



IV. Constitution

of the

Sandhills Baptist Association

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this body shall be "The Sandhills Baptist Association."

ARTICLE II - PURPOSES AND OBJECTIVES

Section 1. The Sandhills Baptist Association shall consist of messengers who are members of duly elected affiliated churches.

Section 2. The objectives of this association shall be to promote fellowship, missions, associations, the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina, and the Southern Baptist Convention in all work of Southern Baptists.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP AND AFFILIATIONS

Section 1. The Sandhills Baptist Association shall consist of messengers who are elected members of affiliated churches.

- (1) Each church affiliated with this association having a membership up to one hundred members shall be entitled to four messengers and one additional messenger for every fifty members or major fraction thereof, thereafter. No church, however, shall be entitled to more than eight messengers.
- (2) Pastors of the affiliated churches and their missions and other full-time paid professional staff.
- (3) Duly elected officers of the association, department directors, chairpersons of all standing committees and the director of missions.

Section 2. Affiliations:

- (1) The churches affiliated with this association shall be churches who use the New Testament as a statement of faith and church policy, and who teach that a person upon profession of faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord will be immersed in water, unless providentially hindered, to qualify for church membership;. In this and other doctrinal matters, the association subscribes to *The Baptist Faith and Message* adopted by the Southern Baptist Convention, May 9, 1963.
- (2) Churches shall be received into this fellowship only after having been under watchcare of the association for one full year. Application for membership shall be made through the Credentials Committee. The Association Board shall have the authority to receive any church under watchcare upon recommendation of the Credentials Committee.
- (3) Baptist churches affiliated with and in fellowship with other Baptist associations may become affiliated with the association without coming under the watchcare, upon the recommendation of the Credentials Committee and the approval of the Association Board or the association.
- (4) The Association shall only have the authority to advise the churches touching all things pertaining to their interest, but shall in no case presume to direct or control them in reference to their government or internal policy. The association recognizes the complete autonomy of each affiliated church. Each church shall recognize the complete autonomy of the association.

(5) Whenever a church fails to be represented by letter at the annual meeting, or fails to show interest by financial support and attendance at associational meetings for two consecutive years, or reportedly violates Section 2, (1) of this article, the moderator shall ask the Credentials Committee to confer with the church. If satisfactory reason is not given and there is not effort to keep alive their association with the cooperating churches, the Credentials Committee shall bring its findings to the association. The association, by majority vote of its messengers casting ballots, may then withdraw its fellowship. The association recognizes that any affiliated church has the right to withdraw its fellowship from the association but requests a church making such a decision to notify its intention in writing to the association.

ARTICLE IV - MEETINGS

Section I. Officers: The officers of the association shall be the moderator, vice-moderator, clerk, treasurer, historian, parliamentarian, three trustees, and director of missions.

Section 2. Departments: This association shall promote an aggressive program of teaching, training, evangelism, missions, and stewardship through the following departments - Brotherhood, Discipleship Training, Evangelism, Library Services, Missions, Music, Pastoral Ministries, Senior Adults, Stewardship, Sunday School, Woman's Missionary Union, and Youth. The department directors shall be elected by the association in annual session. Vacancies occurring between annual sessions shall be filled by the Associational Board.

Section 3. Associational Board.

Section 4. Committees: There shall be the following committees - Executive Committee, Committee on Committees, Constitution and Bylaws, Credentials, Finance and Audit, Nominations, Ordination, Place and Preacher, Program, and Resolutions.

Section 5. Employees: The director of missions and any other employee of the association shall be charged with the responsibility of the promotion of the whole program, subject to the Association Board, and be elected by the Association Board or the association in annual meeting.

Section 6. Representatives: Baptist Children's Homes, Baptist Foundation, Baptist Hospital, Baptist Retirement Homes, *Biblical Recorder*, and Christian Education.

ARTICLE V - ORGANIZATION

Section 1. Officers: The officers of the association shall be the Moderator, Vice-moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Historian, Parliamentarian, three (3) Trustees, and Director of Missions.

Section 2. Departments: This association shall promote an aggressive program of teaching, training, evangelism, missions, and stewardship emphases through the following departments: Sunday School, Discipleship Training, Youth, Brotherhood, Music, Evangelism, Stewardship, Library Services, Woman's Missionary Union, Missions, and Pastoral Ministries. The department directors shall be elected by the association in annual session. Vacancies occurring between sessions shall be filled by the Associational Board.

Section 3. Associational Board.

Section 4. Committees: There shall be the following standing committees - (1) Executive, (2) Committee on Committees, (3) Nominating, (4) Finance and Audit, (5) Program, (6) Constitution and Bylaws, (7) Credentials, (8) Ordinations, (9) Place and Preacher, (10) Property and Grounds, and (11) Resolutions.

Section 5. Employees: The director of missions and any other employees of the association shall be charged with the responsibility of the promotion of the whole program, subject to the authority of the Associational Board, and be elected by the Associational Board or the association in annual meeting.

Section 6. Representatives: (1) Baptist Hospital, (2) Children's Homes, (3) Baptist Retirement Homes, (4) Christian Education, (5) *Biblical Recorder*, (6) and Baptist Foundation.

ARTICLE VI - REVISION

The association may amend or alter the constitution by a vote of two-thirds of the messengers present at the annual meeting, provided that each proposed change or amendment be stated in writing on the first day of the session and be voted on the day following. Each proposed change or amendment must be printed in the Sandhills Baptist newsletter in the last issue before the annual meeting.

ARTICLE VII - THE ASSOCIATIONAL YEAR

The associational year shall begin on the first day of October and close on the thirtieth day of September of the following year.

The work of this association shall be governed by the foregoing constitution and the following bylaws.

Bylaws

ARTICLE I - PROCEDURES

The business of the association shall be conducted according to the latest edition of *Robert's Rules of Order* where not otherwise specified by this constitution or its bylaws.

ARTICLE II - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. Moderator

- (a) Shall preside over the annual sessions of the association, all meetings of the Association Board, and see that order and decorum are observed.
 - (b) Shall be ineligible to serve more than two consecutive one year terms.
- (c) Shall be an ex-officio member of all standing committees of the association. Section 2. Vice-moderator: Shall preside at the pleasure of the moderator or in the absence of the moderator and shall be the chairperson of the Executive Committee. Section 3. Clerk.
 - (a) Shall keep an accurate record of the proceedings of the association.
 - (b) Shall superintend the printing and distribution of the associational minutes.
- (c) Shall keep on file the printed minutes and other important documents belonging to the association.
- (d) Shall be paid an annual amount as set in the associational budget. Section 4. Treasurer.
 - (a) Shall be responsible for the receipt and distribution of all monies.
 - (b) Shall keep an accurate record of both receipts and distributions.

(c) Shall make comprehensive reports to the Associational Board at its regularly scheduled meetings and to the annual meeting of the association.

Section 5. Historian: Shall collect information and put in some durable form the items of particular interest about each of the member churches and association.

Section 6. Parliamentarian: Shall advise and assist the presiding officer of the association and the Associational Board with respect to all matters involving proper parliamentary procedure.

Section 7. Trustees: Shall hold in trust any property, money endowed, or other securities of the association; and shall handle all legal matters of the association under the direction of the association or Association Board.

Section 8. Director of Missions:

- (a) Search Committee: The Nominating Committee, as needed, shall recommend seven persons to the Associational Board who would serve as a director of missions search committee.
 - (b) Conditions of employment:
 - 1) Shall be called on an indefinite basis. The relationship may be terminated by either the director of missions or the association with a thirty day notice.
 - Shall have three weeks vacation with pay; the time will be determined in consultation with the Executive Committee.
 - 3) May be away from the association for three weeks for revivals and/or World Missions Conferences. These meetings will be scheduled in consultation with the Executive Committee.
 - 4) Will be limited to revivals in the association only so far as they do not conflict with basic responsibilities.
 - 5) May serve any church in the association as interim pastor for a period not to exceed five Sundays, except when additional time is approved by the Executive Committee. At such a time, the church should contribute to the associational treasurer a reasonable remuneration for services.
 - 6) May serve as chaplain in one institution outside the association, but this work shall not unduly interfere with the responsibilities to the association.

