REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON MEMOIRS

Your Committee on Memoirs submits this memorial tribute to the Rev. T. H. Rousseau and the Rev. Mrs. Victoria Moore.

The Rev. T. H. Rousseau

Brother Rousseau, an humble, gentle, studious Christian servant, became a member of the North Carolina Conference of the Pentecostal Holiness Church while he was a young man. He had been saved, sanctified, and baptized with the Holy Ghost, and called to preach the Gospel. During his early ministry he attended the Falcon Holiness School and was called of God to become a missionary to China. He was married to Miss Eva Brown, also called to China as a missionary.

Appearing before the General Board of Administration of the Pentecostal Holiness Church for an examination, both Brother and Sister Rousseau were accepted and went to China among the very first of the missionaries sent to Asia under the auspices of our church. Their ministry in Hong Kong, in South China, and other areas of the Orient extended over 25 years.

Brother Rousseau, a member of the Missionary Conference, led and succeeded in establishing a missionary home, organizing several churches, and a school while superintending the work in the China field. He literally gave his very life for the cause of Christ in China, where he died. His ashes rest in his native land of America, having been prepared for burial in China.

Loyal to his church, faithful to God, beloved and appreciated by the missionaries and the Chinese Christians, Brother Rousseau truly fought a good fight and finished his course.

We, of the North Carolina Conference, humbly submit to the will of God in his departure from this earthly scene, and we fervently pray that the vacancy in our missionary field in South China, caused by his passing, may be filled by those who are capable of taking up the work which he laid down and may carry on faithfully until Jesus comes.

The Rev. Mrs. Victoria Moore

Inasmuch as it has pleased Almighty God to call from this earthly scene a fellow minister of this conference, the Rev. Mrs. Victoria Moore, we reverently submit to and become resigned to His will. We are taught in God's Word that it is appointed unto man to die, therefore, every one must experience death.

The Rev. Mrs. Moore gave her heart to God and was saved when just a young girl in the early part of the year 1911 and was sanctified during the latter part of the same year. In 1913, she heard of Pentecost. She attended a camp meeting that year and received the Baptism of the Holy Ghost.

Called to the Christian ministry as a preacher, she was licensed by the North Carolina Conference. In 1928, she was ordained and from that time began to labor in evangelistic work as long as she was physically able. She was a good Gospel preacher. Many were blessed as a result of her ministry. Some were saved, some sanctified, and some were Baptized with the Holy Ghost in the meetings she conducted. Those who attended her services loved and appreciated her

ministry. May God bless her loved ones and enable them by His Grace to meet her in Heaven.



REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

We, your Committee on Finance, submit the following:

We believe that paying tithes and giving free-will offerings is the one and only plan God has instructed in His Word for the support of His work, and we recommend that all our members, both ministers and laymen, employ this plan, as set forth in the Bible and the Pentecostal Holiness Discipline, and in harmony with the recommendations set forth in this report.

We further recommend:

1. That all lay members pay their tithes into the treasury of their local church, and that our pastors encourage the election of officials who comply with this tithing system.

2. That all ministers of the North Carolina Conference pay seventy-five per cent (75%) of their tithes from both ministerial and other income into the conference treasury, the remaining twenty-five per cent (25%) into the treasury of the church of which he is a member, or where he may serve as pastor. This requirement will not apply to superannuated ministers.

3. That no minister shall be elected to an official position or be permitted to pastor a church who does not comply with the above system, or who otherwise fails to meet his financial obligations.

4. That each church pay its pastor his regular salary for the Sabbath during the Annual Conference session.

5. That in cases of pastoral changes, the local church shall defray the moving expenses of the incoming pastor.

6. The loyalty of our fine church people in the matter of supporting their pastors is highly appreciated, but in view of the fact some of our pastors are not being adequately supported, we recommend that the

conference superintendent visit these churches and confer with the local boards with a view to arranging for better pastoral support.

7. That each local church send ten per cent (10%) of funds from its treasury to the treasury of the North Carolina Conference, and that the Conference Treasurer send ten per cent (10%) to the General Treasury.

8. That the funds raised by the local church for the following purposes: Foreign Missions, Orphanage, Education, General Evangelism and General Fund be sent to the Conference Treasurer to be forwarded monthly to the General Treasurer, pro-rated according to the General Conference regulation, except special "ear-marked" offerings, which are not to be pro-rated.

9. We recommend that the Conference Superintendent be paid eighty-five dollars (\$85.00) per week for the ensuing year, and five cents (5c) per mile for traveling expenses, and that all offerings received by the superintendent for his work in the conference shall be credited to his salary.

