MINUTES

Altavista, Va., July 23, 1930.

The Otter River Baptist Sunday School Convention convened in its 39th annual session with First Baptist Church Sunday School of Altavista, Va., Rev. J. A. Shelton, President, presiding; Supt. J. M. Fore, Misses Gennette Stratton and Marie Elliotte in the stand. The Convention sang "Down at the Cross," etc. Sister Marie Elliotte read 23rd Psalm. Prayer was offered by Bro. Wm. Watkins. Singing by the Convention.

Then, by order of the President, the Secretary read the order prepared by the President which was adopted by the Convention. The President then asked permission of the Convention to be absent to attend the funeral of Rev. Sneed which request was granted by the Convention. The President further asked the privilege of giving his address in the morning session as he would be away in the afternoon. His request was granted. Then upon appointment by the president Rev. R. A. Batts, Mrs. J. H. Martin and Mrs. W. A. Byrd would draft some resolutions of condolence from this body in memory of Rev. Sneed.

The welcome address was then called for and Miss Ethel Hoiston ascended the stand and gave a timely and intelligent address of welcome which was heartily received by the Convention and responded to by Supt. W. J. Martin in well chosen words.

We then proceeded to the appointment of committees:

Enrollment—Miss Viola Parker, Mrs. C. T. Monroe and Miss Anna Byrd.

New Schools—Supt. Monroe Jones, Miss Mary Burns, Mr. William Reid, Miss E. Brown and Mr. A. L. Hunter.

Reading Letters—Mrs. Gertrude Jones, Mrs. L. V. Hogue and Mrs. Julia White.

Education—Supt. P. W. Callaham, Rev. S. H. Preston, Mr. Thomas Dean, Mrs. E. K. Burton, Mr. P. S. Coleman, Mrs. Elizabeth Singleton.

Temperance—Supt. D. F. Payne, Supt. James Carr, Dea. C. R. Powell, Supt. A. W. Martin, Supt. W. H. Arnold, Miss Marie Elliotte and Miss Lillie Preston.

Permanent Organization—Supt. E. M. Payne, Rev. David Pannill, Licn. Robert Dabney, Supt. A. W. Martin, Supt. W. J. Martin, Mrs. Elizabeth Harvey and Mrs. L. M. Dabney.

Auditing—Bro. William Watkins, Sister R. J. Lee and I. B. Dixon.

Sunday Schools—Miss Gennette Stratton, Mrs. A. B. Irving, Mrs. Cornelia White, Mrs. Annie Gibson, Mr. Chas. H. Parker, Mr. E. T. Clark, Mrs. Alice Mosley.

Then the Vice President introduced the President who proceeded to deliver his annual address which was one of very great value to the Con-

vention because of its timely advice and the many helpful suggestions to the people of the present time.

By motion this address was referred to the following committee: Rev. R. A. Batts, Dea. J. L. Yuille and Rev. Thos. W. Tweedy, D. D. Then the resolution of condolence as above directed was read and endorsed by the Convention. Then Rev. J. L. McDaniel who had been appointed to preach asked to be excused in order to attend the funeral of Bro. Henry McDaniel, and Rev. S. H. Preston was appointed to preach in his stead in the afternoon. Benediction was given by Rev. David Pannill.

First Day, Afternoon Session, 3 o'clock P. M.

The Vice President, D. W. Gibson, in the chair; Supt. W. H. Arnold, Mrs. H. F. Hamlet, Miss Mary Monroe in the stand. Singing by the Convention. Miss Mary Monroe read from 20th chapter of Exodus through the 11th verse. Prayer was offered by Supt. Arnold. Mrs. Hamlet sang No. 104. Rev. Preston ascended the stand. Then the Committee on Thanks was appointed, viz: Supt. J. L. Yuille, Mr. B. W. Anderson, Miss Sadie Herndon, Miss Mary Monroe and Mrs. H. L. Hamlet.

Singing by the Convention. Then Rev. Butts read from the 18th chapter of Luke through the 14th verse. Prayer was offered by Dea. D. F. Payne. The chair then introduced Rev. S. H. Preston who arose and announced as a text Phil. 2:5, "Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus." Rev. Preston preached an interesting sermon which was enjoyed by the Convention. The President appointed Mr. D. F. Payne and Mr. William Nappier to lift a collection. They took up \$3.00.