(c) Duties

- Shall respond within the limits of time and ability to the invitations of the churches for assistance in their congregational needs; work with associational leaders in planning and initiating a program of work; encourage the cooperation of all the churches in the undertakings of the association; promote missionary interest among the churches; enlist the churches in the support of those causes fostered by the Baptist State Convention.
- 2) Shall give general oversight to the work of the association and, with the assistance of the Executive Committee, draw up an annual calendar of activities which shall be approved by the Associational Board.
- 3) Shall give written quarterly reports to the Associational Board and an annual report to the association.
- 4) Shall publish an attractive and informative newsletter and shall distribute it to pastors, Associational Board members, associational officers, and general church officers.
- 5) Shall cultivate the friendship and goodwill of those churches not fully cooperating with the association in the hope that they may be led to cooperate with us in carrying out the Great Commission.

- 6) Shall be alert to the needs of mission work in unchurched areas and shall conduct surveys, when deemed advisable, to ascertain these needs. When mission work is established, he shall see that it is initiated under the sponsorship of a local affiliated church.
- 7) Shall be an ex officio member of standing committees of the association.

ARTICLE III - DUTIES OF DEPARTMENT DIRECTORS

Section 1. Brotherhood:

- (a) Shall promote the total Brotherhood program (Baptist Men and Royal Ambassadors) in the churches of the association through workshops, retreats, and rallies.
- (b) Shall give special emphasis to the enlistment of men and boys in support of the total program of the local church.
 - (c) Shall select and appoint leaders necessary to facilitate this work.
- (d) Shall make quarterly reports to the Association Board and an annual report to the association.

Section 2. Discipleship Training:

- (a) Shall study and seek to promote the Discipleship Training Program in the churches of the association.
 - (b) Shall select and appoint leaders for each department.
- (c) Shall make quarterly reports to the Associational Board and an annual report to the association.

Section 3. Evangelism:

- (a) Shall promote and encourage evangelism in the association through clinics, lay evangelism schools, retreats, and rallies.
 - (b) Shall appoint a committee to assist in this work.
- (c) Shall make quarterly reports to the Associational Board and an annual report to the association.

Section 4. Library Services:

- (a) Shall promote library services in the association through conferences and workshops, encouraging the churches to establish libraries with adequate books, audiovisual aid materials and equipment.
 - (b) Shall provide assistance, when requested, to all churches in the association.
- (c) Shall make quarterly reports to the Associational Board and an annual report to the association.

Section 5. Missions:

- (a) Shall lead the association in identifying and evaluating its mission needs and in planning and conducting its mission programs.
- (b) Shall help the churches commit themselves to the association mission program and to one another for accomplishing their work.
 - (c) Shall work with the missions committees of the churches.
- (d) Shall select a committee from the association to give proper representation and perspective in helping perform the duties of this office.
- (e) Shall make quarterly reports to the Association Board and make an annual report to the association.

Section 6. Music:

(a) Shall seek to stimulate interest in good church music through workshops, music schools, and hymn sings in the member churches and in association-wide efforts.

- (b) Shall plan with proper associational leaders and direct the music at all meetings of the association.
 - (c) Shall select and appoint personnel necessary to discharge this responsibility.
- (d) Shall make quarterly reports to Association Board and an annual report to the association.

Section 7. Pastoral Ministries:

- (a) Shall assist the churches in the development of pastoral ministries, deacon ministries, vocational guidance, church administration services, and church weekday education.
 - (b) Shall select personnel necessary to conduct this ministry.
- (c) Shall make regular reports to the Association Board and an annual report to the association.

Section 8. Senior Adult:

- (a) Shall identify needs, promote programs, and utilize resources of senior adults in the association.
 - (b) Shall select and enlist personnel necessary to facilitate this work.
- (c) Shall make quarterly reports to the Associational Board and an annual report to the association.

Section 9. Stewardship:

- (a) Shall encourage Christian stewardship in the association through conferences, seminars, clinics, and stewardship revivals.
 - (b) Shall select and appoint personnel necessary to carry on this work.
- (c) Shall make quarterly reports to the Associational Board and an annual report to the association.

Section 10. Sunday School:

- (a) Shall study and seek to promote Sunday School, Vacation Bible School and Mid-winter Bible Study in the churches of the association.
 - (b) Shall select and appoint personnel necessary to carry out this task.
- (c) Shall make quarterly reports to the Associational Board and an annual report to the association.

Section II. Woman's Missionary Union:

- (a) Shall promote the total Woman's Missionary Union program (Baptist Women, Baptist Young Women, Acteens, Girls in Action, and Mission Friends) in churches of the association through workshops, retreats, and rallies.
- (b) Shall give special emphasis to the enlistment of women, young women and girls in the support of the total program of the church.
- (c) Shall help in the selection and appointment of leaders necessary to facilitate the work.
- (d) Shall make quarterly reports to the Associational Board and an annual report to the association.

Section 12. Youth:

- (a) Shall seek to promote youth work in the churches of the association through council meetings, rallies, and retreats.
 - (b) Shall select and appoint leaders necessary to facilitate this work.
- (c) Shall make quarterly reports to the Association Board and an annual report to the association.

ARTICLE IV - COMPOSITION AND DUTIES OF THE ASSOCIATION BOARD AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. The Association Board:

- (a) The active pastors of member churches and missions.
- (b) The officers of the association.
- (c) The chairpersons of each standing committee of the association.
- (d) Three members elected by each church with the request that at least two members are, or have been, officers or elected leaders of that church.
 - (e) The president, vice-president, and secretary of the associational youth council.
- (f) The Association Board shall act for the association in the interim between its annual sessions. Its duties shall be to carry out the policies and the will of the association. No action shall be taken by the Association Board contravening the will of the association, nor shall it initiate any new policy or practice binding the association, unless so directed. However, in an emergency, it may take such actions as it deems necessary, but such action shall be submitted to the next meeting of the association for final disposition. It shall make a full and complete report of its activities at the annual session. The officers of the association shall be the officers of the Association Board. A quorum shall be representatives of a majority of the member churches. Churches shall be allowed to elect two alternates who will attend and vote in the absence of regular Association Board members. This Board shall determine the time and places of its meetings not later than December 31 for the ensuing year, and this information shall be published in the associational calendar.

Section 2. The Executive Committee: moderator, vice-moderator, clerk, treasurer, parliamentarian, direction of missions, department directors, chairperson of the Finance Committee, Baptist State Convention General Board Representative, and presidents of the associational youth council, and ministers' conference. The vice-moderator shall serve as chairperson of this committee. It shall be the duty of this committee, cooperating with the director of missions, to devise ways and means, recommend measures and initiate action implementing promotion and missionary expansion within bounds of the association.

Section 3. The Committee of Committees: Shall consist of five members who will nominate the members of the various standing committees and present them for election at the annual meeting of the association. One member of the committee shall carry over each year to the new Committee on Committees with the provision that no member serve more than two consecutive years.

Section 4. The Nominating Committee: Shall consist of five members who present at the annual meeting a list of nominations for association offices, department directors, Baptist State Convention agency representatives, and as needed, recommend to the Association Board seven members to serve as a Director of Missions Search Committee.

Section 5. The Finance and Audit Committee: Shall be composed of seven members, including the treasurer and representing at least six different churches of the association, chosen so as to embrace reasonably the various geographical areas of the association. No member, exclusive of the treasurer, shall serve, nor any church be represented, more than two consecutive years. No more than four members of this committee shall be replaced during the associational year. It shall be the duty of the committee to draw up and submit the annual association budget to the Association Board for approval prior to the presentation at the annual meeting. Further, this body shall supervise the raising of funds to meet the budget and other miscellaneous needs. It shall make or cause to be made, an annual audit of the receipts and disbursements of all funds of the association and make a comprehensive report to the association at the annual meeting.

Section 6. The Committee on Place and Preacher: Consisting of three members, shall recommend to the association in annual session, the place or places of the next meeting, and the preacher and alternate preacher for the annual sermon.

Section 7. The Program Committee: Shall consist of three members who shall plan well the program for the annual meeting. Copies of the program shall be distributed to the messengers and visitors at the annual meeting.

Section 8. The Constitution and Bylaws Committee: Shall consist of the following four members - moderator, vice-moderator, director of missions, and one member at large, who shall serve as chairperson of the committee. This committee shall be nominated by the Committee on Committees and elected by the association. Its duties shall be to prepare and recommend changes, amendments or additions to the Constitution and Bylaws as may be necessary to serve better the purposes of the association.

