Parker Seeks Presidency Candidate Announcement

The Rev. Dr. Howard W. Parker, Jr., Pastor of the Sycamore Hill Missionary Baptist Church in Greenville, N.C., has announced his candidacy for the office of president of the General Baptist State Convention of North Carolina. Parker began serving the Convention during the presidency of Dr. E.B. Turner as Exhibit Chairman and was elected Fourth Vice President of the Convention during the presidency of Dr. Clifford A. Jones.



Dr. Parker is a native of Winston-Salem, N.C. where he grew up in the Mt. Zion Baptist Church under the pastorate of Dr. K.O.P. Goodwin and was ordained by the Rowan Baptist Association. He is a product of Shaw

University where he majored in Religion; Winston-Salem State University where he majored in History and minored in Political Science; studied at Babcock Graduate School of Management, Wake Forest University and the United Christian College.

Rev. Parker states that he is committed to missions at home and the foreign field. He is committed to supporting churches with resources and/or individuals to further their Christian Educational needs through Workshops, Training Sessions and Worship Experiences. He plans to create an Annual Summit for Moderators to sit down with him and the Vice Presidents to discuss the issues and concerns of churches in their location as a means of discovering methods to correct or solve problems or concerns in a given location. He will work towards an Annual time when the General Baptist State Convention of North Carolina and the Baptist State Convention can jointly co-sponsor a Race Relations Sunday across the State. He will also make an effort to contact churches that have not represented in the Convention over the last three years. After identifying needs, he will work towards asking Pastors who have contractors, builders, plumbers, etc., who are members of Missionary Baptist churches across the state, to volunteer at least one-week during the year when they would work at the J.J. Johnson Baptist Assembly site, to enhance the development of the camp for year round use.

Dr. Parker is married to the former R. LaVerna Grantham of Goldsboro and they have two adult children, Kelly Madison and Andrea Rochelle.

Chase Seeks Presidency Candidate Announcement

The Rev. Percy Raymond Chase was born in Washington, DC to the late Dr. Lendall W. Chase, Sr. and Elnora Elizabeth Ellis Chase.

Rev. Chase received his education in the public schools of Danville, Virginia, Norfolk State University, Norfolk, Virginia—Business Administration (1976), Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, Wake Forest, North Carolina—Master of Divinity (1980). Rev. Chase was conferred by the Apex School of Theology the Doctor of Divinity (1998).

In 1974, Rev. Chase accepted the Lord's Call to "preach the Gospel" of Christ. Rev. Chase became the pastor of the Community Baptist Church, Durham, North Carolina April 1978 and has served as pastor for thirty-two years.

**Partnership—Support for Auxiliary Work
(Article IV, Section 8)**

To promote their work and the mission of the Convention, our auxiliaries need expansion in their session time and place. They are each unique in ministry and purpose for our Baptist Churches and the Convention. They should have their own time. An organized scheduling of their sessions throughout the state gives the Convention and the churches wider access to the needs of the churches and what the Convention has to provide.

Preparedness—

**Adequate Headquarters Staff
(Articles V, Section 6)**

The Convention's mission and work requires adequate and effective staff. State Missions must be defined with the understanding that Headquarters Costs and Program Costs need equal attention.

(Articles III and IV)**

I ask for your prayers and support as I seek to become your Vice-President-at-large of this great body, by the grace and will of God. This convention stands on the threshold of abundant blessings through

the power of God. Our mountaintop view of Promised Land possessions must not result in a stagnant spirituality. God has promised empowerment for those who are faithful. General Baptists, we can experience the power that is ours in Christ Jesus.

Power is a word that is used often in our world. We are familiar with "power plays" and "power dunks" in athletics. We eat "power bars" for energy while on the go. We install power locks, power brakes, power windows, etc. in our automobiles. We use "power points" in professional presentations. Our churches apply the word power to add punch to our ecclesiastical gatherings.

How does the word power apply to our spiritual lives? In the New Testament, there are two forms of the word power:

- **Dunamis:** the ability, the force, the energy to do or act. It literally means powered by power, transforming power. The focus of this word is the transformation {change} that comes in order to glow, grow, and go when this power is present! (see Acts 1:8)

- **Kratos:** the power that is able to overcome resistance (see Hebrews 2:14). This also refers to overcoming the power of death. This word indicates that God's glorious might is

needed for growth as a result of the many challenges that confront our spiritual advancement.

In others words, Jesus the Christ's power must become tangible and visible in our lives in order to glow, grow, and go in the will & work of God!

God provides us with Power to Know (Ephesians 1:17-20; 3:18-19), Power to Walk (Colossians 1:11), and Power to Serve (2 Thessalonians 1:11). 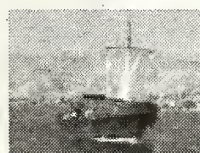

Raleigh, North Carolina – September, 2010 – Dr. Rudolph Tripp is planning to take a group on a pilgrimage to the State of Israel from February 14 - 22, 2011, with members of the national community invited to take part.

Poverty Rate Among African Americans Nearly Double that of Whites

Washington, DC – Annual data released today by the U.S Census Bureau indicates that 43.6 million Americans—one in seven people— now live in poverty. This is the largest number of people in poverty in the 51 years for which the estimates are available. The figures also show that African Americans experience poverty at a much higher rate than whites.

