constitution.

BYLAW VI DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS

SECTION 1. The Director of Missions shall be elected upon a recommendation of the Committee on Missions, and by vote of the Association at a regularly scheduled meeting. The relationship between the Association and its Director of Missions may be terminated following a reasonable notice given by either party.

SECTION 2. The Director of Missions shall promote the work and witness of the Association and Denomination, cooperating with the churches, their pastors and officers, and Associational committees and organizations.

A. He shall be responsible for planning, promoting, and executing the ministry of the Association in cooperation with the Coordinating Council and the Committee on Missions.

B. He shall make an annual report to the Association at the October meeting.

C. He shall be an ex-officio member of all committees of the Association, serving in an advisory and/or resource capacity.

D. He shall seek to visit each church in the Association in order to:

- (1) Enrich Christian fellowship among the churches.
- (2) Encourage and strengthen the ministry of the churches.

(3) Enhance the cooperative relationship between the churches and the Association.

E. He shall, when necessary, conduct surveys or inquiries in order to determine specific needs for ministry within the area of the Association.

F. He shall, upon request, provide a list of qualified persons who may be considered by churches seeking pastors.

G. He shall have full administrative responsibility for all personnel employed by the Association.

SECTION 3.

A. The Director of Missions is entitled to two weeks vacation annually. Upon completion of five years service, the Director of Missions shall be entitled to three weeks annual vacation. Vacation is to be taken within the calendar year, and it is not accumulative.

B. The Director of Missions is entitled to 30 days sick leave per calendar year, sick leave is not to be taken as vacation, and it is not accumulative.

C. The Director of Missions is entitled to four weeks per calendar year which he may use at his discretion for personal enrichment, professional development, and speaking engagements or revivals outside the Association. This time is not accumulative.

SECTION 4. Should there occur at any time a grievance on the part of the Association or the Director of Missions, either party may consult with the Moderator and Chairmen of the Missions and Personnel Committees.

BYLAW VII ANNUAL REPORTS

Persons who are to bring reports to the October meeting of the Association shall present the same to the Director of Missions or Clerk two weeks prior to the October meeting in order for these to be included in the Book of Reports.

BYLAW VIII AMENDMENTS

Amendments to the Bylaws may be made at any session of the October meeting of the Association when presented in writing and approved by a majority of the messengers present and voting.

PROCEEDINGS

of the ONE HUNDRED TWELFTH ANNUAL MEETING

1. The 112th annual session of the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association was called to order at 4 p.m. on October 3, 1983 by the moderator, Rev. Sherrill Wellborn, at Moravian Falls Baptist Church.

2. The congregational hymn, "At The Cross," was led by Associational Music Director Craig Little, accompanied by Mrs. Dorothy Rose at the organ and Vernon Mitchell at the piano.

3. Moravian Falls Church Pastor Jack Calloway welcomed the messengers and made necessary announcements.

4. Devotions were led by Rev. Curtis White using scripture from I Corinthians 13.

5. Missions Committee Chairman Rev. Jim Gore recommended the adoption of the program as printed, with minor modifications regarding schedule and time as the moderator may see fit. The motion carried.

6. The moderator announced the members of the Resolutions Committee and the Place and Preacher Committee which had been appointed 30 days prior to the annual meeting.

7. Business session:

A. The Evangelism Report was presented by the Evangelism Director, Rev. Dean Dillard. (All reports are printed elsewhere in this book.) The report was adopted as printed in the Book of Reports.

B. Rev. Jim Gore called attention to the Missions Committee Report which was also adopted as printed.

C. The Ordination Committee Report was given by Rev. Alfred Andrews, Jr. At the request of Oakwoods Baptist Church, J. T. Jones and Robert Duncan were examined and recommended for ordination. The report was accepted.

D. Rev. L. J. Culler gave the Membership Committee Report: Poplar Grove Baptist Church, which came under watchcare of the Association last year, has met the three requirements for membership during the past year. The committee, the moderator, and the Director of Missions has met with the pastor and six members of the church and feel that it will be an asset to the Association. Therefore, the Membership Committee recommends that Poplar Grove Church be received in full membership with all rights and privileges thereof. The motion was accepted and passed.

E. The Properties Committee Report was given by Chairman Clyde Bumgarner. All planned work on the parsonage, which was referred to in the printed report, has now been completed. The report was adopted as printed in the Book of Reports.

F. Director of Missions Bill McKinney called attention to the Calendar of Activities for 1983-84 and moved its adoption as printed with any changes which need to be made because of later conflicts. Motion carried.

G. The Dedication of Annuals Committee Report was given by J. R. Priestler: It is recommended that the 1983 Associational Annual be dedicated to the honor of William K. Sturdivant because of his many years of service to his church, the association, and Baptist State Convention agencies. The motion carried.

H. Associational Historian Mrs. Madge Sturdivant called attention to the histories of Moravian Falls and Millers Creek Baptist Churches in the Book of Reports.

I. In the absence of Committee Chairman Rev. Paul Shoupe, Dr. John Wayland moved the adoption of the School of Christian Studies Report. The motion carried.

J. Rev. Jack Rose gave the Committee on Committees Report: Due to an oversight new members of the School of Christian Studies Committee and the Nominating Committee were not elected at the April meeting. They were nominated and elected and are printed elsewhere in this book.

K. The treasurer's report, given by Mrs. Douglas Wood, was adopted as printed in the Book of Reports. Total receipts for the year were \$55,678.85, total expenditures \$62,225.44. The checking account balance at the end of the associational year was \$1,056.38 with \$45,638.44 in the Ministry Reserve Fund.

L. Finance Committee Chairman Manson Alley presented Certificates of Recognition to the churches which had increased associational giving by at least 100% during the first five years of Bold Mission Thrust. Receiving the awards were: Little Rock, Mount Pleasant, Cub Creek, Zion Hill, Wilkesboro, Welcome Home, Shady Grove, Roaring River, Pilgrim, Oakwoods, New Hope, Moravian Falls, Millers Creek, Lewis Fork, Hinshaw Street, Gordon, Edgewood, Davis Memorial, and Boiling Springs.

The proposed budget was adopted as printed in the Book of Reports.

8. Stewardship Chairman Rev. James Craig presented Certificates of Recognition to churches which had increased Cooperative Program giving by 100% during 1977-82: Boiling Springs, Calvary, Edgewood, Gordon, Hinshaw Street, Millers Creek, Mount Pleasant, New Hope, Oakwoods, Pleasant Home, Roaring River, Walnut Grove, Welcome Home, Wilkesboro, and Zion Hill.

Mr. Craig also presented certificates to those that showed 100% increase in church receipts: Davis Memorial, Edgewood, Friendly Grove, New Hope, Pleasant Grove, Roaring River, Rocky Creek, Shady Grove, and Zion Hill.

Certificates were presented to the following churches which had 100% increase in baptisms during the last five years: Bethany, Calvary, Cub Creek, Davis Memorial, Fishing Creek, Goshen, Little Rock, First Baptist Church, Oakwoods, Pilgrim, Rocky Creek, Sharon Walker, and Zion Hill.

9. The moderator recognized Dr. Garland Hendricks who spoke on behalf of the Annuity Board. He encouraged churches to make adequate insurance and retirement provisions for their pastors.

10. Rev. Lawrence Goodman announced that there is still time for churches to become involved in the Sunday School Enlargement/Enrollment Campaign. He urged participation in this October 22-30 effort to reach, teach, win, and disciple the 25,000 unchurched people in Wilkes County.

11. The congregation joined in singing "Grace Greater Than Our Sin."

12. Special music was presented by Mrs. Nancy Land, who sang "Only One Life to Live For Christ."

13. Rev. R. A. Call brought an inspirational message based on Matthew 16:13-19 and Matthew 2:19-20. He emphasized the need for all Christians to follow the Great Commission to "Go ye" and to meet together in prayer.

14. After the invocation by Rev. Hal Melton, the meeting was adjourned for the evening meal.

15. The meeting was reconvened at 7 p.m. with the singing of the congregational hymn "On Jordan's Stormy Banks" led by Rev. Hal Melton, accompanied by Dr. Bill McKinney at the piano.

16. Rev. Jack Calloway again welcomed the messengers and Rev. Jim Gore led devotions from Romans 12:1-2.

17. Moderator Wellborn introduced new pastors in the Association during the past year: Rev. James M. Gore and Mrs. Gore, Millers Creek Church; Rev. Paul Hugger and Mrs. Hugger, Pleasant Home Church; Rev. Dayton Roten, Second Baptist Church; Rev. Curtis White, Hinshaw Street Church; and Rev. Dennis Dillard, Rocky Creek Church.

Interim pastors now serving: Rev. Ralph Culler, Beaver Creek Church; Rev. Jerry Reavis, Davis Memorial Church; and Rev. Glenn Huffman, Pilgrim Church.

New staff members include: Rev. Hal Melton, Minister of Education and Youth at Wilkesboro Church; Rev. Lin Bratcher, Minister of Music at North Wilkesboro First Church; and Barry Shepherd, Director of Music at Welcome Home Church.

18. Rev. Coy Privette, Executive Director of the Christian Action League, discussed how the state's new Driving While Impaired laws came to be passed and encouraged participation in a possible beer/wine referendum in Wilkes County.

19. The Children's Home Report was spoken to by Dr. Michael Blackwell, president of Children's Homes.

20. The congregation joined in singing "Trust and Obey."

21. Constitution Committee Chairman Larry Farthing recommended changes to the Associational Constitutional and Bylaws as printed on pages 16, 17, and 18 in the Book of Reports (printed elsewhere in this book). Max Freeman made a motion to accept the changes as printed. The motion carried. Dr. McKinney reminded that changes in the constitution must be proposed on the first day of the meeting and voted upon on the second day. Bylaws may be voted on immediately. Therefore, the vote was declared void, although the motion still stands.

22. A motion was made by Rev. Bill Pardue that the moderator appoint a committee of five people, to be chaired by the moderator, to study the organizational structure of the Association and bring a report to the April Quarterly Meeting. The motion was seconded by Rev. Horace Moree and passed.

23. Rev. Lawrence Goodman made a motion to amend Bylaw IV, Section 5, paragraph 3 to "No candidate for ordination shall be considered by the committee who has not been a member of a cooperating church for at least one year. The committee shall consider only male members for ordination." Mr. Goodman stated that he made the motion in hopes of bringing about harmony and unity in the association; that it would take away the involvement, through the Ordination Committee, of those who are strongly opposed to the ordination of women. Seconded by Rev. Fellman Cheek, the motion carried.

24. The North Carolina Baptist Homes report was given by W. K. Sturdivant, Sr. and adopted as printed. Baptist Homes representative Jim Saul spoke to the report and announced a name change to "The Baptist Retirement Homes of North Carolina."

25. Special music was presented by a choir made up of members of churches in the Association directed by Craig Little, accompanied by Vernon Mitchell at

the piano and Lin Bratcher at the organ. They sang "Go In My Father's Name," "Finally Home," and "Ten Thousand Angels."

26. Rev. Jackie Hartley, pastor of Davisville Baptist Chapel (the mission in West Virginia which Brushy Mountain Association helps to sponsor) brought a report on activities there and plans for the future.

27. The moderator recognized the pastor and messengers from Poplar Grove Church and the right hand of full fellowship was extended to them by the messengers present.

28. The meeting was dismissed by prayer led by Poplar Grove Church Pastor Rom Shumate.

SECOND DAY

29. The second day of the 112th annual meeting was called to order by Moderator Sherrill Wellborn at 7 p.m. on October 4, 1983 at Millers Creek Baptist Church.

30. Pastor Jim Gore welcomed the messengers and Rev. Paul Hugger brought devotions from John 17:18ff.

31. Special music was presented by John and Norma Jean Burnette, who sang "I Worship God" and "Why Must I Die," accompanied by Craig Little at the piano.

32. Rev. Hunter Church brought an inspirational message from Acts 1:1ff, concerning the power of God and spiritual enthusiasm.

33. The congregational hymn "Victory in Jesus" was led by Craig Little, accompanied by Vernon Mitchell at the piano.

34. Business Session:

A. Rev. Phil Chapman called attention to the Place and Preacher Committee Report in the Book of Reports and moved its adoption. The motion carried.

B. The motion, made by Max Freeman during the first day session, to accept the changes in the constitution and bylaws recommendation by the Constitution Committee, was voted upon and passed.

C. Rev. William B. Rogers moved that Article IV, Section 5 of the bylaws be changed to read as in the present constitution and bylaws printed in the associational annual. The sentence "The committee shall consider only male members for ordination," inserted last evening, would be removed.

Mr. Rogers spoke to the motion, feeling that messengers needed more time to consider the matter. The moderator gave equal time to those having a different view.

Rev. Jim Gore made a motion that the vote be received by written ballot. The motion was seconded by Lawrence Goodman and passed. After adequate discussion, the vote was taken by written ballot.

Rev. Phil Chapman made a motion that the moderator appoint someone to count the ballots. Moderator Wellborn appointed members of the Enrollment Committee: Mrs. Gladys Walker, Mrs. Rebecca Gore, Mrs. Robbie McKinney, Mrs. Doris Moree, and Rev. Chapman.

While the ballots were being counted there was discussion as to whether a simple majority or a two-thirds majority was required for the bylaw change. Rev. Curtis White moved that the chair should make the decision. Seconded by Charles Edwards, the motion carried. The moderator ruled that Robert's Rules of Order said a two-thirds majority and that would be followed.

Results of the written vote showed 66 in favor of Mr. Rogers' motion and 104 against. The motion was defeated.

D. Moderator Wellborn asked for other business. There was none.

35. Director of Missions Bill McKinney called attention to his report in the Book of Reports and brought a challenging message based on Nehemiah 6: "Why Should I Leave the Work to Come Down and Talk." Dr. McKinney stated that "While we split theological hairs the world dies," and "Our year of disharmony has cost the Kingdom of God a tremendous price." He urged that conflict be put aside and all efforts put toward winning the world to Christ.

36. Resolutions Committee Chairman Rev. Curtis White brought four resolutions (printed elsewhere in this book), all of which were adopted.

Rev. Horace Moree made a motion that Resolution Number One, referring to alcoholic beverages in Wilkes County, be printed in the local newspaper paid for out of associational funds; and that a copy of Resolution Number Two, commending the sheriff's department of Wilkes County for their recent crackdown on the growth, sale, and consumption of illegal drugs, be sent to the sheriff's office. The motion carried.

37. Mr. Charles Proffit, chairman of the Memorials Committee, paid tribute to the 99 members of churches in the association which had died during the past year.

38. Moderator Wellborn expressed appreciation to Pastor Jim Gore and the members of Millers Creek Baptist Church, and Pastor Jack Calloway and the members of Moravian Falls Baptist Church for their hospitality in hosting the annual meeting this year.

39. Rev. Lawrence Goodman called attention to the change in constitution and bylaws that would render the association without officers between April and October of 1984. Rev. Al Andrews moved that the present officers serve until October, 1984. The motion carried.

