Jesus' Final Worlds ARE Words to Help Us in 2009

On the night of Jesus' betrayal, He got on His knees and washed His disciples feet. He served the disciples their first communion as He confirmed His covenant with them. Afterward, Jesus began to speak His last words to these chosen and select disciples.

So what did Jesus say to His disciples in those final, intimate moments with them? Three entire chapters of John (14, 15 and 16) are devoted to His last words to His disciples. These chapters contain the Spirit-inspired record of what Jesus said to His disciples just hours before He went to the Cross and the grave.

Jesus was about to physically depart from this world. He knew it was absolutely essential that the disciples learn how to rely entirely on the Spirit of God for guidance and direction after He left. Therefore, Jesus used His last moments to teach the disciples how to follow the Holy Spirit's leadership in the same way they had followed Him.

As we enter the uncertainty of 2009, we should recognize our need and dependence upon the Holy Spirit. Jesus did say, "I will pray the Father, and He shall give you another comforter, that He may abide with you forever; "John 14:16

The Greek word for "another" is one of two that can be translated another. The word here means "one of the very same kind; same character; same everything; or nearly a duplicate." The world "another" as used in John 14:16 emphatically means that the Holy Spirit would be like Jesus in every way. This conveys a very strong and important message about the Holy Spirit. Jesus wanted the disciples to know

that the Holy Spirit was just like Him. Following the Hoy Spirit wouldn't be any different than following Him, except the Spirit's leadership would be invisible rather than physical and visible, as Jesus' leadership had been.

John 14:16 could thus be translated to mean: "I will pray the Father, and He will send you Someone who is just like me in every way. He will be identical to me in the way He speaks, the way He thinks, the way He operates, the way He sees things, and the way He does things. He will be exactly like me in every way. If the Holy Spirit is here, it will be just as if I am here because we think, behave, and operate exactly the same."

Having the Holy Spirit with us is just like having Jesus right at our side. And He said, greater works than these will you do. He did not qualify His statement to mean only in good times. In any time, in any set of events, greater works can be done. This is not because of us, but because of Him.

We therefore move into 2009 not as involved in "crisis" but as opportunity. He is with us. He will guide. He will direct! He will comfort. He will encourage.

CEU's-

2009 begins a new CEU cycle. All clergy should get in all their CEU's for the last cycle 2007-2008. Retired Ministers and Licensed Ministers actively pursuing ordination are exempt from the reporting. Those clergy who join within a cycle are required CEU's in a prorated basis. The requirement is 48 over a two year period.

GENERAL CONFERENCE

I am now trying to certify all the delegates to the 2009 General Conference. Every senior pastor may be a delegate. Every pastor's spouse may be a delegate. Every ordained minister may be a delegate. Every spouse may be a delegate. Spouses will be certified if the clergy person is certified. To be certified one must be faithful, in good standing, and up to date with tithes, etc. Each local church that is certified may have one lay delegate. Church delegates will be certified as they are sent to the Conference office.

Certification letters to clergy, spouses, and church delegates reported have been mailed. Any clergy who have not received a letter should contact Bishop Thompson (only those clergy as listed above.)

General Conference will be in Greensboro, North Carolina. July 24 through August 1, 2009. This is an excellent opportunity to attend a General Conference.

Licensed Ministers cannot be certified unless they are the Senior Pastor. They cannot serve as a lay delegate.

All registrations are handled through Oklahoma City—not the Conference Office. However, only those can register that are certified by the Conference Office.
