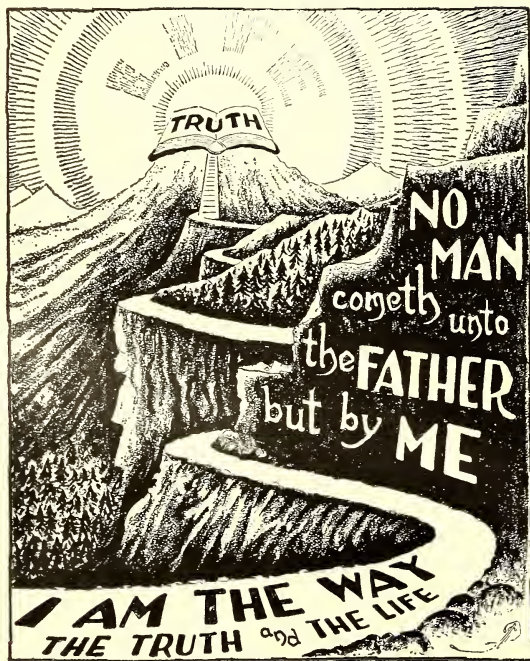

## Ten Years of Progress

---

---

With an uncrushable faith and with great enthusiasm in the possibilities of developing a cause, a young Christian educator came to Shaw University ten years ago, following a successful experience as director of the Division of Education, Psychology and Philosophy at a sister Baptist institution (Union University in Richmond, Va.).

Facing a multiplicity of problems of every "variety," the "frosh" president—now a "dynamo" among college administrators, immediately set forth a program of reorganization and future advancement for the historic institution that was warmly endorsed by trustees, alumni and friends of the school. Today, many of the hopes and aspiration of that young dreamer have doubtless been realized and the cause of Shaw University speeds on its way.

In conjunction with the celebration of the 81st anniversary of Shaw University, November 22, the tenth anniversary of President Robert P. Daniel will fittingly be observed by trustees, alumni, students and friends of the institution.

Ten years at Shaw for President Daniel, have been ten years of physical and mental strain. Perhaps no college administrator has worked harder or longer in ten years, and has through his patrons and assistants accomplished so much with "so little."

Below are listed some of the developments that have taken place in the ten years Dr. Daniel has been administrator at Shaw:

1. The student body has increased from 400 to more than 800 at present.

2. The university staff, 35 persons then, now is composed of 80 persons.

3. The operation budget has doubled and finances of the school are in excellent condition.

4. All buildings on the campus have been renovated.

5. The Turner Memorial gates at the entrance to the campus were taken down and rebuilt to provide a wider entrance and conform to a new design desired by the widow.

6. An indebtedness of \$45,000 was cancelled in two years, which enabled the school to receive a grant of \$45,000 from the General Education Board.

7. Financial support of churches, alumni and friends has increased 500 per cent.

8. A Home Economics Practice Residence and two additional faculty residences have been erected.

9. The activities program of the school has been so extended that the annual operating budget has been increased from \$125,000 to over \$200,000.

10. The institution's educational standing has been raised to the "A" rating by the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools in recognition of the strengthened academic program, progressive administrative policies, enlarged library services, and stable financial condition.

11. Establishment of Baptist Headquarters, which comprise the offices of the General Baptist State Convention of North Carolina, and from which is directed the entire program of the Baptist denomination among Negroes in North Carolina.

12. Maintenance of a Nursery School on the campus for the children in the community.

13. Improved health facilities and services including a new infirmary unit.

14. Establishment of a Department of Religious and Missionary Education offering a major for a degree.

15. Tupper Hall, formerly the university gymnasium, has been converted into a men's dormitory at an estimated cost of \$40,000.

## Our 1946-47 Goals

The Stewardship job of Christian Missions, Christian Education, and Evangelism of North Carolina Baptists was so well done last year that it is imperative that we set new and higher goals.

The exploration of our theme "The Church and Social Ills," at our recent Convention in Charlotte, challenges us as never before to "be about our Father's business." Every speaker and participant on the program seemed to have been filled with a message from God. The information, inspiration, and challenge from this Convention speak loudly in urging us on to greater tasks of Evangelism and Stewardship.

