We, The North Carolina Conference, do accept the challenge of Bro. Culbreth to improve, enlarge and perpetuate this orphanage.

We ask that each church give place to the Falcon Orphanage in its budget, providing for systematic and regular support. Also, that special prayer be offered for the orphanage officials in their task.

We recommend that the North Carolina Conference submit to the General Board the following:

We do hereby pledge our cooperation and support in any plan which you devise for establishing a modern orphanage plant with adequate facilities to take care of the homeless children which God in His own providence may lead us to care for. Also, the establish-

ing of school facilities for orphanage students at Falcon through high school grades.

4. That a P. H. Y. S. Convention be conducted in each district. That there also be an annual P. H. Y. S. Convention and Youth's Training Institute conducted, the details of which to be worked out by the Conference Board and P. H. Y. S. Board.

5. That every Sunday school and P. H. Y. S. provide a library, having a plan whereby they can encourage the reading of good literature.

6. That a reporter of P. H. Y. S. activities in the conference be appointed by the P. H. Y. S. Board.

7. That every society strive to make each member a subscriber to the Youth's Leader.

8. That the pastors and officials of each church should see that P. H. Y. S. officials get financial aid when visiting in the interest of the work.

Report of Committee on Temperance and Public Morals

We, your Committee on Temperance and Public Morals, desire to submit the following report:

Your committee feels that the spiritual enrichment of the lives of our members may be accomplished by patterning our lives after the instructions in God's Word and adhering to the glorious truths for which we as a Church stand and preach.

We feel that emphasis should be placed upon temperate living in these days of duress and strain, and that in our homes parents should provide an atmosphere conducive to Christian living. Pastors should counsel with parents about things that endanger the moral and spiritual and physical welfare of the children in our homes and do all possible to foster and promote righteous deportment.

The teaching and training agencies of our churches are suggested as channels through which to instruct our youth in proper health standards, the evils of intemperance, the abstinence from the use of alcoholic beverages and other habit-forming indulgences.

Viewing the dangers facing all our people, but particularly our youth, because of war-time conditions which always breed drunkenness and immorality, we would call upon our people to be on the alert in defense of our homes, our family altars and the national home front. We urge our ministers and membership to always oppose the evils of the liquor traffic by instruction, active support of those who fight the liquor traffic, and voting against the nefarious business.

We should like here to record our support of the Allied Church League for the Abolition of Beverage Alcohol recently organized in North Carolina and join in the fight to drive liquor from the state of North Carolina.

It is further recommended that our pastors, when preaching temperance sermons, give full and honest facts about America's No. 1 Enemy, the Liquor traffic, and its evil consequences.

In these days of war-time marriages, we urge our people to seriously consider the sanctity of marriage and the home and call upon pastors to encourage the Christian home by visitation, with family worship being held upon the occasion of these pastoral visits.

Finally, in our public worship we would urge a greater respect for the Sanctuary of God, the public reading of the Scriptures, and proper decorum on the part of congregations. We would therefore direct the attention of ministers and deacons to this important matter.

That an all year custodian be selected by Conference Board to care for and protect the Camp Meeting property.

In view of prevailing circumstances at Roper that the Conference Board shall take the necessary steps to protect our rights, name, and reputation in that town.

Because of the responsibilities of the Conference Superintendent at the sitting of the Annual Session that the Conference Board select an able assistant for Camp Meeting management.

Report of Committee on Finance

We, your Committee on Finance recommend the following:

1. That all lay members pay their tithes into the treasury of the local church where they hold their membership; said tithes to be disbursed by the Official Board, except as provided elsewhere in this report.

2. That the pastors inform and encourage all members to pay their tithes into the treasury, and to elect those to the Official Board who do pay their tithes into the treasury. But if this serves to the confusion and detriment of the church, it shall be left to the pastor and church to make such disposition as will keep the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace. And that no minister be allowed to hold official position in the conference who does not comply with this financial system.

3. That all ministers of The North Carolina Conference pay one-half of ministerial and secular tithes into the conference treasury. This does not apply to that which is grown on the farm.

4. That all churches pay their pastor his regular salary for Sabbath during Annual Conference session.

5. In view of the fact that the General Conference is asking for special funds, viz; Home Missions, Bishop's salary, Educational purposes, and General Superannuate fund, we recommend that the churches have a central treasury, and ten per cent of receipts be paid into Annual Conference Treasury, and Conference pay pro rata part into General Treasury.

6. That the Conference Superintendent be paid \$150.00 per month, and three cents per mile for official traveling expenses for ensuing year.

7. That the following appropriations be made: Fifteen per cent of conference funds be paid to Evangelistic Fund; Twenty per cent into Superannuate Fund; Emmanuel College \$50.00; Holmes Bible College \$50.00; Conference Secretary \$50.00; Superannuate Fund Treasurer \$10.00. Conference Treasurer \$25.00 for this session,

and \$25.00 per quarter for the ensuing year. We also recommend that a donation of \$25.00 be made to Rev. H. W. Farmer.

Report of Committee on Education

Your Committee on Education submits the following:

Despite the disaster and distress in the present world crisis, we recognize our obligation to support those institutions which contribute to sane and spiritual civilization. One of our obligations to the church and our youth is that of Christian education. We endorse our own church schools, The Emmanuel College, Emmanuel Academy and Holmes Bible College.

We recommend that our pastors give such help as may be necessary to our prospective ministers in the preparation of the study pursuant to the conference course offered to obtain license for the ministry.

We request that our ministers give themselves to study, especially the Bible and good commentaries, and other good books that will help them in the preparation and delivery of sermons.

We recommend the Pentecostal Holiness Advocate, Youth's Leader and the North Carolina Conference Evangel for every member of the N. C. Conference. Also that the pastor or an appointed person seek to get these periodicals in every home that they can on the outside of our church.

We recommend the appointment of a Conference Committee on Temperance education, to serve as a permanent activity in the conference. This committee labor to prepare and select bulletins, and tracts, presenting facts relative to the use of tobacco and alcoholic beverages. These bulletins and tracts be used in the various activities of the church, to teach our youth facts about these evils, especially may they be used in connection with the Vacation Bible Schools.

We recommend that this Conference Committee on Temperance Education be composed of the following:

President of P. H. Y. S., Chairman; Representative of The Allied Church League for Abolition of Beverage Alcohol, and Conference Sunday School Evangelist.

(Supplementary Report of Committee on Education.)

We recommend that we have a six weeks study course in the N. C. Conference; the expense of first two weeks be paid by the conference, the remainder four weeks by the students, with this exception: Those ministers in other conferences who would like to take any part, or all the course, would be required to pay their own expenses. This would also apply to all laymen. The time and place of the course be worked out by the Official Board.

5. We recommend the following appropriations: Rev. A. H. Butler, be paid \$15.00 per month; Rev. C. B. Strickland, be paid \$10.00 per month; Mrs. Beadie Noble, be paid \$10.00 per month and Rev. H. E. Oxendine be paid \$5.00 per month.

6. That all promissory notes given for loans made from the superannuate fund shall be approved by the Official Board.

7. That loans made from the superannuate fund shall be paid back monthly or quarterly installments.

8. That interest be charged at the rate of six (6) per cent annum.
