Through Conference percentage and district giving we have a strong Evangelism Department. Reverend L. B. Collins has done a great job in leading us in this department. Our Evangelism Board, District Units, Pastors, and caring church members, all need a big "thank you and God bless you" for sharing with others.

We lead all other Conferences in both drives. Thanks Woman's Auxiliary for a super job and thanks to every pastor and friend who helped these ladies set another goal. Together we did it again.

OTHER AREAS OF PROGRESS

The above reflects progress in other departments, but we have a mission program to be thankful and proud of. Reverend T. E. Long, Missions Director, our Missions Committee and each church is to be commended for another successful year. Brother Long has kept the mission outreach before us continually and you have responded. A greater percent of our churches participate in our annual World Mission Evangelism Emphasis at Camp Meeting. Many of our churches make faith pledges each March which has added to our overall giving.

We gave \$35,998.55 in our Annual Emphasis and through other gifts, pledges, etc. Our total giving to World Missions in 1984 was \$221,965.45. God bless each for your love for souls around the world.

MEMOIRS COMMITTEE June 14, 1984

The Apostle Paul heralded an irrefutable truth when he announced to the Philippians, "for me to live is Christ, and to die is gain."

Our lives have been immensely enriched by having known the one lady and six gentlemen this report embraces.

We have not lost them. Although they do not move among us physically, their undying influence encourages us in our sojourn to the land of eternal day. Today we honor Reverend H. E. Bland, Reverend James W. Johnson, Mrs. Doris Jones, Reverend Alex Parson, Reverend J. Moses Thomas, Reverend T. O. Todd, and Reverend J. Louis Williams. We give God the glory for all their accomplishments.

Hubert Elton Bland, Sr., a Martin County native, was born October 14, 1925. He was born again of the Spirit in the Spring of 1949 at a church now known as Hassell Pentecostal Freewill Baptist Church. Brother Bland was licensed to preach at the Conference session of 1957. He was a diligent student of the Word, a faithful shepherd, and a conscientious adherent of the Christian principles to which he pledged himself some 35 years ago. Pastor Bland served the following churches: Fuquay-Varina, Clayton, Alliance, Jacksonville, Red Springs, Thompson Chapel, and Graham Memorial. He was serving the Farmville Church at the time of his sudden and unexpected homegoing, April 24, 1984.

Brother Bland and his wife, Madelyn, were wed July 31, 1946. The Lord blessed their home with two daughters and four sons. Among those children are faithful lay members of our church. One son, Philip W. Bland, has succeeded his dear father as the pastor of the Farmville Church.

James Willard Johnson was born to James Arthur and Mary Narron Johnson of Johnston County on October 15, 1916. On Saturday, October 8, 1983, he departed this life to fill his place among the believers now awaiting our arrival in Heaven. Brother Johnson was born into the family of the redeemed in 1941 at Bizzell's Grove Church. He soon became a leading layman of the church and developed a preaching ability that afforded him a pastorate even

before he was licensed in the Conference of 1952. He was loved by all who came under his influence as a businessman and later in the full-time pastorate. He served the following churches before official retirement in June of 1982: Jones Grove, St. John, Smithfield, Clayton, Sharon, Chadbourn, Bethel and Goldsboro Tabernacle.

Brother Johnson was wed to Miss Allene Bizzell on October 9, 1940. Among the children born to this union is Sherrod W. Johnson who has answered the call to the Christian Ministry and is receiving his local minister's license in this conference session.

Mrs. Doris Lassiter Jones heard the summons from the Master of life and death to leave her earthly body and "Come up higher" on October 10, 1983. She had served her Lord well since her conversion as a girl of 16 some 53 years before. Sister Jones labored as a faithful mission worker and in 1958 was granted minister's license by the Conference. She served as pastor of the Wakelon Church on two occasions by appointment of the Conference. She continued her loving and untiring service in the Millennium Church after her official superannuation in 1979. Bill Nixon of the Bertie-Ledger Advance (a local newspaper) aptly summed it up this way, "One could easily tell she had surrounded herself with the ordinary people of this world. People who believe in each other, people who believe in honesty, people who believe in hard work. They came to honor her because they loved her and she loved them."

