Report of Conference Superintendent, W. E. Morris

Mr. Chairman, and Members of the Conference:

I praise God that my experience is up to date, and it is well with my soul today.

Vast and varied have been the circumstances under which I have labored in the conference this year, but I can say that I have earnestly sought God and endeavored to do what I felt was His will in all the work assigned to my hands.

I have preached 148 times, gotten out 405 pieces of mail, presided over 16 district conferences and 9 board meetings. I have visited all the churches and missions except 8; attended the General Conference. (And I was able to report that real progress had been made in the conference during the past quadrennium. One outstanding thing was a net gain of 476 members.) As director of the evan-

gelistic effort in the conference, with the cooperation of the central committee and others, I have been able to organize 4 new churches; Faison, Selma, Verona and Lamms Grove. Including those two came to through the newly organized churches I have received 51 members into the church. I have conducted or assisted in 4 revival meetings. 12 have testified to being saved, three sanctified and 1 received the Holy Ghost.

I served as Editor of the Conference Evangel and got out one tract in the interest of home mission work.

I have received a salary of \$2100 from the conference treasury; \$191.08 in personal gifts; three cents per mile for traveling expenses; have traveled 13,500 miles in the interest of the conference work. I have paid \$295.71 tithes.

MINUTES OF THE OFFICIAL BOARD MEETING 1944-45

Board met at Falcon immediately after conference adjourned, Sept. 4, 1944. By common consent the note of W. M. Hudnell was renewed. The following loans were made: \$25 to Bethany Church, \$150 to E. T. Gregory.

The conference having authorized the Board to confer with the S. C. Conference Board concerning establishing a boundary line between the two conferences, the two Boards met at the close of the S. C. Conference session in Lake City, S. C. The State line beginning from the east coast thence to Rowland, N. C. up highway No. 130 to Maxton, N. C., following the Seaboard Rail Road to Hamlet, N. C. was established as a boundary line. The Lake View Church transferred to the S. C. Conference and United Holiness transferred to the N. C. Conference. Later United Holiness requested a transfer to the S. C. Conference, which request was granted.

A loan of \$20 was made to Jas. R. Williams and a donation of \$25 to A. B. Howard to assist in moving.

At Kenly, N. C., Oct 11, 1944.

A donation of \$100 and a loan of \$400 was made to the Bailey Church for purchasing a building for worship.

Reverends T. T. Lindsey and R. O. Corvin were invited as guest ministers for the Falcon Camp Meeting. Rev. G. H. Montgomery was invited to conduct the Christian Workers Institute. Rev. C. B. Strickland and Miss Ethel Strickland were invited to conduct an English course during the Institute.

By motion the cost of printing of the P. H. Y. S. Minutes is to be paid from the conference treasury. A donation of \$100 was made to the P. H. Y. S. Board to help defray delegates fare to the General Conference. Miss Della Grace Stewart was transferred to the Upper S. C. Conference. On motion a donation of \$35 was made to the Mt. Olive Church to complete payment on a lot. A loan of \$50 and a donation of \$25 was made to O. D. Lambert.

A donation of \$100 was made to the Rocky Mount parsonage.

At Goldsboro Oct. 18 to investigate a conference parsonage site.

A donation of \$25 to W. R. Johnson. Rev. C. B. Strickland was re-elected custodian of the Falcon property.

At Goldsboro the last Monday in October and completed the purchase of a conference parsonage.

We borrowed \$100.00 from the conference treasury; \$750 from the Evangelistic Funds and \$750 from the Superannuate Funds for the down payment.

By motion the money from the Creekville Church building be given to the Millennium Church. Amount \$102.50.

By correspondence: Dec. 20th a loan of \$400 to Millennium Church. Donation of \$50 to Mrs. Lessie Polston for hospital expenses. Jan. 5th a loan of \$200 to A. B. Howard.

At Falcon Jan. 19 to complete arrangements for Christian Workers Institute and Camp Meeting. Mr. Berry absent.

At Falcon during Christian Workers Institute April 3.