Section 9. The Credentials Committee: Shall be composed of three members who shall review all applications from churches for membership in the association. This committee shall make a thorough investigation of the petitioning churches as to doctrine, practices, and cooperation with the Baptist program. A formal statement of its findings, along with a recommendation, shall be submitted to association in annual session or to the Association Board as provided in Article III, Section 2, of the constitution. This committee may be called upon by the moderator to serve as set forth in Article III, Section 2 (5) of the constitution.

Section 10. The Committee on Ordination: This committee shall consist of a chair-person who is elected by the association and all the pastors in the association. The committee shall examine the candidates who come before it, as to their call and fitness for the gospel ministry, and shall make such recommendations as it feels led to the church requesting ordination for the candidate. The committee shall help plan and arrange for proper services of ordination when such assistance is requested.

Section 11. The Committee on Resolutions: Shall consist of three members who will prepare and present to the association suitable resolutions of appreciation and expression of sentiments on any matter chosen by the committee or referred by the association.

Section 12. The Building and Grounds committee: Shall be composed of five persons. The committee shall inspect the associational properties periodically and assist in maintaining an inventory of equipment, develop and maintain maintenance policies and procedures; develop and recommend an adequate insurance plan to protect all buildings and properties; recommend cost of maintenance care of the property to the budget committee; assist in determining and administering parking space; promote the conservation of energy and other natural resources used in the operation of association properties; and make certain that the grounds are kept clean and in good repair and that trees, shrubs, and grass are healthy, properly nourished, and trimmed.

ARTICLE V - REVISION OF BYLAWS

The association may amend or alter the by laws by a vote of two-thirds of messengers present at an annual meeting, provided that each change or amendment is submitted in writing on the first day of the session for vote on the following day. Each proposed change or amendment must be printed in the association newsletter in the last issue before the annual session.

V. Proceedings

of the

Forty-seventh Annual Session

EMMANUEL BAPTIST CHURCH OCTOBER 21, 1996

- 1. Registration began at 6:30pm with the host church registering messengers and guests. Mrs. Betty Taylor, pianist at Emmanuel church, was pianist for the session. Moderator Ed Johnson called the forty seventh session to order at 7:00pm. Rev. James Cagle, pastor at Cornerstone church, gave the devotion on Matthew 19:29-30, and quotes from Charles Sheldon's book, "In His Steps." The theme of his devotion was "What Would Jesus Do?" The host pastor, Rev. Eugene Ussery, extended a warm welcome to everyone. Mrs. Sandi Ward, association music director, led in singing the hymn, "We're Marching to Zion." Two special music selections were presented by the Emmanuel church, which was a great blessing to all.
- 2. On behalf of the Program Committee, Rev. Larry Wells moved that the order of service for the forty-seventh session be accepted as printed and as changes were needed. The moderator recognized and welcomed all the messengers and visitors. The director of Missions, Dr. J. Billy Graham, recognized the new ministers who came during the year to the association: Rev. James Cagle, Cornerstone Church, and Rev. Gene Booker, interim pastor, Unity Grove. Also Dr. Graham recognized, honored and presented a plaque to Rev. Bennie Maness, pastor of Calvary church, for serving faithfully 60 years in pastoral ministry. On behalf of the Credentials Committee and in the absence of the chairman, Rev. Max Gilmore, the director of missions stated that the Cornerstone Church was voted into full membership at the September Board meeting. The Cornerstone messengers stood and were warmly welcomed into full membership in the association.
- 3. The clerk, Dewitt Purvis, gave the Clerk's Report and Digest of Church Letters. There was an increase in almost every category. Total members, receipts, gifts to missions and to the Cooperative Program, increased over 1995. Appreciation is expressed to all Church Clerks for their help in preparing the 1996 Church Profile.
- 4. Dr. Wayne Adams gave the treasurer's report, which was adopted as presented. Dr. Adams thanked the churches for their continuing strong support and encouraged more contributions to complete payments on the building fund. Becky Gilmore, chairperson of the Finance and Budget Committee, moved the adoption of the proposed 1996-97 budget, which had been presented for information in May and had been recommended to the association for approval at the September Board meeting. The budget was unanimously adopted by standing vote.
- 5. Dr. J. Billy Graham presented the director of missions report, thanking the associational leaders for all their leadership and help and for the prayers and support of all the churches. Dr. Graham encouraged participation in the partnership opportunities, stating that a new 5 year partnership was now beginning with South Africa. "Start Something New" is the theme for missions outreach in the coming year.

6. During the miscellaneous business period. Rev. Don Ballenger, a member of the Board of Ministers at Campbell University, presented an informative report on behalf of the university. The university is now the largest Baptist University in the world, with over 6,000 students, representing all 50 states and over 40 countries. A new divinity school was established in 1996. Mr. Steven Gilmore presented the report for the Committee on Committees which was adopted as given.

7. Mrs. Deanna Stockwell, with the assistance of Evelyn Ballenger, Helen Hays, Virginia Oliver, Viola Bowlin, Nancy Upchurch, gave an informative WMU report. With

everyone holding hands, the director of missions led in a prayer of commitment.

8. Mr. Charles English presented the Brotherhood Report, telling of many things that Baptist men and boys are doing in missions, reporting on an increase in the Angel Tree ministry, involvement in partnership missions, and challenging us to start ministries of disaster relief and handy man help to needy persons.

9. Rev. Don Ballenger gave the evangelism report, informing us of the many ministries of the state convention and how people are being saved through these ministries.

He encouraged us to use opportunities to train our people to witness.

10. In the absence of Curtis Bettini, Dewitt Purvis gave the report for the Property and Grounds Committee. Mr. Purvis reported that all the goals for landscaping, paving, constructing the utility building had been met. Churches and individuals were thanked for their contributions and help. The balance due to pay for the complete project is almost \$10,000. He announced that Mr. John Shields gave a memorial gift in honor of his mother, Mrs. Margaret Shields, which is being used as a living memorial to start an endowment fund of \$40,000 plus. Others are invited to contribute to the fund of which the principal will be used for maintenance and upkeep of the property and grounds.

11. Sandi Ward led in singing the chorus, "This Joy That I Have." Then we were blessed by special music given by Doris Waddell, Steven Gilmore and Cheryl Gilmore.

12. The session was closed with an inspiring, informative presentation on partner-ship missions by the following: Charles English, Brazil; Dr. Phil Ward and Mrs. Mary McCollough, Ukraine; and Dr. J. Billy Graham, South Africa. Several persons have been involved in partnership missions and are available to speak at churches.

13. The total attendance for the evening session was 131. Rev. David Reynold gave instructions on how to get to Middle Cross Baptist Church and led in the closing prayer

and benediction.

AFTERNOON SESSION

- 1. Registration for the afternoon session started at 3:30 pm and the call to order was at 4:00 pm by Moderator Ed Johnson. Mrs. Gaye Saunders for the session. 2. Clerk's Report and Digest of Letters

We want to thank all church clerks for completing the 1996 church profile and for using the disk to record the information at the association. We also want to thank Rev. Ed Johnson for serving as our computer consultant. Nearly every church used this electronic technology. The use of the computer has made our records more accurate and efficient. We will be able to complete the Digest of Letters and prepare the materials for the 1996 Annual and send all our records to the Baptist Sunday School Board on a master disk.

In 1995-96 the Association Board and the Association Executive committee met three times, in January, May, and September. There was good representation from the churches at the meetings. Reports were given and business of the association was transacted. The association calendar was adopted at the May Board meeting and the proposed budget for the next year was presented for information. Cornerstone Baptist Church was received into full membership of the association at the September Board meeting. New Freedom

Baptist mission moved to a new location, the Gun Club section of Pinehurst, after one year of meeting in the Association Center.

Presently, the association has in affiliation a total of 29 churches and 1 mission. The churches are located in 4 counties - Moore, Lee, Hoke, and Harnett counties - with most churches in Moore County. The church letters indicate that the churches increased in categories , including membership, Sunday School, Discipleship Training, Music, Brotherhood, WMU, Total Receipts, Cooperative Program, Association Missions, and Total SBC Expenditures. In 1995 with the SBC "Here's Hope" revivals, we had 220 baptisms; this year the number of baptisms was 193. To God be the glory for all this is done!

Through our Property and Grounds Committee, Curt Bettini, chairman, we were able to complete our parking and driveway paving, landscaping, including a beautiful fountain, and construct a very nice storage and utility building. Thanks to each church and individual that assisted in any way with this project!