“It’s troubling that, in one of the world’s wealthiest nations, one in four African-American households struggle to provide for their families,” said Bishop Don DiXon Williams of Bread for the World’s Church Relations department. “The vast disproportion in poverty rates between African Americans and whites suggests that we must urge our

nation’s leaders to do more to end poverty and hunger.”

In 2009, the poverty rate for African Americans reached 25.8 percent—almost twice as high as that of the general population. One in three African-American children now lives in families that have trouble providing for them. Participation in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program or SNAP (formerly called food stamps) has hit record levels, with African-Americans accounting for 22.6 percent of the 40.5 million Americans who receive SNAP benefits each month. This figure is projected to rise in 2011.

“High rates of poverty and long-term unemployment among African Americans make legislation to extend certain provisions to low-income families extremely important,” said Bishop Williams. “This month, Congress can help by voting to extend tax benefits for low- and moderate-income households.”

SNAP, Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC), and the Child Tax Credit (CTC) have been in lifting people out of poverty and helping families respond to the recession. If SNAP benefits were accounted for in calculating the

poverty figures, 3.6 million people would be lifted out of poverty in 2009 (compared to 1.4 million in 2008). Similarly, accounting for payroll taxes and refundable tax credits, like the EITC and CTC, almost 3 million children would be lifted out of poverty.

Additional Census Bureau Report findings for 2009 include:

- In 2009, the poverty rate increased for non-Hispanic whites (9.4 percent in 2009, up from 8.6 percent in 2008), Asian-Americans (12.5 percent in 2009, up from 11.8 percent in 2008), and Hispanics (25.3 percent in 2009, up from 23.2 percent in 2008).
- For children younger than 18, the poverty rate increased from 19 percent in 2008 to 20.7 percent in 2009, bringing the number of children living in poverty to nearly 15.5 million, an increase of over 2.1 million children.

Judge James A. Wynn Jr.

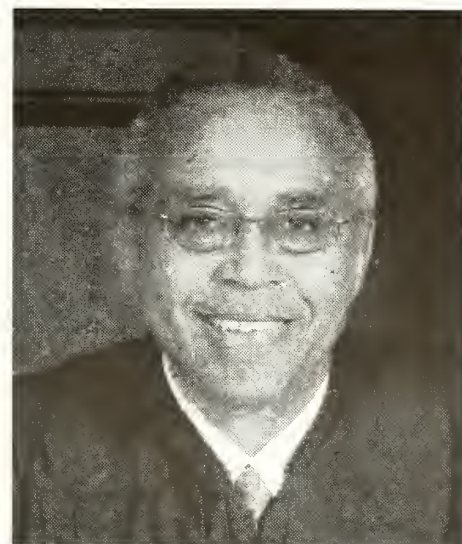


Judge James A. Wynn Jr. (a member of a General Baptist congregation) was confirmed to the U.S. 4th Circuit Court of Appeals, a position for which he was first nominated in the mid-1990s. Wynn formerly served on the N.C. Court of Appeals. He first was nominated for higher court under President Bill Clinton, but he never received a hearing in the U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee. He was nominated again last fall by President Barack Obama. He was sworn in on August 10, 2010 by North Carolina Supreme Court Justice Patricia Timmons-Goodson. (Justice Goodson is also a member of a General Baptist congregation, First Baptist Church in Fayetteville.)

Judge Wynn is a member of the Providence Missionary Baptist Church of Robersonville, NC where he has served as a deacon. He was born and reared in the Gold Point Community of Martin County. He is married to the former Jacqueline Dee Rollins and they have three sons: Javius, Conlan and Jaeander. He received his undergraduate degree (a BA in Journalism) from the University of Chapel Hill in Chapel Hill. His juris doctorate degree was from Marquette University Law School. He also has a Master of Laws degree from the University of Virginia School of Law.

He is a retired from the U. S. Navy Judge Advocate General Corps. He was on active duty from 1979-83.

Judge Cressie H. Thigpen



Judge Cressie H. Thigpen (a member of a General Baptist congregation) was appointed on August 23 to the North Carolina Court of Appeals by Gov. Bev Perdue. Judge Thigpen was appointed to the seat vacated by Judge James A. Wynn, Jr. who was confirmed to the U.S. 4th Circuit Court of Appeals. Judge Thigpen will appear on the November 2 ballot seeking an eight year term on the Court. Of thirteen persons seeking election, Judge Thigpen is the only African-American.

Judge Thigpen is a member of the Christian Faith Baptist Church of Raleigh, NC. He has served with distinction for two years as a Special Superior Court Judge. He has had an exemplary legal career, having been a founder of the firm of Thigpen Blue Stephens and Fellers. For thirty-five years, he litigated cases in both state and federal court. Judge Thigpen and his legal team took the historic Bazemore v. Friday case all the way to the U. S. Supreme Court where they won by a unanimous decision.

When a practicing attorney, Judge Thigpen has been the legal representative for the General Baptist State Convention. He previously served as legal counsel for Shaw University.

He was raised in North Carolina earning his undergraduate degree from North Carolina Central University and his law degree from Rutgers University. Judge Thigpen was married to Cynthia Cartwright Thigpen (deceased) for twenty-six years and is the proud father of two sons, Omar (33) and Daren (30). His 91 year old mother, Nettie Houston Thigpen, is his proudest supporter.

GBSC Annual Session Convenes October 25-28 in Charlotte

If you choose to mail your form, please mail it in adequate time so that it will be received at Baptist Headquarters on or before September 27. Any forms received at Baptist Headquarters on September 28 or later will be processed on site.