A donation of \$75 from conference treasury and a loan of \$60 from superannuate funds were made to the Clayton Church for purchasing a lot. Donation of \$50 to Harkers Island parsonage and \$50 to Wilmington Church. The treasurer was authorized to take care of all expenses of Institute.

The Conference Superintendent reported to the Board that he was called by the pastor and local church at Wilmington to investigate certain rumors reflecting on the character of the pastor I. D. Dickens. The Supt. presided over the meeting of the Board of the church, and there being discrepancies in the testimonies given, the church board decided that it was best for Mr. Dickens to remain as pastor for the present.

At Falcon June 21. A loan of \$500 was made to the Raleigh Church from the superannuate funds.

The General Conference having adopted the rule that all money for general funds be sent through conference treasury, by motion O. T. Howard was elected to handle said funds until annual conference.

A loan of \$425 to the Beaufort Church, and \$40 to W. N. Bass. The Board requested the Evangelistic Committee to donate \$100 each to the Raleigh and Beaufort Churches from the evangelistic funds.

1. That our people subscribe for and read, the Pentecostal Holiness Advocate, the Youth's Leader, and any other sane and wholesome literature in harmony with the doctrine of the Pentecostal Holiness Church.

2. That we continue the publication of the North Carolina Conference Evangel, that it be enlarged to an eight-page monthly and the subscription price be raised to fifty cents per year.

3. That we endorse the teaching of the Bible in the public schools of our state.

4. That a Library be established in every church with the pastor assisting a committee in securing the most appropriate books and literature possible.

5. That we go on record as wholeheartedly supporting the general educational program.

6. That we set our goal at \$4.00 per member to help raise our part of the \$100,000 drive, this money to be paid through the Conference treasury during the month of September.

7. That one member from each district be appointed to work under the supervision of the Conference Superintendent to direct this big September drive, these members to be appointed by the Conference Superintendent.

That we have a Bible Institute with the Official Board assuming all obligations.

Report of the Committee on Finance

We, your Committee on Finance, submit the following:

We believe that the system of paying tithes and giving offerings is the one and only plan God has instituted in His world for His work. We call attention to the General Conference Finance Committee's report and the recommendation that all our members, ministers and laymen, pay tithes so that all phases of God's work may be adequately supported.

We further recommend:

1. That all lay members pay their tithes into the local church treasury; that the pastors encourage the election of officials who comply with the tithing system.

2. That ministers of the North Carolina Conference pay fifty (50%) per cent of all their tithes into the conference treasury, and the remaining fifty (50%) per cent into the church treasury where the minister holds membership or may serve as pastor.

3. That no minister shall be elected to any official position who does not comply with above system.

4. That all churches pay their pastors their regular salary for the Sabbath during the Annual Conference session.

5. That each local church establish a central treasury and that ten (10%) per cent of funds be sent to the North Carolina Conference Treasury and the Conference Treasury send ten (10%) per cent to the General Treasury.

6. That funds raised by each local church for the following causes: Foreign Missions, Orphanage, Education, General Evangelism and General Fund, be sent to the Conference Treasury to be forwarded monthly to the General Treasury.

7. That the Conference Superintendent be paid \$2,100 as annual

salary, to be paid monthly, and \$400 annually for traveling expenses. All offerings received by the Conference Superintendent in his work in this conference shall be credited to his salary.

8. That the following appropriations be made:

Fifteen (15%) per cent of the conference receipts be placed in the Evangelistic Fund.

Twenty (20%) per cent of conference receipts be placed in the Superannuate Fund.

Report of Committee on Temperance and Public Morals

We, your Committee on Temperance and Public Morals, submit the following report:

Your Committee desires to call out people to an enrichment of spiritual living by patterning our lives after the instructions of God's Word and adhering to the truth promulgated by our Church.

Teaching and training agencies of our church are called upon to instruct our children and young people in proper health standards, the evils of intemperance, the abstinence from the use of alcoholic beverages, tobacco in all forms, and other habit-forming indulgencies.

The crime bill in our nation in money is figured in terms of billions of dollars, but no estimate is adequate to cover the moral and spiritual price the nation pays. We deplore the enormous increase in criminal activities, responsibility for which rests largely upon indifferent citizenship and lax administration of and enforcement of the law.