In the area of Evangelism, the officials and workers of the General Baptist State Convention

are offering every possible aid to our 1,711 churches for a state wide revival—a revival that will revitalize our church life, shake us away from our spiritual complacency, and make us alive to the task of our Master. Two-thirds of our supposed constituency of 275,000 Baptists could well be mourners and converts in this revival. Our churches must become spiritually awake before we can win the world to Christ. The revival which I am suggesting is not a one-week meeting in *August*, but rather a year-round spiritual campaign.

When the church in its present state is thoroughly saturated with the spirit of God and evangelism, we can then look upon the harvest which is ripe and waiting. There are 300,000 children in North Carolina who go to no one's Sunday School, and countless thousands of adults and children who never hear the gospel. We must reach these unchurched and unChristian people. Our goal this year is to touch, cause to think, and cause to change, at least 50,000 of North Carolina's unchurched and unChristian people. This is our primary goal on the home front.

As we think in terms of goals of service we must not forget our stewardship of sharing in means. Our President presented, and we adopted, at our annual Convention in Charlotte, a financial goal of \$180,000.00 for the 1946-47 fiscal year. This amount is broken down as follows: Shaw University \$50,000; Foreign Missions \$20,000; State Missions \$50,000; Oxford Orphanage \$10,000; and, \$50,000 for the State Expansion Program.

Each church in the state is asked to assume at least the same responsibility in Quotas and Pledges as it did last year. Our Unified Program goal for this year is a little less than the total receipts for the past year. The \$130,000.00 which we have budgeted for the Unified Program and the Oxford Orphanage can easily be raised if all of the 944 churches, and 75 Associations and Baptist Organizations will do as much for the program as was done last year. I believe many will do more. Then, too, we are anticipating support from many of the 766 Baptist Churches in the state that did not give any thing last year for Christian Missions and Christian Education.

Along with our Unified Program we have launched a drive to raise \$100,000.00 during the next two years (\$50,000.00 per year), for the purpose of purchasing a lot in Raleigh and erecting a Baptist Headquarters Building. This is our next most needed step in expansion. During the past three years we have been wholly unselfish in helping Shaw University and the Lott Carey put over much needed building programs. So, for the next two years without any lessening of interest in these Christian Education and Missionary Objectives, we are going the second mile to establish for ourselves a much needed permanent home

where the expanding program of the North Carolina Baptists can be adequately carried on.

Another article in this issue of the *INFORMER* entitled "The 50 Thousand Club," gives full details as to the procedure to be used for every Baptist individual, organization, and church in the state to participate in the expansion effort.

It is my hope that before or by the time the Board of Missions meets, December 17, that we will have raised at least \$13,000.00 on this new project.

We look forward to a new convention year with new goals—LET'S ATTAIN THEM!

## Summary of the 79th Annual Session of General Baptist State Convention

Following the most significant year in its history, the General Baptist State Convention of North Carolina held its 79th Annual Session at the Ebenezer Baptist Church in Charlotte, October 29-31, with a host of enthusiastic messengers from Murphy to Manteo, centering their attention on the stewardship of the church in combatting social ills.

Dr. Benjamin E. Mays of Atlanta, Ga., in the principal address on "The Church and the Moral Crisis," warned the representatives that the present crisis which is bringing disaster to humanity throughout the world is not one of economics, ideologies, or race relations, but is a moral crisis.

Dr. Mays, who is president of Morehouse College and vice president of the Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America, told the messengers that the paramount issue of representatives at the United Nations Conference is "What can we do for the protection of our individual nations, and the paramount issue in politics is to get elected to office—a condition true with politicians in Georgia and Mississippi and also with those in North Carolina.

"With the beginning of the first and second world wars," he said, "nations involved, abandoned ethics and concerned themselves with one thing—winning the war.

"The church today," he pointed out, "does not insist that its members stop living a double life. I am not familiar with a church in America," he asserted, "which insists that members that are filled with prejudice are asked to give up prejudice. Try to break down segregation in the church in America and you break the church up."

#### Launch Program for Headquarters Building

Confronted with inadequate office space for the growing program of the convention and its enlarged staff of workers presently numbering 15, the convention formally launched a two years' campaign for \$100,000.00 to be used in erecting a headquarters building in Raleigh.