40. A prayer of benediction was voiced by Rev. Dayton Roten and the meeting was adjourned.

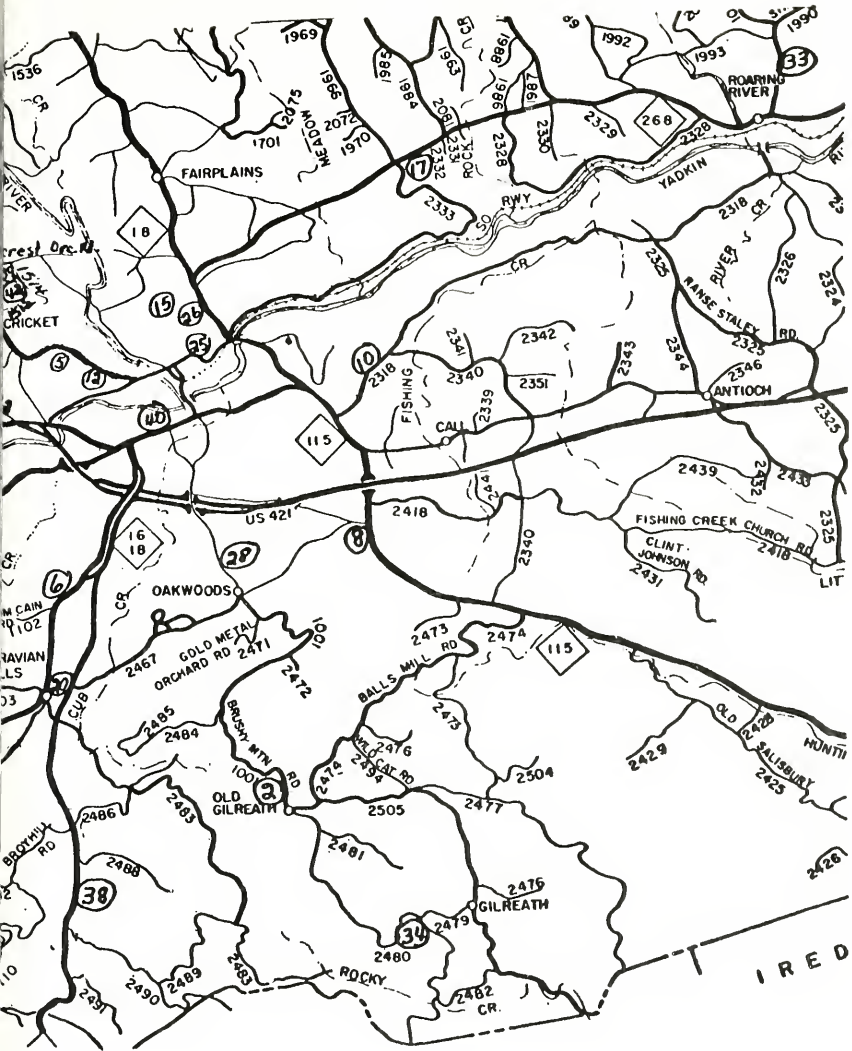

Your financial support of the work has risen seven percent despite the economic distress, and you have provided another ten percent of increase earmarked for our West Virginia mission endeavor. God has made it possible for Jackie and Hazel Hartley to move to Davisville to develop the work there and in nearby Williamstown. Our commitment to undergird and support their ministry must not be diminished.

The largest burden of my work among you this year has been (1) concern and activity on behalf of our West Virginia mission project, (2) assistance to pastor search committees, (3) matters relating to fellowship, and (4) planning and promotion of church growth activities. I am especially thankful for the excellent group of associational leaders who have given so much of themselves to the life of Brushy Mountain Baptist Association this year. As we look toward 1983-84, we have splendid opportunities and strong challenges. May we respond in the spirit of Isaiah 54:23 "... Spare not, lengthen thy cords, and strengthen thy stakes; for thou shalt break forth on the right hand and on the left ..."

SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT

This has been a busy year in associational Sunday School work. The main emphasis has been preparing for a Sunday School Enrollment/Enlargement Campaign which will be conducted the week of October 22-30. There have been other activities as well.

SCHOOL OF CHRISTIAN STUDIES REPORT

Please consult the Associational Annuals for 1981 and 1982 concerning information of introduction pertaining to Seminary Extension Programs throughout the United States and North Carolina. Enrollment continues to increase, studying in more than 80 centers.

In Our Association last fall we offered two courses of study: 1) BS 1 UNDERSTANDING THE BIBLE taught by W. Paul Shoupe. This course is an introduction to Bible Study, including a study of biblical inspiration, the nature of the Bible, principles of interpretation, the general structure of the Bible, and methods and resources of Bible Study. Nine (9) people were enrolled in this course in the Basic Curriculum, three ministers and six laypersons. 2) AC 6 FAMILY LIFE TODAY taught by William B. Rogers. This course is a study of the family from a Christian perspective, with attention to biblical and contemporary patterns of family life. Christian teachings are applied to such issues as family communication, conflict, finances, divorce, sexuality, and worship in the home. Five (5) people were enrolled in this course in the Basic Curriculum, two ministers and three laypersons.

In the spring we offered one course of study - BS 5 GREAT PASSAGES OF THE BIBLE taught by W. Paul Shoupe. This study is an expository study of ten of the most outstanding Bible Passages, including Genesis 3, Isaiah 53, Psalm 23, Romans 8, I Corinthians 13 and 15, and Revelation 4 and 5. Fifteen (15) people were enrolled in this Basic Curriculum study, three ministers and twelve laypersons.

This fall, course offerings are as follows:

RE 0264 - DYNAMICS OF TEACHING: A study of principles and methods of teaching youth and adults. One of the texts is Dr. Finley Edges' book, *TEACHING FOR RESULTS*. The cost is \$27.35. The teacher is Alan Richey.

NT 0173 - JOHN: A study of John's Gospel, "A Gospel of Witness." The cost is \$15.95. The teacher is W. Paul Shoupe.

Both of these courses are College Level studies and will require "LEARNING EXERCISES FOR EXAMINATIONS." The sessions will meet each Tuesday evening at the Associational Office, 7:00-9:00 P. M. beginning September 13th and continuing through November 8th.

CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE REPORT

The Constitution Committee of the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association will propose certain amendments to the present Constitution and Bylaws at the October meeting. These are:

Constitution

1. Change the Preamble to read:

We, the Baptist Churches of the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association, unite according to the plan and for the purpose and work of New Testament churches in our world. To this end and according to the following articles, we cooperate to the fullest extent possible with the State and Southern Baptist Convention and subscribe to the principles of the 1963 Baptist Faith and Message statement.

2. Change Article III, Section 2 to read:

The Association shall be sole judge of its membership and may receive churches, or reject churches, according to its Constitution and Bylaws. Member churches may withdraw from the Association as they desire. Any church in the Association which fails to cooperate with the Association shall, upon the recommendation of the Coordinating Council of the Association, be contacted by the Membership Committee to determine the intentions of the church regarding its remaining in the Association.

A cooperating church shall be defined as one which sends an annual report to the Association and messengers to Associational meetings, and contributes to the financial program of the Association.

Section 3 to read:

The Association shall withdraw fellowship from any church in its membership which shall be found to be disorderly in faith and practice, but not until written charges are brought against it, which charges shall have been authorized by the official act of the church offering the same, or by the Membership Committee of the Association. Thereafter, any such charges shall be carefully considered by the Association.

3. Change Article IV Section 2 to read:

The Moderator shall call a meeting of the pastor and one representative from each church approximately thirty days prior to any quarterly Associational meeting at which business is to be considered for the purpose of publicizing and discussing such matters as may be presented for vote at the Associational meeting. Special meetings may be called by the Moderator provided two weeks notice is given to the member churches.

Section 4 to read:

Each church is entitled to be represented by its pastor, other ordained ministers holding membership in the church, and such additional messengers as will permit a total of 10 messengers. Churches with more than 500

members are entitled to an additional messenger for each 100 members more than the initial 500. Messengers shall be elected annually for all Associational meetings. It is suggested that at least 5 of the messengers be leaders of individual church organizations.

4. Change Article VI Section 1 to read:

The officers of the Association shall be: Moderator (who shall also serve as Chairman of Group I - Associational Administration); Vice-Moderator (who shall also serve as Chairman of Group II - Fellowship and Mutual Care); Group Chairman III (Evangelism and Outreach); Group Chairman IV (Church Growth and Training); Group Chairman V (Associational Ministries); Clerk, Treasurer, Music Director, Auditor, Historian, Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, W.M.U. Director, Brotherhood Director, School of Christian Studies Director.

5. Change Article VI Section 3 to read:

Officers of the Association shall assume their duties at the close of the OCTOBER meeting, and shall serve until the next OCTOBER meeting, or until their successors are elected.

6. Change Article VIII to read:

The Coordinating Council shall be composed of the Moderator, the four Group Chairmen, and the Director of Missions. The Coordinating Council shall be responsible for coordinating and directing all the work of the Association including Long Range Planning. It shall meet monthly and, when appropriate, make reports and recommendations to the Association at scheduled meetings. The Moderator shall serve as Chairman of the Coordinating Council.

7. Change Article IX Section 1 to read:

The Association shall have the following standing Committees with terms of office being from the close of the October meeting through the following October meeting:

Add to Article IX Section 1. A:

12. School of Christian Studies Committee (Bylaw IV Section 16)

8. Change Article X Section 1 to read:

The employment of a Director of Missions shall follow the procedure outlined in Bylaw VI, Section 1, with the understanding that said person be extended an indefinite call and that a period of reasonable notice be given by either the missionary or the association in the event of termination of such employment.

9. Change Article X, Section 5 to read:

One-third of each committee shall be elected to serve a period of three years. Committees, or parts of committees, composed of organizational heads shall not be subject to rotation. No member shall succeed himself for more than one additional term. Vacancies occurring during the year may be filled immediately by the Coordinating Council.

BYLAWS

1. Bylaw II:

Section 2: Delete "Vice Moderator I" and add "Vice Moderator."

Section 3: Change to read:

Task Group III, "Evangelism and Outreach," shall be composed of Group Chairman III and the Evangelism Committee. It shall be responsible for planning and promoting evangelism and

outreach. It shall also plan the April meeting of the Association. The Director of Evangelism shall serve as Chairman of this group.

Section 4: Delete "Vice Moderator III" and add "Group Chairman IV."

Section 5: Delete "Vice Moderator IV" and "Group Chairman V."

2. Bylaw III:

Section 2: Change to read: The Vice Moderator shall preside in the absence, or at the pleasure, of the Moderator. In addition, the Vice Moderator shall serve on the Coordinating Council representing Task Group II.

Section 3: Change to read: Group Chairman III shall serve on the Coordinating Council representing Task Group III.

Section 4: Change to read: Group Chairman IV shall serve on the Coordinating Council representing Task Group IV.

Section 5: Change to read: Group Chairman V shall serve on the Coordinating Council representing Task Group V.

3. Bylaw IV:

Section 3: Delete "Vice Moderator III" and add "Group Chairman III."

Section 16: (NEW) ADD:

The School of Christian Studies Committee shall work with the Director of the School of Christian Studies to plan, promote, and implement the offering of such courses of study as will meet the needs of pastors and lay-persons in the areas of biblical studies, historical theology, Baptist life, church administration, Christian education, and pastoral training.

4. Bylaw VI:

Section 2. B: Change to read:

He shall make an annual report to the Association at the October meeting.

She has been a messenger to the association for sixty years. Presently, she is association historian, an office she has held for several years, and is serving a fourth term on the Board of Trustees of Mars Hill College. She has served as a member of the General Board of the Baptist State Convention.

In 1970 Madge was named Alumna of the Year by Mars Hill College. The words of this citation speak to every area of her life: "A talented, dedicated, loyal, generous individual whose personal and public life has reflected great credit to Mars Hill." Mrs. Sturdivant's well-disciplined mind, deep conviction, and courageous Christian faith give her power and authority when decisions need to be made in church, home or association.

HISTORY OF LEWIS FORK BAPTIST CHURCH 1975-1984

The history of Lewis Fork Baptist Church is recorded in the 1952 Associational Annual and the 1974 Associational Annual brings her history forward to that date. This report is concerned only with the period from 1974 to the present.

The church building has been completely air conditioned; a speaker and recording system has been installed. The Sunday School rooms have been redecorated; the parking lot has been enlarged; a parsonage has been purchased; and additional land has been purchased. A new organ and piano have been added to the sanctuary. A new piano was purchased for the choir room and a baptistry was installed. In 1976 the church acquired a Minister of Music and the current Minister of Music is Kent Burchette.

The average attendance rose from 128 in 1970 to 284 in 1984. The number of baptisms rose from 10 in 1970 to 31 in 1984. The membership of 210 in 1878 rose to 794 in 1984. Average Bible School attendance in 1984 was 303.

Lewis Fork has a fully graded Sunday School with Rev. Ray Loyola as Minister of Education. A Youth Ministry has been started with Jeff Campbell as Youth Director and a Youth Council made up of parents. The Senior Citizens organization meets each week for Bible Study, lunch, and other activities. The church sponsors Boy Scout and Girl Scout troops.

In the past 40 years only three pastors have served: Rev. A. W. Eller for 20 years, Rev. Glenn Huffman for 6 years, and Rev. Sherrill Wellborn, present pastor, since April, 1971. The deacons are: Vernon Dyer, chairman, Harold Blackburn, Clyde Blevins, Cecil Church, Pete Craven, Milton Goforth, Raynard Goforth, Demus Goulds, Frank Eller, Wayne Eller, Vernon Foster, Albert Holman, John Idol, Avery Triplett, and James Triplett.

Lewis Fork has ordained two young men into the ministry: Rex Foster in 1974 and Hadley Triplett in 1984. The church was voted Rural Church of the Year in North Carolina in 1979 by the state Grange organization.

HISTORY OF PLEASANT GROVE BAPTIST CHURCH

Pleasant Grove Baptist Church has had a very active period both in spiritual programs and physical construction. In 1975 Gordon Church was ordained into the ministry and added to the list of Monroe Huffman and Rex Eldreth who were ordained in 1970. Lyn Lambert was licensed October 14, 1981.

The deacons presently serving are: Jerry Hamby, Wade Parsons, Paul Johnson, Garvey Griffin, Richard Shatley, and Ken Pardue; inactive: Joe Parsons and J. R. Parsons.

Worship service and Sunday School are held each Sunday morning and worship service each Sunday evening. Wednesday night is Bible Study and Thursday night is visitation. Choir practice is held bi-monthly. Ladies Friendship Circle and deacon meetings are held monthly. Vacation Bible School and Homecoming meet once a year. The church has two revivals each year and one Bible Conference.

The church sets aside 10% of the regular offerings for missions, and are presently supporting six missionaries. They also contribute to Children's Home, Home for the Aging, Christian Action League of N. C. and Missions in the local community. In 1975 a parsonage was purchased at a cost of \$32,500.

In 1980 the church voted to construct a new church building. In February, 1981 construction began, and the congregation held the first service in July, 1981. The sanctuary has a seating capacity of 500. As of August 25, 1984, \$205,377.54 has been spent on this construction. The parking lot was paved and new parking area added. In 1980, a van was purchased for use in the church ministry.

Pleasant Grove Baptist Church was established in 1884 and applied for membership in Brushy Mountain Association in 1889.

The general church officers are as follows: Clerk - Kenneth Pardue; Treasurer - Glenn Dameron, Jr.; Sunday School Director - Les Dyer; Chairman of Deacons - Richard Shatley; Music Director - Paul Johnson; Director of Musicians - Shirley Hamby; Musicians - Bobbi Jean Church and Wanda Marlow.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE

We, the Baptist Churches of the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association, unite according to the plan and for the purpose and work of New Testament churches in our world. To this end and according to the following articles, we cooperate to the fullest extent possible with the State and Southern Baptist Convention and subscribe to the principles of the 1963 Baptist Faith and Message statement.

ARTICLE I — NAME

This body shall be known as the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association of North Carolina.

ARTICLE II — PURPOSE

It shall be the purpose of this association to consider and promote measures for increasing the harmony, the knowledge and the spiritual life of the churches and for developing and directing their energies and their contributions in the advancement of Christ's kingdom throughout the earth, always in harmony with the teachings of the New Testament. This association shall be an auxiliary of the North Carolina Baptist State Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention in all their missionary, educational and benevolent work.