Gambling breeds crime and is a menace to business integrity. The nation must rise in spiritual might in order to end this rapidly growing evil.

We register once again our opposition to the use of and the traffic in habit-forming drugs. Concerned over the increase in the use of cigarettes, especially among our youth, we urge them to repudiate the habit, and we protest against the misleading and suggestive advertisements for the promotion of this habit.

Papers, magazines, and books which offend common decency are on the increase. Sex immorality, low moral standards, and crime make literature of this type and ever-threatening menace to our homes.

We challenge our people to have no part and interest in the infamous liquor traffic. Repeal of National Prohibition has proven a more ghastly failure than its enemies predicted. There is more evil accompanying the modern saloon than the old saloon with all its debauchery. This disaster falls most heavily upon youth.

We commend the Allied Church League for the Abolition of Beverage Alcohol for its educational program and its agitation on this vitally important matter, in an effort to create a conscience in North Carolina that will no longer tolerate the iniquitous liquor traffic.

An obligation of the State and Nation is to protect its citizens. It seems inconsistent that any government, through participation in revenues, should be a party to any business which has its growth by thriving upon spiritual, moral, physical and social decay of its people. An era of unprecedented debauchery faces us unless Christian forces of the Nation alert themselves and rally in a united warfare against the liquor traffic in all forms.

Our Church has insisted that legalizing the liquor traffic cannot be condoned, for engaging in and supporting the liquor business is sinful. Wine has been declared to be a mocker throughout the centuries, destructive and blighting in effects. Let us call our people to a co-operative effort with other temperance agencies. The Woman's Christian Temperance Union, the World League against Alcoholism, The American Business Men's Research Foundation, and similar organizations.

As our young men return from participation in a global war, we urge our churches to an active interest in them, and call for every assistance to help these men rehabilitate themselves. Especially in the foundation of a Christian home, we call upon our pastors to encourage family worship.

In our public worship let us give greater respect for the Sanctuary of God, the public reading of the Holy Scriptures and proper decorum on the part of the congregation. We would therefore direct the attention of ministers and deacons to this important matter.

We urge our ministers to give the Lord's Day the place it deserves in the educational and preaching program of the church, to promote a revival of Sabbath observance as a necessity of our human natures for worship and rest and make effective a united protest against all efforts to make the Lord's day a holiday instead of a holy day and thus destroy this primary institution.

Report of Committee on Superannuate Fund

The Committee on Superannuate Funds makes the following recommendations:

1. All beneficiaries of the superannuate funds must pay one-half of all their tithes into the conference treasury.
2. Ministers who have served ten years or more shall receive a maximum of \$25 per month when superannuated.
3. That the following benefits shall be paid monthly for the ensuing year:

Rev. S. C. Hodges \$12.50, Rev. H. E. Oxendine \$15.00, Mrs. Beadie Noble \$12.50, Rev. C. B. Strickland \$20.00, Rev. M. H. Alexander \$12.50, Rev. A. H. Butler \$15.00.

4. If at any time an emergency shall arise with the respect to the

above paragraphs (viz 2 and 3) consideration can be made by the Conference Official Board.

5. That any minister who has complied with paragraph one, in case of death, \$100 be paid in his or her burial expenses; this also applies to wife or husband.

6. That all promissory notes given for loans made by the superannuate funds be endorsed by a member of the P. H. Church or Annual Conference, and loans of \$100 or more be endorsed by two members of the P. H. Church or Annual Conference.

7. That loans made from the superannuate funds be paid back monthly, quarterly, or annually.

8. That interest be charged at the rate of 6% per annum.

9. That any note paid within thirty days after loan is made shall bear no interest. However a service charge of 1% shall be made.

Report of Committee on Missions

In view of this and of the immediate need of the field and the crises that now face our Church, we your Committee on Missions earnestly recommend:

1. That one missionary service continue to be held at each Annual Conference.

2. That at least one sermon on missions be preached in each of the district conferences during the year.

3. That all members of the conference pledge themselves to pray more earnestly and give more sacrificially that the needs of the missionaries on the fields may be supplied, and that more laborers may be sent to the fields white already to harvest.

