RULES FOR THE EDUCATIONAL FUND

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON PENTECOSTAL YOUNG PEOPLE'S SOCIETY

We the committee on Pentecostal Young People's Society submit the following: That all of our churches put forth every effort that possibly lieth within its power to organize in each of them a Young People's Society for the sole purpose of putting before our young people Bible teaching and Christian influence. We feel that with the efforts set forth by the world to influence them today, that when we have done all that can be done to help them, it will not be enough.

We know that this great work of ours largely depends upon the culture of the young people at an early date, or while they are young, and may the Lord help us to put before them Christian ideals that will be an inspiration for them to reach and that will draw them to the cross of Christ. The church needs them and they need the church provided they have been so influenced or drawn by the power of God. We believe that "The Young People's Society carries with its ideals this influence when conducted through much prayer and by Spiritual leaders.

Bro. Hodges asked for an offering at this point to supplement funds for the General Superintendent. The offering amounted to \$27.15.

Motion was adopted that the president of the Pentecostal Young People's Society visit each church for the purpose of encouraging and organizing societies in the churches. Also that each church should pay expenses of such visits.

Bro. Noble spoke of the necessity of these visits and methods of raising expenses. Bro. Butler spoke concerning methods of order and system in the societies.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON SUNDAY SCHOOLS

It is so important that we have a systematic study of God's Word that we, the Committee on Sunday School work, recommend that a live, wide-awake Sunday School be organized or in progress in every church. Also that the best selection of Superintendent, together with efficient teachers and officers be made to carry on this work to the glory of God.

We recommend that the officers and teachers of the Sunday School be selected with an eye single to their spirituality as well as efficiency in the knowledge of God's Word. That where practicable, a teacher training class be organized for the training of teachers for service.

We would not permit the services to drag; neither would we fail to have an eye single to order, government and discipline.

A lecture of the lesson is very beneficial and we suggest that the Superintendent, or one that he might select give this lecture to make the lesson more impressive.

We recommend that the Sunday School take into consideration the Falcon Orphanage and at least set aside one Sunday's offering each month for the Orphan children. That the Sunday School be a channel of blessing to any worthy call that may be properly presented by the Superintendent.

We recommend also that Pentecostal Holiness literature of our faith be used in the Sunday Schools where practicable and that The Pentecostal Holiness Advocate be supplied for class use, as may be directed by the Superintendent.

We especially recommend that parents attend Sunday School

with their children and that they, together with preachers and pastors punctually attend, cooperate and assist in the work of the Sunday School, and that they also use their influence in and for its advancement.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

We recommend:

1. That every member of the Pentecostal Holiness Church own an individual copy of the Holy Scriptures. Also that it be read daily in the hearing of the entire family around what was formerly called the "family altar," before it was discarded by Christians so-called.

2. That the children of our Pentecostal homes be supplied with good books and literature in harmony with the Bible. That religious books and periodicals be placed in the home. No one who is able to subscribe for a newspaper is too poor to subscribe for both the Advocate and the Evangel.

3. That the parents instruct their children in the home and see that the home education is not neglected.

4. That the schools in harmony with our church, Falcon, Holmes School and especially Franklin Springs Institute which is owned by the church be given our moral and financial support.

5. That we continue to help deserving boys and girls to obtain a Christian education and prepare themselves to be a help in our churches and for lives of usefulness.

6. That we increase the Conference Educational Fund and also contribute to the General Educational Fund.

7. That our ministers read more, both in the Bible and in religious books and papers. We are never too old to learn. If we would read more and talk less we would make more progress.

8. That our ministers make an effort to study the English language both for the purpose of understanding that which is read and of speaking correctly.

9. That the parents see that their children attend Sunday School with well learned lessons.

10. That each pastor read this report to each of his churches the first appointment after receiving the minutes.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

We the committee on Finance beg to submit the following report:

In as much as all the church work must have financial support and since the Bible teaches us that "They that preach the gospel shall live by the gospel," we your committee submit the following recommendations:

1. That each member of the local churches give to the church of which he or she is a member.
2. That each member pay tithes into the treasury of the church of which he or she is a member.
3. That the board of each local church have full control of the treasury.
4. That the board of each local church encourage each member to support the church and that the board obligate the church to support its pastor and whenever feasible agree to pay the pastor a minimum amount each month.
5. That all members of the conference pay a tenth of their net income to the Lord's work and that at least half of the tithes received as pastor or evangelist in the bounds of this conference be payed into the conference treasury.
6. That a fund be created sufficient to support at least one evangelistic meeting each year.
7. That at least one offering be made each month for foreign missions and whenever possible a missionary society be organized to raise money for this worthy cause.

Motion was adopted to pay amount raised for Bro. Butler's expenses into the General Treasury, except that paid by Bethel church, they having requested that Bro. Butler be paid back amount paid by them. At Bro. Butler's suggestion amendment was made to pay entire amount into General Treasury. Motion as amended was adopted.

Bro. Medford spoke in behalf of missions showing great needs and methods of raising funds. He also stressed necessity of church secretaries making out reports correctly.

Bro. Page spoke in behalf of the Evangel.

Offering was taken at this point for Rev. Jerome Hodges, Conference Superintendent, amounting to \$50.00.

Bro. Butler spoke encouragement to the candidates who were not granted license, showing them the great opportunities.

Bro. Strickland spoke in behalf of the Falcon School and asked secretary and Bro. Presley, the principal to speak. It was stated that the indebtedness is \$7,000 and aid was asked in raising this amount. Bro. Presley showed that though receiving county aid for teachers, that the school is a private one, and is the only standard high school with such religious influences thrown about it. Bro. Page also spoke in behalf of the work at Falcon.

Bro. Medford spoke in behalf of the conference parsonage showing that it is necessary to raise about \$500.00 right away in order that this work may go forward.