#### Growth Noted

A report on the finance of the convention during the past five years by Executive Secretary Thomas Kilgore offers the following figures 1940-41, \$7,-853.03; 1941-42, \$20,155.09; 1942-43, \$30,827.86; 1943-44, \$71,086.60; 1944-45, \$101,623.34; and 1945-46, \$134,338.90.

At the recommendation of President P. A. Bishop, the body approved a budget of \$180,000.00 for the current fiscal year to cover its gifts to Shaw University, the Lott Carey Foreign Mission Convention, the Oxford Orphanage, and to be used in a state program of missions and benevolence and expansion.

#### Officers Reelected

Dr. P. A. Bishop, Rich Square, was reelected president of the Convention for the sixth consecutive year, and Dr. W. H. Davidson, Charlotte, was reelected first vice president for the third consecutive year.

Other executive officers reelected were: the Rev. D. C. Gore, Whiteville, second vice president; the Rev. J. A. Nimmo, Greenville, third vice president; the Rev. Thomas Kilgore, executive secretary; the Rev. W. M. Wyatt, Salisbury, recording secretary; Dr. B. K. Mason, Charlotte, assistant recording secretary; the Rev. D. L. Simon, Powellsville, treasurer, and the Rev. M. W. Williams, Raleigh, statistician.

Elected as trustees of the convention were—Dr. O. S. Bullock, Raleigh; Dr. J. W. Tynes, Greensboro; Dr. W. P. Carter, Gastonia; the Rev. L. W. Wertz, Hamlet, and the Rev. J. A. Nimmo of Greenville.

Added to the executive committee were the Rev. R. J. Davidson and the Rev. J. F. Wertz of Charlotte. Retained on the committee were—Dr. O. S. Bullock, Raleigh; Mrs. Viola McMillan, Tarboro; Dr. G. W. President P. A. Bishop was selected as the convention's official representative on the board of trustees of Shaw University by a unanimous vote.

The session accepted an invitation to hold its 80th annual meeting at the First African Baptist Church in Goldsboro. The Rev. M. W. Morgan is pastor.

In a resolution from the convention, special appreciation was expressed for the excellent entertainment rendered by the Baptist ministers and their members and friends under the able direction of the Rev. J. F. Wertz, chairman of the entertainment committee.

## Report of the Committee on the State of the Country

(As approved by the 79th Annual Session)

We, the Committee on the State of the Country submit the following report:

Implementing our 79th Annual Convention theme, "The Church and Social Ills," we call attention to the following aspects of local, state and national affairs which deserve our serious attention for social action:

1. Thirty of the forty-eight states of our nation have statutory laws prohibiting the free association of citizens of the United States, to choose freely companions for the fireside and home and in other mutually desirable social relationship, as between individuals.

2. We observe that the artificial separation forced among the American people in secular affairs by unconstitutional laws of a majority of the states has become the pattern of organization in the American church. The Christian fellowship taught by our Holy Scriptures is denied chance for expression in most of the churches in all of our American communities, because of the activity of the "Missionaries of prejudice" created in the process of law observance in the 16 Jim-crow states, and in all of the 30 which prohibit free association of our citizenship across so-called racial lines.

3. We observe that inequality of educational opportunity is guaranteed by law in at least one-third of the states of the nation. This inequality is inescapable, because of the dual set-up of buildings and facilities requiring separate administrative and supervisory personnel which to be equally efficient would double costs per community on a per capita basis. We recognize in that the "separate but equal" formula used to nationalize this system is misleading, hypocritical and impossible

of achievement to the extent of having such separate facilities compare favorably with the integrated facilities in states providing the same facilities for all the schools in a given community.

4. We observe that in the Veterans Administration, dealing with readjustment of the returning soldiers, sailors and marines, great injustice is practiced against those classified as Negroes. While during the war the Army and Navy administration of personnel discriminated against the colored men and women of the armed forces, the Veterans Administration is offending these veterans even more flagrantly.

In the administration of the educational provisions of the so-called G.I. Bill of Rights, the Veterans Administration has ignored the qualifications of, and the social need for, colored personnel who are interested in the administrative and supervisory positions under the Veterans Educational program. Under the dual educational system in our southern states this is particularly unjust and discriminatory. Such a policy deprives the colored citizenship of any semblance of a fair share of the salaries and other emoluments going along with such opportunities for employment in the leadership services of the Veterans Administration.