It shall be the purpose of the Association (1) to provide the mutual encouragement and fellowship of member churches through the definition and practice of Baptist distinctives; (2) to consistently seek to confront everyone in our area with the claims of Christ on his/her life; (3) to encourage and facilitate church growth and development; (4) to promote participation in missions and ministries on the foreign field, in the homeland, in the state, and in the area of the association; (5) to provide services to the churches as needed and desired; (6) to provide an additional channel by which member churches may participate in the Southern Baptist Convention.

ARTICLE III — MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1. The Association shall be composed of cooperating Baptist churches desiring to affiliate with it. Any church desiring to become a member of the Association shall present, through messengers chosen for that purpose, its request for membership on APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP provided in the minutes along with a UNIFORM ASSOCIATIONAL LETTER provided by the clerk at any annual session of the body. The Moderator shall refer the church to the Committee on Membership for study and investigation. The church maintains for the year the status of associate membership until the committee makes its recommendation. If favorable, it will be received into full membership with all the rights and privileges at the next annual session. If the Association then votes to receive the church, the moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the messengers.

SECTION 2. The Association shall be sole judge of its membership and may receive churches, or reject churches, according to its Constitution and Bylaws. Member churches may withdraw from the Association as they desire. Any church in the Association which fails to cooperate with the Association shall, upon the recommendation of the Coordinating Council of the Association, be contacted by the Membership Committee to determine the intentions of the church regarding its remaining in the Association.

A cooperating church shall be defined as one which sends an annual report to the Association and messengers to Associational meetings, and contributes to the financial program of the Association.

SECTION 3. The Association shall withdraw fellowship from any church in its membership which shall be found to be disorderly in faith and practice, but not until written charges are brought against it, which charges shall have been authorized by the official act of the church offering the same, or by the Membership Committee of the Association. Thereafter, any such charges shall be carefully considered by the Association.

ARTICLE IV — MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The Association shall meet quarterly on the Monday after the first Sunday in January, April, and July. In October the Association shall meet on Monday and Tuesday after the first Sunday.

SECTION 2. The Moderator shall call a meeting of the pastor and one representative from each church approximately thirty days prior to any quarterly Associational meeting at which business is to be considered for the purpose of publicizing and discussing such matters as may be presented for vote at the Associational meeting. Special meetings may be called by the Moderator provided two weeks notice is given to the member churches.

SECTION 3. In case of emergency, the Coordinating Council shall have the authority to change the time and/or place of meetings, and shall be responsible for providing churches with sufficient notice of change.

SECTION 4. Each church is entitled to be represented by its pastor, other ordained ministers holding membership in the church, and such additional messengers as will permit a total of 10 messengers. Churches with more than 500 members are entitled to an additional messenger for each 100 members more than the initial 500. Messengers shall be elected annually for all Associational meetings. It is suggested that at least 5 of the messengers be leaders of individual church organizations.

ARTICLE V — AUTHORITY

While independent and sovereign in its own sphere, the Association does not claim, and will never attempt to exercise any authority over any other Baptist body, whether church or auxiliary organization.

ARTICLE VI — OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTION

SECTION 1. The officers of the Association shall be: Moderator (who shall also serve as Chairman of Group I — Associational Administration); Vice-Moderator (who shall also serve as Chairman of Group II — Fellowship and Mutual Care); Group Chairman III (Evangelism and Outreach); Group

Chairman IV (Church Growth and Training); Group Chairman V (Associational Ministries); Clerk, Treasurer, Music Director, Auditor, Historian, Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, Woman's Missionary Union Director, Brotherhood Director, and School of Christian Studies Director.

SECTION 2. The officers of the Association shall be elected at the April meeting of the Association for a term of one year. Officers shall be contacted and nominated by the Committee on Nominations (Bylaw IV, Section 7).

SECTION 3. Officers shall assume their duties at the close of the October meeting and serve until the next October meeting, or until their successors are elected.

SECTION 4. Any person having served two terms as Moderator shall be ineligible for re-election for a period of two years.

ARTICLE VII — TRUSTEES AND THEIR ELECTION

There shall be three Trustees of the Association, one of whom should be an attorney. Trustess shall be elected for an indefinite term and shall serve at the pleasure of the Association.

ARTICLE VIII — THE COORDINATING COUNCIL

The Coordinating Council shall be composed of the Moderator, the four Group Chairmen, and the Director of Missions. The Coordinating Council shall be responsible for coordinating and directing all the work of the Association, including Long Range Planning. It shall meet monthly and, when appropriate, make reports and recommendations to the Association at scheduled meetings. The Moderator shall serve as Chairman of the Coordinating Council.

ARTICLE IX — COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. The Association shall have the following standing Committees with terms of office being from the close of the October meeting through the following October meeting:

A. To be nominated by the Committee on Committees and elected at the April meeting:

1. Committee on Personnel (Bylaw IV, Section 1)
2. Committee on Missions (Bylaw IV, Section 2)
3. Committee on Evangelism (Bylaw IV, Section 3)
4. Committee on Finance (Bylaw IV, Section 4)
5. Committee on Ordinations (Bylaw IV, Section 5)
6. Committee on Memorials (Bylaw IV, Section 6)
7. Committee on Nominations (Bylaw IV, Section 7)
8. Committee on Constitution (Bylaw IV, Section 8)
9. Committee on Membership (Bylaw IV, Section 9)
10. Committee on Properties (Bylaw IV, Section 14)
11. Committee on Calendar (Bylaw IV, Section 15)
12. School of Christian Studies Committee (Bylaw IV, Section 16)

B. To be appointed by the Moderator at the April meeting:

1. Committee on Committees (Bylaw IV, Section 10)
2. Committee on Enrollment (Bylaw IV, Section 13)

SECTION 2. The following committees shall be appointed by the Moderator at least 30 days prior to the October meeting to serve during the October meeting:

1. Committee on Place and Preacher (Bylaw IV, Section 11)
2. Committee on Resolutions (Bylaw IV, Section 12)

ARTICLE X — GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 1. The employment of a Director of Missions shall follow the procedure outlined in Bylaw VI, Section 1, with the understanding that said person be extended an indefinite call and that a period of reasonable notice be given by either the missionary or the Association in the event of termination of such employment.

SECTION 2. The Director of Missions shall be empowered to procure and supervise necessary secretarial and janitorial personnel for the proper operation and maintenance of the Associational office, provided that funds for the hiring and salary of such personnel have been included within the current year's budget.

SECTION 3. All questions of order not herein provided for shall be decided according to ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER, Revised.

SECTION 4. Amendments to this Constitution may be made at any annual session upon vote of two-thirds of the members present, provided that such amendments be presented on the first day of the annual session and voted upon the second day.

SECTION 5. ROTATING OF COMMITTEES. One-third of each committee shall be elected to serve a period of three years. Committees or parts of committees, composed of organizational heads shall not be subject to rotation. No member shall succeed himself for more than one additional term. Vacancies occurring during the year may be filled immediately by the Coordinating Council.

SECTION 6. SPECIAL ADVISORS. The Moderator and Director of Missions will serve on all committees of the Association as special advisors.

BYLAWS

BYLAW I GENERAL

SECTION 1. The Association shall convene as provided by the Constitution (Article IV, Section 1).

SECTION 2. Each session of the Association shall be opened with religious exercise.

SECTION 3. A majority of the members present shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business except the matter of making changes in the Constitution.

SECTION 4. Any member wishing to speak shall rise and address the Moderator, shall confine himself strictly to the question under consideration, and avoid the use of unnecessary personalities.

SECTION 5. The members shall observe toward the officers and towards one another such courtesies as are becoming to Christians.

SECTION 6. The annual Associational year, for the purpose of reporting statistical information, shall be September 1 to August 31, inclusive.

BYLAW II ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

The organizational structure of the Association shall be divided into five Task Groups. Each Task Group shall meet quarterly and make reports to the Coordinating Council as needed.

SECTION 1. Task Group I, "Associational Administration," shall be composed of the Moderator, Clerk, Trustees, Treasurer, and Committees on Personnel, Finance, and Properties. Task Group I shall oversee all administrative functions of the Association, including employing and/or discharging staff personnel, budget planning, and use and maintenance of Associational property and equipment.

SECTION 2. Task Group II, "Fellowship and Mutual Care," shall be composed of the Vice Moderator, Committees on Membership, Ordination, and Memorials, the President of the Pastor's Conference of the Association, and the General Board Representative. Task Group II shall seek to enrich fellowship within and between churches in the Association and it shall be responsible for planning the January meeting of the Association.

SECTION 3. Task Group III, "Evangelism and Outreach," shall be composed of Group Chairman III and the Evangelism Committee. It shall be responsible for planning and promoting evangelism and outreach. It shall also plan the April meeting of the Association. The Director of Evangelism shall serve as Chairman of this group.

SECTION 4. Task Group IV, "Church Growth and Training," shall be composed of Group Chairman IV, Associational Directors of Music, Sunday School, Church Training, Brotherhood and Woman's Missionary Union. It shall be the responsibility of Task Group IV to coordinate leadership training and to encourage church growth. It shall also be responsible for planning an annual calendar and the July meeting of the Association.

SECTION 5. Task Group V, "Associational Ministries," shall be composed of Group Chairman V, and the Committee on Missions. It shall seek to discover, implement, and maintain Associational ministries. It shall also be responsible for planning the October meeting of the Association, including the preparation of a printed program which shall be sent to all persons on the program and to all pastors at least 30 days prior to the October meeting. It shall, in the opening session of the October meeting of the Association, present the printed program for adoption.

BYLAW III DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. Moderator

The Moderator shall preside during meetings of the Association according to the Constitution and Bylaws, serve on the Coordinating Council as Moderator of Task Group I, appoint Committee on Committees, Place and Preachers, Resolutions, and Enrollment. The Moderator shall serve also as Ex-Officio member of all other committees.

SECTION 2. Vice Moderator

The Vice Moderator shall preside in the absence, or at the pleasure, of the Moderator. In addition, the Vice Moderator shall serve on the Coordinating Council Representing Task Group II.

SECTION 3. Group Chairman III

Group Chairman III shall serve on the Coordinating Council representing Task Group III.

SECTION 4. Group Chairman IV

Group Chairman IV shall serve on the Coordinating Council representing Task Group IV.

SECTION 5. Group Chairman V

Group Chairman V shall serve on the Coordinating Council representing Task Group V.

SECTION 6. Clerk

The Clerk shall provide annual report forms at least 30 days before the October meeting, distribute at the October meeting copies of a digest of these reports, make an accurate record of the proceedings of the Association, supervise the printing and distribution of minutes, records, and other documents of the Association, and serve also as secretary of the Coordinating Council.

SECTION 7. Treasurer

The Treasurer shall receive and bank all funds of the Association in the name of the Association; disburse the same upon instructions from the Association, its Coordinating Council, or as designated in the budget; render an accurate report of receipts and disbursements and distribute same at the October meeting; give an oral report at each quarterly meeting; and keep books available and up to date for examination.

The Treasurer shall serve as a member of the Committees on Finance and Missions.

The Chairman of the Committee on Finance shall have the authority to act for the Treasurer in the event the Treasurer is incapacitated.

SECTION 8. Music Director

The Music Director shall be in charge of the music program of the Association during and between Associational meetings.

SECTION 9. Auditor

The Auditor shall, at the close of the fiscal year, make an audit of the Treasurer's records.

SECTION 10. Historian

The Historian, in his sole discretion, shall collect facts of interest to the Association and the cooperating churches, and shall make a report to each annual session of the association.

SECTION 11. Organizational Directors

Associational Directors of the Sunday School, Church Training, Brotherhood, and Woman's Missionary Union shall be in charge of their respective organizations during their tenure of service.

BYLAW IV DUTIES OF COMMITTEES**SECTION 1. Committee on Personnel**

The Committee on Personnel shall be composed of six members, each of whom will serve a tenure of three years, with two members rotating off the Committee each year. The Committee will prepare and update, as necessary,

position descriptions of all Associational staff personnel, excluding the Director of Missions whose responsibilities are described by Bylaw VI. It shall survey the need for additional staff positions; recruit, interview, and recommend to the Association or its Coordinating Council new employed personnel; and, when necessary, recommend to the Coordinating Council the termination of employment of staff personnel. The Committee shall review annually salaries and benefits, and make recommendations to the Finance Committee. It shall review at least annually the performance of each employee, receive any grievance, and otherwise seek to promote harmonious relationships between all employees of the Association.

SECTION 2. Committee on Missions

(1) The Committee on Missions shall be composed of one representative each from Associational Brotherhood, Woman's Missionary Union, the Treasurer, the Director of each Associational ministry, and three additional members elected by the Association to serve three years on a rotating basis. It shall work with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of the Association, and lead and assist in organizing new churches and in beginning new mission stations.

(2) Upon request, the Committee on Missions shall advise any group seeking to organize a new church. The Committee will be available to any church desiring assistance with problems.

(3) When without a Director of Missions this Committee shall seek out and recommend to the Association or its Coordinating Council for election a new Director of Missions according to Bylaws VI, Section 1.

SECTION 3. Committee on Evangelism

The Committee on Evangelism, composed of three members, shall promote the work of Evangelism within the Association in cooperation with the State Department of Evangelism. All plans and programs shall be subject to approval by the Association or its Coordinating Council. The Evangelism Committee shall be chaired by the Director of Evangelism who will also serve as Group Chairman III.

SECTION 4. Committee on Finance

A. The Committee on Finance, composed of six members and the Treasurer, shall study the Association's financial needs for an adequate program, prepare and present a budget to the Association for the following year, devise and develop plans for securing the cooperation of churches in providing funds to meet the budget, and make a written report at the October meeting.

B. In the event it becomes necessary to borrow funds for current operating expenses of the Association, the Committee on Finance is authorized to instruct the Trustees to secure by loan an amount not to exceed 10% of the annual budget for a period not to exceed 90 days, and to renew the loan as needed.

SECTION 5. Committee on Ordinations

The Committee on Ordinations, composed of seven ministers, shall when requested by a member church, assist with the examination and ordination of candidates for the Gospel Ministry. Churches wishing to ordain ministers are requested to place their candidates before the committee at least thirty days prior to the date set for ordination for examination on the following principles:

- a. Christian experience or conversion
- b. Call to the ministry
- c. Attitude toward denominational work and objects
- d. Support of denominational causes

- e. Moral and spiritual fitness
- f. Doctrinal beliefs
- g. Knowledge of the Bible

Candidates are to be ordained with the assistance of this committee only when they are serving a church or churches as pastor or having been called as pastor of a Baptist church of like faith and practice with those member churches of this association.

No candidate for ordination shall be considered by the committee who has not been a member of a cooperating church for at least one year. The committee shall consider only male members for ordination.

Candidates are to be urged to prepare themselves for the ministry as far as possible in Baptist institutions of Higher Learning.

This committee shall not recommend any candidate for ordination whom they feel will not bring honor and esteem to the Lord, to Southern Baptists and to the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association.

Recommendations will be made by the committee to the church where the candidate holds membership. The committee will assist the church in the ordination service at a time convenient to the church and to the members of the committee if such assistance is desired.

SECTION 6. Committee on Memorials

The Committee on Memorials, composed of three members, shall bring a report at the October meeting and lead in a memorial service in memory of those reported by the churches as deceased since the last annual meeting.

SECTION 7. Committee on Nominations

The Committee on Nominations, composed of seven members, shall contact and nominate at the April meeting of the Association the officers and trustees of the Association according to Article VI and VII of the Constitution.

SECTION 8. Committee on Constitution

The Committee on Constitution, composed of five members, shall be available to study any changes or revisions in the Constitution, and to make recommendations as needed to keep the Constitution in line with the policies and programs of the Association.

SECTION 9. Committee on Membership

The Committee on Membership, composed of five members, shall perform the duties as set forth in the Constitution, Article III.