4. The General Conference has asked for \$4.00 per member per annum for missions, and if each church raised one cent per day per member, this with the contributions of friends outside our church would amply reach this quota, judging from the past records.

5. That each evangelist preach at least one sermon on missions during each quarter, and take an offering during each evangelistic meeting.

6. That each pastor preach at least one sermon on missions during each quarter, bringing before the people the needs of the fields, both at home and abroad.

7. That each pastor take an active part in the missionary society of his church, and if one is not in existence, see that one is organized, urging each of his members and others to join.

8. That each society arrange such programs each month as are calculated to inspire the members to zealous activity in the interest of missions.

9. That the deacons and pastor cooperate with the president of the missionary society in having the regular programs and allowing nothing to hinder the offerings.

Report of Committee on Conference Evangelism

We, your Committee on Conference Evangelism and Church Extension, submit the following:

1. That the North Carolina Conference be divided into two zones, designated as Zone No. 1 and Zone No. 2. Zone No. 1 to consist of the Fayetteville and Goldsboro Districts. Zone No. 2 to consist of the New Zern and Tarboro Districts.

2. That we have a conference evangelistic committee composed of three men, who will have the general oversight and management of the conference evangelistic program, such committee to be selected as follows:

(a) The chairman of this committee be elected on the conference floor, and said chairman also serve as treasurer of evangelistic funds.

(b) The conference Stationing Committee appoint a Director of Evangelism for each zone, who will devote his full time to the evangelistic effort within the zone.

3. That the appointed zone directors serve on the basis of \$150 per month average minimum salary, plus actual traveling expenses; their income to be equalized on a quarterly basis and supplemented from the evangelistic treasury, to make up the minimum salary whenever necessary. It will be necessary that the evangelistic committee submit to the Conference Board, each quarter, an itemized statement showing all receipts and expenditures.

4. That the Evangelistic Committee devise means for the evangelization of each zone; such as, securing and placing parties and providing such equipment as is needed in so far as is possible.

5. That all evangelistic funds be forwarded to the Conference Evangelistic Committee treasury.

Report of Committee on Orphanage

The Committee on Orphanage work from last year's Conference thought it well to quote from the Committee's report of the previous year, in order to re-emphasize the joint agreement between the Falcon Orphanage Board and the General Board of the P. H. Church, in making the transfer of the Falcon Orphanage plant and management to the Church. We, the Committee, reporting at this conference session perhaps for similar reasons, wish to refer to last year's report, in order to emphasize and more deeply impress upon the minds of all our churches composing the conference, and all the individual members constituting the churches, the great importance of every local church and their members uniting together in one great effort to enlarge our orphanage work and to improve its services both in quality and efficiency.

The quotation from last year's report is: "We, the North Carolina Conference, do accept the challenge of Bro. Culbreth to improve, enlarge and perpetuate this orphanage." If such references from year to year to previous reports are necessary in order to keep the challenge before us as a sacred pledge, all our future reports should be thus linked together, lest we should forget our solemn obligations. There

was not only a challenge involved in the transfer, but our obligation in accepting the proposal of transfer to the Church, became the consideration in exchange for the valuable gift of this plant. There was no financial obligations assumed, on the part of the Church for outstanding debts, or any promises required to pay any amount of the value of the property; but only to perpetuate, expand and enlarge the orphanage work according to the principles previously governing the orphanage management and the articles of incorporation contained in the Certificate of incorporation.

Our conference report of last year pledged its co-operation and support in any plan which might be advised to provide funds to establish a modern orphanage plant with adequate facilities, including educational requirements through grades to graduation from High School, and we should reiterate our pledge from year to year until it is accomplished.

Every church in our conference and every individual member should immediately inaugurate some financial plan most suitable and effective in their locality to secure funds for improving and operating our orphanage work to its utmost capacity, and constant enlargement. Plans to finance the work could be inaugurated by the church under leadership of its pastor, by the Sunday School under direction of the Superintendent of the school; by the P. H. Y. S., or through some other Orphanage Society organized in the church for the purpose of raising funds for the orphanage work. There should be monthly meetings held to inspire interest in the work and to promote the most liberal contributions to the same, and if properly managed, every agency of support could get literal and cheerful co-operation from friends outside their organizations, for which their organized effort would get credit and greatly increase their donations to orphanage.