5. We observe that the general administration of civil service in our cities, counties, states and in the nation, is discriminatory with reference to employment opportunities for the colored citizens of the nation. The use of photographs with applications in violation of the spirit of the original civil service act, the multiple choice privilege as accorded postmasters, and other devices used to circumvent the fair-play provisions of the original civil service act we protest as undemocratic, unjust and hypocritical to the extent of creating disrespect for law and orderly process in the administration of public affairs.

6. We endorse the petition of the National Negro Congress to the United Nations Organization on behalf of the oppressed citizens of the United States of America, who are represented by this Congress. We recommend, that the Executive Secretary of our Convention be authorized to write such an endorsement to the Secretary-General of the United Nations Organization and to the National Negro Congress.

7. We declare our uncompromising opposition to all the unChristian practices enumerated in this statement above and we adjure our constituency to bring to bear all the resources of our Christian Gospel against these social practices, laws and customs which deny in part our profession of human brotherhood under a common heavenly Father.

## Plan of Relief and Benevolence, As Adopted at Convention in Charlotte

I. The Department of Relief and Benevolence was established by the General Baptist State Convention of North Carolina, January 8, 1946, and shall be supported and maintained as follows:

A. Five per cent of all undesignated money shall be set aside for Benevolence.

B. Ministers and workers will pay according to age and accepted schedule and receive benefits in proportion (See Table).

II. Eligibility for Membership:

A. Any Baptist Pastor in North Carolina upon ordination is eligible to join by paying fee of three dollars (\$3.00) and quarterly, semi-annually or annual dues in the classification which he desires (See Table).

B. Any ordained Baptist Preacher in North Carolina is eligible to join by paying fee of three dollars (\$3.00) and quarterly, semi-annually or annual dues in the classification which he desires (See Table).

C. Any full-time worker of General Baptist State Convention of any of its auxiliaries is eligible to join by paying a joining fee of three dollars (\$3.00) and receive benefits on the same principle as pastors (See Table).

III. Benevolence and Relief Benefits:

A. Regular Pastors:

1. The age of 65 years shall be considered "Retirement" or "Relief-Age."
2. Any pastor joining the Department of Ministerial Benevolence and Relief before the age of fifty-five (55) shall be entitled to the following benefits:

a. If he suffers complete physical breakdown during the first five (5) years he is a member, the "Department" will pay in a lump sum to him all he has paid in plus five dollars (\$5.00) per month for the continuation of the period of disability.

b. If he suffers complete breakdown after he has been a member of the department more than five years (5) but less than ten years (10), the Department will pay to him in a lump sum all he has paid in plus ten dollars (\$10.00) per month for the continuation of the period of disability.

