#### PROCEEDINGS, SPRING SESSION 1921

Jones Hill, Stanly County, N. C.

Saturday before first Sunday in May, 1921.

Asembled at the stand at 11 o'clock A. M. Praise and prayer by Elder W. C. Edwards, who preached the Introductory Sermon from these words: "Ye are the salt of the earth."

Intermission one hour for dinner.

Then the ministers and messengers convened in the house. Praise and prayer by Elder J. F. Mills. Elder Edwards resumed his seat and proceeded.

1. Called for the letters from the churches. These were handed in as called and read by brother H. M. Baucom, reading clerk.

2. By motion elected Elder W. C. Edwards, Moderator and J. W. Jones, Clerk.

3. Invited visiting ministers and messengers from sister associations to seats. Elder C. A. Davis, of Salem, Elder Sam McMillan, of Abbots Creek, Elder W. C. McMillan, of Tennessee and brothers T. H. Bentley and W. A. Bentley, of Silver Creek, present and seated.

4. Invited visiting brethren from sister associations to seats. Elder J. M. Royal, of Fishers River and brothers Mabe and Henry Tucker and \_\_\_\_\_\_Sneed ,of Abbots Creek and brother Tate from Salem and Elder M. L. Riner of Lots Creek in Georgia were present and seated. Also brother H. E. Walser of Abbotts Creek.

5. Appointed on Committee of arrangement the following brethren: P. A. Howard, J. J. Hill and H. M. Baucom together with Moderator and Clerk.

6. That Elders J. M. Royal, C. A. Davis, M. L. Riner and B. L. Treece preach at the Stand tomorrow.

7. Adjourned to 9:30 Monday A. M.

#### SUNDAY, MAY 1.

## BEAR CREEK ASSOCIATION.

FALL SESSION, 1921, PROCEEDINGS.

Philadelphia, Rutherford County, N. C.

October 1st, 1921.

Assembled in the grove on the church yard and service commenced at the Stand with singing and prayer by conducted by Elder D. S. Jones.

Introductory Sermon delivered by Elder B. L. Treece from 4th verse of 17th chapter of St. John.

Intermission one hour for dinner.

Then convened in the church house at 1:30 P. M.

Praise and prayer conducted by Elder J. F. Mills, after which Elder Edwards resumed the chair and proceeded in usual order.

1. The letters from the several churches were called for and read by brother Lee A. Jones, who the Clerk had chosen as assistant and reading Clerk.

2. Re-elected Elder W. C. Edwards, Moderator and J. W. Jones, Clerk.

3. Invited visiting messengers from Sister associations to seats. The following were present and seated: Elder H. M. Williams, T. H. Bentley, W. A. Bentley and file of Minutes from Silver Creek. Brethren C. B. Owen and D. P. Broadaway and Minutes from Abbotts Creek. (Elder Samuel McMillan came in Sunday evening.)

4. Invited visiting brethren from Sister associations to seats.

5. At this juncture, a letter was presented from the church at Freedom, showing their return to good order, and this church was reinstated as a member of the association and their messenger duly seated in our council.

6. Appointed the following brethren a committee of arrangements: Lee A. Jones, H. F. Curlec and W. M. Clontz, with Moderator and Clerk.

7. Appointed on Finance committee brethren W. A.

Hargett and P. A. Howard.

8. Appointed Elders J. F. Mills, W. C. Edwards, D. S. Jones and B. L. Treece to preach at the Stand Sunday. Service to commence at 10 A. M.

9. It was reported that one of our coresponding associations, the Mountain District, was recognizing and preaching Elder T. M. Standly, who we know to be in disorder and the following brethren were appointed to find the facts of said rumor and report same to our next session.

10. Adjourned to 9 A. M. Monday.

Preaching Service conducted at the Stand Saturday afternoon by Elders J. F. Mills and D. S. Jones.

#### SUNDAY SERVICE—OCT. 2.

Assembled around the Stand in grove at 10 A. M. Praise and prayer by Elder H. M. Williams. Then Elder J. F. Mills preached from the 20th verse of the 12th chapter of Matthew, followed by Elder W. C. Edwards from the 10th and 11th verses of the 33rd chapter of Ezekiel.

Intermission one hour for dinner.

Afternoon Elder D. S. Jones preached from the 21st. verse of the 10th chapter of St. Luke, followed by Elder B. L. Treece, from these words: "The Lord knoweth them that are His."

The Ministers were wonderfully blessed to preach Christ and Him crucified, a whole and complete Savior, and the only name given among men whereby poor sinners could ever be justified and saved. Surely the gospel was preached in power and demonstration of the Spirit and the Saints present built up, strengthened in faith, and edified and we believe this blessed gospel will be loved and the praise of our dear Redeemor shall go on in time and then through the trackless vista or ages of eternity where we hope to sing His praise forevermore.

Convened in the house at 9 A. M. pursuant to adjourn-

ment. Praise and prayer by Elder Sam McMillan.

11. Called for report of arrangement committee. Report read and approved.

12. Called roll of messengers and noted absentees.

(Omitted reading Rules of Decorum.)

13. Called on coresponding messengers to Sister associations to report. Reports were satisfactory.

Elder Mills and brother J. F. Burrus attended Abbotts Creek.

