

Rules Of Decorum

- 1. This Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
- 2. Those members who are regularly chosen by the churches in our union shall compose the Mill Branch Primitive Baptist Association.
- 3. It shall be the duty of the members thus chosen to present letters from the respective churches, certifying their appointment, together with the number baptized, restored, received by letter, dismissed, excluded, died, and total since our last Association.
- 4. This Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk, who shall be chosen by the members present.
- 5. This Association shall have no power to lord it over God's heritage nor infringe on the internal rights of any church.
- 6. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preserve order, explain and put questions. He may have the same right of speech as any other member, provided he appoint some person to fill his place while speaking.
- 7. It shall be the duty of the clerk to keep a fair record of the proceedings of this Association and the minutes taken shall be read and corrected if thought necessary.
- 8. Any church applying by letter for admittance, which upon examination is found orthodox and orderly, shall be received into this Association, and manifested by the Moderator giving the right hand of fellowship to its messengers.
- 9. The Association shall be composed of not over three messengers from each church.
- 10. Every motion made and seconded shall claim the action of the Association except withdrawn by the person who made it with the consent of the Association.
- 11. Every person who speaks in debate shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator and shall not be interrupted except he depart from the subject.
- 12. No person shall speak more than three times on the same subject without leave of the Association.
- 13. There shall be no talking or whispering in time of public speech nor reflections cast upon the speaker.
- 14. Whenever a case is decided by vote there shall be no more debating on that subject.
- 15. No person shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.

- 16. This Association is in favor of preaching the Gospel, the circulation of the scriptures and the advantage of education and recommends temperance and morality in general, but to our members in particular, notwithstanding, she is opposed to all the modern institutions of men, such as Missionary Bible tracts, and Sunday School Union societies, together with Baptist State Conventions, and Theological schools and such like because their connection with the Church of God is unwarranted by the scriptures, as such, we cannot fellowship nor admit to our church privileges any persons that are therewith connected in any wise, believing all such to be speculative in their nature and a fruitful source of corrupting the church.
- 17. We recommend to the churches composing this body to receive members who went off with the Missionary Baptists at the time of the division. Provided they bring satisfactory evidence of a legal baptism with a suitable confession of faith and not otherwise in disorder and not receive any who have been baptized since the division, only by experience and baptism.
- 18. It is the duty of this Association to provide for the general Union of the churches, to give her best advice in matters of difficulty and if the union be broken between any of the sister churches to inquire into the cause of the breach and use her best endeavors to remove the difficulty but if the breach cannot be healed, to withdraw from any church or churches that may be deemed unsound in faith or immoral in practice until they be reclaimed.
- 19. To invite visiting brethren from sistes Associations and ministers of the same faith and order to seats with us.



OF THE SEVENTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL SESSION OF THE MILL BRANCH PRIMITIVE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION,

Held with the Church at Pleasant Hill Horry County, South Carolina, Friday, Saturday and Sunday, October 31, November 1, 2, 1947.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. We believe in one living God, and that He has revealed Himself in His word under the characters of Father, Son and Holy Ghost.
- 2. We believe that the scripture of the Old and New Testament are the true word of God, and the only rule of Faith and practice for believers to be governed by.
- 3. We believe in the doctrine of particuler, eternal and on the creature's part, unconditional election and predestination.
 - 4. We believe in the doctrine of original sin.
- 5. We believe in man's inability to recover himself from the fallen estate he is in by nature, by his own free will and ability.
- 6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed righteousness of Christ.
- 7. We believe that God's elect shall be called or regenerated and sanctified by the Holy Ghost.
- 8. We believe that the Saints shall persevere in grace and never finally fall away.
- 9. We believe that baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ and that true believers are the only subjects of these ordinances and the only true mode of baptism is immersion.
- 10. We believe that the punishment of the wicked will be everlasting and the joys of the righteous will be eternal.
- 11. We believe that no minister has the right to administer the ordinances only such as are called of God and come under the imposition of hands of the Presbytery.
 - 12. We believe in the resurrection of the dead and a general judgment.