Part of my ministry is working with pastors and lay leaders in an effort to strengthen our churches. Two of our churches are now in interims, searching for pastors: Pleasant Hill with Rev. Robert Denton serving as interim pastor and Unity Grove with Rev. Gene Booker coming in October to serve as interim pastor. We are deeply grateful to Rev. Hayes Ritter for his eight good years of pastoral ministry at Unity Grove; at another time, Rev. Hayes served Unity Grove for five years. Some of the churches have been able to construct new buildings and make improvements to facilities. New Home Church is building a new sanctuary. Beaver Creek and Ephesus churches have made improvements to their sanctuaries. Unity Grove is building a new fellowship hall with a kitchen. Victory completed the final payment on their sanctuary, paying off a \$95,000 plus debt on a 15 year loan in 2 years. Rev. Bennie Maness celebrated 60 years of pastoral ministry and continues to "keep on keeping on serving the Lord" as pastor. Southern Pines is seeking to call a minister of youth to help with an increasing ministry.

We are seeking to do missions locally and overseas. Ives Memorial is doing a good job as mother church for the New Freedom Mission, under the capable leadership of Rev. Gary Greene. This mission met for one year in the association center and moved in July to the Educare Center in the Gun Club section of Pinehurst. We still are sending teams to countries where we have partnership relationships. Partnership mission trips were made by Dr. Phillip Ward and Mary McCollough to Ukraine, Charles English, Percy Flowers, and Rick Gehl to Brazil, and J. Billy Graham to South Africa. The South Africa partnership is for 5 years. We hope to have another team for South Africa to do construction, evangelism, deacon training, and pastoral leadership training. Increasingly, more people from our churches are involved in volunteer missions, locally and overseas.

I am hoping that we can be involved in ministries to nursing homes, jails and prisons, schools, starting new work and helping other ways with the Hispanics, seeking ways to have Bible classes and ministry to the retirement communities in our area, helping with Habitat for Humanity projects and supporting local coalition needs, and conducting Backyard Bible clubs and starting "something new" where the need exists. A booklet, "Starting Something New," has been given to each pastor in our association. From this little resource there are a lot of ideas on starting some new mission projects, according to the need in your area.

Anne and I are grateful to God and to you for the privilege of serving with you in associational ministries. On September 1, we began our 18th year. Thank you for your prayers

and strong support.

11. Woman's Missionary Union Report

Theme for 1995-96 - "Risk the Journey," based on Isaiah 42:16: "...along unfamiliar paths I will guide them. I will turn the darkness into light before them..." (NIV). To this end, as an association, our people were involved in many meaningful and diverse missions and ministries:

(1) Providing birthday cakes each month for Cameron Boys' Home. Flannel shirts were also given. At Christmas socks were collected and taken to area rest homes. In addition individuals churches were involved in other ministries including aid to New York churches and missions, collecting clothing and toys for Hispanics, taking toilet articles to area rest homes and other groups and providing for needy families. (2) The Project Help 1996 emphasis was ministering to those affected by AID's by risking love and compassion. (3) The associational leadership team attended the Mission Extravaganza at Ridgecrest in the Spring. Leaders from individual churches also attended. It was a time of learning and inspiration as we were challenged to "Risk the Journey" throughout the world. (4) Sandhill's leadership team also attended a training leaders workshop at Caraway in July. Four planning meetings were held by the associational team during the year. (5) The associational workshop was held at Ives Memorial in September. About 35 attended for training in leading Women on Mission, Adults on Mission, Acteens, GA's, and Mission Friends. 6. Property and Grounds Committee Report

The Lord continues to bless our Sandhills Baptist Association in so many ways, and we praise him for this. The Building and Grounds Committee, consisting of Dewitt Purvis, Margaret Shields, Clyde Burge, Ray Tyner, and Curtis Bettini met several times to plan and carry out the plan to pave the parking lots, landscape the grounds, including a fountain in front of the building, and construct the small storage building, and to plan ways to maintain the upkeep and maintenance of our property. We asked the Lord for his help and He answered our prayers. We believe that we have accomplished what we set out to do.

It was necessary to haul several loads of top soil and to plant more grass in areas as needful.

We received enough funds from individuals and churches to pay off the parking lot and driveway project. We still need to raise almost \$10,000 to complete the cost of the landscaping and construction of the storage and utility building. All of the Finance Committee were very helpful in support for this project and our committee thanks them. Out of the meeting with the finance committee came the idea of recommending each church to set a goal based on the resident membership to support this plan. Most churches adopted this plan. As approved by the association, we will make a loan from the bank. However, we hope that individuals and churches who have not yet given, or who are able to contribute again this year will help with the balance on the project.

One last goal is to set up an endowment of \$40,000 plus, which has been one of the goals of the long range planning of the building of the center. The interest from the fund would provide for the maintenance and upkeep of the property and grounds. We received our first contribution of \$432 from Mr. John Shields, Jr., a living memorial to his mother, Mrs. Margaret Shields, a devoted Christian and a member of our committee. This endowment is open to others who want to help underwrite it and thereby freeing the budget to be used in other important associational ministries. A small or large gift in honor or in memory of someone may be put to work in the endowment fund.

We want to thank everyone who helped with the construction of the storage building. Robert Cooke and son, Johnny, helped with the brick for the footing; Warren Harris, Martin Baughn, Roger Cole, Grady Culler, Curt Bettini, J. Billy Graham did the carpentry; Rev. Darrell Cheek put on the roofing and vinyl. The Building and Grounds Committee would like to thank every church member of the Sandhills Baptist Association for your accepting and supporting this project. May God bless you.

X. Historical Events in the Churches

ABERDEEN: The youth went on a mission trip to Gatlinburg, Tn. and have been involved in several other youth events. The senior adults have taken several trips together, including a trip to Myrtle Beach, SC.

The men's Sunday School class continued their tradition of preparing breakfast for everyone after Easter Sunrise Service. Each month we have a Senior Adult Luncheon in our fellowship hall and take out plates are carried to the sick and shut-ins in the community. In May, we were host to the Association Senior Adult Banquet. We were very pleased with large attendance. The Lord has blessed us in many ways during the year. He enables us to retire our debt on the fellowship hall and kitchen! (Anne Dowd, Historian)

BEULAH HILL: A group from the church went on a mission trip to Rock Cave, W. Va. where the church is helping support a mission project with the Baptist church there.

CALVARY: Rev. Bennie Maness celebrated 60 years in the ministry August 2. Our church had a program and presented him with gifts on Sunday, August 4. We had special speakers including Rev. Judson Rotan from Randolph Association and our own Rev. J. Billy Graham. Afterward we had a dinner for all who attended. We purchased a new Dodge 15 passenger van and paid cash for it. We also gave Bibles to the graduating high school seniors and college graduates. We celebrated "Old Timers Day" the third Sunday in November with a dinner. (Janet Brewer, Clerk)

CAMERON: We have had a good year at Cameron church: (1) Participated in the World Missions conference, serving the missionaries and pastors a noon meal; (2) Annual fishing trip for the men of the church, with an 11 year old boy catching the biggest fish, and serving the whole church with the fish catch; (3) Dedication of the sanctuary renovation, with appreciation to the Cameron Presbyterian for providing a place for us to meet during the work on our building; (4) "Legacy Builders" formed from the men of the church to help the needy of the community and to be involved in disaster relief, as needed (one Saturday these men on mission bought materials and built a ramp and deck for a needy person. After the big storm "Fran," the Legacy Builders brought saws and cleaned up the yards of several of needy elderly; the women of the church served refreshments), (5) State Missions emphasis was given by Rev. Jim Lambert; (6) Over 140 attended VBS, using the theme, "Prayer Safari: Kingdom of the Son," with the youth acting out a skit written by some adults; (6) Deacons annual sweetheart banquet was held at Russell's Seafood Restaurant; (7) Pastor Greg Poplin attended the mass Promise Keepers meeting in Atlanta, Georgia and several of the men attended the Promise Keeper meeting in Rockingham, (8) Younger youth cooked and took their cookies to patients at Duke hospital, talked and prayer with them, and also helped clean up several yards and a house and helped a family to pack; (9) To begin the foreign missions emphasis, Pastor and Mrs. Poplin and their parents cooked and served a Thanksgiving dinner to the congregation, and Pastor Poplin allowed anyone for \$1.00 throw pies in his face, with proceeds going to Lottie Moon - a lot of fun!; (10) Older youth went to a concert at Emerald Isle on Christmas day, to Super Summer at Carowinds, to Fayetteville to see a Christian comedy at a dinner theater, and attended a youth retreat at Caswell; (11) Lisa Perry, a Journeyman to China and a member of Ashely Heights showed slides on China; (12) Women of the church conducted the service during the focus on WMU, with the youth assisting; (13) Men of the church assisted in the service on Baptist Men's day; and (14) Youth taught Sunday School classes and participated in worship during youth week.