Alex Parson, age 81, heard the summons from another land to which he had longed to go on September 18, 1983. He had served well and now this dedicated soldier of the cross was welcomed home by our Lord. Brother Parson was licensed by the Conference in 1952 and officially retired in 1970. However, after retirement, he faithfully responded in a positive manner to requests by Conference leadership to serve as interim pastor. He pastored the following churches: New Hope, Friendship, Bridgeton, Reelsboro, Spring Creek, and Trinity.

Brother Parson wed the former Miss Susan Miller on December 1, 1922. Among their ten children are two ministers who serve in this conference: Medford and Richard.

John Moses Thomas, born June 30, 1904, near Kenly, NC was born from above in a cottage prayer meeting in Clayton during the month of August, 1937. He was licensed by the conference in 1944 and retired in 1972. During his twenty-eight years of faithful service, he and his bride, the former Miss Mae Belle Jordan, whom he wed July 15, 1928, served in pastorates at Selma, Pinetown, Roper, Abbottsburg, Boardman, Moore's Chapel, Wallace, Penderlea, Jacksonville, Bizzell Grove, Pikes Crossroads, Vanceboro, Thomas Chapel, Scotland Neck, Kenly, and Sims.

Brother Thomas, who was deeply committed to his calling was a man who stood tall in stature and in spiritual quality among his peers. He responded to the Heavenly summons to come home on May 19, 1984.

Thurman Oliver Todd: His Conference Superintendent called him a "special man, he added dignity to the occasion. He was a prince." Fellow ministers who served with him on the Conference Board spoke of his grace and dignity, his dedication to preparation for preaching and his pastor said of him, "In him, righteousness and goodness were beautifully blended." All of them spoke truth.

Brother Todd was born March 2, 1911 to Lewis and Ellen Todd near Conway, South Carolina. He responded to the call of the Holy Spirit to give his life to our Lord in 1928 at the age of 17. He immediately answered the call to the preaching ministry. In his years of service, he served for 21 years on the

Conference Board, two of those years he was assistant superintendent of the Conference. He served the following pastorates: Boardman, Kenly, Moore's Chapel, Niagara, Beaufort, Morehead City, Harkers Island, Rocky Mount, New Bern First, Whiteville, Scotland Neck, Roanoke Rapids, Oak Street, Wilmington First, Wilson First.

Brother Todd wed the former Miss Annie Mae Floyd on September 14, 1935, and God blessed them with three children. They surely were a diligent team in the service of the King.

J. Louis Williams was born in 1906 to John R. and Nannie Elizabeth Williams of Pitt County. He was the eldest son of a family of 9 children. He answered the call of the Lord to spread the Gospel message as a preacher and labored for many years as an evangelist before he was licensed to preach in 1957.

Brother Williams' pastorates included Goose Creek, Pinetown and Grifton. He retired in 1965. He was first wed to the former Miss Bernice Lillian Buck who preceded him to glory in 1944. In 1949, he was married to Miss Beulah Edwards who survives. His six children have a beautiful heritage he gave them.

Let us continue to march forward for our Lord. The speech of these precious bearers of the gospel message has been silenced but their message still leaps from the lofty heights of their eternal abiding place to the hearts and lives of the militant church and challenges us to "look for a city whose builder and maker is God."

Please stand with me in a moment of silent prayer in their memory after which I request our presiding officer to pray.

Rev. Ruth Heath

Sister Ruth Heath became a member of the North Carolina Conference of the Pentecostal Holiness Church on August 28, 1948. Her early years of ministry which really began in 1940 were centered at Holmes College of the Bible. She was at Holmes for a total of twelve years; first as a student and then as a teacher, also serving in the capacity of Dean of Girls. Sister Heath continued her education by completing studies at Pembroke College and graduating from Furman University in Greenville, SC.

Upon joining the NC Conference, she immediately began work as an evangelist proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Her fields of labor led her into the pastorate and during her pastoral ministry, she received assignments to Warsaw, Hollands Chapel, Mt. Olive, Stedman, and Tyndall Grove Pentecostal Holiness Churches where she endeared herself to the people of these congregations. Sister Heath states that she actually helped physically in the building of Warsaw, Garland, and Stedman Churches.

To help support herself and the churches she pastored, she served as a teacher in the public school system of Cumberland County for a number of

years. For 12 years, she was principal of an elementary school and for 18 years as liaison teacher and school social worker. Sister Heath now makes her home in Roseboro, NC and will continue to advance the cause of Christ in whatever way she can.