SECTION 10. Committee on Committees

The Committee on Committees, composed of seven members, shall be appointed as set forth in the Constitution (Article IX, Section 1), and shall nominate persons to be elected by the Association to serve on all standing Committees.

SECTION 11. Committee on Place and Preachers

The Committee on Place and Preachers, composed of three members, shall receive or solicit invitations for the place or places for meetings of the Association, and shall recommend the places. It shall also recommend the Preachers and alternates for the annual sermons.

SECTION 12. Committee on Resolutions

The Committee on Resolutions, composed of three members, shall draw up and present to the Association at the October meeting resolutions of appreciation and any other resolutions it may deem expedient.

SECTION 13. Committee on Enrollment

The Committee on Enrollment, composed of five members, shall prepare for and direct the enrollment of messengers at all sessions of Associational meetings. Each messenger shall be enrolled only once during the October meeting. This Committee shall be prepared to report on enrollment when called for during meetings.

SECTION 14. Properties Committee

The Properties Committee, composed of three members, shall be responsible for the maintenance of all properties owned or leased by the Association or its Trustees.

SECTION 15. The Calendar Committee

The Calendar Committee shall be composed of the following Associational officers: Director of Missions, Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, W.M.U. Director, Brotherhood Director, Director of Music Ministry, and president of the Ministers Conference. This committee shall prepare an associational calendar for the year, and present same to the annual meeting, for adoption. This calendar shall be included in the annual.

SECTION 16. School of Christian Studies Committee

The School of Christian Studies Committee shall work with the Director of the School of Christian Studies to plan, promote, and implement the offering of such courses of study as will meet the needs of pastors and lay-persons in the areas of biblical studies, historical theology, Baptist life, church administration, Christian education, and pastoral training.

BYLAW V TRUSTEES

The legal title to all real and personal property of the Association shall be vested in the trustees and their successors in such office. The said trustees may convey said property legal instruments pursuant to resolutions adopted and approved by the Association or its Coordinating Council. They shall handle all legal matters of the Association under the direction of the said Association or its Coordinating Council. See Article VII of the Constitution.

BYLAW VI DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS

SECTION 1. The Director of Missions shall be elected upon a recommendation of the Committee on Missions, and by vote of the Association at a regularly scheduled meeting. The relationship between the Association and its Director of Missions may be terminated following a reasonable notice given by either party.

SECTION 2. The Director of Missions shall promote the work and witness of the Association and Denomination, cooperating with the churches, their pastors and officers, and Associational committees and organizations.

A. He shall be responsible for planning, promoting, and executing the ministry of the Association in cooperation with the Coordinating Council and the Committee on Missions.

B. He shall make an annual report to the Association at the October meeting.

C. He shall be an ex-officio member of all committees of the Association, serving in an advisory and/or resource capacity.

D. He shall seek to visit each church in the Association in order to:

- (1) Enrich Christian fellowship among the churches.
- (2) Encourage and strengthen the ministry of the churches.

(3) Enhance the cooperative relationship between the churches and the Association.

E. He shall, when necessary, conduct surveys or inquiries in order to determine specific needs for ministry within the area of the Association.

F. He shall, upon request, provide a list of qualified persons who may be considered by churches seeking pastors.

G. He shall have full administrative responsibility for all personnel employed by the Association.

SECTION 3.

A. The Director of Missions is entitled to two weeks vacation annually. Upon completion of five years service, the Director of Missions shall be entitled to three weeks annual vacation. Vacation is to be taken within the calendar year, and it is not accumulative.

B. The Director of Missions is entitled to 30 days sick leave per calendar year, sick leave is not to be taken as vacation, and it is not accumulative.

C. The Director of Missions is entitled to four weeks per calendar year which he may use at his discretion for personal enrichment, professional development, and speaking engagements or revivals outside the Association. This time is not accumulative.

SECTION 4. Should there occur at any time a grievance on the part of the Association or the Director of Missions, either party may consult with the Moderator and Chairmen of the Missions and Personnel Committees.

BYLAW VII ANNUAL REPORTS

Persons who are to bring reports to the October meeting of the Association shall present the same to the Director of Missions or Clerk two weeks prior to the October meeting in order for these to be included in the Book of Reports.

BYLAW VIII AMENDMENTS

Amendments to the Bylaws may be made at any session of the October meeting of the Association when presented in writing and approved by a majority of the messengers present and voting.

PROCEEDINGS

of the ONE HUNDRED THIRTEENTH ANNUAL MEETING

1. The 113th annual session of the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association was called to order at 4 p.m. on October 1, 1984 by the moderator, Rev. Sherrill Wellborn, at Lewis Fork Baptist Church.

2. The congregational hymn "Praise Him, Praise Him" was led by Bill McKinney, accompanied by Craig Little at the piano.

3. Lewis Fork Pastor, Sherrill Wellborn, welcomed the messengers and guests.

4. Devotions were led by Rev. Pat Fortner with scripture from II Timothy 4.

5. Missions Committee Chairman, Rev. Jim Gore, recommended the adoption of the program as printed with minor modifications as needed. Motion carried.

6. The moderator announced that all committee positions had been filled, therefore, there was no need for other appointments.

7. Business Session

A. The Evangelism Report, presented by Rev. Paul Hugger, Evangelism Director, was adopted as printed in the Book of Reports. Rev. Hugger stated that evangelism is the most important work the Lord has commissioned us to do. He also reported that churches in the association had reached more people this year than last year and that on an average it had taken 49 people to lead one person to Christ. He invited all who would to stay for a special time of prayer after the evening sessions.

B. The Missions Report was given by Rev. Jim Gore and moved for adoption. Report accepted. Area missionary, Jim Lambert, spoke on North Carolina missions calling attention to the different ministries supported by our gifts to state missions. He commented on four associations in Wilkes County that are working together to further missions.

C. The Ordination Committee Report, presented for adoption by Rev. Alfred Andrews, stated that the committee had examined Hadley Triplett and recommended that he be ordained by Lewis Fork Baptist Church. Report adopted.

D. The Properties Committee Report was given by Chairman Clyde Bumgarner. Report accepted.

E. Director of Missions, Bill McKinney, called attention to the Calendar of Activities for 1984-85 and moved its adoption as printed with any changes which need to be made because of later conflicts. Motion carried.

F. The Dedication of Annuals Committee Report given by chairman, J. R. Priester, recommended that the 1984 Annual be dedicated to Mrs. Madge Sturdivant because of her service to the Association over a period of many years.

G. Mrs. Madge Sturdivant, Associational Historian, called attention to the histories of Lewis Fork and Pleasant Grove Baptist Churches in the Book of Reports and moved for adoption as printed. Motion carried.

H. Rev. Paul Shoupe gave a report on the School of Christian Studies calling attention to a study in Revelation this fall at Liberty Grove and another in the spring of '85 on the life and faith of Baptists to be taught by Dr. William

McKinney at the association office. Rev. Shoupe moved the adoption of the report printed in the Book of Reports. The motion carried.

I. The Nominating Committee Report was given by Rev. Elliott Hayes noting vacancies that had been filled: Group Chairman IV, Jack Calloway; WMU Director, Mabel Couch; Prayer Ministry Chairman, James Craig. Report accepted.

J. The Committee on Committees Report was given by Rev. Alfred Andrews. Vacancies filled: Evangelism Committee, Fred McNeil; Membership Committee, Brent Eller; Nominating Committee, Ray Wellborn; Ordination Committee, Rev. Bill Nicholson, Rev. Pat Fortner; Personnel Committee, Rev. Hunter Church; Committee on Committees, Scott Church, chairman. Report accepted.

K. The Treasurer's Report, given by Manson Alley in the absence of the treasurer, was adopted as printed.

L. The Finance Committee Report was presented by chairman Manson Alley. Mr. Alley expressed his appreciation for the efficiency and cooperation of the treasurer, Mrs. Norma Jean Wood. The report was accepted as printed.

8. Director of Missions, Bill McKinney, moved the adoption of the NC Baptist Hospital Report. Brother Calvin Knight, Denominational Relations, Baptist Hospital, was introduced to speak to the report.

9. Rev. L. J. Culler gave the Membership Committee Report: Mt. Carmel and Cricket have voted to withdraw from the Association; there were only two churches that had not contributed financially to the Association this year; Parkway Garden on Armory Road has made application for membership in the Association. Rev. Bill McKinney recommended a special motion to accept Parkway Garden under watchcare. Motion was made and accepted by a standing vote. Parkway Garden was well represented by pastor Gwyn Kilby and several members.

Rev. Culler also called attention to the Baptist Foundation Report and moved its adoption. Accepted.

10. The congregation joined in singing "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms."

11. Moderator Wellborn introduced the special music and the speaker for the evening. Mrs. Nancy Land sang "O Lord, Our Lord, How Majestic is Your Name" accompanied at the piano by Craig Little.

12. Rev. Monroe Huffman, pastor of Harmony Church, brought an inspiring and challenging message on the "Principles of the Church" with scripture from Acts 6:1-7.

13. Rev. James Weaver announced the availability of Rev. Joe Hewitt to speak in the churches (dates are given in the second day's proceedings). Rev. Hewitt is an ex-Jehovah's Witness, born-again Christian, who would like to share his message.

14. Benediction and blessing for the evening meal was given by Rev. Olin Barker.

15. The meeting was reconvened at 7 p.m. with the singing of congregational hymn "When we all get to Heaven" led by Kent Burchette, accompanied by Craig Little at the piano and Christine Holman at the organ.

16. Rev. Sherrill Wellborn again welcomed the messengers and James Rhoades led in devotion using Acts 4:31.

17. Moderator Wellborn introduced new pastors in the Association during the past year: Rev. Jerry Reavis, Davis Memorial; Rev. Bob Seatz and Mrs. Seatz, Beaver Creek; Rev. Bill Nicholson and Mrs. Nicholson, Bethany; Rev.

Raytee Greene and Mrs. Greene, Elk; Rev. Pat Fortner, Goshen; Rev. Olin Barker, North Wilkesboro Second; Rev. James Rhoades, Pilgrim; Rev. Dennis Dillard, Poplar Grove; Rev. Gwyn Kilby and Mrs. Kilby, Parkway Garden; Rev. Ben Johnson, Rocky Creek. Interim Pastors now serving: Rev. Smoot Baker, Hinshaw Street; Rev. J. W. Myers, Oakwoods; Scott Church and J. T. Vannoy III, Purlear. Roaring River and Stony Hill are currently without pastors.

Rev. McKinney reported that Doug Wood had returned home from the hospital, on Dean Dillard's condition and that I. V. and Mabel Couch are now at home in Millers Creek.

18. The Sunday School Report was given by Rev. Lawrence Goodman. He stated that out of a population of 59,838 in Wilkes County, 6,940, or 11.6%, are enrolled in Brushy Mountain Association Sunday schools. Population has increased over 1983 by 1,300 while Sunday school enrollment increased by 112. A report on the churches which were involved in the Sunday School Enlargement Campaign in 1983 showed an increase in both enrollment and attendance while churches that did not participate remained about the same. In 1983, the eight churches have 2,215 enrolled and in 1984, 2,445 enrolled, a gain of 230. The eight churches had a gain of 110 in average attendance; more than the rest of the churches combined. Rev. Goodman stated that the most important figure is enrollment and challenged everyone, pastors first, to enroll five new people in Sunday school in '85. The report was adopted.

19. The Church Training Report was adopted as printed.

20. The Women's Missionary Union Report was moved for adoption by Mrs. Betty Pardue. She stated that less than one half the churches in the Association have WMU and encouraged the ones that do not to prayerfully consider organizing WMU. This year's emphasis is "Strengthening the Family." Report accepted.

21. Mr. Clinton Call presented the Brotherhood Report and a challenge to pray about a Brotherhood Organization in each church. Fifteen churches have a Brotherhood at the present time. The report was adopted.

22. The Music Report was given by Craig Little, Associational Music Director, and adopted as printed in the Book of Reports.

23. During the business session, Rev. Jim Gore gave a report on the West Virginia project and made the following motion:

"The associational missions committee recommends that we re-affirm our commitment regarding the the final year of our three-year commitment to the West Virginia mission project.

"Financially, this means we re-affirm our commitment of \$500.00 monthly for housing and utilities until a pastor is in the field at which time we are committed to an additional \$500.00 monthly for support.

"Spiritually, this means we re-affirm our commitment as individuals and churches to pray earnestly for this ministry and that we make ourselves available to help in this work.

"Brother Moderator, the missions committee brings this recommendation as a motion to our association." Motion carried.

Rev. James Craig, Prayer Ministry Chairman, announced he had enlisted five people to help lead in a prayer campaign. (List of leaders and churches are shown elsewhere in this annual.) Rev. Craig recommended these leaders be accepted by the Association. Moved and accepted.

24. Special music was presented by Craig Little, Kent Burchette, Linda

Bentley and Bill Mastin. They sang "I Go to the Rock of My Salvation" and "Spirit Song."

25. Rev. Sherrill Wellborn brought the moderator's message, "What Does It Really Mean To Be A Member Of The Church?" Scripture: II Corinthians 5:17.

26. Dismissal prayer was led by Rev. Bob Seatz, pastor of Beaver Creek Church.

SECOND DAY

27. The second day of the 113th annual meeting was called to order by Moderator Sherrill Wellborn at 7:00 p.m. on October 2, 1984 at Pleasant Grove Baptist Church.

28. Pastor Phil Chapman welcomed the messengers and urged everyone to register and vote against beer and wine in the November election.

29. Rev. Jerry Reavis of Davis Memorial Baptist Church read devotions from Luke 12:37 and John 14:1 and had a prayer.

30. Moderator Sherrill Wellborn announced changes in the evening program. Due to illness of Rev. Dean Dillard, Rev. Bill McKinney will be speaking in his place and representatives from Baptist Children's Homes (Ms. Donna Lail) and Wake Forest University (Dr. David L. Smiley) will speak in Dr. McKinney's place.

31. Special music was presented by Mr. Hal Melton who sang "Fill My Cup Lord" accompanied by Mr. Craig Little at the piano, and Charles and Lib Billings, Kent Burchette and Craig Little, who sang "Lovest Thou Me More Than These" also with Craig Little at the piano.

32. The evening message was brought by Director of Missions Bill McKinney. The topic was: "God's Church: Dry-eyed and Tongue-tied in a Hell-bound World." Scripture texts used were II Kings 6:28-30, II Kings 7:3-9 with further references to Jeremiah 8:18-9:2; Romans 5:1-2, 6-11; and I Peter 1:18-2:10.

33. The congregation joined in singing "I Am Thine O Lord."

34. Business Session:

A. Rev. Bob Seatz brought a recommendation from the Evangelism Committee as follows:

The Evangelism Committee of the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association recommends that the churches of the association agree to pray for and work together to accomplish Spirit-anointed, simultaneous revival.

Namely, that the pastors agree to come together as often as weekly to pray for unity in and among the churches with a view toward showing the lost in our county the spirit and love of our Lord Jesus, that our churches agree to pray for a spiritual awakening all across our land, especially in Wilkes County; that we, as an association of churches, agree to participate in the convention-wide 1986 "GOOD NEWS AMERICA — GOD LOVES YOU" Simultaneous Revival effort; that on March 23-30, 1986, we, as an association of churches, will conduct simultaneous meetings; and in preparation for these meetings give priority to the October 20-26, 1985, Evangelistic People Search and Scripture Distribution campaign.

The motion to accept these recommendations was adopted.

B. Moderator Wellborn announced that Rev. Joe Hewitt, a former Jehovah's Witness will be speaking at Gordon Baptist Church at 11:00 a.m. on October 14. On the same day, he will be at Lewis Fork Baptist Church at 2:30

p.m. and at Moravian Falls Baptist Church at 7:00 p.m. On October 15, Rev. Hewitt will be at Parkway Garden Baptist Church at 7:00 p.m., on October 16 at Gordon Baptist Church at 7:00 p.m. and on October 17 at Purlear Baptist Church at 7:00 p.m.

