Mr. Chairman, and members of the Conference, God's blessings have been very real in my life this year. Many have been the problems, and especially problems that arise as a result of this war, but I have found the Lord the mighty Counsellor.

My Work

I have given my entire time to the ministry and work of the Conference. I have visited all the churches that were on the Conference roll at the beginning of the year, preached 129 times; presided over 20 District Conferences and 5 Board meetings; have held revivals or special meetings in Sanford, Kenly, Roper, Wilmington, and Millennium. Also, I have assisted some of the pastors in filling their appointments; attended the Piney Grove Meeting and Bible Conference, and assisted some there; re-organized the church in Roper, organized a church in Benson, and a mission at Thompson Chapel. I have traveled approximately 15,000 miles; have written 370 cards and letters; sent a number of telegrams and made some long distance calls. I have endeavored to do my duty as I have known it, and have found a great spirit of cooperation in the Conference.

I firmly believe that we are making progress, but our greatest need at this time is a permanent place to hold our Annual Conference sessions.

Therefore, we, your Committee on Missions and Evangelism, recommend the following:

1. That the office of the Director of Home Missions and of Foreign Missions be combined in the office of Director of Missions and that this body elect a person to fill this place.

2. That this Director of Missions appoint an assistant in each district.

3. That the Director of Missions in cooperation with the Conference Superintendent, arrange a Missionary Convention and Home Mission Rally in each district during the coming year, time and place to be announced.

4. That the method of support of Director of Missions be decided upon by the Conference Board.

That each District Conference elect a committee of three on evangelism who will work with the Director of Missions in evangelizing the entire Conference.

Report of Committee on P. H. Y. S. and Sunday Schools

It has been said that the time to begin training a child is fifty years before it is born. A child will learn to speak its native language the first two years of its life. Therefore, the tremendous importance of an early start in training our youth cannot be overestimated.

We know that the Home the Church and the School are the three great institutions which God, in His wisdom, has designed to train our boys and girls. It cannot be denied that of these three the importance of home training is paramount.

Without a doubt, the Bible is by far the greatest factor in the proper training of the young. Deut. 6:7-9 should be deeply pondered by all who have to do with this training. The Scripture must be read and taught more in our homes.

All of our churches should arrange for, and have daily vacation Bible Schools for the children and young people. We have learned

from observation that the Bible is the best program Book for Youth's Society work.

Sunday School and P. H. Y. S. activities must not be a mere side-line for those engaged in them. Such workers must obtain, and make use of the best books and periodicals which treat these subjects, to better equip and qualify themselves for this glorious task.

Should there not be a united, consecrated, and concentrated effort of all the parents, ministers, Sunday school and P. H. Y. S. leaders, for the salvation and training for the rising generation? Every school should have teachers' training classes.

We believe it would be wise to have an Assistant Youth Director in each district, and, that if possible these officials be appointed by the Official Board of the Conference in collaboration with the Conference Youth Director. There should be a P. H. Y. S. Conference held in each district, and it should be at least separate and distinct enough from other services so as not to be interfered with for want of time.

All of our churches should install libraries for the benefit of our young people.

Insofar as possible and practical all of the Christian young people should be given something to do in connection with all our Christian endeavors.

The pastor and officials of the Church should see that P. H. Y. S. officials get financial aid when visiting in the interest of the work.

Report of Committee on Education

Your Committee on Education respectfully submits the following report:

Despite the disaster and distress and disturbance in the present international crisis, we recognize our obligation to support those institutions which contribute to sane and spiritual civilization. One of our obligations to the youth of our Church and the world is in the field of Christian education, and we here record our endorsement of our own Church School, a growing institution of higher learning, Emmanuel College and Emmanuel Academy. Also we endorse the training program of Holmes Bible College. We renew our pledge of support of these institutions with our means, our prayers, and insofar as possible with patronage.

We recommend that our pastors give encouragement to those in their local congregations who may be called into the Christian ministry, assisting them in their study of the prescribed courses for admission to the Conference as licensed and ordained ministers, and in other ways aiding them in meeting the requirements of those who seek to preach the Gospel and administer to the spiritual needs of the world.

We call upon all our ministers to "give themselves to study and personal devotions" that they may be workmen rightly dividing the word of truth, using the Bible, such helps as they might obtain from sound writers, and publications and periodicals as our Church Publishing House carries or be able to order.

We recommend to all our local congregations in this Conference, the Pentecostal Holiness Advocate, Youth's Leader, and other books, periodicals and tracts written by our own preachers and laymen, as well as other publications which contain inspiration and instruction. We recommend once again that the printed page is a means of disseminating the Gospel which our Church can use to great profit.

We recommend that study be given to a Conference Periodical for the North Carolina Conference, and the Official Board of the Conference look into the feasibility of establishing such a publication for the purpose of serving pastors and churches as a medium of strengthening our own work in this area.

