CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I. This body shall be known as The Wake Baptist

The state of the s

ARTICLE II. The object of this Association shall be the promotion of Christt's Kingdom among men and the means of accomplishing this shall be in strict conformity with the New Testament:

ARTICLE III. This Association shall be composed of Delegates chosen by the Churches connected with it, each Church being entitled to at least one delegate, and one delegate for each hundred members or fraction thereof. Ministers who are members of the Churches connected with this body shall be considered members of the Association ex-officio, and ministers who are not in charge of or connected with churches within the bounds of this Association, who present testimonials of good standing in the Baptist denomination, may become members of this Association by payment of \$1.00 annually. Provided ministers who aided in the organization of this Association shall be considered members so long as they are in good standing in the Baptist Denomination. Also, any layman in good standing in the Baptist Church may become an annual member by the payment of \$1.00.

ARTICLE IV. The delegates from each church shall bear a letter certifying their appointment. Giving an account of the condition of the Church, and a Statement of all funds contributed for benevolent purposes during the year.

ARTICLE V. The Officers of this body shall be a Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, and a Statistician, whose duties shall be such as are generally performed

by such officers. In addition, there shall be apointed a Home Mission Board, Foreign Mission Board, Educational Board, Sunday School Board, and an Executive Board, which latter shall have charge of the work of the Association during the interim of its annual session and three members of the executive board shall constitute a quorum and the officers of the body shall be ex-oficio members. The other boards shall have supervision of the work of the Association along their several lines, subject to the executive board of the Association, and shall so organize the territory of the Association as to accomplish the best results, but not contrary to the executive board of the Association.

ARTICLE VI. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside during the deliberations of the body, to enforce an observance of the Constitution, preserve the decorum, appoint committees, decide all questions of order, give his opinion concerning any subject under discussion after others have spoken or when called upon, and give the casting vote if a tie.

ARTICLE VII. It shall be the duty of the clerkk to report the proceedings of each annual session and superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes among the churches.

ARTICLE VIII. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds sent up by the Churches or collected during the session of the body, and distribute the same for the purpose for which they were sent or collected. He shall not pay any order on the treasurer except it be signed by the Moderator and the Clerk of the Association, subject to the provisions of the by-laws.

ARTICLE IX. Any church desiring to become a member of this body shall present her petition to an annual session of the Association through delegates appointed for that purpose and if the Association shall consent to receive her the moderator shall extend to the delegate the right hand of fellowship.

ARTICLE X. This association shall not maintain fellowship with any Church that does not preserve Gospel order.

ARTICLE XI. This Association may invite visiting brethren to seats, and extend to them all privileges of the body save that of voting. The Association shall meet on Wednesday before the third Sabbath in August at such place as the Association may select.

ARTICLE XII. All ministers composing the Association shall hold three ministerial meetings a year in such places as the brethren shall designate.

ARTICLE XIII. We shall-receive no minister into the Association but those who have good moral character.

ARTICLE XIV. Any Baptist Sunday School or Missionary Society within the bounds of this Association may become a member

of this Association by sending voluntary contributions. Each shall be entitled to one delegate.

ARTICLE XV. We shall withdraw the right hand of fellowship from every minister who walks disorderly and contrary to the Gospel rule.

ARTICLE XVI. Each Church connected with this Association can continue its membership by suporting this constitution.

ARTICLE XVII. By appointment of the Association there shall be Preached during each session an introductory Sermon.

ARTICLE XVIII. There shall be a Woman's Auxiliary to the Wake Baptist Association, both Junior and Senior Departments.

ARTICLE XIX. The object of the Auxiliary shall be to aid the Association in the extension of Christ's Kingdom.

Section 1. The officers of the Auxiliary shall be a President, Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, and treasurer of each department.

Section 2. All officers of the Auxiliary shall be elected annually. Section 3. All moneys collected by the Auxiliary shall be turned over to the finance committee of the Association in session and a receipt taken for same.

Section 4. All the reasonable expenses of the Auxiliary shall be paid by the Association.

Section 5. The time of the meeting of the Auxiliary shall be simultaneous with the meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE XX. This constitution may be amended at any annual session of the Association by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. Schools, societies and individuals shall be acknow-ledged in the minutes of the Association.

Section 2. Before the final adjournment of the Association all the funds, notes, etc., shall be counted by the finance committee and treasurer. The treasurer shall give the finance committee a receipt for the amount placed in his hands.

Section 3. The treasurer shall pay out no money except on order written by the clerk and signed by the moderator and clerk.

Section 4. After the expense of the Association shall have been paid the remaining Associational funds shall be applied to such purposes as the Association may direct.

The Executive Board shall execute plans adopted by the Association.

Section 5. The Auditor shall audit the accounts of the Treasurer and make annual reports of the Association.

Section 6. The duties of the boards provided for in the constitution shall be such as are usually performed by such boards in other similar bodies.

PROCEEDINGS

The Seventy-Seventh Annual Session of the Wake Baptist Association met with the New Providence Baptist Church Wednesday, August 11, 1943, at 11 a.m., Dr. O. S. Bullock presiding. Devotion led by Rev. A. A. Morrisey and Rev. T. B. Smith. We heard echoes from the field, after which the meeting was opened for discussion.

How to revamp, renovate and remodel the church to meet present conditions, led by Dr. O. S. Bullock. He said, "It means to take what you have, and make what you want. Not to change the Gospel, but to make the approach different."

The Introductory Sermon was preached by Rev. C. C. Jones, found in St. John 15:12. Subject: "This is my Commandment, that ye love one another as I have loved you."