Rev. James McCandless

Brother James McCandless was born in Wayne County, NC, January 22, 1921. His parents were Jim and Betty McCandless of that county. It was the year 1947 when Brother McCandless came under the influence of the ministry of the Oak Street Pentecostal Holiness Church in Goldsboro, NC and while just a young man, was converted in that church. In less than a year's time, he felt the call to enter the Gospel ministry and being true to that call, he began his ministerial pursuits by receiving mission worker's license on April 24, 1948 in a district conference at the Niagara Pentecostal Holiness Church. This was only the beginning for Brother McCandless, and on August 25, 1951, in Falcon, NC, he was granted license to preach. This was followed by ordination August 22, 1953, when a highlight of his ministry occurred, as Bishop J. A. Synan laid his hands on him and ordained him into full fledged ministry of the Pentecostal Holiness Church.

Brother McCandless has served since that time as an evangelist and pastor, his primary work being that of a pastor. He has served as Pastor of the Jacksonville Church (which he was instrumental in organizing), Hodges Chapel, Holly Hill, Alliance, Calvary (Vanceboro District), Tiffany Street—Kinston, Winterville, Goose Creek, Alliance for the second time, and New Hope, Pentecostal Holiness Churches.

In order to help support his family, Brother McCandless did the work of a carpenter contractor and because of his knowledge and experience was asked to teach vocational training in this field; for 10 years in Craven County Schools, and 1 year at Beaufort Technical Institute. He attended Pikeville High School, completed several off-campus courses through NC State University, as well as church related courses to upgrade his education.

On May 10, 1939, Brother McCandless was married to Miss Pauline Gardner. To this union were born seven children. Sister McCandless has stood by his side faithfully in all these years of ministry and supported her husband in his endeavors. Brother and Sister McCandless make their home at Route 3, Box 238, Vanceboro, NC 28586, and will continue to advance the cause of Jesus Christ.

Brother McCandless and Sister Heath, we ask you to stand—we salute you—we honor you—and now we ask the entire conference body to stand as an expression of our sincere appreciation for your faithful ministry. COMMITTEE ON DECORUM

- I. Rules of Order
 - A. Rules herein outlined shall apply to all alike.
 - B. Rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the business procedures of the convention in all cases not specified in this report.
- II. Enrollment

Enrollment in the convention shall be according to official registration of members provided for in the Woman's Auxiliary Constitution.
- III. Bar of Convention shall include platform and middle section and left side to the second post of the tabernacle.
- IV. Obtaining the Floor
 - A. All members shall ask and receive recognition from the chair before addressing the convention.
 - B. No one shall be recognized by the chair before the previous speaker takes her seat or yields the floor.
 - C. In case two or more persons shall address the chair simultaneously, the chair shall not recognize either until all are seated and one gains the floor first.
- VI. Discussion and Debate
 - A. All adverse personal references shall be avoided.
 - B. No member shall speak longer than three minutes at one time, and shall not speak the second time as long as any other member who has not spoken desires to speak.
 - C. A member shall confine her remarks to the question before the body.
 - D. Insofar as possible, the chair shall alternate speakers on opposite sides of the question.
 - E. Any member may rise to a point of order during debate.
- V. Motions and Resolutions
 - A. All debatable motions must be seconded before being considered.
 - B. Subsidiary, incidental, and privileged motions shall have precedence.
 - C. Dilatory, absurd, or frivolous motions shall not be recognized by the chair.
 - D. All resolutions for consideration of the convention are first to be submitted to the Resolutions Committee. In the event the Resolutions Committee does not accept the Resolution as part of its report, the resolution may be presented on the convention floor if it is signed by five members of the convention.

VII. Voting

- A. No absentee or proxy voting shall be permitted.
- B. Voting on motions, resolutions, and acceptance of reports shall be by voice.
- C. After the vote has been taken by voice, the chair or any member of the convention shall have the privilege of calling for a division of the house.
- D. After a vote (which is not unanimous) is declared by the chair, it cannot be made unanimous by voting to make it so.