In the providence of God, it has pleased Him to remove from our midst Rev. J. M. Howell, for many years a beloved member of the North Carolina Conference, and to call our brother to his Heavenly home. Brother Howell was highly esteemed, not only by the Pentecostal Holiness people, but by all who knew him.

Brother Howell joined the Fire Baptized Church in 1905 and when that denomination and the Pentecostal Holiness Church were consolidated at Falcon, N. C., in 1911, he remained loyal to God and the Church until his death. He was a farmer and a preacher. He owned a nice farm and a comfortable home and it afforded him great pleasure to entertain God's ministers, especially the poor and those in need.

The home of Brother Howell was a haven to God's true and weary servants. For a number of years he traveled and preached mostly in the neglected fields, and there are many living today who were led to Christ through his ministry. He was strictly honest and sincere, meek and humble, always laboring to attain to the depths and heights and lengths and breadth of God's fulness of blessings. His life spoke much louder than his words.

His frail body, for the last few years of his stay on earth, prevented him from activity in the ministry, but though the outward man perished away, the inward man was renewed day by day.

Therefore, since God has been pleased to call Brother Howell from his labor and toil to his reward, we humbly bow in reverence and humble submission to His divine will and pray for grace to enable each and all of us to manifest the Christ-like life as he did.

We also recommend that a copy of this resolution be sent to his son, Prof. W. W. Howell of Elon College, N. C., and a copy be sent to his daughter, Mrs. W. G. Batten of Goldsboro, N. C.

1. That all lay members pay their tithes into the treasury of the local church where they hold their membership; said tithes to be disbursed by the Official Board of same, except as provided elsewhere in this report.

2. That the pastors inform and encourage all members to pay their tithes into the treasury, and to elect those to the Official Board who do pay tithes into the treasury. But if this creates confusion, or serves to the detriment of the church, that no minister be allowed to hold official position in the Conference who does not comply with this financial system.

3. That all ministers of the North Carolina Conference pay one-half of their tithes, both ministerial and secular, into the Conference Treasury. We insist that tithes be paid monthly.

4. That all churches pay their pastor his regular salary for Sabbath during Annual Conference session.

5. In view of the fact that the General Conference is asking for special funds, viz.; Home Missions, Bishop's salary, Educational purposes, and general Superannuate Fund, we recommend that the churches have a central treasury, and ten per cent of receipts be paid into Annual Conference Treasury, and Conference pay pro-rata part into General Treasury.

6. That the Conference Superintendent be paid \$125.00 per month and \$350.00 per year for traveling expenses for the coming year.

7. That the following appropriations be made: Fifteen per cent of Conference funds be paid to Evangelistic Fund; fifteen per cent into Superannuate Fund; Emmanuel College \$50.00; Holmes Bible College \$50.00; Conference Secretary \$25.00; Superannuate Fund Treasurer \$10.00; Conference Treasurer \$10.00 for this session and \$25.00 per quarter for the ensuing year.

Report of Committee on Prohibition and Public Morals

Feeling the responsibility and the call as Christians to hold the standard of holiness as high as becometh Pentecostal Holiness brethren, we humbly submit the following:

1. We deplore and utterly oppose the liquor traffic and all its accompanying evils. We urge that our people be instructed along the lines of temperance and that we constantly wage a warfare against the manufacture, sale and use of all forms of intoxicating beverages.

2. We feel that we should stress the importance of living temperate along all lines of Christian activity, and that the atmosphere of the home life be such as to inspire Christian living.

3. We urge that all pastors repeatedly visit homes and encourage the establishment of family altars if they find the home, along this line, has been neglected.

4. We voice our protest to the rising number of divorces. We stress the sacredness of matrimony and the sanctity of the home.

5. We also oppose the desecration of the Sabbath and call upon our people to keep the Sabbath day holy.

6. We believe that there should be a greater respect given to the services of the Church, and especially to the reading of the Word of God in public services. We therefore direct the attention of our ministers and deacons to the importance of the training and development of church members along this line.

7. We urge that our Sunday schools and P. H. Y. S. leaders give instruction to those of tender years, showing the harmfulness to physical, mental, and spiritual faculties through indulgence in the tobacco habit.

We, the North Carolina Conference of the Pentecostal Holiness Church, in its Thirty-Second Annual Session, assembled in Williams-ton, N. C., Oct. 24-26, 1942, do respectfully petition the Congress of the United States of America to enact such pending legislation which proposes the enforcement of laws against the sale, supplying, giving, or having in possession any alcoholic beverages in or near military or training camps for the Army or the Navy.

Our Church is deeply concerned over the welfare of our youth. This Conference wants the best protection for the 18 and 19 year old boys who now face induction into the Army through the Selective Service System.

We urge the Conference to authorize the Conference Official Board to consider the selection of a site as permanent headquarters for the annual sessions of the North Carolina Conference, and that a Conference Camp Meeting be held at the same site.