1. If a member regains his health and desires to continue as a member, he may do so by joining as a new member under Article III—Section A, Part 3 of this plan.
  2. If death occurs under (a) or (b) the beneficiary of member will receive all the member has paid in. This payment will be made in a lump sum within thirty days (30) after proof of death is given.
    - c. If pastor retires at age of sixty-five (65) he will receive benefits according to the schedule in proportion to what he has paid in and will be relieved from payment of dues (See Table).
    - d. If pastor chooses to continue to pastor after sixty-five (65) he may receive relief benefits according to schedule but must continue to pay according to schedule.
    - e. Regular Pastors who leave the state before retirement age is reached may receive all they have paid. These payments will be made in twelve (12) monthly installments. If they choose, however, to keep paying they will upon age of retirement receive benefits just as others, except benevolence.
    - f. When death occurs after retirement and one has not received in benefits an amount equal to what he has paid in, then the difference will be paid to his beneficiary within thirty days (30) after proof of death is given.
  3. Any pastor joining the Department of Ministerial Benevolence and Relief between the ages of 55-65 will receive the following benefits:
    - a. If he reaches the age of sixty-five (65) in active service, and retires, he will receive full relief for as many years as he participated in fund plus ten dollars (\$10.00) per month for the rest of his natural life, beginning at the expiration of his eligibility for relief benefits.
    - b. If pastor continues in active service after sixty-five (65) he will not be eligible for relief benefits until he ceases to pastor. When he does cease to he will receive benefits on the same basis as in paragraph (a).
    - c. If death occurs before retirement age, his beneficiary will receive all he has paid in within thirty days (30) after proof of death has been given.
    - d. When death occurs after retirement and benefits have not been paid equal to what has been paid in, the difference shall be paid to his beneficiary within thirty days (30) after proof of death is given.
  4. Regular pastors over the age of sixty-five (65) will not be able to join for relief benefits but when they become disabled, they will receive a monthly benevolent stipend of ten dollars (\$10.00) when recommended by the Executive Committee.
    - B. Ordained Baptist Ministers who are not pastors will receive benefits as follows:
      1. Any Ordained Baptist Minister who is not a pastor, and is not sixty-five (65) years of age, may join the Department of Ministers Benevolence Relief, and upon reaching the age of sixty-five (65) shall receive benefits according to schedule (See Table) until all he has paid in shall be paid back. After which time he will receive five dollars (\$5.00) per month for the rest of his natural life.
      2. In case of total disability before retirement age, then he will receive what he has paid in at the rate it was paid. After the amount has been paid in full, he will get a five dollars (\$5.00) a month for the rest of his natural life.
      3. In case of death before retirement his beneficiary will receive all he has paid in within thirty days (30) days after proof of death is given.
      4. In case of death after retirement and before all benefits are paid back, his beneficiary will receive remaining benefits within thirty days (30) after proof of death is given.
    - C. Full-time employees of General Baptist State Convention and its Auxiliaries:
      1. Any full-time employee of General Baptist State Convention or its Auxiliaries shall receive benefits and benevolence on the same basis as Ordained Baptist Pastors (See Article III).
- IV. Withdrawals:
- A. Any person who is a member of the Department of Ministerial Benevolence and Relief may withdraw at any time he desires, and will receive one-half of what he has paid in, after a six months (6) notice of withdrawal has been given.
- V. Termination of Membership:
- A. In the event of non-payment of dues upon due-date for payment as set forth on the Membership Application, the same being payable at the office of General Baptist State Convention, Post Office Box 287, Raleigh, North Carolina, this membership agreement shall be automatically terminated, and the reinstatement of the certificate shall be made upon the request of the member, if he is in good health and pays a reinstatement fee of \$3.00, and is approved by the Executive Committee of General Baptist State Convention.
  - B. In the event a member's certificate is terminated and he does not qualify for reinstatement within six months (6) from date of termination of certificate, he will be refunded all that he

