By vote of conference, Heber C. Baker, now at Holmes Bible School, was granted license, and the Official Board of the South Carolina Conference is empowered to set him apart to the work.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON MISSIONS.

In Matthew 28:19 we have the Master's own words: "Go ye therefore and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. To the disciples of Jesus there is no greater charge entrusted, no greater duty enjoined, than that involved in the "Great Commission, "Go Ye." "Go ye" was given to the individual disciples and every man must answer for himself. What is important for us to understand is that this generation of disciples on that

great day will be brought face to face with these neglected ones of our own time. We must be sure that our skirts are clear of their blood. "How shall they call on Him whom they have not believed? how shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard? and how shall they hear without a preacher? and how shall they preach except they be sent? Rom. 10.

There are one billion, sixty-five million heathen who have never heard of Jesus. Thirty million heathen die every year and fill heathen graves. Let every pastor, evangelist and lay member preach, talk and pray, stir up the minds of every onc we can to the great need of foreign missions. Adopt the plan of giving one cent a day, sacrifice and do what we can to organize missionary societies in all our churches. The pastor and deacon and every one should take part in this great work. It has been said that the cause of missions or spreading the gospel among the heathen shows for the glory of God more than any other enterprise on earth. It is the duty and responsibility and privilege of every child of God to have some part in evangelizing the world, some part in taking the gospel to every creature.

We as a committee recommend that home missions be made prominent in new fields in our own and other States. Make this the greatest year that we have known for both home and foreign missions.

Report of Committee on Education and Literature of last year was then read.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION AND LITERATURE.

We earnestly desire of our people that they more fully carry out the recommendation of the past committees, and that they give especial attention to the following suggestions:

- 1. That they patronize Pentecostal Holiness Schools.
- 2. That they subscribe for The Pentecostal Holiness Advocate and The Apostolic Evangel.
- 3. That they read the Bible daily, also literature in harmony with our teachings.
- 4. That this conference establish a circulating library for the benefit of its preachers.

RULES FOR EDUCATIONAL FUND.

- 1. The Official Board of this Conference shall decide who may become beneficiaries of this fund.
- 2. Each loan shall be made for two years, with privilege of renewal for two years.
 - 3. The rate of interest shall be 6 per cent.
- 4. Security must be given, that will be satisfactory with the Official Board.
- 5. The loans shall be limited to \$75.00 for each student per year.

Collection was then taken to the amount of \$28.64 to supplement the Educational Fund. Motion was carried to change rule 5 for the Educational fund so as to read as follows: "The loans shall be limited to \$75.00 for each student per year."

Collection was then taken to supplement fund for minutes and General Superintendent. It was voted that secretary be paid \$20 and assistant secretary be paid \$5, and balance after printing and mailing minutes be paid to General Superintendent. \$100 was raised for minutes, \$162.17 for General Superintendent.

Motion was introduced to adopt tithing system in this conference. Bros. Butler, Boroughs, the Chairman and others made comments explaining the tithing system. In short it seems to mean that each member of the local church is asked to pay a

part or all, of his tithes into church treasury, and each member of the conference is asked to pay all or a part of his tithes into conference treasury, and all or as near all as possible of the regular expenses to be paid from this fund.

Motion was adopted.

Motion to adjourn carried.

SECOND DAY — AFTERNOON SESSION.

Conference was called to order at hour appointed by the General Superintendent. After singing and prayer, minutes were read and approved. Further explanations and remarks were made concerning the "Tithing System."

Motion to require Ordaining Committee to remain in office during the conference year, was passed.

Motion was introduced and passed that the present ordination committee (A. H. Butler, Jerome Hodges and M. D. Sellers) serve throughout the coming conference year, or until next annual conference meeting.

Motion was introduced and carried that the expenses of A. H. Butler be paid to the meeting of the General Board, Jan. 2, 1924, at Greenville, S. C.

Another offering of \$6.00 was taken for the Educational Fund. This fund now amounts to \$150.00.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS.

The following were nominated for superintendent: Jerome Hodges, C. B. Strickland, A. H. Butler. Jerome Hodges was elected.

The following were nominated for assistant superintendent: C. B. Strickand, J. H. Marshburn, A. H. Butler. C. B. Strickland was elected on second ballot.

The following were nominated for secretary and treasurer: J. H. Marshburn and A. C. Holland. A. C. Holland was elected.

The following were nominated and elected for members of the Annual Board: J. B. Williams, and P. F. Robinson.

Motion was introduced and carried that the official board be given power to decide concerning the distribution of the funds in the conference treasury, during the conference year, as they think best.

Motion was introduced and passed that Mrs. M. E. Virden be elected as missionary evangelist for this conference.

Place of next meeting: Falcon, Tarboro and Goldsboro asked for the conference next year. Tarboro was selected by majority vote.

Motion was introduced and carried that the next session of the annual conference of N. C. shall convene on the Thursday before the fifth Sunday in November — November 27, 1924, Thanksgiving Day. Annual Communion service to be held on Wednesday night preceding.

By standing the conference offered a vote of thanks to Bro. King for enabling the conference to complete the business session so speedily, and to the people of Fayetteville, especially the Holiness church and the Methodist church for their kindness and hospitality.