CARTHAGE: Some highlights of the Carthage First Baptist Church during the 1995-96 year were as follows: On March 24, we enjoyed having the Wingate University Choir give a musical presentation at the morning worship service. The first Community Lenten Services were started and held at our church. Area churches participating in this very successful 7 week event were First Baptist, Mt. Carmel, Carthage Presbyterian, Carthage United Methodist, John Hall Presbyterian, and the Sandhills Baptist Association. Our summer youth corps worker was Tina Hagler, of Marshville. Tina directed a very active program of ministry with our children and youth for 10 weeks. The church has arranged for Tina to come twice a month to serve as director of youth activities. Two buses were reserved to take approximately 80 people from our church and community to the Billy Graham Carolinas Crusade in Charlotte in September. We received several nice monetary donations made in memory of loved ones and relatives. (Hoyle Sullivan, Historian)

CORNERSTONE: The congregation gave a reception and a gift to Pastor Darrell Cheek and family at their resignation and preparation for entrance at the seminary. Rev. James Cagle was called as pastor. After a year under watchcare membership in the association, the congregation was received into full membership at the September,

1996 Board meeting.

EPHESUS: The year 1995-96 has been one of growth for Ephesus, both in membership and outreach. Women on Mission have led the church in observing the Weeks of Prayer for Foreign Missions, Home Missions, State Missions, World Hunger Day, World Day of Prayer, Christmas in August, a Prayer Retreat, AIDS support, support of the Children's Homes, and support of the county food pantry. Through the effort of a member with other county leaders working for two years, a local video store dealing in pornography has been closed by a conviction in a court trial. Our church is alert to community issues and helps needy people through a budgeted fund as well as supporting the county Meals on Wheels and the Christian Action League. The RA's went to Campbell on RA day in February. Youth Sunday was observed on March 17, 1996. There was an Easter egg hunt in April. The youth took a trip to Morrow mountain, a trip to Fayetteville for putt-putt. The youth went to Carowinds for Super Summer. Mr. Avron Upchurch, speaker for our annual missions supper, shared with us his South Africa mission experiences. There was a guest with Mr. Upchurch, a boy, Alex, from Belarus. There was a wonderful time of singing and fellowship at the WMU ministry in Sanford.

MIDDLE CROSS: The Lord again saw fit to bless us with souls saved. Some were at home recuperating from sickness without Christ, but due to God's mercy and prayers of believers they now live as a wonderful testimony for God. God is still at work in the miracle business of hearing and answering our prayers. We thank God for the spiritual growth among our body of believers, due in large part to our Bible studies. Some studies include: "Journey of a Lifetime," "Christian Discipleship," and "Journey to the Cross." Our church choir has grown; and we're learning new music. David Reynolds, and his family, for being right in the middle of the work, helping to accomplish things for God. We are fortunate and thankful to God for sending them our way. (Mrs. Leora Thomas, historian).

NEW FREEDOM MISSION: The mission moved from meeting in the association center to the new location, Educare, in the Gun Club section of Pinehurst on Murdockville Road.

NEW HOME: On November 19, we had "A Day of Thanksgiving the Old Fashion Way" as a fund raiser for our building fund. We raised over \$10,000.00 that day and our building fund has been growing ever since. We at New Home have a lot to be thankful for. We have our new church under construction now and on August 25th we had our Ground Breaking service with Dr. J Billy Graham as our guest speaker. We had the history of the church presented by Donald & Lynda Ring and dinner served in our fellowship building by the Building Committee, and the deacons and their wives. We look forward to the day that we can occupy our new church and have the room for expansion that is badly needed. At Christmas we gave our widows a supper and each one received a special gift. A Valentine Sweetheart supper was given for our married couples, and our young people enjoyed many activities during the year. Tiny tots planted flowers in front of the church for everyone to enjoy. At Christmas we went caroling, had a Christmas play, and distributed cheer baskets to the elderly, shut-ins, and the needy in our area. On Easter Sunday morning we had Sunrise service and served breakfast for everyone. On September 30, Brother Billy Futral went before the Ordination Board and will be ordained on October 13. Rev.

Jimmie Phillips has been a blessing to us at New Home and we thank God for him. God has been good to us this year and we give Him all the honor and praise.

PINE GROVE: A new deacon family ministry plan has been developed this year. For second time in history, a new church directory was made.

PINEYWOOD: A love offering of \$300 was received for the Christian Coalition of Virginia for help with some of the 51 churches that were destroyed by fire. Our missions gifts to the Lottie Moon foreign mission offering and the Annie Armstrong home mission offering were increased to \$600 each a year. The Lord is still blessing our church. We all have love for one another and for our pastor, Rev. Charles Lassister and his family.

PLEASANT HILL: We have had a year of spiritual growth and maturing in our church family. Rev. Robert Denton continues to serve as interim pastor. The search committee is still working under the leadership of chairman C. G. Boyte. Fall revival guest speaker was Rev. Jimmy Upton. Other key events included the annual Thanksgiving-Christmas Dinner, annual Christmas play, and homecoming with guest speaker, Rev. Darrell Cheek. IV. Constitution

of the

Sandhills Baptist Association

Article I - Name

The name of this body shall be "The Sandhills Baptist Association."

ARTICLE II - PURPOSES AND OBJECTIVES

Section 1. The Sandhills Baptist Association shall consist of messengers who are members of duly elected affiliated churches.

Section 2. The objectives of this association shall be to promote fellowship, missions, associations, the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina, and the Southern Baptist Convention in all work of Southern Baptists.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP AND AFFILIATIONS

Section 1. The Sandhills Baptist Association shall consist of messengers who are elected members of affiliated churches.

(1) Each church affiliated with this association having a membership up to one hundred members shall be entitled to four messengers and one additional messenger for every fifty members or major fraction thereof, thereafter. No church, however, shall be entitled to more than eight messengers.

(2) Pastors of the affiliated churches and their missions and other full-time paid professional staff.

(3) Duly elected officers of the association, department directors, chairpersons of all standing committees and the director of missions.

Section 2. Affiliations:

(1) The churches affiliated with this association shall be churches who use the New Testament as a statement of faith and church policy, and who teach that a person upon profession of faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord will be immersed in water, unless providentially hindered, to qualify for church membership. In this and other doctrinal matters, the association subscribes to *The Baptist Faith and Message* adopted by the Southern Baptist Convention, May 9, 1963.

(2) Churches shall be received into this fellowship only after having been under watchcare of the association for one full year. Application for membership shall be made through the Credentials Committee. The Association Board shall have the authority to receive any church under watchcare upon recommendation of the Credentials Committee.

(3) Baptist churches affiliated with and in fellowship with other Baptist associations may become affiliated with the association without coming under the watchcare, upon the recommendation of the Credentials Committee and the approval of the Association Board or the association.

(4) The Association shall only have the authority to advise the churches touching all things pertaining to their interest, but shall in no case presume to direct or control them in reference to their government or internal policy. The association recognizes the complete autonomy of each affiliated church. Each church shall recognize the complete autonomy of the association.

(5) Whenever a church fails to be represented by letter at the annual meeting, or fails to show interest by financial support and attendance at associational meetings for two consecutive years, or reportedly violates Section 2, (1) of this article, the moderator shall ask the Credentials Committee to confer with the church. If satisfactory reason is not given and there is not effort to keep alive their association with the cooperating churches, the Credentials Committee shall bring its findings to the association. The association, by majority vote of its messengers casting ballots, may then withdraw its fellowship. The association recognizes that any affiliated church has the right to withdraw its fellowship from the association but requests a church making such a decision to notify its intention in writing to the association.

ARTICLE IV - MEETINGS

Section 1: The time of the annual meeting shall be Monday and Tuesday after the third Sunday in October.

Section 2: In case of emergency, or for just cause, the Association Board is empowered to change the time or place of the meeting, cancel the annual meeting, or call a special meeting by vote of two-thirds of the members when the vote is taken and by giving two weeks' notice if possible.