C. Moderator Wellborn asked for other business. There was none.

35. Moderator Wellborn recognized Mr. Eugene Puckett, editor of the *Biblical Recorder*, to give his report. Reference was made to Mr. Neil Peyton "The voice of the *Biblical Recorder*," whose son was found dead. Open house and dedication of their new office building will be on October 9 - the facility is entirely debt free.

36. Moderator Wellborn recognized Ms. Donna Lail from the Baptist Children's Homes who will be changing their name to the Hickory-Lenoir Family Services Center. Ms. Lail urged everyone to read the report in the Book of Reports.

37. The next speaker was Dr. David L. Smiley, a professor at Wake Forest University. Dr. Smiley made some announcements and urged participation in the Poteat Scholarship program, which is supervised in this county by District Chairman, Rev. Bill Rogers of the First Baptist Church of North Wilkesboro. Dr. Smiley urged everyone to read I Corinthians 12, II Timothy 2:15 and Philippians 4.

38. The Resolutions Committee Report was given by Mr. Tom Vannoy (report is printed elsewhere in this book).

39. Mr. Charles Proffit gave the Memorials Committee report. There were 83 deaths last year.

40. Rev. Gwyn Kilby said "Thanks" to all the churches and people for their support in establishing Parkway Garden Baptist Church. Rev. Kilby then gave the benediction and the meeting was adjourned.

save thousands of dollars which would have been paid out in interest on a long-term note. For each dollar raised through a TOGETHER WE BUILD program, it means more than two dollars saved. This enables the church to support present and new programs and ministries. The church has also experienced significant spiritual benefit. The pastor said, "We have had more spiritual response during the TOGETHER WE BUILD program than in the past twelve months. Many believers have in fact experienced Christian revival."

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL REPORT

Reporting of Vacation Bible School activity continues to present a problem. Up to the date of this report we had twenty-six of forty churches reporting — sixty-five percent. It appears from the reports received that enrollment was down some seven percent from last year's figures. Perhaps the statistics will look better when all reports are obtained.

Two churches reported significant increases in VBS enrollment and are to be strongly commended for their efforts: Gordon Baptist Church had a twenty-one percent increase over last year, and Moravian Falls Baptist Church has a whopping fifty-four percent increase this year. We strongly commend these two churches for their VBS outreach. Ten churches reported a total of sixty-eight professions of faith. Lewis Fork led in evangelism with twenty-four professions, Millers Creek was second with seventeen, and Fishing Creek was third with nine professions of faith. We urge all churches to continue their efforts in VBS and to give special attention to evangelism and to reporting of results.

CHURCH TRAINING REPORT

Due to the enthusiasm and dedicated work of Gail Calloway, 1984 was an excellent year in the area of Bible Skills competition. Several of our children and youth were successful in regional and state tournaments. We are working to involve more churches in this activity.

The program emphasis for 1984-85 is "Developing Believers." Church Training continues to stress Baptist doctrine, new church member training, leadership training, church history, and Christian ethics. The Dynamic Doctrines curriculum will deal with the doctrines of Christ, the Holy Spirit, the church, and the last things. Other emphases are Christian witness training, the Christian home, and evangelism.

Many new resources in the form of Equipping Centers are now available in all of the areas of emphasis mentioned above. Survival Kit II is now available for further Christian life development. We encourage all of our churches to engage in **some** form of training during the coming year.

BROTHERHOOD REPORT

Baptist men continue to be deeply involved in North Carolina and global ministries. This year more than 1,500 lay persons did missions in West Virginia. Others were involved in New York, Ohio, and other strategic locations, and more than 100 lay persons went on mission service to other countries. More than 2,000 men were involved in 50 lay-led revivals and 25 lay renewal weekends. Ministries were continued in prison units and in combatting pornography, alcohol, and drug use. The Disaster Relief van was completed and placed in service . . . its first use was in the tornado-ravaged area of Eastern North Carolina. Baptist Men's organizations worked with over 31,000 boys in RA programs. Medical missions teams went out to Antigua, Nigeria, and Brazil, and individual physicians, surgeons, and dentists served in other parts of the world.

Projects for 1985 include continued work in West Virginia; establishing Prayer Ministry units in churches across the state; overseas mission teams for

medical ministries, construction, and evangelism; continuing activity in moral issues; lay evangelism and lay renewal projects, agricultural mission involvement in Togo; and strengthened work with RA boys. Mission education and mission involvement are top priority concerns of North Carolina Baptist Brotherhood.

WOMAN'S MISSIONARY UNION REPORT

The WMU Leadership Conference was sponsored by our association in September to better prepare directors and leaders of age-group levels in each church. On November 17, 1983 at the Moravian Falls Baptist Church there was an associational Foreign Mission Study, which included Brotherhood and R.A.'s. Many of our churches observed the Week of Prayer for Foreign Missions and gave to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering during the month of December.

The Acteen leaders of our association met in January for fellowship and planning Acteen activities. Miss Martha Franks, former missionary to China, led Baptist Women in an inspiring Prayer Retreat on January 19 at the Oakwoods Baptist Church. On February 24-25 the Acteens of our association had an overnight retreat with Rev. and Mrs. Hubert K. Middleton as guest missionaries. In March the Week of Prayer for Home Missions and Annie Armstrong Easter Offering were observed by many of our churches.

For the first time a Mission Action/Personal Witnessing workshop was held at the Hinshaw Street Baptist Church for Baptist Women and Young Women.

The WMU Annual meeting was held at the Wilkesboro Baptist Church on May 8 with "Partnership in Prayer and Ministry" as the theme. This was an inspiring occasion with Mrs. Bea McRae, president of Woman's Missionary Union of North Carolina as guest speaker. Ladies of the Wilkesboro Baptist Church gave a skit emphasizing the theme. The Associational WMU Council attended the leadership training conferences at Caraway Conference Center on August 3-4. The council had quarterly planning meetings during the year.

It has been a privilege and joy to serve on the WMU Associational Council with Betty Pardue, Baptist Women's Director, and Linda Phillips, Acteens Director.

How do we intend to make disciples throughout Wilkes County? One great missionary said, "I am made all things to all men, that I might by **all means** save some." There is no bad way to lead a soul to Jesus — but some ways are more effective than others.

March 23-30, 1986 is a red letter date that marks the climax of a simultaneous effort to bring genuine revival to our county, our state, our nation. The theme is GOOD NEWS AMERICA, GOD LOVES YOU. Part of this effort to reach multitudes with the gospel will be a massive people search and scripture distribution campaign. Most vital, however, to the success of the effort is a spiritual preparation period in which God's people commit themselves to consistent, united, and extraordinary prayer! Jesus prayed (John 17:21) that we would be united so the world would believe that God indeed sent Him!

Reaching lost people with the gospel will also mean training disciples or soul winners. Other effective witness training tools are Lay Evangelism School (LES), Training Evangelistic Lay Leadership (TELL) and the Church Training Equipping Center Modules, "How To Witness" and "Preparing Your Church For Revival." **MasterLife** is also an effective tool that will help your church lay a solid foundation for spiritual revival!

SCHOOL OF CHRISTIAN STUDIES REPORT

Please consult the Associational Annuals for 1981 and 1982 concerning information of introduction pertaining to Seminary Extension Programs throughout the United States and North Carolina. Enrollment continues to increase, studying in more than 80 centers.

In our Association last fall we offered only one course of study — NT 0173 JOHN. This is a study of John's Gospel, "A Gospel of Witness." Ten persons enrolled in the course but only five completed it. This is a college level course. It started 9/20/83 and continued through 11/29/83. The course was taught by W. Paul Shoupe.

In the spring we offered one course of study — NT 0175 ROMANS — A study of the book of Romans. Fifteen persons enrolled and completed this college level course of study. The course started 2/14/84 and continued through 4/19/84 and was taught by W. Paul Shoupe.

This fall, we are offering one course — REVELATION — NT 0190, a study of the book of Revelation; the Text: *The Broadman Bible Commentary*, Volume 12. This course of study will begin Tuesday, October 9th and continue through December 11th. The time is 7:00-9:00 P.M. The teacher is W. Paul Shoupe. The place is Liberty Grove Baptist Church. The cost is \$30.50 which includes textbook and tuition. This is a college level course.

Next spring we will also offer one course — CH 0210 LIFE AND FAITH OF BAPTISTS. Section I deals with Baptist history from the 17th century in Europe, featuring the history of Southern Baptists since 1845. Section II concentrates on a survey of important Baptist doctrines. The Texts: *Our Baptist Story*, Duncan; *What Baptists Stand For*, Cook. This course of study will begin January 22nd (Tuesday) and continue through March 26th. The time is 7:00-9:00 P.M. The teacher is Dr. Bill McKinney. The place is our Association Office. The cost is \$21.00 which includes textbooks and tuition. This is also a college level course.

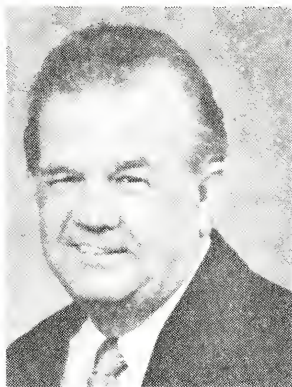

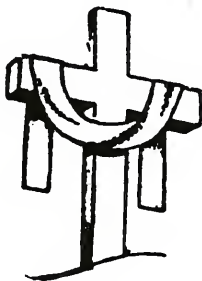

History of Mount Pleasant Baptist Church 1976 - 1985

Mt. Pleasant Baptist Church has a membership of 433 and five percent of their offering is given to the Cooperative Program.

Within the two years of 1977 and 1978 much remodeling was done in the fellowship hall and parsonage with air conditioning installed and a choir loft elevated. In 1978 church signs were placed on the highway pointing to the church by the family of J.C. McNeil. Greene Brothers gave cushions for the pews in the sanctuary. The *Biblical Recorder* was sent to every church family. Harold Bass directed the choir in the first Christmas Cantata.

In 1979 the church vestibule and sanctuary were painted and new carpet installed. A deacon family plan was adopted. The church employed a choir director.

On March 6, 1980, the pastor of 17 years, Rev. J.C. Shaw, died suddenly. The church adopted resolutions of respect and appreciation for Rev. Shaw. A memorial fund was raised to assist in the construction of a home for Mrs. Shaw. A dishwasher and refrigerator were purchased for the parsonage. Landscaping and repaving were done on the parsonage property. Air conditioning was installed in the Sunday School rooms behind the sanctuary. Also, the church purchased four acres of land adjoining the cemetery property.

In June 1982, Rev. Lawrence Goodman was called as pastor. The parking lot was extended and paved. A new furnace for the sanctuary and parsonage were purchased. A monthly newsletter was started for the members. The space between the church and fellowship hall was enclosed for a pastor's study and prayer chapel; also, the library was completed. Commercial stove and freezer were purchased for church kitchen and meals were served each month. A new lawn mower was purchased.

In 1984 more equipment was purchased; folding doors, vinyl covering, carpet. Painting was done inside and outside. New furniture was purchased for the pastor's study and Sunday School rooms.

In 1985 a gift of land was received from Lennis Triplett and wife, Vera, located behind the fellowship hall so as to extend the building program. Also, Foster Foster made a gift for a church steeple. In February 1985, Rev. Lawrence Woodman resigned as pastor. Rev. Albert Young served as interim pastor. In June of 1985, Dr. James A. Hubbard was called as pastor. The church guttering was replaced.

J.C. McNeil died in June of 1983. His sister, Lizzie Shoemaker, died in May of 1984. They were the oldest members of the church and the children of James Oliver McNeil who was founder of Mount Pleasant Baptist Church.

History of Goshen Baptist Church

For some two or three years before Goshen Baptist Church was begun, Baptist people in the Goshen community conducted a Sunday School in a Methodist Church in that same vicinity. Finally in February 1914, the Reverend L.B. Murray, with T.F. Walsh, C.M. Carlton, Mr. and Mrs. Robert L. Proffitt and J.E. Ferguson met and organized Goshen Baptist Church.

The first pastor of the church was L.B. Murray, who served for four years. Following him came B.F. Austin, who served one year; again L.B. Murray, who served one year; I.C. Woodruff, for six years; L.B. Murray again seven years; Isaac Watts, for 13 years; Clate Brown, for six years; Albert Pruitt, for four years; Richard Byrd, for 10 years; James Williams, for four years; Glenn Ballard, for one year; Dean Dillard, for four years; Larry Broome, for six years; and Rev. Pat Fortner is now serving as pastor.

The First Goshen Baptist Church was completed at a cost of only \$350.00. It was a frame building, built on property given to the church by C.M. Carlton.

A church bell was purchased in April 1916, at a cost of \$41.62, and placed in the belfry. The first service was held in the building May 13, 1916.

In 1952 a second more modern church was started to replace the original church. In 1961 the third Goshen Baptist Church was started as a result of W. Kerr Scott Reservoir construction. Land was purchased on Highway 268 and construction was begun on the present church building.

In 1972 a parsonage was begun to provide housing for our pastor. In July of this year a vestibule, and two bathrooms were added on the front of the building.

Constitution

PREAMBLE

We, the Baptist Churches of the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association unite according to the plan and for the purpose and work of New Testament churches in our world. To this end and according to the following articles, we cooperate to the fullest extent possible with the State and Southern Baptist Convention and subscribe to the principles of the 1963 Baptist Faith and Message statement.

ARTICLE I — NAME

This body shall be known as the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association of North Carolina.

ARTICLE II — PURPOSE

It shall be the purpose of this Association to consider and promote measures for increasing the harmony, the knowledge and the spiritual life of the churches and for developing and directing their energies and their contributions in the advancement of Christ's kingdom throughout the earth, always in harmony with the teachings of the New Testament. This Association shall be an auxiliary of the North Carolina Baptist State Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention in all their missionary, educational and benevolent work.

It shall be the purpose of the Association (1) to provide the mutual encouragement and fellowship of member churches through the definition and practice of Baptist distinctives; (2) to consistently seek to confront everyone in our area with the claims of Christ on his/her life; (3) to encourage and facilitate church growth and development; (4) to promote participation in missions and ministries on the foreign field, in the homeland, in the state, and in the area of the Association; (5) to provide services to the churches as needed and desired; (6) to provide an additional channel by which member churches may participate in the Southern Baptist Convention.

ARTICLE III — MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1. The Association shall be composed of cooperating Baptist churches desiring to affiliate with it. Any church desiring to become a member of the Association shall present, through messengers chosen for that purpose, its request for membership on APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP provided in the minutes along with a UNIFORM ASSOCIATIONAL LETTER provided by the clerk at any annual session of the body. The Moderator shall refer the church to the Committee on Membership for study and investigation. The church maintains for the year the status of associate membership until the committee makes its recommendation. If favorable, it will be received into full membership with all the rights and privileges at the next annual session. If the Association then votes to receive the church, the moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the messengers.

SECTION 2. The Association shall be sole judge of its membership and may receive churches, or reject churches, according to its Constitution and bylaws. Member churches may withdraw from the Association as they desire. Any church in the Association which fails to cooperate with the Association shall, upon the recommendation of the Coordinating Council of the Association, be contacted by the Membership Committee to determine the intentions of the church regarding its remaining in the Association.

A cooperating church shall be defined as one which sends an annual report to the Association and messengers to Associational meetings, and contributes to the financial program of the Association.

SECTION 3. The Association shall withdraw fellowship from any church in its membership which shall be found to be disorderly in faith and practice, but not until written charges are brought against it, which charges shall have been authorized by the official act of the church offering the same, or by the Membership Committee of the Association. Thereafter, any such charges shall be carefully considered by the Association.