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. This Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
- 2. Those members who are regularly chosen by the churches in our union shall compose the Mill Branch Primitive Baptist Association.
- 3. It shall be the duty of the members thus chosen to present letters from respective churches, certifying their appointment, together with the number baptized, restored, received by letter, dismissed, excluded, died, and total since our last Association.
- 4. This Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk, who shall be chosen by the members present.
- 5. This Association shall have no power to lord it over God's heritage nor infringe on the internal rights of any church.
- 6. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preserve order, explain and put questions. He may have the same right of speech as any other member, provided he appoint some person to fill his place while speaking.

- 7. It shall be the duty of the clerk to keep a fair record of the proceedings of this Association and the minutes taken be read and corrected if thought necessary.
- 8. Any church applying by letter for admittance, which upon examination is found orthodox and orderly, shall be received into this Association, and mnaifested by the Moderator giving the right hand of fellowship to its messengers.
- 9. The Association shall be composed of not over three messengers from each church.
- 10. Every motion made and seconded shall claim the action of the Association, except withdrawn by the person who made it with the consent of the Association.
- 11. Every person who speaks in debate shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator and shall not be interrupted except he depart from the subject.
- 12. No person shall speak more than three times on the same subject without leave of the Association.
- 13. There shall be no talking or whispering in time of public speech nor reflections cast upon the speaker.
- 14. Whenever a case is decided by vote there shall be no more debating that subject.
- 15. No person shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.
- 16. This Association is in favor of preaching the Gospel, the circulation of the scriptures and the advantage of education and recommends temperance and morality in general, but to our members in particular, notwithstanding she is opposed to all the modern institutions of men, such as Missionary Bible tracts, and Sunday School societies, together with Baptist State Conventions, and Theological schools and such like because their connection with the Church of God is unwarranted by the scriptures, as such, we cannot fellowship nor admit to our church privileges any persons that are therewith connected in any wise, believing all such to be speculative in their nature and a fruitful source of corrupting the church.
- 17. We recommend to the churches comprising this body to receive members who went off with the Missionary Baptists at the time of the division, provided they bring satisfactory evidence of a legal baptism with a suitable confession of faith and not otherwise in disorder and not receive any who have been baptized since the division, only by experience and baptism.
- 18. It is the duty of this Association to provide for the general Union of the churches, to give her best advice in matters of difficulty, and if the union be broken between any of the sister churches to inquire into the cause of the breach and use her best endeavors to remove the difficulty but if the breach cannot be healed, to withdraw from any church or churches that may be deemed unsound in faith or immoral in practice until they be reclaimed.
- 19. To invite visiting brethren from sister Associations and ministers of the same faith and order to seats with us.
- 20. To keep a correspondence with other Associations of the same faith and order that a chain of connection may be preserved through the denomination.
- 21. If any member shall break these rules of decorum, he shall be immediately reproved by the Moderator.
- 22. These rules shall be read, if necessary, at every Association previous to entering to business.

- 9. The Association shall be composed of not over three Messengers from each church.
- 10. Every motion made and seconded shall claim the action of the Association, except withdrawn by the person who made it with the consent of the Association.
- 11. Every person who speaks in debate shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator and shall not be interrupted except he depart from the subject.
- 12. No person shall speak more than three times on the same subject without leave of the Association.
- 13. There shall be no talking or whispering in time of public speech nor reflections cast upon the speaker.
- 14. Whenever a case is decided by vote there shall be no more debating that subject.
- 15. No person shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.
- 16. This Association is in favor of preaching the Gospel, the circulation of the scriptures and the advantage of education and recommends temperance and morality in general, but our members in particular, notwithstanding she is opposed to all the modern institutions of men, such as Missionary, Bible tracts, and Sunday School societies, together with Baptist State Conventions, and Theological schools and such like because their connection with the Church of God is unwarranted by the scriptures, as such, we cannot fellowship or admit to our church privileges any persons that are therewith connected in any wise, believing all such to be speculative in their nature and a fruitful source of corrupting the church.
- 17. We recommend to the churches comprising this body to receive members who went off with the Missionary Baptists at the time of the division, provided they bring satisfactory evidence of a legal baptism with a suitable confession of faith and not otherwise in disorder and not receive any who have been baptised since the division, only by experience and baptism.
- 18. It is the duty of this Association to provide for the general union of the churches to give her best advice in matters of difficulty, and if the union be broken between any of the sister churches to inquire into the cause of the breach and use her best endeavors to remove the difficulty but if the breach cannot be healed, to withdraw from any church or churches that may be deemed unsound in faith or immoral in practice until they be reclaimed.
- 19. To invite visiting brethren from sister Associations and ministers of the same faith and order to seats with us.
- 20. To keep a correspondence with other Associations of the same faith and order that a chain of connection may be preserved through the denomination.
- 21. If any members shall break these rules of decorum, he shall be immediately reproved by the Moderator.
- 22. These rules shall be read, if necessary, at every Association previous to entering into business.