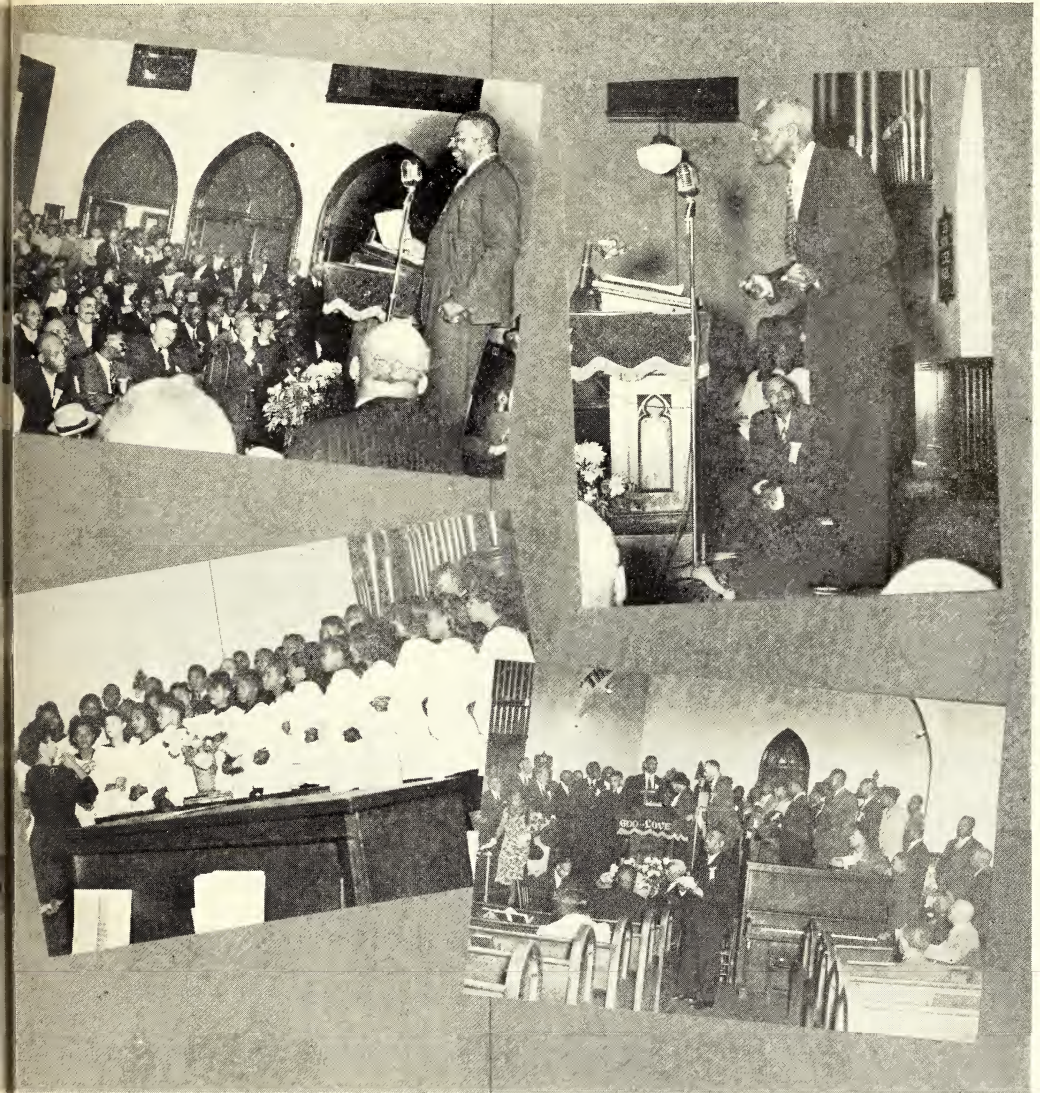

## DEPARTMENT OF Christian Education and Training

Within the last twelve months of our Conventional year it has been very encouraging to observe the growth and increased interest in the program of Christian Education. Indeed, much good is being done, and we may look forward to greater accomplishments in proportion as we organize for effective Christian training and service.

We have in North Carolina approximately 1,700 Negro Baptist Churches. Of this number, 330 participated in the Training Course Program. This represents 19.4% of the total number of churches within our state; leaving 80.6% of the churches not touched by any form of supervised Christian training.

During the Conventional year, 1945-46, 1,768 awards and diplomas were given to persons of the state who qualified through study for the certificates. This represents an increase of 196 over last year's total of 1,572, which is less than 1% of our total constituents. A total of 63 conferences and institutes were held, compared with 44 for the year, 1944-45. Of the 56 associations within the state 30 were reached by our Training Course Program, representing 54% of the total. Many of the other associations were visited during the year, but not for a conference or Training Course.

Our Fourth Annual Training Conference, held at Shaw Uni-

versity, Raleigh, North Carolina, June 24-28, 1946, was conducted with an enrollment of 227; an increase of 48 over the 179 enrolled during the previous year. Eighty (80) churches were represented at this conference.

Therefore, our challenge is to seek to get a larger percentage of our individuals, churches and associations to participate in the Christian Training Program. It can be done more quickly if our pastors will encourage and support such Christian training. The average child gets 30 hours per week in the public school and about 27½ hours per year in the once-per-month church. Thus, Christian training is minimized ridiculously in our social order, and the Christian church is challenged to elevate the same to a more noble place. **THIS IS OUR TASK !**

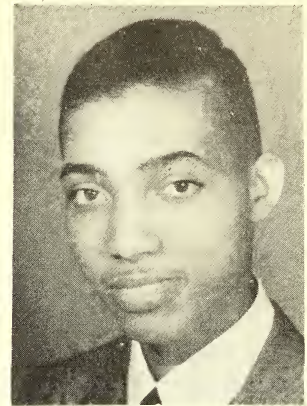