ARTICLE IV — MEETINGS

SECTION 1. The Association shall meet quarterly on the Monday after the first Sunday in January, April, and July. In October the Association shall meet on Monday and Tuesday after the first Sunday.

SECTION 2. The Moderator shall call a meeting of the pastor and one representative from each church approximately 30 days prior to any quarterly Associational meeting at which business is to be considered for the purpose of publicizing and discussing such matters as may be presented for vote at the Associational meeting. Special meetings may be called by the Moderator provided two weeks notice is given to the member churches.

SECTION 3. In case of emergency, the Coordinating Council shall have the authority to change the time and/or place of meetings, and shall be responsible for providing churches with sufficient notice of change.

SECTION 4. Each church is entitled to be represented by its pastor, other ordained ministers holding membership in the church, and such additional messengers as will permit a total of 10 messengers. Churches with more than 500 members are entitled to an additional messenger for each 100 members more than the initial 500. Messengers shall be elected annually for all Associational meetings. It is suggested that at least five of the messengers be leaders of individual church organizations.

ARTICLE V — AUTHORITY

While independent and sovereign in its own sphere, the Association does not claim, and will never attempt to exercise any authority over any other Baptist body, whether church or auxiliary organization.

ARTICLE VI — OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTION

SECTION 1. The officers of the Association shall be: Moderator (who shall also serve as Chairman of Group I — Associational Administration); Vice Moderator (who shall also serve as Chairman of Group II — Fellowship and Mutual Care); Group Chairman III (Evangelism and Outreach); Group Chairman IV (Church Growth and Training); Group Chairman V (Associational Ministries); Clerk, Treasurer, Music Director, Auditor, Historian, Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, Woman's Missionary Union Director, Brotherhood Director, and School of Christian Studies Director.

SECTION 2. The officers of the Association shall be elected at the April meeting of the Association for a term of one year. Officers shall be contacted and nominated by the Committee on Nominations (Bylaw IV, Section 7).

SECTION 3. Officers shall assume their duties at the close of the October meeting and serve until the next October meeting, or until their successors are elected.

SECTION 4. Any person having served two terms as Moderator shall be ineligible for re-election for a period of two years.

ARTICLE VII — TRUSTEES AND THEIR ELECTION

There shall be three Trustees of the Association, one of whom should be an attorney. Trustees shall be elected for an indefinite term and shall serve at the pleasure of the Association.

ARTICLE VIII — THE COORDINATING COUNCIL

The Coordinating Council shall be composed of the Moderator, the four Group Chairmen, and the Director of Missions. The Coordinating Council shall be responsible for coordinating and directing all the work of the Association including Long Range Planning. It shall meet monthly and, when appropriate make reports and recommendations to the Association at scheduled meetings. The Moderator shall serve as Chairman of the Coordinating Council.

ARTICLE IX — COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. The Association shall have the following standing committees with terms of office being from the close of the October meeting through the following October meeting:

A. To be nominated by the Committee on Committees and elected at the April meeting:

1. Committee on Personnel (Bylaw IV, Section 1)
2. Committee on Missions (Bylaw IV, Section 2)
3. Committee on Evangelism (Bylaw IV, Section 3)
4. Committee on Finance (Bylaw IV, Section 4)
5. Committee on Ordinations (Bylaw IV, Section 5)
6. Committee on Memorials (Bylaw IV, Section 6)
7. Committee on Nominations (Bylaw IV, Section 7)
8. Committee on Constitution (Bylaw IV, Section 8)
9. Committee on Membership (Bylaw IV, Section 9)
10. Committee on Properties (Bylaw IV, Section 14)

11. Committee on Calendar (Bylaw IV, Section 15)
12. School of Christian Studies Committee (Bylaw IV, Section 16)

B. To be appointed by the Moderator at the April meeting:

1. Committee on Committees (Bylaw IV, Section 10)
2. Committee on Enrollment (Bylaw IV, Section 13)

SECTION 2. The following committees shall be appointed by the Moderator at least 30 days prior to the October meeting to serve during the October meeting:

1. Committee on Place and Preacher (Bylaw IV, Section 11)
2. Committee on Resolutions (Bylaw IV, Section 12)

ARTICLE X — GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 1. The employment of a Director of Missions shall follow the procedure outlined in Bylaw VI, Section 1, with the understanding that said person be extended an indefinite call and that a period of reasonable notice be given by either the missionary or the Association in the event of termination of such employment.

SECTION 2. The Director of Missions shall be empowered to procure and supervise necessary secretarial and janitorial personnel for the proper operation and maintenance of the Associational office, provided that funds for the hiring and salary of such personnel have been included within the current year's budget.

SECTION 3. All questions of order not herein provided for shall be decided according to *Robert's Rules of Order, Revised*.

SECTION 4. Amendments to this Constitution may be made at any annual session upon vote of two-thirds of the members present, provided that such amendments be presented on the first day of the annual session and voted upon the second day.

SECTION 5. ROTATING OF COMMITTEES. One-third of each committee shall be elected to serve a period of three years. Committees or parts of committees composed of organizational heads shall not be subject to rotation. No member shall succeed himself for more than one additional term. Vacancies occurring during the year may be filled immediately by the Coordinating Council.

SECTION 6. SPECIAL ADVISORS. The Moderator and Director of Missions will serve on all committees of the Association as special advisors.

Bylaws

BYLAW I — GENERAL

SECTION 1. The Association shall convene as provided by the Constitution (Article IV, Section 1).

SECTION 2. Each session of the Association shall be opened with religious exercise.

SECTION 3. A majority of the members present shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business except the matter of making changes in the Constitution.

SECTION 4. Any member wishing to speak shall rise and address the Moderator, shall confine himself strictly to the question under consideration and avoid the use of unnecessary personalities.

SECTION 5. The members shall observe toward the officers and toward one another such courtesies as are becoming to Christians.

SECTION 6. The annual Associational year, for the purpose of reporting statistical information, shall be September 1 to August 31, inclusive.

BYLAW II — ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

The organizational structure of the Association shall be divided into five Task Groups. Each Task Group shall meet quarterly and make reports to the Coordinating Council as needed.

SECTION 1. Task Group I, "Associational Administration," shall be composed of the Moderator, Clerk, Trustees, Treasurer, and Committees on Personnel, Finance, and Properties. Task Group I shall oversee all administrative functions of the Association, including employing and/or discharging staff personnel, budget planning, and use and maintenance of Associational property and equipment.

SECTION 2. Task Group II, "Fellowship and Mutual Care," shall be composed of the Vice Moderator, Committees on Membership, Ordination, and Memorials, the President of the Pastor's Conference of the Association, and the General Board Representative. Task Group II shall seek to enrich fellowship within and between churches in the Association and it shall be responsible for planning the January meeting of the Association.

SECTION 3. Task Group III, "Evangelism and Outreach," shall be composed of Group Chairman III and the Evangelism Committee. It shall be responsible for planning and promoting evangelism and outreach. It shall also plan the April meeting of the Association. The Director of Evangelism shall serve as Chairman of this group.

SECTION 4. Task Group IV, "Church Growth and Training," shall be composed of Group Chairman IV, Associational Directors of Music, Sunday School, Church Training, Brotherhood and Woman's Missionary Union. It shall be the responsibility of Task Group IV to coordinate leadership training and to encourage church growth. It shall also be responsible for planning an annual calendar and the July meeting of the Association.

SECTION 5. Task Group V, "Associational Ministries," shall be composed of Group Chairman V, and the Committee on Missions. It shall seek to discover, implement, and maintain Association ministries. It shall also be responsible for planning the October meeting of the Association, including the preparation of a printed program which shall be sent to all persons on the program and to all pastors at least 30 days prior to the October meeting. It shall, in the opening session of the October meeting of the Association, present the printed program for adoption.

BYLAW III — DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. Moderator

The Moderator shall preside during meetings of the Association according to the Constitution and Bylaws, serve on the Coordinating Council as Moderator of Task Group I, appoint Committee on Committees, Place and Preachers, Resolutions, and Enrollment. The Moderator shall serve also as ex officio member of all other committees.

SECTION 2. Vice Moderator

The Vice Moderator shall preside in the absence, or at the pleasure, of the Moderator. In addition, the Vice Moderator shall serve on the Coordinating Council representing Task Group II.

SECTION 3. Group Chairman III

Group Chairman III shall serve on the Coordinating Council representing Task Group III.

SECTION 4. Group Chairman IV

Group Chairman IV shall serve on the Coordinating Council representing Task Group IV.

SECTION 5. Group Chairman V

Group Chairman V shall serve on the Coordinating Council representing Task Group V.

SECTION 6. Clerk

The Clerk shall provide annual report forms at least 30 days before the October meeting, distribute at the October meeting copies of a digest of these reports, make an accurate record of the proceedings of the Association, supervise the printing and distribution of minutes, records, and other documents of the Association, and serve also as secretary of the Coordinating Council.

SECTION 7. Treasurer

The Treasurer shall receive and bank all funds of the Association in the name of the Association; disburse the same upon instructions from the Association, its Coordinating Council, or as designated in the budget; render an accurate report of receipts and disbursements and distribute same at the October meeting; give an oral report at each quarterly meeting; and keep books available and up-to-date for examination.

The Treasurer shall serve as a member of the Committees on Finance and Missions.

The Chairman of the Committee on Finance shall have authority to act for the Treasurer in the event the Treasurer is incapacitated.

SECTION 8. Music Director

The Music Director shall be in charge of the music program of the Association during and between Associational meetings.

SECTION 9. Auditor

The Auditor shall, at the close of the fiscal year, make an audit of the Treasurer's records.

SECTION 10. Historian

The Historian, in his sole discretion, shall collect facts of interest to the Association and the cooperating churches, and shall make a report to each annual session of the Association.

SECTION 11. Organizational Directors

Associational Directors of the Sunday School, Church Training, Brotherhood, and Woman's Missionary Union shall be in charge of their respective organizations during their tenure of service.

BYLAW IV — DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. Committee on Personnel

The Committee on Personnel shall be composed of six members, each of whom will serve a tenure of three years, with two members rotating off the Committee each year. The Committee will prepare and update, as necessary, position descriptions of all Associational staff personnel, excluding the Director of Missions whose responsibilities are described by Bylaw VI. It shall survey the need for additional staff positions; recruit, interview, and recommend to the Association or its Coordinating Council new employed personnel and, when necessary, recommend to the Coordinating Council the termination of employment of staff personnel. The Committee shall review annual salaries and benefits, and make recommendations to the Finance Committee. It shall review at least annually the performance of each employee, receive any grievance, and otherwise seek to promote harmonious relationships between all employees of the Association.

SECTION 2. Committee on Missions

(1) The Committee on Missions shall be composed of one representative each from Associational Brotherhood, Woman's Missionary Union, the Treasurer, The Director of each Associational ministry, and three additional members elected by the Association to serve three years on a rotating basis. It shall work with the Director of Missions in promoting the work of the Association, and lead and assist in organizing new churches and in beginning new mission stations.

(2) Upon request, the Committee on Missions shall advise any group seeking to organize a new church. The Committee will be available to any church desiring assistance with problems.

(3) When without a Director of Missions this Committee shall seek out and recommend to the Association or its Coordinating Council for election a new Director of Missions according to Bylaws VI, Section 1.

SECTION 3. Committee on Evangelism

The Committee on Evangelism, composed of three members, shall promote the work of Evangelism within the Association in cooperation with the State Department of Evangelism. All plans and programs shall be subject to approval by the Association or its Coordinating Council. The Evangelism Committee shall be chaired by the Director of Evangelism who will also serve as Group Chairman III.

SECTION 4. Committee on Finance

A. The Committee on Finance, composed of six members and the Treasurer, shall study the Association's financial needs for an adequate program, prepare and present a budget to the Association for the following year, devise and develop plans for securing the cooperation of churches in providing funds to meet the budget, and make a written report at the October meeting.

B. In the event it becomes necessary to borrow funds for current operating expenses of the Association, the Committee on Finance is authorized to instruct the Trustees to secure by loan an amount not to exceed 10% of the annual budget for a period not to exceed 90 days, and to renew the loan as needed.

SECTION 5. Committee on Ordinations

The Committee on Ordinations, composed of seven ministers, shall when requested by a member church, assist with the examination and ordination of candidates for the Gospel Ministry. Churches wishing to ordain ministers are requested to place their candidates before the Committee at least 30 days prior to the date set for ordination for examination on the following principles:

- a. Christian experience or conversion
- b. Call to the ministry
- c. Attitude toward denominational work and objects
- d. Support of denominational causes
- e. Moral and spiritual fitness
- f. Doctrinal beliefs
- g. Knowledge of the Bible

Candidates are to be ordained with the assistance of this Committee only when they are serving a church or churches as pastor or having been called as pastor of a Baptist church of like faith and practice with those member churches of this Association.

No candidate for ordination shall be considered by the committee who has not been a member of a cooperating church for at least one year. The Committee shall consider only male members for ordination.

Candidates are to be urged to prepare themselves for the ministry as far as possible in Baptist institutions of higher learning.

This Committee shall not recommend any candidate for ordination whom they feel will not bring honor and esteem to the Lord, to Southern Baptists and to the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association.

Recommendations will be made by the Committee to the church where the candidate holds membership. The Committee will assist the church in the ordination service at a time convenient to the church and to the members of the Committee if such assistance is desired.

SECTION 6. Committee on Memorials

The Committee on Memorials, composed of three members, shall bring a report at the October meeting and lead in a memorial service in memory of those reported by the churches as deceased since the last annual meeting.

SECTION 7. Committee on Nominations

The Committee on Nominations, composed of seven members, shall contact and nominate at the April meeting of the Association, the officers and trustees of the Association according to Article VI and VII of the Constitution.

SECTION 8. Committee on Constitution

The Committee on Constitution, composed of five members, shall be available to study any changes or revisions in the Constitution, and to make recommendations as needed to keep the Constitution in line with the policies and programs of the Association.

SECTION 9. Committee on Membership

The Committee on Membership, composed of five members, shall perform the duties as set forth in the Constitution, Article III.

SECTION 10. Committee on Committees

The Committee on Committees, composed of seven members, shall be appointed as set forth in the Constitution (Article IX, Section 1), and shall nominate persons to be elected by the Association to serve on all standing committees.

SECTION 11. Committee on Place and Preachers

The Committee on Place and Preachers, composed of three members, shall receive or solicit invitations for the place or places for meetings of the Association, and shall recommend the places. It shall also recommend the preacher and alternates for the annual sermons.

SECTION 12. Committee on Resolutions

The Committee on Resolutions, composed of three members, shall draw up and present to the Association at the October meeting resolutions of appreciation and any other resolutions it may deem expedient.

SECTION 13. Committee on Enrollment

The Committee on Enrollment, composed of five members, shall prepare for and direct the enrollment of messengers at all sessions of Associational meetings. Each messenger shall be enrolled only once during the October meeting. This Committee shall be prepared to report on enrollment when called for during meetings.

SECTION 14. Properties Committee

The Properties Committee, composed of three members, shall be responsible for the maintenance of all properties owned or leased by the Association or its Trustees.

SECTION 15. The Calendar Committee

The Calendar Committee shall be composed of the following Associational officers: Director of Missions, Sunday School Director, Church Training Director, W.M.U. Director, Brotherhood Director, Director of Music Ministry, and President of the Ministers' Conference. This Committee shall prepare an Associational calendar for the year, and present same to the annual meeting for adoption. This calendar shall be included in the annual.