10. That the following appropriations be made:

(a) Fifteen per cent (15%) of the conference receipts be placed in the evangelistic fund, and that twenty-five per cent (25%) of conference receipts be placed in the superannuate funds.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS

We, your Committee on Resolutions, submit the following:

1. That full time pastors and evangelists shall have the privilege of deducting house rent from the amount received when they have no parsonage in which to live.

2. That traveling expenses of ministers traveling in private car be estimated at five cents per mile when traveling in the interest of his or her church work.

3. That steps be taken as soon as feasible to sell or exchange the present conference parsonage and purchase or erect such building as may be determined by the conference board to meet the requirements of the conference superintendent's living quarters, office space and location.

4. That the Falcon Camp Meeting embrace the third and fourth Sundays in August, 1953, beginning August 13th through the 23rd and that the annual conference begin on Friday, August 21st, at 2:00 p. m.

5. That the conference board take all necessary steps to provide guest rooms with sanitary facilities before next conference.

6. In as much as the North Carolina Conference of the Pentecostal Holiness Church does not have a charter and the church is not chartered in North Carolina, and in legal transactions, the need of this has become evident in order to comply with the discipline in its present status; we do hereby recommend that the conference authorize the official board to take all necessary steps in effecting the charter for the conference as some of the other conferences have done and thereby have the full recognition of the state of North Carolina for both conference and church.

Be it understood that this will in no way change or affect the conference status with the church as a whole or the discipline as it now stands.

7. That the conference board have charge of entertainment and management of the camp meeting and conference, including the operation of the restaurant.

8. That the Board of Examiners shall not consider the application of any person for admission to this conference for license or transfer from another denomination unless such person is sponsored by three Pentecostal Holiness ministers who vouch for his or her character.

9. That the delegates from the North Carolina Conference to the General Conference of 1953 be required to carry a resolution, and give their strongest support to the same resolution, which shall move the General Conference to rescind appendix "B" on page 73 of the Discipline of the Pentecostal Holiness Church; and that appendix "B" shall read:

The words "assuming the personal responsibility" in rule 4 under General Rules on page 46 shall be interpreted to mean the consent of any man or woman who is free to make his or her own decisions, or the consent of any wife or child who is not compelled by the husband or parent to associate with the tobacco industry.

 6. That in purchasing publications and educational supplies, our Pentecostal Holiness Publishing House be given patronage. We recommend the Pentecostal Holiness Advocate, Youth's Leader, and, for the ministers, The Pentecostal Pulpit.
 7. We endorse the general educational program of our church and pledge our whole-hearted support.
 8. That our families provide wholesome religious literature for the home, on the age level suitable for their individual families.
 9. That each church endeavor to conduct a Daily Vacation Bible School.
 10. That the conference sponsor a Minister's training school in 1953. The plans and details to be worked out by the conference board.

BY-LAWS PASSED BY N. C. CONFERENCE

1936—"All ministers shall keep a record of their work, number of sermons preached and finances."

"The names of all deceased ministers be placed in the minutes."

1937—"All ministers shall use blanks prepared for making reports."

1941—"All candidates for the ministry shall be a member of the local church six months before the convening of the annual conference."

"Each church voting for pastor shall vote by ballot; result of said ballot be forwarded to conference superintendent seven days before conference convenes."

1943—"The secretary shall prepare a Ministerial Financial Record to determine who is eligible for support from the superannuate fund."

1945-52—"All lay members shall pay their tithes into the church treasury; that the pastors encourage election to the official board of those who comply with the tithing system."

"All ministers pay seventy-five (75) per cent of all their tithes, both ministerial and secular, into the conference treasury; the remaining twenty-five (25) per cent into the church where they hold membership or may serve. This does not apply to superannuated ministers."

"That no minister shall be elected to an official position or be permitted to pastor a church who does not comply with the above financial system, or otherwise fails to meet his financial obligations." See Finance Committee's report 1952.

"That all churches pay their pastors their salary for the Sabbath during the annual conference session."

1947—"The Committee on Division of Labor give due consideration where practicable to churches and ministers involved in radical changes contrary to the expressed wishes of the churches."

1948-52—"All candidates for membership in the North Carolina Conference shall satisfy the Board of Examiners that they have met the requirements of the discipline for license and ordination."

"The Board of Examiners shall not consider the application of any person for admission to this conference for license or transfer from another denomination unless such person is sponsored by three Pente-

costal Holiness ministers who vouch for his or her character." See Resolution Committee's report 1952.

1949—"That no church lot or church building be purchased by any preacher or congregation until it has been approved by the conference board."

"That the conference superintendent be given a two (2) weeks vacation during the year with pay. He shall be allowed to conduct one revival meeting outside the conference boundary if he so desires, and any pay for such services shall not apply to his salary."