Then the Secretary, Rev. Thos. W. Tweedy, gave a lecture, his subject being: "The Superintendent of the Sunday School." This subject created much interest and was spoken to by Supt. J. L. Yuille, Rev. T. M. McClendon, Mr. J. C. Coleman, Dea. D. F. Payne, Dea. William Reid, Supt. D. W. Gibson, Mr. C. H. Gibson. We then adjourned by benediction from Rev. David Pannill.

First Day, Evening Session, 8:20 o'clock P. M.

The President in the chair; Supt. W. J. Martin, Mrs. L. G. Preston and Mrs. Elvira Brown in the stand. Singing by the Convention. Mrs. Brown read the 1st Psalm. Prayer by Supt. W. J. Martin. Singing by the Convention.

We then commenced the reading of letters after which the Committee on Place was appointed, viz: Rev. T. M. McClendon, Mrs. P. S. Coleman and Supt. D. W. Gibson.

A motion prevailed to place on a separate list the amounts sent up to the Seminary during the year together with the name of the school. (This list will appear elsewhere in these minutes.)

Then the Secretary, Thomas W. Tweedy, gave the second of his series of lectures, subject: "The Teacher." This created a great amount of interest in the Convention. The President then introduced Rev. R. A. Batts who was to preach at this hour. Rev. Batts ascended the stand in company with Rev. T. M. McClendon. Rev. McClendon sang "Amazing Grace, How Sweet the Sound," etc., Rev. Batts announced as a text John 14:6,

"Jesus said unto Thomas, I am the way." This sermon, because of its holy influence upon the Convention will be remembered for a long time.

A solo by Miss C. T. Monroe was sung with ability and enjoyed by the convention. The President then appointed Bro. Charlie Clark and Supt. Burl Anderson to lift a collection. Singing by the Convention. We then had several selections by the First Baptist choir. The committee took up \$5.00, after which the Committee on Permanent Organization reported as follows: We, your Committee on Permanent Organization, beg leave to offer the following report: We recommend the present corps of officers for the next 12 months. This report was adopted and Supt. Burl Anderson was appointed by the chair to install the officers, which he did with credit to himself and to the Convention. Then after notices by the President we adjourned with benediction by Rev. T. M. McClendon.

Second Day, Morning Session, 9 o'clock A. M.

The President in the chair; Bros. William Nappier, W. B. Reid and C. R. Powell in the stand. Convention sang "I Shall Know Him," etc. Bro. Powell read 1st division of Psalms. Prayer was offered by Bro. Reid. Convention sang "I Will Guide Thee," etc. The letter from the Secretary, Thos. W. Tweedy, was read asking the Convention to pardon him for not being present owing to the severe illness of his wife. The letter was received and prayer was offered by Bro. J. L. Yuille for our Secretary and his wife. Then Supt. P. W. Callaham motioned that the Convention send a resolution of sympathy to Rev. Tweedy, which resolution was adopted and Bro. P. W. Callaham and Supt. Burl Anderson were appointed to draw up the resolution.

The minutes of the first day's deliberations were read by Mrs. A. B. Martin who was acting secretary in place of Rev. Thos. W. Tweedy and with necessary corrections stood approved by the Convention. We then proceeded to the reading of letters, after which the following visitors were introduced: Rev. W. H. Herbert, Mrs. Clark, Mrs. Hays and Mrs. Christian. Mrs. Hays gave a short but interesting talk.

Then the report on obituaries was called for but the report was not ready, but Mrs. A. B. Martin spoke in memory of Mrs. Sallie James, of Piney Grove Sunday School; Supt. William Burton spoke in memory of Bro. James Nowlin of Flat Creek. Mrs. Sginleton led in singing, "I Would Not Mind Dying if that Was All." Mrs. A. B. Irving spoke in memory of Mrs. Annie B. Irving of Mount Evergreen; Mrs. Brown spoke in memory of Mrs. Kayne of Bethany Sunday School; Bro. Reid spoke in memory of Mr. Sandy McIvor of Mt. Obid; Rev. T. G. Walker spoke in memory of Miss Tiny Lovelace of Grace Sunday School; Sister Matilda Clark spoke in memory of Sister Sarah Callaham; Bro. Callaham spoke in memory of Sister Lucy Arnold of First Baptist, Altavista; Bro. William Nappier spoke in memory of Supt. J. W. Watts of Mount Pelier Sunday School; Bro. W. H. Burton spoke in memory of Deacon Jackson of Flat Creek Sunday School. The memory of Rev. J. B. Shelton, D. D., was spoken to by Mrs. Kate Burton, Rev. S. H. Preston, Bro. Burks of Holcomb Rock, Supt. Burl Anderson. Then adopted. Singing by the Convention.