Section 3: Voting in the association meetings shall be limited to the duly elected officers and messengers as set forth in Article III, Section 1.

Section 4: A quorum shall consist of messengers from a majority of the affiliated churches.

ARTICLE V - Organization

Section 1. Officers: The officers of the association shall be the Moderator, Vice-moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Historian, Parliamentarian, three (3) Trustees, and Director of Missions.

Section 2. Departments: This association shall promote an aggressive program of teaching, training, evangelism, missions, and stewardship emphases through the following departments: Sunday School, Discipleship Training, Youth, Brotherhood, Music, Evangelism, Stewardship, Library Services, Woman's Missionary Union, Missions, and Pastoral Ministries. The department directors shall be elected by the association in annual session. Vacancies occurring between sessions shall be filled by the Associational Board.

Section 3. Associational Board.

Section 4. Committees: There shall be the following standing committees - (1) Executive, (2) Committee on Committees, (3) Nominating, (4) Finance and Audit, (5) Program, (6) Constitution and Bylaws, (7) Credentials, (8) Ordinations, (9) Place and Preacher, (10) Property and Grounds, and (11) Resolutions.

Section 5. Employees: The director of missions and any other employees of the association shall be charged with the responsibility of the promotion of the whole program, subject to the authority of the Associational Board, and be elected by the Associational Board or the association in annual meeting.

Section 6. Representatives: (1) Baptist Hospital, (2) Childrens' Homes, (3) Baptist Retirement Homes, (4) Christian Education, (5) *Biblical Recorder*, (6) and Baptist Foundation.

ARTICLE VI - REVISION

The association may amend or alter the constitution by a vote of two-thirds of the messengers present at the annual meeting, provided that each proposed change or amendment be stated in writing on the first day of the session and be voted on the day following. Each proposed change or amendment must be printed in the Sandhills Baptist newsletter in the last issue before the annual meeting.

ARTICLE VII - THE ASSOCIATIONAL YEAR

The associational year shall begin on the first day of October and close on the thirtieth day of September of the following year.

The work of this association shall be governed by the foregoing constitution and the following bylaws.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I - PROCEDURES

The business of the association shall be conducted according to the latest edition of *Robert's Rules of Order* where not otherwise specified by this constitution or its bylaws.

ARTICLE II - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. Moderator

- (a) Shall preside over the annual sessions of the association, all meetings of the Association Board, and see that order and decorum are observed.

 - (b) Shall be ineligible to serve more than two consecutive one year terms.(c) Shall be an ex-officio member of all standing committees of the association.
- Section 2. Vice-moderator: Shall preside at the pleasure of the moderator or in the absence of the moderator and shall be the chairperson of the Executive Committee.

Section 3. Clerk.

- (a) Shall keep an accurate record of the proceedings of the association.(b) Shall superintend the printing and distribution of the associational minutes.(c) Shall keep on file the printed minutes and other important documents belonging to the association.
 - (d) Shall be paid an annual amount as set in the associational budget.

Section 4. Treasurer.

- (a) Shall be responsible for the receipt and distribution of all monies.(b) Shall keep an accurate record of both receipts and distributions.
- (c) Shall make comprehensive reports to the Associational Board at its regularly scheduled meetings and to the annual meeting of the association.
- Section 5. Historian: Shall collect information and put in some durable form the items of particular interest about each of the member churches and association.
- Section 6. Parliamentarian: Shall advise and assist the presiding officer of the association and the Associational Board with respect to all matters involving proper parliamentary procedure.

Section 7. Trustees: Shall hold in trust any property, money endowed, or other securities of the association; and shall handle all legal matters of the association under the direction of the association or Association Board.

Section 8. Director of Missions:

- (a) Search Committee: The Nominating Committee, as needed, shall recommend seven persons to the Associational Board who would serve as a director of missions search committee.
 - (b) Conditions of employment:
- 1) Shall be called on an indefinite basis. The relationship may be terminated by either the director of missions or the association with a thirty day notice.
- 2) Shall have three weeks vacation with pay; the time will be determined in consultation with the Executive Committee.
- 3) May be away from the association for three weeks for revivals and/or World Missions Conferences. These meetings will be scheduled in consultation with the Executive Committee.
- 4) Will be limited to revivals in the association only so far as they do not conflict with basic responsibilities.
- 5) May serve any church in the association as interim pastor for a period not to exceed five Sundays, except when additional time is approved by the Executive Committee. At such a time, the church should contribute to the associational treasurer a reasonable remuneration for services.
- 6) May serve as chaplain in one institution outside the association, but this work shall not unduly interfere with the responsibilities to the association.

(c) Duties

- 1) Shall respond within the limits of time and ability to the invitations of the churches for assistance in their congregational needs; work with associational leaders in planning and initiating a program of work; encourage the cooperation of all the churches in the undertakings of the association; promote missionary interest among the churches; enlist the churches in the support of those causes fostered by the Baptist State Convention.
- 2) Shall give general oversight to the work of the association and, with the assistance of the Executive Committee, draw up an annual calendar of activities which shall be approved by the Associational Board.
- 3) Shall give written quarterly reports to the Associational Board and an annual report to the association.
- 4) Shall publish an attractive and informative newsletter and shall distribute it to pastors, Associational Board members, associational officers, and general church officers.
- 5) Shall cultivate the friendship and goodwill of those churches not fully cooperating with the association in the hope that they may be led to cooperate with us in carrying out the Great Commission.
- 6) Shall be alert to the needs of mission work in unchurched areas and shall conduct surveys, when deemed advisable, to ascertain these needs. When mission work is established, he shall see that it is initiated under the sponsorship of a local affiliated church.
 - 7) Shall be an ex officio member of standing committees of the association.

ARTICLE III - DUTIES OF DEPARTMENT DIRECTORS

Section 1. Brotherhood:

- (a) Shall promote the total Brotherhood program (Baptist Men and Royal Ambassadors) in the churches of the association through workshops, retreats, and rallies.
- (b) Shall give special emphasis to the enlistment of men and boys in support of the total program of the local church.
 - (c) Shall select and appoint leaders necessary to facilitate this work.
- (d) Shall make quarterly reports to the Association Board and an annual report to the association.

Section 2. Discipleship Training:

- (a) Shall study and seek to promote the Discipleship Training Program in the churches of the association.
 - (b) Shall select and appoint leaders for each department.
- (c) Shall make quarterly reports to the Associational Board and an annual report to the association.

Section 3. Evangelism:

- (a) Shall promote and encourage evangelism in the association through clinics, lay evangelism schools, retreats, and rallies.
 - (b) Shall appoint a committee to assist in this work.
- (c) Shall make quarterly reports to the Associational Board and an annual report to the association.

Section 4. Library Services:

- (a) Shall promote library services in the association through conferences and workshops, encouraging the churches to establish libraries with adequate books, audio-visual aid materials and equipment.
 - (b) Shall provide assistance, when requested, to all churches in the association.
- (c) Shall make quarterly reports to the Associational Board and an annual report to the association.

Section 5. Missions:

- (a) Shall lead the association in identifying and evaluating its mission needs and in planning and conducting its mission programs.
- (b) Shall help the churches commit themselves to the association mission program and to one another for accomplishing their work.
 - (c) Shall work with the missions committees of the churches.
- (d) Shall select a committee from the association to give proper representation and perspective in helping perform the duties of this office.
- (e) Shall make quarterly reports to the Association Board and make an annual report to the association.

Section 6. Music:

- (a) Shall seek to stimulate interest in good church music through workshops, music schools, and hymn sings in the member churches and in association-wide efforts.
- (b) Shall plan with proper associational leaders and direct the music at all meetings of the association.
 - (c) Shall select and appoint personnel necessary to discharge this responsibility.
- (d) Shall make quarterly reports to Association Board and an annual report to the association.

Section 7. Pastoral Ministries:

- (a) Shall assist the churches in the development of pastoral ministries, deacon ministries, vocational guidance, church administration services, and church weekday education.
 - (b) Shall select personnel necessary to conduct this ministry.
- (c) Shall make regular reports to the Association Board and an annual report to the association.

Section 8. Senior Adult:

- (a) Shall identify needs, promote programs, and utilize resources of senior adults in the association.
 - (b) Shall select and enlist personnel necessary to facilitate this work.
- (c) Shall make quarterly reports to the Associational Board and an annual report to the association.

