THE PRESIDENT SPEAKS



DR. R. M. PITTS

Allow me to again express deep appreciation for your response to the appeal made at our One Day Session. This appeal has been followed up by mail and personal contact with good results. Yet, we are a long way from where we are to go.

I am aware of the Revival Season being upon us and the many imposing demands being made upon our time and energy. It goes without saying we are busy.

But let us not get so busy that we forget and neglect the Causes of our great Convention. Summer like

winter, our work suffers because many fail to send funds to operate our work.

Now a word about our coming convention. As you know we will meet in Charlotte, the Queen City of the two Carolinas. We have heard, in recent weeks, many good things from Charlotte and I am eagerly looking forward to this session.

Not only come, but bring some money. This can be a banner year but it all depends on you.

From the office of the Executive Secretary comes this letter:

Dear Fellow Pastor:

One of the most significant things which came out

of the last Annual Session of the N. C. Council of Churches was the adoption of a resolution to employ a full time man to promote interracial cooperation throughout the entire state among all denominations. This is good and the minority races in the state will be given a substantial advance in human dignity. However, this program will have to receive the financial support that is necessary to make it a success. Feeling that every pastor in our convention would be cooperatively in favor of this wonderful effort to advance the Kingdom, we stated in the Council that our convention could be counted on to carry its share of the financial responsibility. We can very easily raise \$1,000 for this cause if 200 of our churches will give at least \$5.00 each. While we are praying for equal rights, opportunities and respect, we must also work for these priceless heritages which God has ordained for all men everywhere.

Rules for the Contest:

1. Each contestant will choose one of the subjects listed above.
2. Each contestant must compose his own speech. It is permissible to quote from materials gathered from any source, but proper credit must be given for quoted material.

3. Each contestant will have six minutes.
4. Each contestant must learn his own speech. Reading from a paper is not permissible.
5. Each contestant will be judged on content, composition, and delivery. Content will count 25% Composition 25%, and Delivery 50%, for a possible total score of 100%.
6. The two top winners will receive scholarships to Shaw University, cash prizes if they do not wish to attend Shaw University.
7. Contestants must be certified by a local BTU Director. The contest is open to high school graduates, and college freshmen who are active BTU members.