Report of Committee on Sunday School and P. H. Y. S.

There are thirty-six million young people in America with no religious instruction.

Catholics provide 200 hours of religious instruction per year for their children and the Jews provide 325 hours for theirs, while protestants provide only an average of 17 hours for theirs.

The Bible in the public school, the teaching pastor and the teaching parent and the family altar are almost a matter of history.

Since the repeal of the eighteenth amendment, juvenile delinquency has increased by leaps and bounds.

The liquor and tobacco traffic, with all other agencies of the devil, are making a determined effort to capture the youth of our land. The powers of darkness seem to have set themselves to defy the church of the living God.

All these things constitute a mighty challenge to our Sunday schools and Pentecostal Holiness Youth's Societies.

Therefore we recommend:

1. That in harmony with the recommendations of the Sunday

School Committee at the last General Conference, found on page 36, paragraph 3 of the minutes of said conference, there be elected at this annual conference a President, Vice-President, and Secretary-Treasurer, who shall be the head officials of, and direct all the activities of the Sunday School Association of the North Carolina Conference of the Pentecostal Holiness Church.

2. That the officials of the Sunday Schools and P. H. Y. S. inform themselves of the recommendations made at the last General Conference, in order that, insofar as possible or practical, the same may be put into operation in their respective organizations in the North Carolina Conference.

3. That, insofar as possible or practical the presidents of the Sunday School Association and P. H. Y. S. devote their whole time to the interests of their respective institutions.

4. That all pastors have a monthly meeting of the officials of the Sunday School and P. H. Y. S. to counsel together, in order to determine what are the best ways, means and methods of prompting the work assigned to their hands.

5. That our ministers preach occasionally on the Teaching Ministry of the Church, Sunday School and P. H. Y. S.

6. That the instructors in our Sunday Schools and P. H. Y. S do personal work, among and strive to lead their unsaved pupils to Christ, and into the deeper experiences of grace.

7. That we make use of all the modern means, methods and ways at our command to teach the Word of God.

8. Latest statistics reveal that the age of thirteen is the pinnacle of the conversion curve, and that the chances are three to one against a person getting saved after twenty-one. Therefore, let us bring the children into the fold while young.

9. We must provide teacher training and vacation Bible teaching for all who need them in connection with our work.

10. We beg our general officials to take steps to provide curriculum for the Sunday School which will give us the whole Bible with lessons arranged bearing directly on the great doctrine of the same.

11. In all our efforts there must be supreme emphasis on deep spirituality, without which, all of our activities will be in vain.

5. That the American Bible Society be recognized as a connectional missionary interest to encourage wider reading of the Holy Scriptures, their translation, publication and distribution in the United States and abroad.

6. That all reports, resolutions and recommendations to local churches and adopted by the North Carolina Conference, for publication in the Minutes of this session, be read to and discussed at the local church meetings to give information to our people as to the request and recommendations they are expected to follow in the new conference year. And we further recommend that all church members in the North Carolina Conference attend regularly and support with their means the church where they hold their membership, when at all possible.

7. Seeing the need of Christian training and reading of good wholesome literature, we request and urge that each home represented in the North Carolina Conference be a subscriber to the Pentecostal Holiness Advocate, Youth's Leader, Conference Evangel, and such literature that will elevate the moral standard and deepen the spirituality.

8. We recommend that the coming Conference Board consider the advisability of erecting a Conference building adequate to take care of the ministers and delegates of the North Carolina Conference thereby eliminating the necessity of occupying room that is necessary for the care of our Orphanage children.

9. Seeing the natural drift toward worldliness, be it resolved that we hold to the doctrines of Holiness and Pentecost and strive to conform to its principles outwardly as well as inwardly.

Report of W. B. Godwin, Conference year 1945

During the year I was sick for quite awhile, not able to work at all, but God had mercy, answered prayer and raised me up.

I visited all the churches except three or four.