Then Rev. G. C. Henderson and Rev. J. H. Peters, D. D., of Jackson

St., M. E. church were introduced. Both gave interesting talks. Dr. Peters gave a more lengthy address which was very helpful stating that the youths of today are about what they have always been, but their failures are due to the influence of the home, school and the church. A beautiful solo was sung by Mrs. Cola Mosley entitled, "Were You There When They Crucified My Lord?"

The time having arrived for preaching Rev. F. Shelton, Rev. E. T. Henderson and Dg. W. Clark and Rev. Smith ascended the stand. The Convention sang "I am saved through Jesus' Blood." The President then introduced Rev. G. C. Cook, D. D., of Lynchburg, who preached at that hour, taking no special text but his principal discourse was about Jacob and his brother. The Rev. Cook emphasized firmness and stability as a trait of character to be cherished by the Christian. The President then appointed Deacon Smith Russell and Brother Lovelace to lift a collection. They took up \$6.05. Then the Committee on Fees was appointed, viz: Rev. J. L. McDaniel, Dea. Burl Anderson and Supt. D. W. Gibson. Benediction given by Rev. J. L. McDaniel, D. D.

Second Day, Afternoon Session, 3 o'clock P. M.

The President in the chair; Mount Zion and Mount Evergreen delegates in the stand. Singing by the Convention. Scripture lesson by Mrs. A. B. Irving, 25th division of the Psalms. Prayer by Rev. S. H. Preston. Singing by the Convention, "Sweet Hour of Prayer," etc. Then the resolution written relative to Rev. Thos. W. Tweedy was read and received and adopted after which the Committee on Temperance reported as follows: We, your Committee on Temperance beg leave to offer the following report: Whereas intemperance seems to continue to spread over our country and to grasp such hold on not only the young people, but some of our leading members of the churches, some of whom seem to take the lead in spreading this evil. Not only does it lower conditions in the church and Sunday School, but it breaks up homes and the community, causing many wrecks and even deaths. Therefore, Be it resolved that each Sunday School composing this Convention stand firmly against this evil. Respectfully submitted, D. F. Payne, James Carr, C. R. Powell, A. W. Martin, W. H. Arnold, Lillie Preston, Marie Elliotte, Committee.

The report was received and spoken to by Rev. S. H. Preston, Licn.

Robert Dabney, Mrs. Bettie Elliotte, Mrs. M. L. Dabney, and then by motion was adopted.

Mrs. Clark, Mrs. Hattie Shelton, and Mrs. Hays ascended in company with Mrs. Cook and were introduced to the Convention. Mrs. Clark gave a splendid paper, subject, "Mothers Conditions of the Ages." The Convention was much interested in the paper. This was in lieu of a paper by Miss Lottie Herndon who was absent. Singing by the Convention, "What a Meeting There Will Be," etc.

Then the Committee on Education reported as follows: We, your Committee on Education, beg leave to offer the following report: Whereas, the Virginia Theological Seminary and College is operated by the colored Baptists of this state and others, and whereas at this time the school is undergoing a financial crisis and anxious to raise \$100,000.00 to meet some urgent obligations, Resolve, 1st, That the Sunday Schools composing our Convention do their best in donating finances for the school; and we recommend and urge the schools to lift monthly contributions for the school at Lynchburg and send same through the President of the Convention. Committee, P. W. Callahan, E. K. Burton, L. Singleton, Thomas Dean, Rev. S. H. Preston. The report was received and spoken to by Rev. Henderson and Rev. L. K. Jackson. These gentlemen spoke positively of the needs of the school. Then Rev. David Pannill and Rev. R. L. Heck were appointed to lift a collection for the school which amounted to \$20.37.

Then the missionary, Rev. Aaron Early, reported that he had visited several Sunday Schools but owing to circumstances did not get much money—only \$5.00. His report was received and adopted.

