I was in attendance at the Annual Woman's Auxiliary Convention, presided over the Annual Youth Convention, and managed the Falcon Camp Meeting so far. Report of Committee on Finance

We, your Committee on Finance, submit the following:

We believe that paying tithes and giving free-will offerings is the one and only God has instructed in His Word for His work. We call attention to the General Conference Finance Committee's report and recommendation that all our members, ministers and laymen, pay tithes so that all phases of God's work can be adequately supported.

We further recommend

1. That all members pay their tithes into the local church treasury and that the pastors encourage the election of officials who comply with the tithing system.

2. The ministers of the North Carolina Conference pay fifty per cent (50%) of their ministerial and secular tithes into the conference treasury, the remaining fifty per cent (50%) into the church treasury where the minister holds membership or may serve. This does not apply to superannuated ministers.

3. That no minister be elected to an official position or pastor a church who does not comply with the above system, or who does not satisfactorily meet his financial obligations.

4. That the churches pay their pastor his regular salary for the Sabbath during the annual conference session.

5. That in case of changing pastors, the local church shall defray the moving expense of the incoming pastor.

6. It is to be appreciated the way the majority of our churches have supported their pastors this year, but in view of the fact that some churches are not providing a sufficient salary, we recommend that the conference superintendent shall visit said churches and meet with the local boards and work out a financial plan that will give the pastor a better salary.

7. That each local church establish a treasury and ten per cent (10%) of funds be sent to the North Carolina Conference Treasury and the Conference Treasurer send ten per cent (10%) to the general treasurer.

8. That the funds raised by the local church for the following purposes: Foreign missions, Orphanage, Education, General Evangelism and General Fund be sent to the conference treasurer to be forwarded monthly to the general treasurer, pro-rated according to the general conference regulation, except special "ear-marked" offerings which are not to be prorated.

9. We recommend that the conference superintendent be paid seventy-five (\$75.00) dollars per week as annual salary to be paid monthly, and five (5) cents per mile for traveling expenses. All offerings received by the superintendent for his work in the conference shall be credited to his salary, and that he be allowed three hundred (\$300.00) dollars per year for secretarial help.

10. That the following appropriations be made:

(a) Fifteen (15%) percent of conference receipts be placed in the evangelistic fund. Twenty-five (25%) percent of conference receipts be placed in the superannuate fund.

Ministers' wives shall pay (5) dollars if they attend the entire camp meeting and conference. Attending conference only they shall pay two (2) dollars and fifty (50) cents. That delegate's entertainment fee be four (4) dollars for the conference session.

4. That we continue the set of rules devised for the governing of regulation in the dormitories, and that adequate measures be taken in the future for their enforcement.

5. That the conference elect a committee of three to work in cooperation with the conference board in planning for the musical program of the 1952 camp meeting.

6. That our pastors and church boards consider our local as well as our general evangelists in planning their evangelistic programs.

7. That each church give its pastor a one week vacation with pay, including one Sunday.

8. That the conference board arrange for a Christian Worker's Institute in 1952 in harmony with the expressed wishes of the conference.

9. That the superannuated ministers receive the Conference Evangel and meals at the restaurant without charge.

10. That the provision in the By-Laws for the conference board to serve as Nominating Committee for all committees to serve at the annual conference be stricken, and that in its place be inserted the following: "That the North Carolina Conference delegate to the several districts the right to nominate one man in each district at the last round of district conferences to serve with the superintendent on the Stationing Committee, and that a separate Nominating Committee be elected at each annual conference to nominate all other committees for the following annual conference." (See footnote to this paragraph.)

11. That the work of the Stationing Committee be conducted in short sessions over a number of days, giving the committee ample time to deliberate without becoming too fatigued through long sessions, and designating certain sessions as the time for certain groups of delegates or ministers to come for interviews, providing that no pastoral moves be made without adequate consultation with parties concerned; so removing at least a large amount of the secrecy which has heretofore surrounded the work of this committee, and making for what we believe will be a more satisfactory system of labor division. (See footnote to this.)

12. That the conference board arrange for a lecture on Sunday School lesson to be delivered on each of the two Sundays of the Falcon Camp Meeting; this lecture to precede the eleven o'clock service.

Report of Committee on Sunday School and P. H. Y. S.

We, your Committee on Sunday School and P. H. Y. S. submit the following:

1. We urge that all Sunday Schools pay the tithes of their Sunday School offerings into the Sunday School Association treasury so that it can be able to carry on a greater work.

2. The work of the Sunday School Association shall be carried on under the supervision of the president of the association.

3. It shall be the duty of the district directors to promote the Sunday School work in their respective districts as authorized by the president.

SUPERANNUATE FUND CONSTITUTION

Article 1

a. The Superannuate Fund shall be continued by the North Carolina Conference of the Pentecostal Holiness Church.

b. The fund shall be the benefit for: (a). Ministers and their wives.
(b). Widows and widower of minister.

Article II

Participation

A. Retirement: A minister having become disabled to do the work of a minister shall be eligible for retirement benefits. The rate of benefits shall be determined by: (a) His number of years of service, and (b) his support of conference financial program.

1. Having become disabled, after having served a minimum of ten years, he shall receive one dollar per month per service year; however, no one shall receive more than fifty dollars per month.

2. The official board shall have the authority to give assistance to widows of deceased ministers where a real need is evident.