14. Called on visiting messengers from Sister associations to report. Report only from Abbotts Creek and Silver Creek by messengers and Minutes.

15. Called on Presbyteries to report. Elder D. S. Jones reported that he and Elder Henry Taylor formed a Presbytery on Saturday before the 5th Sunday in July, 1921 at Liberty and ordained brother Edmond Privitt a Deagon for that church.

16. That we continue corespondence with Sister associations as follows: To Abbotts Creek, J. W. Jones, H. M. Baucom, J. F. Burrus, H. F. Curlee and Minutes. To Mill Branch, Elder J. F. Mills, J. F. Burrus, J. J. Hill, Arch Helms and Minutes. To Salem, J. F. Burrus and Minutes. To Mountain District Minutes. To Nolachucky of Tennessee, Minutes.

17. That we advise the members of our Sister churches who have joined Labor Unions, to withdraw from such Unions immediately.

18. That our next Spring Session convenes with the church at Liberty, Union County, N. C. about three miles south of Monroe and commences on Saturday before the first Sunday in May, 1922 and that Elder J. F. Mills is appointed to preach the Introductory Sermon, Elder B. L. Treece his alternate, and that the Annual or Fall Session will be held with the church at Crooked Creek, Union County, N. C., about twelve miles north of Monroe and commence on Saturday before the first Sunday in October, 1922. Elder W. C. Edwards to preach the In-

troductory Sermon, Elder D. S. Jones, his alternate.

19. That the Clerk have notices of these meetings published.

20. Called on Treasurer to report. Report shows one. dollar and fifty five cents due the Clerk from last year.

21. Called on Finance Committee to report. Report shows sent up for Minutes and Associational fund this year the sum of \$92.30.

22. Agreed to distribute any surplus fund to Ministers present at Close of meeting. \$36.30 was so distributed after dismission.

23. That the Clerk act as Treasurer and also have 1100 copies of the Minutes printed and distributed in our usual manner.

24. That we return thanks to God for His mercy and blessings, and also that we thank this church, kind brethren and sisters for their generous hospitality extended us during this meeting.

25. Adjourn in order, after reading and approving above Minutes, to times and places above mentioned.

1st, A Moderator, of Chief Speaker, and Clerk may be chosen by the suffrages of the members present.

2nd. The Chief Speaker, or Moderator, shall take his seat at the hour to which the Association shall be adjourned, and after prayer shall proceed to business. It shall be his duty to keep order, and shall be entitled to the same privilege of speech as that of another member; provided, he appoint one of the members to fill the chair during the exercise of such privilege, and in no case shall give a vote unless the Association be equally divided.

3rd. Only one member shall be allowed to speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Chief Speaker by the appellation of brother, and while speaking shall confine himself strictly to the subject in question, and shall not be interrupted unless he digress from the subject, and shall in no wise reflect on any other speaker, so as to make remarks on his slips and failings and imperfections, but shall fairly give his own views of the case without sophistry or criticism.

4th. No person shall speak more than three times on one subject without leave of the Association.

5th. No person shall absent himself from the Association without leave.

6th. No member of the Association shall address any other member by any other term or name than that of brother.

7th. The Chief Speaker, or Moderator, shall not interrupt one member to prohibit him from speaking until his speech is finished, except he break the Rules of Decorum.

8th. The names of all members of the Association shall be enrolled by the clerk, and be called over as often as the Association may require.

9th. Any member who shall willingly and knowingly break or violate any of the foregoing rules of this Association, shall be reproved by the Association in any way they may think proper. Article 1. We believe in one only living and true God, the Father, the Word and the Holy Ghost.

Art. 2. We believe in the man Jesus being the first of all God's creation and the pattern of all God's perfection in nature, providence, grace and glory, and in relative union with the divine word, and thus united with the whole Trinity.

Art. 3. We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New testaments contain the only written revealed word of God, and are the only perfect rule of faith and practice for God's church in her militant state while here on earth.

Art. 4. We believe in the doctrine of Election, that God chose his church in Christ Jesus before the world • began.

Art. 5. We believe in all mankind's apostacy by transgression in Adam, the federal head.

Art. 6. We believe in the doctrine of original sin.

Art. 7. We believe in the impotency of man to recover himself from his fallen state by his own free will and ability.

Art. .8. We believe that sinners are justified freely by grace and before God by faith in Christ and his righteousness only.

Art. 9. We believe that God's elect or church shall be called, converted, regenerated and sanctified by the Holy Spirit in due time.

Art. 10. We believe that the saints shall persevere in grace and never really fall away.

Art. 11. We believe that baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinances of Christ's appointment and that believers alone are the subjects of baptism and the only proper communicants of the supper; that the mode of baptism is immersion, and that neither of the ordinances is to be altered or changed by the inventions or opinions of men.

Art. 12. We believe that no man as a minister has any right to the administration of any of the ordinances of the gospel except such as are sound in the faith of the gospel, regularly baptised, called of God and have come under the imposition of hands by a regular Presbytery.

Art. 13. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both the just and the unjust, and a general judgment.

Art. 14. We believe that the punishment of the wicked will be everlasting and the joys of the righteous eternal.

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
