Bro. J. P. Barrow made a very interesting talk in behalf of the Smithfield Bible School. Prof. Barrow presented the situation as follows; 1—To uphold the Bible. 2—Our purpose to teach the Bible. 3—Outlook of the future. 4—Standards of Religious work. 5—Guidance of the Holy Spirit. 6—Loyalty to the Smithfield Church and town. 7—Today the Crisis of the School. 8—The Need of an Evening Class. 9—Need \$150.00 to 200.00 per month. 10—The course the same as other Bible Schools. 11—The necessity of a trained ministry. 12—Teaching the plans of Jesus. 13—Win souls for God.

Eld. J. C. Griffin spoke in behalf of the Bible School. Eld. Griffin said "there was a time when our people did not care for an educated preacher, but today they are quite different. They are deeply interested now in a Bible School." Other religious schools are not doing anything for our denomination, we must do it ourselves. We old preachers will soon have to go to our final reward, therefore we will need more and better trained men to take our place. **STAND BY A BIBLE SCHOOL.**

At 11:00 o'clock Eld. J. C. Griffin preached a very interesting sermon. Text Romans 8:9. Subject—"The Spirit of Christ."