SECTION 16. School of Christian Studies Committee

The School of Christian Studies Committee shall work with the Director of the School of Christian Studies to plan, promote, and implement the offering of such courses of study as will meet the needs of pastors and laypersons in the areas of biblical studies, historical theology, Baptist life, church administration, Christian education, and pastoral training.

BYLAW V — TRUSTEES

The legal title to all real and personal property of the Association shall be vested in the trustees and their successors in such office. The said trustees may convey said property legal instruments pursuant to resolutions adopted and approved by the Association or its Coordinating Council. They shall handle all legal matters of the Association under the direction of the said Association or its Coordinating Council. See Article VII of the Constitution.

BYLAW VI — DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS

SECTION 1. The Director of Missions shall be elected upon a recommendation of the Committee on Missions, and by vote of the Association at a regularly scheduled meeting. The relationship between the Association and its Director of Missions may be terminated following a reasonable notice given by either party.

SECTION 2. The Director of Missions shall promote the work and witness of the Association and denomination, cooperating with the churches, their pastors and officers and Associational committees and organizations.

A. He shall be responsible for planning, promoting, and executing the ministry of the Association in cooperation with the Coordinating Council and the Committee on Missions.

B. He shall make an annual report to the Association at the October meeting.

C. He shall be an ex officio member of all committees of the Association, serving in an advisory and/or resource capacity.

D. He shall seek to visit each church in the Association in order to:

- (1) Enrich Christian fellowship among the churches.
- (2) Encourage and strengthen the ministry of the churches.
- (3) Enhance the cooperative relationship between the churches and the Association.

E. He shall, when necessary, conduct surveys or inquiries in order to determine specific needs for ministry within the area of the Association.

F. He shall, upon request, provide a list of qualified persons who may be considered by churches seeking pastors.

G. He shall have full administrative responsibility for all personnel employed by the Association.

SECTION 3.

A. The Director of Missions is entitled to two weeks vacation annually. Upon completion of five years service, the Director of Missions shall be entitled to three weeks annual vacation. Vacation is to be taken within the calendar year, and it is not accumulative.

B. The Director of Missions is entitled to 30 days sick leave per calendar year, sick leave is not to be taken as vacation, and it is not accumulative.

C. The Director of Missions is entitled to four weeks per calendar year which he may use at his discretion for personal enrichment, professional development, and speaking engagements or revivals outside the Association. This time is not accumulative.

SECTION 4. Should there occur at any time a grievance on the part of the Association or the Director of Missions, either party may consult with the Moderator and Chairmen of the Missions and Personnel Committees.

BYLAW VII — ANNUAL REPORTS

Persons who are to bring reports to the October meeting of the Association shall present the same to the Director of Missions or Clerk two weeks prior to the October meeting in order for these to be included in the Book of Reports.

BYLAW VIII — AMENDMENTS

Amendments to the Bylaws may be made at any session of the October meeting of the Association when presented in writing and approved by a majority of the messengers present and voting.

Proceedings

of the
114th Annual Meeting

1. The 114th annual session of the Brushy Mountain Baptist Association was called to order at 4:00 p.m. on October 7, 1985 by the moderator, Rev. Sherrill Wellborn, at Mount Pleasant Baptist Church.

2. The congregation joined in singing "All Hail the Power," led by Director of Missions, Bill McKinney, accompanied by Pat Faw at the piano.

3. Mount Pleasant pastor, James Hubbard, welcomed the messengers and guests. He announced that this was the eighth time that the associational meeting had been held at Mount Pleasant, with the first time being 96 years ago.

4. Devotions were led by Rev. Ron Gilbert with scripture from Galatians 5.

5. Moderator Wellborn announced that resolutions will be taken until 7:00 p.m., October 8, 1985 and to see Charles Edwards.

6. Rev. Paul Shoupe recommended the adoption of the Order of Business with any changes during the meeting approved. Motion passed.

A. Rev. Paul Hugger gave the Evangelism Report. Churches were urged to participate in "Good News America - God Loves You" Simultaneous Revivals in March 1986. Scripture distribution will be on October 20, 1985 with five months of cultivation. Rev. Hugger showed a film clip on the "Good News America." After the film clip, Rev. Hugger urged commitment to the "Good News America." He announced the Lay Evangelism School. Anyone interested should see him or Bob Seatz or Charles Edwards. Report was adopted.

B. Rev. Paul Shoupe gave the Missions Report in the absence of Rev. Jim Gore. Rev. Shoupe read the Missions Committee Recommendation (printed elsewhere in this book). The Home Mission Board will be contributing \$650.00 a month, Missions \$100.00 a month. Fairview Baptist Church of Parkersburg is the sponsoring church. Recommendation was adopted.

C. Rev. Elliott Hayes gave the Finance Committee Report. He read over the report and urged churches to give more to the association, to increase their giving to 5% of the church offering. The report was adopted.

D. Rev. L.J. Culler gave the Membership Committee Report. Rev. Culler called attention to the Baptist Foundation Report - urged everyone to read it. He also called attention to the fact that there are 40 churches in the association and gave the three requirements for membership. Parkway Garden Baptist Church came under watchcare last year and

Rev. Culler recommended that they receive membership in the association. Motion was adopted.

E. Rev. James Craig gave the Ordination Report. Report was adopted.

F. Mr. Clyde Bumgarner gave the Properties Committee Report and welcomed Mr. Hoke McNeil and Mr. Will Fletcher onto the committee. Report was adopted.

G. Director of Missions, Bill McKinney, gave the Calendar Committee Report. After a correction was made by Rev. Paul Hugger, the report was adopted. (The Good News Rally scheduled for January 11, 1986 was cancelled.)

H. In the absence of J.R. Priester, Bill McKinney gave the Dedication of Annuals Report. The dedication was to Rev. Dean Dillard. Report was adopted.

I. In the absence of Madge Sturdivant, Moderator Wellborn called attention to the histories of the churches and urged everyone to read them. A correction to a name in the Mount Pleasant history was made and the report was adopted.

J. Rev. Paul Shoupe gave the School of Christian Studies Report. The report was adopted.

K. In the absence of Naydell Pardue, Bill McKinney gave the Nominating Committee Report. He recommended that since Mrs. Norma Jean Wood has resigned that Mrs. Teresa H. Taylor be made the new clerk/treasurer. Report was adopted. Mr. McKinney spoke for a moment on Mrs. Wood and her husband. She had originally taken a six-month leave of absence but since she couldn't see any improvement in his condition she decided to resign and her resignation was accepted.

L. In the absence of Rev. Hadley Triplett, Rev. J.T. Vannoy III gave the Committee on Committees Report. Vacancies filled: Constitution Committee, Herbert McKenzie; Dedication of Annuals Committee, Alene Whittington; Evangelism Committee, Rev. Paul Hugger, Chairman; Finance Committee, Rev. Al Andrews, Jackie Church; Memorials Committee, Jim Triplett, Chairman; Missions Committee, Rev. Jimmy Hubbard, Rev. Tom Vannoy III; Nominating Committee, Rev. Charles Edwards, Chairman, Rev. R.A. Call; Ordination Committee, Rev. John T. Wayland, Chairman, Rev. Charles Edwards; Personnel Committee, Bill Shepherd, Jackie Huffman; Properties Committee, Will Fletcher; Committee on Committees, L.J. Culler, Rex Shumate, R.A. Call, Horace Moree, Pat Fortner; Enrollment Committee, Kathleen Ellis, Irene McNeil, Angela Minton, Jane Bynum; Place and Preacher Committee, Dale Ellenburg, Chairman; Resolutions Committee, Lynn Parsons. Report was adopted.

7. In the absence of Henry Stokes, Garland Hendricks gave the N.C. Baptist Colleges Report. Points he made were that we have the finest network of Baptist college campuses in America. Henry Stokes came in during Dr. Hendricks' report and so he was introduced to speak further on Christian Education. Report was adopted.

8. The congregation joined in singing "The Church's One Foundation," with Director of Missions, W.C. McKinney, leading and Pat Faw at the piano.

9. Rev. Richard Moretz gave special music, "Why Have You Chosen Me?"

10. Rev. Phil Chapman brought the message with scripture from Philippians Chapter 3, verses 13 and 14. The topic of the message was "Reaching Forth Unto the Things That Are Before." Out of 60,000 people in Wilkes County only half are affiliated with a church, and only half of those are dedicated to the church. Another topic of the sermon was "What Associational Goals Have Been Set?"

1. Will these goals make our association a better association?
2. Will this association be a better association for God?
3. Will the whole association enjoy the goals and benefits?

Three other points brought out in the message were:

1. Priorities must be right - "God must be first."

a. Stand against sin

b. Stand for separation - "Cannot join the worlds crowd and win this county to God."

2. Purpose must be right

a. Must be a cooperative spirit

3. Our program must be right

Rev. Chapman ended his sermon with a prayer and asked that all pastors and messengers that would commit themselves to God to stand, and asked Moderator Wellborn to have a prayer.

11. Benediction and blessing for the evening meal was given by Rev. Dale Ellenburg.

12. The meeting was reconvened at 7:00 with Vice Moderator Al Andrews presiding. The congregation joined in singing "Glory to His Name," with Director of Missions, W.C. McKinney, leading, accompanied by Vernon Mitchell at the piano.

13. In the absence of Rev. Jimmy Hubbard, Deacon Joe Huffman welcomed the messengers.

14. Rev. J.T. Vannoy read scripture from the second chapter of Acts, the first verse and had prayer.

15. Vice Moderator Andrews introduced the new pastors: Rev. Rex Foster, Fishing Creek; Rev. Richard Moretz, Hinshaw Street; Rev. Jimmy Hubbard, Mount Pleasant; Rev. Dale Ellenburg, Oakwoods; Rev. J.T. Vannoy III, Purlear; Rev. Ron Gilbert, Roaring River; Rev. Rex Eldreth, Stony Hill and Rev. Lynn Parsons, Lewis Fork Mission.

16. Director of Missions, W.C. McKinney, introduced Rev. Rick Jordan who is presently without a church and is available for service in any of the churches.

17. Rev. James Weaver gave a speech thanking everyone for the prayers and monies received during his and his family's recovery after their auto accident.

18. Dr. Garland Hendricks gave a report on Southern Baptist Annuity, Pastors Retirement and the B.E. Morris Academy. He made the following points on the Annuity Program:

1. What would happen to your pastor's family if he was killed?
2. What would happen to your pastor and his family if he became permanently disabled within the next six months?
3. What would happen to pastor and family if a family member ran up a huge hospital bill?

4. Do you really love your pastor? Will he live in dignity or poverty after retirement?

Dr. Hendricks left some literature at the associational office.

19. Rev. Richard Moretz gave the Sunday School Report, he summarized the report for the people. Asked for prayer for our evangelism effort.

20. Mrs. Ruth Craig asked Mrs. Mae Duncan to give the W.M.U. Report, which she did. She summarized the report for the people and urged everyone to be at the W.M.U. Foreign Mission Study on November 14, 1985 at Oakwoods Baptist Church. Mrs. Duncan also introduced all the W.M.U. officers.

21. Mr. Clinton Call gave the Brotherhood Report and urged everyone to read the report in its entirety and also urged churches to start a brotherhood in their church.

22. In the absence of Craig Little, Vice Moderator Andrews urged everyone to read the Music Report.

23. The congregation joined in singing "Send the Light," with Director of Missions, W.C. McKinney, Jr., leading, accompanied by Mr. Vernon Mitchell at the piano.

24. Mr. Henry Stokes asked for a few minutes to talk about Wake Forest University. He urged all churches to send their records to be microfilmed at no charge.

25. Mr. Pete Stickel gave the N.C. Missions Report. He talked about the Togo Project and stated that one of the requirements of going overseas was to read the 17th chapter of John every other day (especially verse 19). Ten volunteers went to Togo in May. Mr. Stickel is available to speak at any church at any time. He is a member of the Macedonia Baptist Church in the Elkin Association.

26. Mr. Coy Privette gave the Christian Action League Report. Mr. Privette summarized the report and highly commended the new obscenity law:

1. No pornography in North Carolina
2. Protection of minors
3. Prohibited to disseminate obscene materials
4. Penalties have been increased from misdemeanors to felonies

Mr. Privette distributed material, "Building a Better Tomorrow Through Today's Actions," which contained an article about Wilkes County's attempt to vote out beer and wine.

27. Special music was presented by David Walsh from Beaver Creek Baptist Church who sang "He Touched Me" and "He Was There All of the Time," accompanied by Vernon Mitchell at the piano.

28. Mr. Jim Saul gave a report on N.C. Baptist Retirement Homes. Over 34 years ago the ministry was begun for older people. Over \$700,000.00 a year is provided by the Cooperative Program. Bill Stillerman is the new president.

29. Charles Tanner gave a report on the Baptist Children's Homes. He presented a book to Director of Missions, W.C. McKinney, Jr., for the association entitled "100 Years of Caring." He urged everyone to read the report and added three more things to the report: Centennial Year

1. November 9 - Birthday Party in Thomasville, N.C.
2. November 10 - Worship Service and bury time capsule
3. November 11 - 100th year anniversary - combined choir of children in Charlotte on November 12, 1985.

30. Dismissal prayer was led by Ronald Gilbert of Roaring River Baptist Church.

SECOND DAY

31. The second day of the 114th annual meeting was called to order by Vice Moderator Al Andrews at 7:00 p.m. on October 8, 1985 at Goshen Baptist Church.

32. Pastor Pat Fortner welcomed the messengers and guests.

33. Rev. Richard Moretz of Hinshaw Street Baptist Church read devotions from Roman 10:8-15 and had a prayer.

34. Special music was presented by the "Oak Grove Quartet" of Oak Grove Baptist Church who sang a selection of five songs.

35. Rev. Glenn Caudill of Oak Grove Baptist Church brought the evening message with scripture from Luke 9:27-35. The topic was "A Mountain Top Experience with the Lord." The Lord took three men to the mountain top - Peter, John and James. "Be willing to do what the Lord asks you to do." He also used scripture from Hebrews 12:1, "The angels in Heaven rejoice over someone being saved."

36. The congregation joined in singing "Victory in Jesus," with Director of Missions, W.C. McKinney, Jr., leading, accompanied by Craig Little at the piano.

37. Vice Moderator Andrews opened the business session:

A. Director of Missions, Dr. McKinney, discussed the Annuity Retirement Plan for pastors. A pamphlet was given to each pastor. Dr. McKinney asked that the concept of new annuity plan be approved by the association. The motion was made that "We adopt in principle the idea of participating in the new retirement plan for pastors and church staff." The motion was approved. No more business.

38. Rev. Bob Seatz announced that on November 18, 1985 there will be Lay Evangelism Schools. Rev. Seatz will be having one at Boiling Springs Baptist Church and Charles Edwards will be having one at Welcome Home Baptist Church. On December 2, 1985 Rev. Seatz will be having the school at Moravian Falls Baptist Church and Rev. Edwards will be having one at the Hinshaw Street Baptist Church. Rev. Seatz urged everyone to come and participate and learn how to share with another person how to become a Christian.

39. Rev. Paul Shoupe announced a course in Seminary Extension and a course on "How to Understand the Bible" with more information on the courses in the School of Christian Studies Report in the Book of Reports.

40. Dr. W.C. McKinney, Jr. gave the Director of Missions Report. He expressed gratitude to all for the years of service. He read scripture from John 10:7, "Jesus came to include not exclude, Christ refused fellowship to no one." He expressed disappointment over the fact that the prayer groups that were formed at last years associational meeting never met for prayer. Dr. McKinney expressed concern for the growth of the churches in the association. Fewer than one-fourth of our churches are participating in the People Search Scripture Distribution. Fewer than one-fourth of the churches are participating in the Lay Evangelism Schools. Fifty-eight percent of church members are enrolled in Sunday School and only 30% attend Sunday School. Dr. McKinney ended with a prayer.