VIII. Nominations and Elections

- A. Nominations for officials shall be made by voice from the floor, and voting shall be by ballot.
- B. If there is not an election on the first ballot, the person receiving the lowest number of votes shall be eliminated from each succeeding ballot taken until there is an election by majority vote.
- C. Nominations for delegates to the General Convention shall be made by voice from the floor, and voting shall be by ballot. Those receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected and those receiving the next highest number shall be declared alternates.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

COMMITTEE REPORT ON RESOLUTIONS

We, your Committee on Resolutions, make the following recommendations:

1. That we, as a convention, continue the General WA Theme: "Let the Word of Christ Dwell in You Richly" (Colossians 3:16).
2. That a Woman's Auxiliary, Young Woman's Auxiliary, and Girl's Auxiliary be organized in each church where feasible.
3. That the N. C. Conference stress the importance of local churches complying with the W. A. Constitution. The Official name of this organization shall be The Woman's Auxiliary of the Pentecostal Holiness Church. Organizations under this parent organization include: (WA (Woman's Auxiliary), YWA (Young Woman's Auxiliary), and GA (Girl's Auxiliary). The Conference WA Board promotes the "Ministers' Wives' Fellowship" for the purpose of training and inspiration for ministers' wives. In related colleges, the General WA Board acts with college administration to supervise an organization for college women known as Pi Alpha Rho. No organization in any Pentecostal Holiness Church, or conference, shall function under any of these names unless it complies with rules and by-laws as set forth in this document.
4. That the conference president in organizing any WA or YWA be authorized to give the president a **Manual, Secretary Record Book**, a year's subscription each to the **Advocate, Helping Hand**, and **N. C. Evangel**.
5. That the election of local officials be held during the months of October or November prior to the biennial convention. The newly elected officials are to take office January 1.
6. That the pastor's wife serve in an advisory capacity on the local WA board.
7. That the first local WA meeting after the WA convention be given a briefing of all convention reports and decisions.
8. That the president stress the importance of the Ten-point Standard in the **WA Manual**.
9. That the WA Secretary send quarterly WA reports to the Conference WA President and Secretary, close the books on December 31, and mail annual reports by January 10 to both the Conference President and Secretary.
 - a. That each auxiliary use official secretary record and report blank book which can be obtained from the Falcon Gospel Book Store.
 - b. That each secretary furnish the church secretary quarterly and annual WA reports.
10. That each auxiliary annually invite a visiting official for a special inspirational service.
11. That each auxiliary sponsor a reception for the incoming pastor and outgoing pastor be remembered in some special way.
12. That the local WA assist in preparing meals for the evangelists under the direction of the Entertainment Committee.
13. That each local WA sponsor a fellowship annually for their senior citizens.
14. That pre-convention planning committees meet on a day designated by the conference WA board.

15. That NCWA board be authorized to appoint committee personnel for the 1986 WA Convention.
16. That the number of delegates to be elected to the General WA Convention be divided equally between ministers' wives and lay women and that persons who have served as delegates for the past two (2) consecutive General WA Conventions be ineligible to serve as delegate.
17. That the conference board be requested to approve 1984 officials immediately and that these officials take office Tuesday, June 12, 1984. The secretary-treasurer is to have thirty days to close books.
18. That the conference president's report be placed in the minutes with today's program.
19. That we have a Historian appointed by the WA conference board.
20. That the Circle Plan be adopted in each local auxiliary with thirty or more members where feasible.
21. That we lend our support and Christian influence to promote the American Bible Society, Gideons, religious broadcasting stations, missions, and all other worthwhile organizations.
22. That the conference WA board continue to participate in Sharing Sisters Program and that the district directors promote this program for WAs in their district.
23. That we endorse Section II, Paragraph D of the General W. A. Convention Resolution Committee Report: "Training and Fellowship sessions be designated by the acronym LIFT (Lila Isaac Fellowship Training) in recognition of Lila Isaac; and that area LIFT retreats be conducted quadrennially on the general level, and LIFT retreats be conducted annually on the conference, district, and local levels."
24. In the event a vacancy occurs on the Conference WA Board, said board shall appoint a person to serve until the biennial election of officers.
25. That WA Founders Day honoring Lila Berry shall be continued annually on the second Sunday of March.
26. That the district directors be appointed by the board and that no person serves as district director for more than eight consecutive years. A board member will serve in this capacity only if it becomes necessary.