Section 9. Stewardship:

- (a) Shall encourage Christian stewardship in the association through conferences, seminars, clinics, and stewardship revivals.
 - (b) Shall select and appoint personnel necessary to carry on this work.
- (c) Shall make quarterly reports to the Associational Board and an annual report to the association.

Section 10. Sunday School:

- (a) Shall study and seek to promote Sunday School, Vacation Bible School and Mid-winter Bible Study in the churches of the association.
 - (b) Shall select and appoint personnel necessary to carry out this task.
- (c) Shall make quarterly reports to the Associational Board and an annual report to the association.

Section II. Woman's Missionary Union:

- (a) Shall promote the total Woman's Missionary Union program (Baptist Women, Baptist Young Women, Acteens, Girls in Action, and Mission Friends) in churches of the association through workshops, retreats, and rallies.
- (b) Shall give special emphasis to the enlistment of women, young women and girls in the support of the total program of the church.
- (c) Shall help in the selection and appointment of leaders necessary to facilitate the work.
- (d) Shall make quarterly reports to the Associational Board and an annual report to the association.

Section 12. Youth:

- (a) Shall seek to promote youth work in the churches of the association through council meetings, rallies, and retreats.
 - (b) Shall select and appoint leaders necessary to facilitate this work.
- (c) Shall make quarterly reports to the Association Board and an annual report to the association.

ARTICLE IV - COMPOSITION AND DUTIES OF THE ASSOCIATION BOARD AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. The Association Board:

- (a) The active pastors of member churches and missions.
- (b) The officers of the association.
- (c) The chairpersons of each standing committee of the association.
- (d) Three members elected by each church with the request that at least two members are, or have been, officers or elected leaders of that church.
 - (e) The president, vice-president, and secretary of the associational youth council.
- (f) The Association Board shall act for the association in the interim between its annual sessions. Its duties shall be to carry out the policies and the will of the association. No action shall be taken by the Association Board contravening the will of the association, nor shall it initiate any new policy or practice binding the association, unless so directed. However, in an emergency, it may take such actions as it deems necessary, but such action shall be submitted to the next meeting of the association for final disposition. It shall make a full and complete report of its activities at the annual session. The officers of the association shall be the officers of the Association Board. A quorum shall be representatives of a majority of the member churches. Churches shall be allowed to elect two alternates who will attend and vote in the absence of regular Association Board members. This Board shall determine the time and places of its meetings not later than December 31 for the ensuing year, and this information shall be published in the associational calendar.

Section 2. The Executive Committee: moderator, vice-moderator, clerk, treasurer, parliamentarian, direction of missions, department directors, chairperson of the Finance Committee, Baptist State Convention General Board Representative, and presidents of the associational youth council, and ministers' conference. The vice-moderator shall serve as chairperson of this committee. It shall be the duty of this committee, cooperating with the director of missions, to devise ways and means, recommend measures and initiate action implementing promotion and missionary expansion within bounds of the association.

Section 3. The Committee of Committees: Shall consist of five members who will nominate the members of the various standing committees and present them for election at the annual meeting of the association. One member of the committee shall carry over each year to the new Committee on Committees with the provision that no member serve more than two consecutive years.

Section 4. The Nominating Committee: Shall consist of five members who present at the annual meeting a list of nominations for association offices, department directors, Baptist State Convention agency representatives, and as needed, recommend to the Association Board seven members to serve as a Director of Missions Search Committee.

Section 5. The Finance and Audit Committee: Shall be composed of seven members, including the treasurer and representing at least six different churches of the association, chosen so as to embrace reasonably the various geographical areas of the association. No member, exclusive of the treasurer, shall serve, nor any church be represented, more than two consecutive years. No more than four members of this committee shall be replaced during the associational year. It shall be the duty of the committee to draw up and submit the annual association budget to the Association Board for approval prior to the presentation at the annual meeting. Further, this body shall supervise the raising of funds to meet the budget and other miscellaneous needs. It shall make or cause to be made, an annual audit of the receipts and disbursements of all funds of the association and make a com-

prehensive report to the association at the annual meeting.

Section 6. The Committee on Place and Preacher: Consisting of three members, shall recommend to the association in annual session, the place or places of the next meeting, and the preacher and alternate preacher for the annual sermon.

Section 7. The Program Committee: Shall consist of three members who shall plan well the program for the annual meeting. Copies of the program shall be distributed to

the messengers and visitors at the annual meeting.

Section 8. The Constitution and Bylaws Committee: Shall consist of the following four members - moderator, vice-moderator, director of missions, and one member at large, who shall serve as chairperson of the committee. This committee shall be nominated by the Committee on Committees and elected by the association. Its duties shall be to prepare and recommend changes, amendments or additions to the Constitution and Bylaws as may be necessary to serve better the purposes of the association.

Section 9. The Credentials Committee: Shall be composed of three members who shall review all applications from churches for membership in the association. This committee shall make a thorough investigation of the petitioning churches as to doctrine, practices, and cooperation with the Baptist program. A formal statement of its findings, along with a recommendation, shall be submitted to association in annual session or to the Association Board as provided in Article III, Section 2, of the constitution. This committee may be called upon by the moderator to serve as set forth in Article III, Section 2 (5) of the constitution.

Section 10. The Committee on Ordination: This committee shall consist of a chair-person who is elected by the association and all the pastors in the association. The committee shall examine the candidates who come before it, as to their call and fitness for the gospel ministry, and shall make such recommendations as it feels led to the church requesting ordination for the candidate. The committee shall help plan and arrange for proper services of ordination when such assistance is requested.

Section 11. The Committee on Resolutions: Shall consist of three members who will prepare and present to the association suitable resolutions of appreciation and expression of sentiments on any matter chosen by the committee or referred by the association.

Section 12. The Building and Grounds committee: Shall be composed of five persons. The committee shall inspect the associational properties periodically and assist in maintaining an inventory of equipment, develop and maintain maintenance policies and procedures; develop and recommend an adequate insurance plan to protect all buildings and properties; recommend cost of maintenance care of the property to the budget committee; assist in determining and administering parking space; promote the conservation of energy and other natural resources used in the operation of association properties; and make certain that the grounds are kept clean and in good repair and that trees, shrubs, and grass are healthy, properly nourished and trimmed.

ARTICLE V - REVISION OF BYLAWS

The association may amend or alter the by laws by a vote of two-thirds of messengers present at an annual meeting, provided that each change or amendment is submitted in writing on the first day of the session for vote on the following day. Each proposed change or amendment must be printed in the association newsletter in the last issue before the annual session.

V. Proceedings

of the

Forty-eighth Annual Session

UNITY GROVE BAPTIST CHURCH October 20, 1997

- 1. Registration began at 6:30pm with the host church registering messengers and guests. Mrs. Lisa Beasley, pianist and Mrs. Vickie Cox, organist, were instrumentalists for the session. Moderator Ed Johnson called the forty-eighth session to order at 7:00pm. The welcome and devotion were given by the host pastor, Rev. Brad Williams. Mrs. Sandi Ward, association music director, led in singing the hymn, "Open My Eyes That I May See," which was the theme for the annual meeting. Two special music selections, "I'll Fly Away" and "It Will Be a Great Day," were presented by the Unity Grove Baptist Church choir, which was a great blessing to all.
- 2. Dr. Greg Poplin, Chairman of the Program Committee moved that the order of service for the forty-eighth session be accepted as printed and as changes were needed. The moderator recognized and welcomed all the messengers and visitors. The director of Missions, Dr. J. Billy Graham, recognized the new ministers who came during the year to the association: Rev. and Mrs. Brad Williams, Unity Grove church; Rev. and Mrs. D. C. Sullivan, Red Branch church; Rev. and Mrs. Gregg Newton, Pleasant Hill church; Rev. and Mrs. Kenneth Baker, Eagle Springs; Mrs. Donna Lowe, minister of children and youth, Aberdeen church; Mrs. Allison Coltrane, minister of youth and children, Southern Pines church; Mr. Robbie Gibson, minister of youth, Vass church.
- 3. On behalf of the Credentials Committee Rev. Max Gilmore, stated that the Eagle Springs Baptist Church church was received into membership at the September Board meeting. The Eagle Springs messengers stood and were warmly welcomed into membership of the association.
- 4. The clerk, Dewitt Purvis, gave the Clerk's Report and Digest of Church Letters. There was an increase in almost every category. Total members, baptisms, receipts, gifts to missions and to the Cooperative Program, increased over 1996. Appreciation is expressed to all church clerks for their help in preparing the 1997 Church Profile.
- 5. Dr. Wayne Adams gave the treasurer's report, which was adopted as presented. Dr. Adams thanked the churches for their continuing strong support. Mr. Jack Hartsell, chairperson of the Finance and Budget Committee, moved the adoption of the proposed 1997-98 budget, which had been presented for information in May and had been recommended to the association for approval at the September Board meeting. The budget was unanimously adopted.
- 6. Dr. J. Billy Graham presented the director of missions report, thanking the associational leaders for all their service and help and for the prayers and support of all the churches. Dr. Graham encouraged participation in the partnership with South Africa and in other volunteer mission projects. At Dr. Graham's recommendation and by common consent it was agreed to dedicate the 1997 Annual in honor of retiring pastors Rev. John Stone, Southern Pines First, and Rev. Charles Hinson, Aberdeen First.
- 7. Ms. Lisa Perry, journeyman to China for 3 years, primarily in Mandarin language study in Beijing, shared some experiences with the Chinese and told how she was able to cultivate friendships and to witness in that setting.