"That all evangelistic campaigns or prayer meetings conducted by our Pentecostal Holiness people within a radius of one mile of the Pentecostal Holiness Church be under the direction of the pastor or the church board if at all possible."

"That the conference continue the code of regulations adopted by the Board of Examiners."

"That members of the conference board when traveling in the interest of the conference work, be paid the rate per mile as the superintendent."

"That the moving pastor refrain from making frequent visits to his old pastorate to the extent that he may cause confusion and lack of cooperation of the church with the new pastor. Any minister who infringes on the rights of any pastor shall be referred to the official board."

1951—"That the N. C. Conference delegate to the several districts the right to nominate one man in each district at the last round of district conferences to serve with the superintendent on the stationing committee."

"That the work of the stationing committee be conducted in short sessions over a number of days, giving the committee ample time to deliberate without becoming too fatigued through long sessions, and designating certain sessions as the time certain groups of delegates or ministers may come for interviews, and providing that no pastoral moves be made without adequate consultation with parties concerned, thereby removing at least a large amount of the secrecy which has heretofore surrounded the work of the committee, and making for what we believe a more satisfactory system of labor division." See Resolution 1951.

"That the conference board arrange for a lecture on the Sunday School lesson to be delivered on each of the two Sundays of Falcon Camp Meeting; this lecture to precede the eleven o'clock service."

Report of Committee On Christian Service

5. We suggest that each Woman's Auxiliary sponsor a program through prayer and personal contact of the mothers of the Community to stress the importance of their lives as personal examples, whether righteous or ungodly. "A nation rises or falls with its mothers."

6. We urge our women to take a firm stand against intoxicating liquors, gambling and all forms of degrading amusements and the use of tobacco in any form.

7. Recognizing the serious world conditions of our day, we recommend that each Auxiliary member faithfully pray for our Military Service men and women, and National and International Leaders.

Motion that where there is a Sunday School that is represented by only a delegate or Superintendent and other persons are present, that they may be made a delegate, the Superintendent or delegate designate the delegate.

Rev. W. H. Morris, as Tarboro District gave his report. Motion that we receive the report of Mr. Morris.

Motion that we nominate from the floor and elect by ballot.

Motion that we give a rising vote of thanks to the Goldsboro Church for their entertainment.

Motion that we give a rising vote of thanks to the Chairman in appreciation for his service.

Motion that the Secretary, Rev. B. T. Underwood, be Editor of the Sunday School page in the Evangel.

Motion to adjourn with the reading of the minutes.

Report of Committee on Extension and Evangelism

The Sunday School has been called the out-reaching arm of the church, because it is the only organization of the church whose ministry includes all of the people of the community:

1. Since it has been estimated that 20 per cent of the population may be kept from attending Sunday School by work and illness, we feel that

the extension department of our Sunday School is weak.

- A. That the extension department be a definite department in every church, with a corps of workers whole-heartedly engaged in its important ministry.
- B. We urge that each Sunday School survey the possibilities in old folks' homes, hospitals, soldiers' homes, detention homes, jails, sanitoriums, penal farms and the like.
- C. That we not overlook the possibilities of ministering to those who are unable to attend Sunday School because of work, the shut-outs. These might include bus drivers, radio station employees, those who work in restaurants, hotels, and service station employees, those who work in hospitals, nurses, firemen, and policemen.
- D. That the extension department increase its work with the bedridden, and the shut-ins.

2. That each pastor, Superintendent, and teacher emphasize the need of salvation and make a special effort to present the beauties and advantages of Christian living, and thus aid in bringing pupils to a saving knowledge of Christ.

3. That a committee be elected to contact and invite to Sunday School newcomers and non-churched people of the community. Also where practicable, each class have its own attendance committee.

4. Many churches are born out of a Sunday School. Therefore let the churches where practicable organize, promote, and foster extension schools in cities, towns, communities where we do not have churches.

5. While the Sunday School is primarily the teaching arm of the church it is also one of the greatest avenues of evangelism.

A. That attention be given to community census, public school census, and church family census.

B. That the Sunday School be made a part of evangelistic campaigns by:

1. That pastors and evangelist be Sunday School minded.

2. That decision days be linked with Revivals.

3. That we have Sunday School nights when classes sit together.

7. That the Sunday School Association board, in collaboration with the Annual Conference Board, work out the method of raising money for expenses to the General Convention in 1953.
8. That the President of the Association be paid \$25.00 per month for the ensuing year. The secretary be paid \$10.00 per month for the ensuing year.
9. That the following appropriations be made at this session for services rendered:
 - Rev. V. W. Callahan—\$25.00
 - Miss Louise Smith—\$25.00
 - Rev. A. D. Beacham—\$40.00