COMMITTEE REPORT ON FINANCE

We, your Committee on Finance, make the following recommendations:

1. That the NCWA continue the present financial program recommended in the General Minutes as follows:
 - a. Local auxiliaries shall tithe all monies received into the WA, YWA, and GA treasuries, except special funds for missions, Falcon Children's Home, education, visiting officials, and general and conference projects.
 - b. General project funds, which shall be used for the development of the WA internationally, shall be paid to the Conference WA treasury quarterly according to the following schedule:
 1. Each local WA and YWA—\$3.00 per month.
 2. Each local GA—\$1.00 per month.
2. That conference project funds shall be paid annually in March as follows:
 - a. Each local WA and YWA pay 50¢ per active member to the conference WA treasury.

- b. Each local GA pay 10¢ per active member to the Conference GA treasury.
- 3. That \$175.00 per month be paid to the conference president for the period ending June, 1986. —Amended to read \$185.00 per month.
- 4. That \$150.00 per month be paid to the conference secretary-treasurer for the period ending June, 1986. —Amended to read \$160.00 per month.
- 5. That WA and GA officials and district directors be paid travel expense as adopted by the general church.
- 6. That each local WA inviting WA officials present a gift of appreciation for services rendered.
- 7. That no obligations be incurred by any committee without the approval of the Executive Board.
- 8. That the following appropriations be made at this convention:
 - a. Mrs. Dolly Davenport, Convention speaker and Presiding Officer, amount designated by Conference WA Board.
 - b. Mrs. Faye Leggett, NCWA President, \$160.00.
 - c. Mrs. Mary Belle Johnson, Secretary-Treasurer and Children's Home Director, \$160.00.
 - d. Mrs. Ruth Jones, Vice-President and Education Director, \$75.00.
 - e. Mrs. Westa Barefoot, Board Member, and Sharing Sister Director, \$75.00.
 - f. Mrs. Joyce Collins, Board Member and Missions Director, \$75.00.
- 9. That the Conference Secretary-Treasurer be authorized to pay the expense of the printing of the minutes of this convention as a part of the conference minutes.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE REPORT

We, your Committee on Education, recommend the following:

- 1. That the local Committee on Education and the WA President take action to interest both young people and parents in our Pentecostal Holiness Schools.
- 2. That we keep in contact with Pentecostal Holiness College students by making their addresses available to the local church and by remembering them with cards, boxes, etc.
- 3. That we keep in contact with our Pentecostal Holiness servicemen and

- college students providing a subscription to the **Advocate** and the **Evangel**, and by making their addresses available to the local church.
4. That we continue to cooperate with the NC Christian Education Department Scholarship Fund for our church schools and inform high school seniors how to apply for scholarships available through the NC Christian Education Department.
 5. That we make available to high school seniors information concerning the WA Feast of Ingathering Scholarship and the Dollie Davenport Scholarship.
 6. That the local WA cooperate with the church board and local CE Department to establish a scholarship fund in their church to be used for individuals who plan to attend our Church Schools.
 7. That the local WA Education Committee Chairman provide high school guidance counselors in their local area with information on our Pentecostal Holiness schools and the scholarships available.
 8. That each WA mail a list of juniors and seniors in their church to our church schools in the Fall of each year.
 9. That each local WA continue to promote and support the Annual Feast of Ingathering and that the NCWA Board represent the NC Conference at the Feast of Ingathering.
 10. That each local WA cooperate in planning and promoting Vacation Bible School.
 11. That we make available current information about our Youth Camps and encourage our young people to attend.
 12. That the local WA cooperate with GA Department to promote and support youth talent and Bible Quiz programs.
 13. That the local church sponsor a career day or weekend. Invite members of school faculty to be present to talk to high school juniors and seniors about their plans for the future and what they can expect if they attend our schools. Have former students give their testimony as to what they have meant to them.
 14. That we encourage people to place books in Church schools and local libraries as memorials or honorariums.
 15. That we conduct study courses each year for the purpose of training and promoting leadership. (Courses may be based on WA Manual and/or books recommended by the General WA or Conference WA Board.)
 16. That we contact, promote, and encourage our Pentecostal Youth Organization in our colleges and universities.
 17. That the WA Board continue to plan and implement Spiritual and Education Retreats in our conference.
 18. That the local WA encourage the church families to become involved with all aspects of their children's education, using Isaiah 54:13 as a guideline. "And all thy children shall be taught of the Lord, and great shall be the peace of thy children."

COMMITTEE REPORT ON WORLD MISSIONS

In Romans 10:14, 15, Paul stated, "How then shall they call on him whom they have not believed? and how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? and how shall they hear without a preacher? And how shall they preach, except they be sent?"