- 8. Mrs. Deanna Stockwell and several of the ladies on the WOM council presented an inspirational and informative report on the women's work.
- 9. Mr. Charles English presented the Brotherhood Report, telling of many things that Baptist men and boys are doing in missions, the Angel Tree ministry, his interest in helping street children in Brazil. Others are invited to participate in local and world missions. Mr. Lewis Blue, member at Emmanuel, has agreed to serve as associate director.
- 10. Rev. Don Ballenger gave the evangelism report, informing us of the many ministries of the state convention and how people are being saved through these ministries. He encouraged us to use opportunities to train our people to witness. Rev. Ballenger also gave a most informative report on Campbell University, stating that it is the third largest Baptist University in the world with over 6,000 students from all 50 states and from over 40 countries.
- 11. Mr. Curtis Bettini, gave the report for the Property and Grounds Committee. He reported that the project for landscaping, paving, constructing the utility building, installing a fountain, planting shrubs and other plants was dedicated at the September Board meeting. He thanked all churches and individuals for their support. Curt referred to the committee as the "sick committee," since so many had experienced sickness the past year. 3. Director of Missions Report

The association is a family of churches on mission for Christ in our setting. As a people of God, we choose to work together in kingdom work, reaching the unreached and ministering to the needy in the name of Christ. Our churches focus on evangelism, missions, training to be better disciples, fellowship, and stewardship. We thank God for this privilege. Yet we know we fall short of the great potential in meeting the challenges before and using the resources that God has made available. We thank God for a good associational year and we pray for a better year in 1997-98.

Through our association, state, and national conventions we promote and conduct weeks of prayer for world missions, beginning here and reaching around the world. We are encouraged to pray for our missionaries and to support mission projects through volunteers from our churches. This past year, representatives from several of our churches participated in mission projects in our homeland in the Ukraine, Germany, Poland, Brazil and South Africa. Presently, we are in a five year partnership with South Africa; pastors and laypersons are encouraged to consider ways of supporting this partnership. As your director of missions, I have had the privilege of going last year and this year with teams to the Central Baptist Association in the South African Free State. Pray for and support the mission studies and mission offerings for world missions, including local, state, home and foreign. The name for the Home Mission Board has been changed to The North American Mission Board, and the name for the Foreign Mission Board has been changed to The International Mission Board.

This year we have studied demographics of our associational area and prayerfully considered possible places where there are needs for new missions and home Bible studies. In our growing population there are opportunities for witness and ministry among the Hispanics, the resort communities, the mobile home parks, and the black communities. We will continue to seek to find ways to minister to these people as well as evangelize our communities for Christ. Let us be alert to opportunities to minister in the nursing homes, jails and prisons, hospitals, the coalition, Habitat for Humanity, food and clothes closets for the needy, and pregnancy crisis centers.

We are happy to welcome back home Ms. Lisa Perry who lived in Beijing for 3 years and Dr. and Mrs. Zeb Moss who retired from the International Mission Board after serving more than 36 years! And we are pleased that the Patton Malones and Virginia Oliver live among us here in the Sandhills. The Malones united with Southern Pines First and Zeb and Evelyn Moss returned to Ashley Heights church where Lisa is a member.

Let us continue to pray for New Freedom and their pastoral family. The mother church of this congregation, now meeting at EduCare in Pinehurst, is Ives Memorial. We all are indebted for the excellent, caring ministries of Rev. John Stone, Southern Pines First, and Rev. Charles Hinson, Aberdeen First, who are retiring in April of 1998. We thank God for their ministries and wish them well in retirement, but we will continue to call upon them for counsel and ministry. We are pleased to welcome to our pastoral leadership Rev. D. C. Sullivan, called to serve Red Branch church, and Rev. Brad Williams, called to serve the Unity Grove congregation. We also gladly welcome to the our association, Mrs. Donna Lowe, Minister of Youth at Aberdeen First, and Mrs. Allison Coltrane, Minister of Youth and Children at Southern Pines First.

We were able to arrange for Pastor Domingos A. Grego, his wife Anna, and their good friend, Rose Marie Del Santos, from Baron, Sao Paulo, Brazil, to spend a very busy weekend here in our Association. Pastor Domingos brought messages at Emmanuel, Ives Memorial, and Red Branch, telling of their work in Brazil.

There is a continuing need and many opportunities for "hands on missions". There are thirteen ministries in the Baptist Brotherhood. Do you fit in? Become obedient to God and allow him to control your life.

3. Evangelism Report

Empowered by God's Spirit, North Carolina Baptists reached and <u>baptized 25.674</u> in 1996 for an increase of 1.9% over 1995. During two <u>Youth Evangelism Weeks</u>, 704 decisions were made, including <u>177 professions of faith</u>, 465 recommitments, 25 special service, and <u>37 other</u>. <u>Super Summer 1997</u> at Carowinds resulted in <u>2.822 decisions</u>, including <u>563+ professions</u> of faith.

However 45-50% of North Carolina residents are not actively affiliated with any church. North Carolina Baptists' goal is to touch every home in North Carolina with the gospel witness by 2001.

The development of spot announcements for radio and television to highlight a Christian message and North Carolina Baptist work is planned to aid in this goal. A color booklet will be produced in 1998 to help present the gospel to the 25 million tourists who visit North Carolina each year.

September 28 will be Homecoming with Brother Gilbert McDowell speaking. (Arliss Upchurch, Historian)

MIDDLE CROSS: Once again it is time to tell everyone in the association how good God has been to us this year. He has greatly blessed us through our skit leaders. They wrote and directed an original Christmas play, which reportedly blessed many in the community; also uplifting skits at Easter and for VBS. Again, our VBS was a great success with games and a special balloon for anyone who wished to participate, and souls were saved during VBS. The ladies of the church have been busy doing various things to raise funds for our Baptismal and carpeting for our fellowship hall. On

Memorial weekend we held a chicken and dumpling dinner at the Carthage Rescue Squad Building and would like to give them a special "Thank You" for the use of their building. With God's help we had good attendance and raised enough money to finish paying for our carpet. Some in our church have opened up their homes to have prayer meetings on Fridays. Prayer changes everything. Our homecoming is scheduled for September 28th with Dr. Ray Holland as our speaker. (Leora Thomas, Historian)

NEW FREEDOM: New Freedom church has had a very busy year. In May, we moved from our initial location in the associational office to larger temporary lodgings in the Edu-Care school on Murdocksville Rd. in Pinehurst. We continued our adult and children's Sunday School classes, and began children's church during the morning worship hour. In addition to the regular Sunday morning and evening worship services, during the winter months our mid-week bible study took the form of "Wonderful Wednesdays", which consisted of a simple meal just prior to Bible study. Dr. Paul Carlisle, professor of counseling and family ministry from Southeastern Seminary, returned for the second year to present a program on enriching family relationships. A very special ministry involving three of our youth continues to thrive: Alex Nance, Donna Greene, and Donna Garner (leader and teacher) have presented sign language programs here and in other counties under the name "Of One Accord". This group was the opening number for the gospel concert at Pinecrest High, with the girls performing for 1,600 people. In September, the Biblical Recorder listed New Freedom as #25 in the top 100 churches in NC in giving to missions, with regard to percentage given per size of church membership. 