5. We believe in man's inability to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by nature, by his own free will and ability.

6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by

by the imputed righteousness of Christ.

7. We believe that God's elect shall be called or regenerated and sanctified by the Holy Ghost.

8. We believe that the saints shall persevere in grace and never

finally fall away.

9. We believe that baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ and that true believes are the only subjects of these ordinances and the only true mode of baptism is immersion.

10. We believe that the punishment of the wicked will be everlast-

ing and the joys of the righteous will be eternal.

11. We believe that no minister has the right to administer the ordinances only such as are called of God and come under the imposition of hands of the Presbytery.

12. We believe in the resurrection of the dead and a general judg-

ment.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. This Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.

2. Those members who are regularly chosen by the churches in our union shall compose the Mill Branch Primitive Baptist Association.

3. It shall be the duty of the members thus chosen to present letters from respective churches, certifying their appointment, together with the number baptised, restored, received by letter, dismissed, excluded, died and total since our last Association.

4. This Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk, who shall

be chosen by the members present.

5. This Association shall have no power to lord it over God's heri-

tage nor infringe on the internal rights of any church.

6. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preserve order, explain and put questions. He may have the same right of speech as any other member, provided he appoint some person to fill his place while speaking.

7. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a fair record of the proceedings of this Association and the Minutes be read and corrected if

thought necessary.

8. Any church applying by letter for admittance, which upon examination is found orthodox and orderly, shall be received into this Association, and manifested by the Moderator giving the right hand of fellowship to its Messengers.

9. The Association shall be composed of not over three Messengers

from each church.

10. Every motion made and seconded shall claim the action of the Association, except withdrawn by the person who made it with the

consent of the Association.

11. Every person who speaks in debate shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator and shall not be interrupted except he depart from the subject.

12. No person shall speak more than three times on the same sub-

ject without leave of the Association.

13. There shall be no talking or whispering in time of public speech nor reflection cast upon the speaker.

14. Whenever a case is decided by vote there shall be no more de-

bating that subject.

15. No person shall absent himself from the Association without

leave of the Moderator.

16. This Association is in favor of preaching the Gospel, the circulation of the scriptures and the advantage of education and recommends temperance and morality in general, but our members in particular, notwithstanding she is opposed to all the modern institutions of me, such as Missionary, Bible tracts and Sunday School societies, together with Baptist State Conventions and Theological schools and such like, because their connection with the Church of God is unwarranted by the scriptures, as such, we cannot fellowship or admit to our church privileges any persons that are therewith connected in any wise, believing all such to be speculative in their nature and a fruitful source of corrupting the church.

17. We recommend to the churches comprising this body to receive members who went off with the Missionary Baptists at the time of the division, provided they bring satisfactory evidence of a legal baptism with a suitable confession of faith and not otherwise in disorder and not receive any who have been baptised since the division, only by

experience and baptism.

18. It is the duty of this Association to provide for the general union of the churches to give her best advice in matters of difficulty, and if the union be broken between any of the sister churches to inquire into the cause of the breach and use her best endeavors to remove the difficulty but if the breach cannot be healed, to withdraw from any church or churches that may be deemed unsound in faith or immoral in practice until they be reclaimed.

19. To invite visiting brethren from sister Associations and minis-

ters of the same faith and order to seats with us.

20. To keep a correspondence with other Associations of the same faith and order that a chain of connection may be preserved through the denomination.

21. If any members shall break these rules of decorum, he shall be

immediately reproved by the Moderator.

22. These rules shall be read, if necessary, at every Association, previous to entering business.