Report of Committee on Superannuate Funds

We, your Committee on Superannuate Funds, beg leave to submit the following report:

We should like to take note of and commend the generosity of a layman in the North Carolina Conference, Mr. J. N. Williams of Greenville, N. C., for his contribution of \$200 to the Superannuate Fund during the past year, and invite others who may feel an inspiration to follow his example.

Attention is directed to action of the 1940 session of the North Carolina Conference held at Goldsboro in the adoption of a resolution requiring all beneficiaries of the Superannuate Fund to pay one-half of their tithes into the Conference Treasury for the ensuing year, and each Conference year following.

We recommend:

First: That the Conference Secretary compile a record from the Ministerial Reports of those ministers who have complied with the resolutions adopted as aforesaid paragraph sets forth. From this record of Ministerial Reports the Conference Official Board will be able to ascertain the eligibility of those who request financial benefits from the Superannuate Fund.

Second: That all promissory notes given for loans made from the Superannuate Fund shall be endorsed by one member of a local church or the Annual Conference, and that loans above \$100 shall bear the endorsements of two members of a local church or the Annual Conference.

Third: That all loans made from the Superannuate Fund shall be paid back in monthly or quarterly installments.

Fourth: That interests be charged at the rate of six (6) per cent per annum, and that interest shall be deducted from the loan at the time it is first made.

Fifth: That payment of \$15.00 per month be made to Rev. A. H. Butler during the Conference year of 1943; that payment of \$8.00 per month be made to Mrs. Beadie Noble during the Conference Year of 1943.

Report of Committee on Orphanage Work

For many years our Conference has appointed committees on Orphanage Work, and our churches have supported in a very generous and loyal manner, The Falcon Orphanage as an adopted institution. This recognition, evidenced by our Conference reports, and by the moral and financial support of our churches was due to the facts that this orphanage was within the bounds of our Conference, was operated as a Pentecostal Institution, and we had no orphanage work of our own.

We were glad to have the privileges of endorsing and supporting this worthy cause as a practical and scriptural evidence of the "Pure and undefiled religion" which we teach and profess, and because the services of this institution were available to us, when needed, for the welfare of widows and orphans within our gates.

Since our last Conference the Trustees of The Falcon Orphanage, Inc., offered its entire physical Plant, and good will, to The Pentecostal Holiness Church for ownership, operation, and control as its own institution. The considerations asked and agreed upon between the representative Boards of The Falcon Orphanage, Inc., and The Pentecostal Holiness Church, involved an outstanding indebtedness not to exceed \$5,500.00, and the moral obligation to enlarge, expand and perpetuate the orphanage work in harmony with the articles of the incorporation included in the Certificate of Incorporation of The Falcon Orphanage. The formal details of transfer are in process and will be legally perfected and completed at the coming annual meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Orphanage about the first of January, 1943, and the Book Value of the Plant thus transferred to The Pentecostal Holiness Church, will be approximately \$95,000.00.

Inasmuch as our orphanage institution will be located within our Conference, we desire to be the first Conference of the Pentecostal Holiness Church to adopt a report expressing our appreciation and approval of the actions taken to make the ownership and management of The Falcon Orphanage, Inc., our very own.

Because of this transfer of ownership and management, we realize that we shall be under greater obligations and responsibilities to give a larger and more universal support to our orphanage work, but these will not be burdensome if we accept them as offering us greater privileges and opportunities to render greater service to God in behalf of the welfare of the fatherless and widows within our ranks. In the

adoption of this report, which we hope will be without a dissenting vote, we want to pledge ourselves as a Conference of churches, and as individuals making up the membership of our churches, to give to our orphanage work the fullest moral and financial support possible without neglecting any other phases of our work equally worthy and important.

Report of W. B. Godwin, Sunday School Evangelist

Preached or lectured 83 times.

Directed eleven Sunday School Conferences, which I believe as a whole were more spiritual than usual.

There were 38 programs rendered at these Conferences.

By taking a census of the churches and Sunday schools of this Conference, I find that 28% of our church members are males, and 72% females.

There are more than twelve hundred homes represented in this membership.

About 1 in 12 of our churches have Bible studies other than preaching, and Sunday school.

41% of the members of our Sunday schools are males, 59% females. Males above 21 years of age compose 16% of the total membership of our Sunday schools.

Males 13 to 20 years of age 9%. Males under 13 years of age 16%.

Females above 21 years of age compose 23% of the total membership of our schools. Females 13 to 20 years of age 14%. Females under 13 years of age 22%.

We have 1,000 boys in our schools under 21 years of age; while the number of girls under 21 is more than 1,400.

We have about 290 teachers, 35% of which are males, and 65% females.

A very small per cent of these have had any special training for teaching in the Sunday school.

I have picked up many people on the roads and preached Christ to them, also visited the sick in homes and hospitals and prayed for them.

I have received \$255.24 for the ministry.

I gave \$208.65, \$72.00 of which I put in the Conference Treasury.