I preached or lectured 87 times.

I directed eleven Sunday School Conferences, 44 of our Sunday schools were represented with splendid and inspiring programs.

A good number of the other schools were represented either by a delegate or a written report.

Between 30 and 40 of our ministers participated in these conferences.

The attendance was good and in some instances large.

Order and attention were splendid.

Probably 150 Sunday school officers and teachers attended these conferences.

They were all given an opportunity to say something about their school or classwork.

Many of these talks were instructive and inspiring.

Offerings amounting to several hundred dollars all told, was received for different phases of God's work, mostly for our missionary and orphanage work.

Most of these conferences were richly blessed of God's glorious presence, and in some instances the saints were moved to shout and praise God.

Two Missionary Baptist Sunday schools rendered musical programs at these conferences, one of which was the local Baptist Sunday school here in Falcon.

For some time I tried to get someone to hold Teacher Training Classes, finally I secured the services of Sister Ethel Strickland, and all reports indicate that her lectures on The Science and Art of Teaching have been very helpful, instructive and inspiring to those who attended the classes.

I visited and prayed with the sick a good many times.

I distributed hundreds of pieces of literature dealing with the subject of temperance, prohibition, and public morals.

Correspondence with all the Sunday schools is a necessary part of my job.

I received six hundred and fifty dollars.

Put sixty-four dollars into conference treasury.

Other gifts amounted to eighty-seven dollars and forty-two cents.

Many of my friends visited me while I was sick, and the people have shown me a great many kindnesses throughout the conference year, for which I do thank every one.

I also thank and praise God for the multitude of tender mercies and loving kindnesses He has bestowed upon me.

BY-LAWS PASSED BY THE N. C. CONFERENCE

1936—"All ministers shall keep a record of their work, number of sermons preached and finances."

"The names of all deceased ministers be placed in the minutes."

1937—"All ministers shall use blanks prepared for making reports."

1941—"All candidates for the ministry shall be a member of the local church six months before the convening of the Annual Conference."

"Each church voting for pastor shall vote by ballot and result of said ballot be forwarded to the Conference Superintendent seven days before conference convenes."

1943—"The secretary is to prepare a Ministerial Financial Record to determine who is eligible for support from the superannuate fund, said report to be printed in the minutes."

1945—"All lay members pay their tithes into the local church treasury; that the pastor encourage the election of officials, who comply with the tithing system."

"All ministers pay one-half of all their tithes into the conference treasury; the remaining one-half into the church treasury where they hold membership, or may serve as pastor."

"No minister shall be elected to official position who does not comply with the above system."

"That all churches pay their pastors their regular salary for the Sabbath during annual conference session."

"Ten per cent of the Sunday school offerings is to be sent to the Treasurer of the Sunday School Association, Miss Daisy Jones."

Report of the Committee on Resolutions

The Committee on Resolutions submits the following report:

1. We recommend that each local society use the official report blanks of the P. H. Y. S. in submitting reports to the Annual P. H. Y. S. Convention.

2. In reference to matters of public morals we urge our youth to exert every influence against the evils of alcoholic beverages and their use, against the motion pictures and their corruptive forces and against immodesty in dress.

3. In all our worship services, we request attention to reverence, in attitude and in practice, and urge our youth and adults to set examples of respect for the house of God.

4. We recommend the election of the P. H. Y. S. Reporter to "The Conference Evangel" be left to the P. H. Y. S. Convention.

5. The North Carolina P. H. Y. S. Convention requests the North Carolina Conference of the Pentecostal Holiness Church to provide for the publication of the minutes of this convention in the minutes of the annual session of 1945 and the sharing of the expense of publication to be adjusted by the Annual Conference Board and the P. H. Y. S. Board.

6. To our Institute speaker and Training Leaders, we record here our official acknowledgement of their valuable contribution to this program.

7. We recommend that our district P. H. Y. S. Convention be held on Sunday in connection with the second round of district conferences in the form of a rally.

8. That the P. H. Y. S. Convention of North Carolina be held separate from the ministerial conference and Conference Camp Meeting, and that a five day Training School be conducted in connection with the convention—following the same procedure of this year.