Supt. W. J. Martin, corresponding messenger from the Otter River Sunday School Union brought greetings from that Union accompanied with \$4.00 from the Union. Then upon a motion the report was received with thanks. Then Mrs. Loveday, corresponding messenger from the Corner Stone Sunday School Convention brought to us greetings from the Convention, which report was received.

The Committee on Place reported as follows: We, your Committee on Place, beg to offer the following report: We find two schools asking for our next sitting, viz., the Silver Grove of Rustburg and Antioch of Coleman Falls. After carefully considering the invitations we recommend the Convention to meet with the Antioch Sunday School in 1931. Respectfully submitted, T. M. McClendon, P. S. Coleman and D. W. Gibson. The report was adopted. Then after some remarks by Rev. R. L. Heck we had benediction by Rev. Nelson.

Second Day, Evening Session, 8 o'clock P. M.

The President in the chair; Miss Mary Monroe, Miss M. H. Hamlet and Mr. J. H. Martin in the stand. Singing by Miss Mary Monroe. Mr. J. H. Martin read from John 14th chapter through the 12th verse. Prayer by Miss Mary Monroe. Singing by the Convention.

The Committee on Sunday Schools reported as follows: We, your Committee, beg to offer the following report: We think it would be interesting to each school in this Convention that has at least four classes

should get two banners, one for attendance and one for offerings, in order that each will have something to work for. In so doing we feel that the attendance will be better and pupils will bring more finances, working for the banner. We insist that all persons of the community attend the Sunday School which will increase their efficiency for church service. Committee, Gennette Stratton, Annie Gibson, C. H. Parker, C. T. Clark, A. B. Irving, Alice Mosley and Cornelia White. The report was adopted.

The Committee on New Bodies reported as follows: We, your Committee on New Bodies, beg to offer the following report: We find no new school seeking membership in our Convention this year. Committee, Monroe Jones, Mary Jones, E. Brown, W. R. Reid. The report was adopted.

Mr. Arthur Dennis, corresponding messenger from Southside Appomattox and Campbell County Sunday School Union, came before the Convention bringing greetings from the Union, accompanied by \$5.00 for the Virginia Seminary and College. The report was received and a vote of thanks was extended to the Union for the money.

We then had a solo by Mrs. Sallie Singleton, "His Eyes are on the Sparrow." Then the time having arrived for preaching. Rev. T. M. McClendon ascended the stand in company with Rev. Jackson and Rev. Henderson and Licn. Robert Dabney. Convention sang "Take the Name of Jesus with You," etc. The President then introduced Rev. McClendon who in turn introduced Rev. Henderson who preached from the subject, "Pentecost with Us." Rev. Henderson preached an inspiring sermon. Then we had a duet by some members of the church. Mrs. W. A. Byrd made some remarks relative to the Training School at Rustburg.

The Committee on Subjects and Speakers reported as follows: Annual sermon, Rev. J. L. McDaniel, D. D., alternate Rev. David Pannill. Wednesday, 8:30, Rev. F. Shelton. Thursday 11:30, Rev. S. H. Preston, alternate Rev. M. E. Calloway, subject, "The Birth of the Sunday School." Thursday evening, 8:30, Rev. J. R. Nelson, alternate Rev. A. F. Thompson. Respectfully submitted, Rev. S. H. Preston, Rev. J. R. Nelson, Rev. F. Shelton. The report was adopted.

The Committee on Thanks reported as follows: We, your Committee on Thanks beg leave to offer the following report: Since this Convention has been so carefully entertained and cared for while here by the First Baptist church of this place, this committee recommends that this Convention extend to these people a vote of appreciation for their hospitality while here and may the blessings of our Heavenly Father always attend them. Respectfully submitted, E. T. Clark, Miss Arabell Haden, Miss Anna W. Byrd.

Bro. J. L. Yuille and A. W. Martin were appointed to lift a collection for Prof. J. F. Fowlkes' monument on behalf of Rev. J. B. Shelton who stood for a part of the debt. Collection amounted to \$8.03.

The Auditing Committee stated that the report of the Treasurer was correct, which was received and adopted.

Rev. S. H. Preston spoke in favor of the Millers work of Hays Memorial Orphan Home at Staunton, Va., and a collection of \$2.92 was taken up for the home.

Then the Committee on Finances made report as follows: We, your Committee on Finance, beg to submit the following report:

Constitution of Woman's Auxiliary Society