B. Sickness: In cases of illness or accident which impairs earning ability of a minister, the authority administering this fund shall be authorized to give assistance from the fund as they deem necessary.

C. Death Benefit: Upon the death of any member of the N. C. Conference who has complied with this system, \$100.00 shall be paid on burial expenses. This rule shall apply to the minister's wife, widow or widower.

D. Requirements: Persons receiving benefit from this fund shall have paid one-half of all his tithes (both secular and ministerial) into the conference treasury over a period of a minimum of ten years. This shall not be retroactive.

E. No one shall have recourse to civil law for the collection of any benefit herein set forth.

F. In case the fund becomes insufficient to meet the appropriation, the authority shall have the right to reduce the pro-rata part of each beneficiary, and the conference shall not be obligated to make up the deficit.

Article III

Perpetuation

A. The fund shall be supported from the conference treasury by the payment of twenty-five (25) per cent of tithes from ministers and churches.

B. Gifts, bequests and endowments by churches, organizations or individuals.

C. Interest collected on loans made from the fund.

D. Father's Day of each year be observed as Superannuate Day, at which time an offering be taken for this fund.

Article IV

Administration

A. The fund shall be administered by the N. C. Conference Board.

B. A Committee on Superannuation shall function at each annual conference. However, no name shall be submitted for superannuation without first consulting the Stationing Committee and Treasurer.

C. This fund shall be handled by the Conference Treasurer.

D. A minimum of \$2000.00 cash reserve shall be maintained at all times.

E. No conference superannuate committee shall appropriate more than 70% of current receipts.

Article V

Loans

A. Churches and ministers shall be granted loans when funds are available by furnishing proper security.

B. Interest: Interest shall be pro-rated at the rate of 6% per annum.

C. Payments: Repayments shall be arranged on monthly, quarterly, semi-annually, or annual terms. The borrower shall choose the schedule which he feels he can meet. The conference treasurer shall duly notify borrower when payments are delinquent. The official board shall take the necessary steps to collect notes in default.

D. No note shall be extended longer than three years.

Article VI

Amendments

Amendments to this Constitution shall be made only after being recommended by the Superannuate Committee or a number of persons equal to the committee at a session of the annual conference. Amendments shall require a two-thirds' majority vote for adoption.

BY-LAWS PASSED BY N. C. CONFERENCE

1936—"All ministers shall keep a record of their work, number of sermons preached and finances."

"The names of all deceased ministers be placed in the minutes."

1937—"All ministers shall use blanks prepared for making reports."

1941—"All candidates for the ministry shall be a member of the local church six months before the convening of the annual conference."

"Each church voting for pastor shall vote by ballot; result of said ballot to be forwarded to conference superintendent seven days before conference convenes."

1943—"The secretary shall prepare a Ministerial Financial Record to determine who is eligible for support from superannuate fund."

1945-51—"All lay members pay their tithes into the church treasury; that the pastors encourage election to the official board of those who comply with the tithing system."

"All ministers pay one-half of all their tithes, both ministerial and secular, into the conference treasury; the remaining one-half into the church where they hold membership or may serve. This does not apply to superannuated ministers."

"That no minister be elected to an official position or pastor a church who does not comply with the above system, or who does not satisfactorily meet his other financial obligations." See Finance Committee's report 1951.

"That all churches pay their pastors their salary for the Sabbath during the annual conference session."

1947—"The Committee on Division of Labor gives due consideration where practicable to churches and ministers involved in radical changes contrary to the expressed wishes of the churches."

1948—"All candidates for membership in the North Carolina Conference shall satisfy the board of examiners that they have met the requirements of the Discipline for license and ordination."

1949—"That no church lot or church building be purchased by any preacher or congregation until it has been approved by the conference board."

"That the conference superintendent be given a two (2) weeks vacation during the year with pay. He shall also be allowed to conduct one revival meeting outside the conference boundary if he so desires, and any pay for such services shall not apply to his salary."

"That all evangelistic campaigns or prayer meetings conducted by our Pentecostal Holiness people within a radius of one mile of the Pentecostal Holiness Church be under the direction of the pastor or the church board if at all possible."

"That the conference continue the code of regulations adopted by the board of examiners."

"That members of the conference board when traveling in the interest of the conference work, be paid the same rate per mile as the superintendent."

"That the moving pastor refrain from making frequent visits to his old pastorate to the extent that he may cause confusion and lack of cooperation of the church with the new pastor. Any minister

who infringes on the rights of any pastor shall be referred to the official board."

1951—"That the Falcon Camp Meeting embrace the second and third Sundays in August, and that the annual conference begin on Monday at 2:00 p. m., following the last Sunday of camp meeting.

"That the N. C. Conference delegate to the several districts the right to nominate one man in each district at the last round of district conferences to serve with the superintendent on the Stationing Committee, and that a separate nominating committee be elected at each annual conference to nominate all other committees for the following annual conference."

"That the work of the Stationing Committee be conducted in short sessions over a number of days, giving the committee ample time to deliberate without becoming too fatigued through long sessions, and designating certain sessions as the time certain groups of delegates or ministers may come for interviews, and providing that no pastoral moves be made without adequate consultation with parties concerned, thereby removing at least a large amount of the secrecy which has heretofore surrounded the work of this committee, and making for what we believe a more satisfactory system of labor division."