41. The Resolutions Committee Report was given by Rev. Lynn Parsons. (Report is printed elsewhere in this book). Report was adopted.

42. Mr. Clinton Eller gave the Memorials Committee Report. There were 108 deaths last year. Report adopted.

43. Rev. Lynn Parsons gave the benediction and the moderator's position was given over to Rev. Monroe Huffman and the meeting was adjourned.

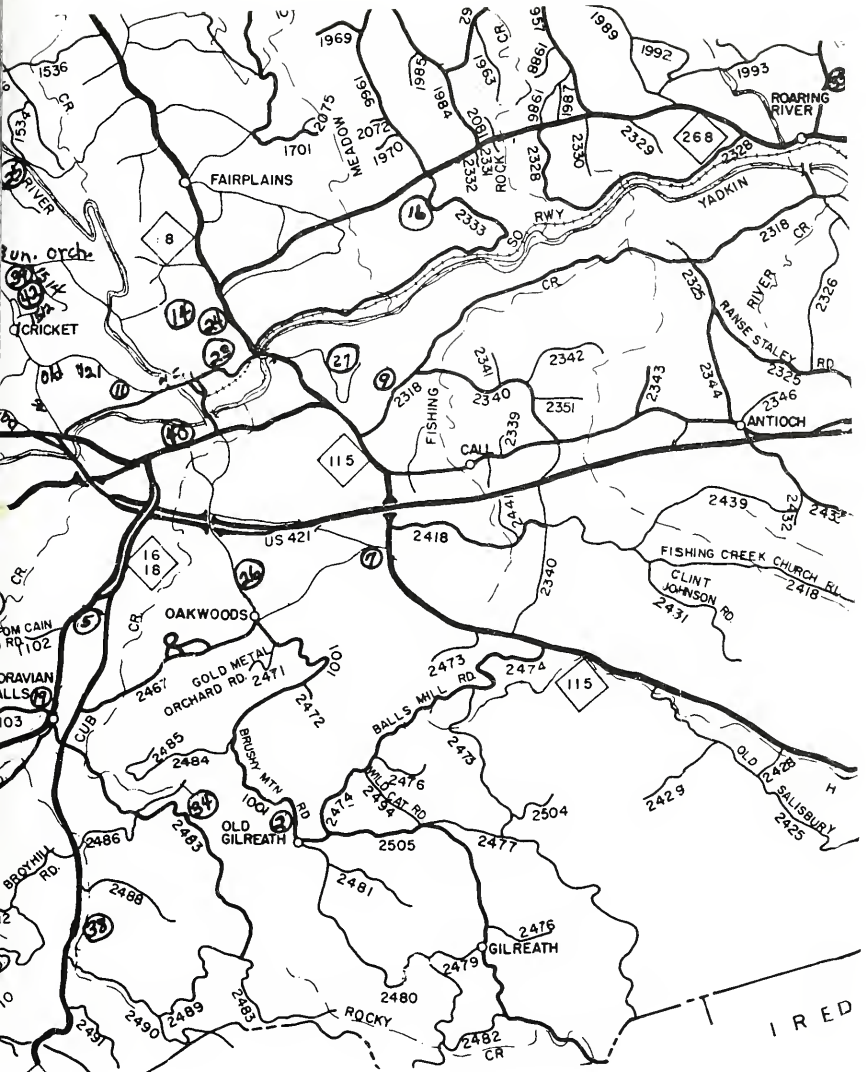

Missions Committee Recommendation

The Missions Committee of our association has received a request from the West Virginia Baptist Convention for pastoral support assistance. The request involves salary for Pastor Mark Partin, a Southeastern Seminary graduate who has accepted the challenge of developing an existing mission congregation at West Union, West Virginia and seeking to establish a new mission in the nearby town of Pennsboro. The West Union Mission is the only SBC work in Doddridge County. No SBC work is now in existence in Pennsboro nor Ritchie County where Pennsboro is located.

Two-thirds of the necessary support for this work has been committed by the Home Mission Board and the local congregation. The remainder of the necessary support is \$500.00 per month. Your Missions Committee recommends that Brushy Mountain Baptist Association commit itself to providing the needed support over a five-year period on a diminishing basis: \$6,000.00 for 1985-86, \$4,800.00 for 1986-87, \$3,600.00 for 1987-88, \$2,400.00 for 1988-89, \$1,200.00 for 1989-90.

Formal classroom training, small group activities, plus on-the-job witness training help committed Christians overcome the fears and hesitation of sharing the gospel with lost persons.

If the enemy can make us feel negative, skeptical, and discouraged about winning the lost - and the efforts we make to encourage one another to win the

lost, then he has won his victory. But remember, “. . . greater is He that is in you than he that is in the world!” Let's let the Lord Jesus have the victory in our lives!

Home Missions Report

The Home Mission Board's (HMB) single task is direct missions - hiring and placing missionaries on the field - in their efforts to tell our nation about Jesus Christ beginning with the local church as the primary agency for missions, evangelism and ministry.

The association unites the community of churches into a local fellowship. To assist the association, the HMB has developed many programs and responds to requests from Directors of Missions and other workers helping to have a greater opportunity of making an impact on the nation's non-Christian people.

State conventions and the HMB work together in selecting and appointing missionaries, budgeting for mission work penetrating into places neither the HMB nor the state conventions could reach alone.

The HMB has one unique assignment from the Southern Baptist Convention (SBC). This is to establish and carry out a national missions plan resulting in a greater impact on a national scale of Christ's Charge: "Go - do all things I have commanded."

All 50 states, Puerto Rico, America Samoa, Canada and the American Virgin Islands have missionaries supported through the HMB. Approximately 3,700 missionaries serve throughout America while almost 300 staff and support personnel work full-time with the HMB in Atlanta, Georgia. The HMB places about 46,000 special workers on mission fields each year. This includes evangelism workers, choirs, youth and adult mission groups, student summer and semester missionaries, Sojourners for older teens and young adults, campers on missions, and Christian Service Corps volunteers.

One hundred million Americans identify with a language culture group other than Anglo-Americans. More than 1,300 language missionaries serve these groups. Today the HMB ministers to 84 of the 200 language groups in the United States. About 315 missionaries serve in Christian Social Ministries. Approximately 900 pastors, many of whom serve in newer areas of the convention, receive Church Pastoral Aid from the HMB. Almost 80 US-2ers - college graduates - serve as missionaries for a two-year term working on home mission fields. A total of 11,101 Mission Service Corps volunteers have been assigned to home mission fields since 1976. More than 50% of the annual Home Mission Budget is committed to ministries in newer areas of the convention. The HMB total budget for 1984 was \$57,300,000. Operation of the HMB and its ministries cost \$4,775,000 per month, \$1,101,923 per week, \$156,557 per day, \$6,523 per hour or \$109.00 per minute.

Baptist Foundation Report

Whether we look at our objectives in life as individual Christians or collectively, as a church, an association or convention, we should be interested, above all other life's objectives, in presenting the message of Christ to those who need to know and accept Him as Lord and Savior. One of the most exciting aspects of being a Christian is to feel the joy that comes in serving Him now as well as having influence on others in the future. Some of the future influence we have as Christians is reflected in our daily commitment of service now. This can be accomplished first through our personal witness to those who will live beyond our lifespan and, secondly, through use of our resources. An increasing number of North Carolina Baptists are experiencing the excitement that comes with knowing that a portion of their resources will be set aside in trusts to further the spread of the Gospel, in perpetuity. The Baptist Foundation provides the services that make this possible.

During the past fiscal year (1984), 81 new trusts were established with the North Carolina Baptist Foundation to serve as trustee. These gifts totalled \$265,029.34. Additions and contributions to new and existing trusts totalled \$741,153 for the year. When maturity value of bonds in the invested portfolio are considered along with market value for real estate held in trust, the assets of the Foundation at the end of 1984 totalled \$10,930,279. Real estate holdings have an estimated value of \$4.478 million dollars. Income distributed to Baptist institutions and agencies, and to individuals receiving annuity payments totalled \$471,563 during 1984. Investing of Foundation assets is carried out under the direction of the Board of Directors elected by the State Convention. Day to day management is given to the investments by two fiscal agents selected by the Board. Investment philosophy now used calls for maximum return with some internal growth. Throughout the 65-year history of the Baptist Foundation, its Directors have taken seriously their fiduciary responsibilities as related to the trusts held as well as to the convention.

Support of new church growth through trusts will receive increasing attention by the convention in the immediate future. A variety of methods are available to North Carolina Baptists through their Baptist Foundation. Foreign Mission Report

It has been a year of miracles on our foreign mission fields, says President Keith Parks. Wells of water have sprung up in desert places and the illiterate have learned to read. Doors have opened into new countries, numbering now 106.

Eleven thousand Southern Baptists have served in these countries, 3,500 of whom are missionaries, and the remainder volunteers. These volunteers were involved in 226 projects in 48 countries. Thrilling indeed have been the partnership projects shared by conventions and groups, such as this well digging report: "As water gushed from a new well, and a 70-year-old woman rolled on the wet ground with joy, while other villagers danced and sang, the toughened well driller stepped behind his rig and wept."

The final report on the Lottie Moon Christmas offering fell slightly short of the \$66,000,000 goal (98.1%), yet in the first four months of last year, Southern Baptists gave \$5 million to World Hunger, more than the total offering of the previous year.

On April 15, James Baker Cauthen, affectionately known as "Mr. Foreign Missions," died at his home in Richmond. In his last sermon before the Southern Baptist Convention, he challenged us: "Let us pray, go, give, send, preach, teach, bear witness to the lost, the hungry, the poor, the broken, the distressed, and if need be, to suffer and die that the name of Jesus Christ be made known to every human being on the face of the earth." And Dr. Parks, his successor adds, "This year let us put the Thrust in Bold Missions."

Last year we had 28 churches and 32 members enrolled in the retirement program. This year we have 27 churches and 24 members enrolled. Brotherhood Report

Baptist men continue to be deeply involved in North Carolina and Global Ministries. We are in our fifth year of our five-year partnership with West Virginia Baptists. Over 30 North Carolina churches have already requested and been assigned construction projects for 1985. Churches of the New South

River Association in cooperation with churches of the Columbus Association went to Sutton, West Virginia to build a two-story Educational/Fellowship/Workshop facility there. They also set a goal of raising \$37,000 to purchase materials for the project. Along with working during the day hours, a crusade/witnessing team will be involved. Many more churches returned to West Virginia to complete projects begun in the summer of 1984. We are close to reaching the goal of the partnership of starting 100 new works there in a five-year period.

The excitement and spiritual growth of North Carolina churches during this project can be easily recognized in the life of those who went. Already 514 groups have gone to participate in missions in West Virginia and have touched 75 churches in some way.

Many Baptist men were involved in 47 lay-led revivals and 31 lay renewal weekends. Ministries were continued in prison units and in combating pornography, alcohol and drug use. In April the Baptist Children's Home of North Carolina requested use of the Disaster Relief Unit for sleeping facilities during their 1400 mile run across the state to celebrate their 100 years. On May 28, the unit left with the six runners as they began their 1400 mile run. It has traveled the length and breadth of this state, traveling through 38 counties and 135 towns. It has stopped at 40 different churches for an overnight stay. Once again, the unit has been called upon to minister a service and has proven itself.

Mission teams are continuing to work in Antigua, Nigeria, and Brazil; also, individual physicians, surgeons, and dentists served in other parts of the world. Wells, bridges, and many buildings are now well underway in Togo, West Africa. Volunteers from North Carolina have gone in steady numbers since July of 1984 to be a part of a "Partnership in Wholeness" that North Carolina and the Togo Mission are involved in - a bridge that will span some 175 feet across the Mono River. This bridge, being built by North Carolina volunteers will make it possible for year-around passage across the river. The bridge will make it possible for people in Moretan and other villages to take their crops to market, get to medical facilities, and to other parts of the country. According to the village chiefs, this is one of the greatest needs.

Also, water wells have been drilled in record numbers; to-date there have been 32 wells drilled. The amazing record is that there have been only a few "dry wells." Twenty-seven wells produced water and 22 pumps have been installed to pump water.

School of Christian Studies Report

Please consult the Associational Annuals for 1981 and 1982 concerning information of introduction pertaining to Seminary Extension Programs throughout the United States and North Carolina.

In our association last fall we offered only one course of study - NT 0190 REVELATION. This course approaches the book of Revelation historically, exegetically, and from the standpoint of its unique literary method. Twelve persons received credit for this college-level course. The course was taught by W. Paul Shoupe.

In the spring we offered one course of study - CH 0210. This course introduces the student to some phases of Baptist history so that he (she) will have a better understanding of our Baptist heritage. Ten persons enrolled in this college-level course. This course was taught by Dr. Bill McKinney.

This fall, we are offering one course - HOW TO UNDERSTAND THE BIBLE - BB 0100. This course is a basic introduction to the nature and purpose of the Bible and how to understand it. As a background for in-depth Bible study, the course deals with such basic considerations as the nature of the Bible itself, principles of biblical interpretation, how the Bible came to be accepted as authoritative, kinds of literature in the Bible, a history of the Bible in English, and the relevance of the Bible in life today. This is a college-level course and the teacher is Dr. Bill McKinney. The course will begin October 15, 1985 and continue on Tuesday nights through December 10, 1985. The cost of the course is \$24.95. The place of meeting is the associational office. The course writer is Dr. Frank Stagg and the textbook is "How to Understand the Bible" by Dr. Frank Stagg, Dr. Ralph Herring, and others.

Next spring we will also offer one course - EVANGELISM IN ACTION - EC 51. This is a study of what it means to be a Christian and how *anyone*, guided and empowered by the Holy Spirit, can improve his (her) personal witness in evangelism ministry. LeRoy Ford is the writer of the Study Guide for this course. This is a Basic Curriculum Course and there will be no examinations. This course will begin January 14, 1986 on Tuesday night and continue through March 18, 1986. The cost is \$16.00. The place is the associational office. The teacher is to be announced later.

American Bible Society Report

The American Bible Society (ABS) is an interesting organization. It cooperates with approximately 100 other Bible societies around the world in providing Bible translations for between 500 and 600 languages.

The ABS came into being in May 1816. Several early leaders of the ABS were also leaders of our country. John Quincy Adams was a vice president, and John Jay was a president. Since its founding, the ABS has distributed over 3.6 billion copies of some portion of the Bible.

The ABS translates and distributes portions of the Bible to those who request them. There are often traditional versions, such as the King James Version and there are "common language" versions, such as the Good News Bible (for young people). About one-half of the world's languages (or 98% of the people) have a translation of some portion of the Bible. There are still about 3,000 languages which have no written translation of some portion of the Bible.

If a person, church, or denomination wishes to have copies of the Bible to distribute, they may request them from the ABS at 1865 Broadway, New York, New York 10023. The ABS charges for these copies of the scriptures depending on the ability to pay. In 80 different countries, for example, the average laborer makes less than one dollar a day, so these people would receive their scriptures at no charge.

Last year the Southern Baptist Convention churches gave \$309,610.00 to help support scripture translation and distribution throughout the world. The ABS also accepts individual and church contributions and local volunteers. Additionally, the ABS offers life income plans for substantial contributors.

It further pledges itself to live by the "Church Covenant" of a Missionary Baptist Church. It declares itself to be a duly-constituted and organized Missionary Baptist Church, and will maintain this status at all times, or will voluntarily withdraw from the Association.

It understands that upon submitting this application, accompanied with a Southern Baptist Convention uniform Associational letter to the Annual Session of the Association, and if the Association received the application and uniform letter, it will be referred to the Membership Committee for study and investigation. The Church maintains for the year the status of Associate Membership until the committee makes its recommendation, if favorable, it will be received into full membership with all the rights and privileges at the next Annual Session.