The preachers must preach love today, as all salvation hangs on love." Jesus is speaking today not through doctors, but through his preachers.

Dr. O. S. Bullock, acting moderator, said that we have not been in such a predicament for 22 years with both Moderator and Vice Moderator sick. He asked for a series of prayers which was carried out.

An offering of \$13.05 was taken, and after the visitors were introduced by J. L. Tilley, the meeting adjourned.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Devotion was led by Rev. Trotter and Bro. R. Rayford. Then the Moderator's Address was read by Rev. C. C. Jones. Adopted by the Association and given to the committee. After hearing the report of the Committee, a motion was made that in due respect of the Moderator who was sick, that the election rules be suspended and that the Moderator and all the present officers retain their offices for ensuing year. The election was unanimous.

WOMAN'S AUXILIARY REPORT

Mrs. B. E. Barrett, who made the report on Woman's Auxiliary, stated that twenty-five years ago the Auxiliary started out with only two members, both present at this session. She gave a brief history of the Auxiliary and stated how the Lord had been with the work.

MINISTERS' AND DEACONS' UNION

This report was given by Rev. A. A. Morrisey, who stated that, "The Lord had visited them. A number of faithful ministers and deacons have stood by us." He stressed the benefit of Bible lectures given at every union meeting and said "The Union has been instrumental in helping delinquent ministers."

WAKE MISSIONARY UNION

Bro. O. P. Dunn said the Union had a splendid year and had raised more money than ever.

WAKE COUNTY SUNDAY SCHOOLS

This report was given by Bro. A. C. Parrish who said, among other things, "There are too many preachers and church officers who don't attend Sunday School. The pastors and church officers must take more interest in the Church School."

BAPTIST TRAINING UNION

To have a better church we must revamp our program and train our people. We must train our people to give more money. We cannot carry on without finances.—Rev. Otis Dunn.

THURSDAY MORNING SESSION Vice Moderator Rev. H. D. Eaton, Presiding

Praise service was led by Rev. James Avery and Rev. Otis Dunn. Theme: "Contending for the Christian Faith in a World Crisis."

Topic: "The Qualifications of Prospective Church Officers." This was discussed by Rev. V. T. Williams, who said, among other things, "The deacon should show signs of Spiritual appreciation and a willingness to make some sacrifice to carry on the Lord's work. He should be honest and kind, and remember he is only a servant of the church and not a boss."

OUR STATE PROGRAM

Dr. O. S. Bullock, speaking on Our State Program, declared that "The Wake Association is the hub of the state work. With her characters, the Association should be in the lead. The N. C. Baptists have the best program in the union."

ADDRESS ON EDUCATION By Rev. John L. Tilley

The Education Program must not only be one of telling, but must be one of experience.

LOTT-CAREY CONVENTION

In speaking of the Convention, Dr. W. C. Sommerville encouraged the members of the Association to attend the Lott-Carey Convention in Orange, N. J., and give more money to missions.

An offering of \$5.00 was raised. By vote, this amount was suplemented with \$40.00.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The Afternoon Session was opened with praise service led by Rev. T. J. Foster and Deacon 'S. H. Hicks, after which a summary of the previous day's meeting was read by the clerk. Next was a sermon by Rev. A. A. Anderson. Text: Isaiah 40:31—"But they that wait on the Lord shall renew their strength."

The Seventy-Eighth Annual Session of the Wake Association convened with the Mt. Pleasant Baptist Church, Neuse, N. C., August 16-17, 1944, with Geo. S. Stokes, Moderator, presiding.

The session was welcomed by the church pastor, Rev. A. Horton.

Impressive addresses were made by Rev. M. W. Williams and Dr. O. S. Bullock following an able sermon by the Rev. A. B. Johnson of Raleigh.

The Moderator's strong message, setting a standard of Christian living and giving to reach \$5,000 for the next fiscal year, was heard on Wednesday.

Thursday's session was highlighted by a profound message

on Missions by the Rev. C. E. Griffin, Executive Secretary of the N. C. Baptist Convention. Reports of committees were made, then the close.

The Woman's Auxiliary, headed by Mrs. B. E. Barrett, also held an impressive session during the two-day meeting. Among other messages than that of President Barrett, Mrs. M. Brown of Shaw University spoke ably.

The session adjourned to convene with the Baptist Grove. Church near Raleigh, N. C., August 15-16, 1945.

RESOLUTIONS — EXTRA SESSION—APRIL 29, 1945

We your Committee on Resolutions wish to make the following observations:

In view of the fact that the Church's first mission is to help save lost souls, we therefore urge all churches within its bounds to put more stress on *Evangelization*. Along with the regular yearly revivals, we would advocate weekly and monthly conversions or church additions

We recommend as an aid to evangelism the teaching of Religious Education in individual schools as sponsored by the Wake County S. S. Convention in its training program. We wish further to emphasize the importance of Christian Education, as taught at Shaw University and other Christian Schools, and to foster the same we urge that the churches and members follow God's plan of giving.

DOCTRINE

That the pastors and churches of the Wake Association will continue to conform to the doctrines and faith as practiced by the founders—fathered of the Baptist Faith, and taught in the Great Commission to men.

Resolve:

- 1. That we as Christians emulate the Prince of Peace, use our influence to put in office men whose character and influence point to democracy in dealing with groups, races and nations.
- 2. That we as an Association pray that the Holy Spirit will guide the representatives in their deliberations as they plan for permanent peace in the world.