In view of these words, we, your Committee on World Missions, make the following recommendations:

1. That each local WA set aside one day each month as a day of prayer and fasting specifically for missions and remember each missionary family

by name as we pray. That this special day be communicated to the local church through church bulletins and other available media.

2. That we remember assigned missionary families on special occasions and while on furlough in cooperation with the Sponsor Plan, as recommended by the general convention.
3. That the local WA committee correspond on a regular basis with their sponsor missionaries and that they present news and needs of these families to the church by means of church bulletins, church newsletters, and by keeping current a Missions Bulletin Board.
4. That each local WA promote the Christmas offering program recommended by the General Auxiliary Board and mail the offering by October 1 to the Conference Missions Director.
5. That each WA have at least one missions program each year; that the local missions chairman, through correspondence with their sponsor missionary, request slides, tapes, and other materials to aid in the promotion of missions; and that the Conference Missions Director continue to promote and make available missions materials.
6. That each local WA cooperate with the local church missions program.

FALCON CHILDREN'S HOME COMMITTEE REPORT

"My little children, let us not love in word, neither in tongue; but in deed and in truth" (1 John 3:18).

We, your Committee of the Falcon Children's Home, recommend the following:

1. That each Auxiliary emphasize the continued interest in the home by—praying for the superintendent, staff, and children.
2. We urge your continued support of the annual Harvest Train with cash and commodities. That each Auxiliary appoint a chairman to:
 - a. Collect coupons and premium stamps for the Falcon Children's Home and mail them to the Home. We recommend that each WA place more emphasis on this endeavor.
 - b. Place special emphasis on the Harvest Train to the local church by highlighting a much-needed item at the Home each month.
 - c. Invite a group from the Children's Home to visit the local church and take a free-will offering to help defray travel expenses.
3. That if possible each Auxiliary contribute \$300.00 per year toward the clothing fund. This should be paid \$150.00 in the Spring and Fall. In the event an Auxiliary cannot join the clothing fund, a monthly check of \$12.00 may be designated toward one of the following: General Allowance Fund; General Youth Camp Fund; General Music Fund.
4. We recommend the Auxiliary consider as a project the purchasing or replacing of one of the needed items at the home.
5. That we encourage the chairman of local Children's Home committee to contact the officials of the Home to set up an appointment for local WA members to visit the Home thereby helping to meet the emotional needs of the children and bringing a better understanding of the Home to the local churches.
6. That each Auxiliary encourage a memorial gift to Falcon Children's Home.
7. We suggest that each Auxiliary who participates in the sponsor program plan to invite a child to visit at least once a year, during holidays or summer vacations.

8. We suggest that the local WA reporter share in the **Evangel or Guardian** completed projects which have been successful for raising money or commodities in their local church.

COMMITTEE ON CHRISTIAN SOCIAL CONCERN AND SERVICES

We, your Committee on Christian Social Concern and Services, submit the following:

1. That women work to promote the observance of the Lord's Day as set forth in God's Word.
2. That women join, or otherwise support, community action and organization to help rid the community of obscene matter and that women take a firm and active stand in opposition to the following:
 - a. Legalized abortion. (Proverbs 24:11, 12)
 - b. Legalized marijuana and other harmful drugs.
 - c. Equal Rights Amendment.
 - d. Homosexuality, and illicit sex.
 - e. Evils of pornography.
 - f. Liquor by the drink in our local counties.
 - g. Any attempt against religious activities by Madelyn O'Hair.
 - h. Child abuse and battered wives.
 - i. Teenage alcoholism
3. We recommend that each local WA have a Committee on Christian Social Concern and services and be responsible for obtaining materials and presenting at least one or more programs during the year with emphasis on the social issues listed above in number 2.
4. That we reaffirm our position that we deplore in the strongest possible terms the decision of the U. S. Supreme Court to legalize abortions for no better reason than personal convenience or sociological considerations. We recognize the necessity for the therapeutic abortions to safeguard the health or the life of the mother, or to end pregnancies resulting from rape or incest, but the decision should be made only after there has been medical, psychological, and religious counseling of the most sensitive kind.
5. Realizing that television is having such a strong influence on our families, we strongly urge our women to write to the sponsors and the networks of objectional programs.
6. That women plan and promote an active program of visitation to help the sick, needy, aged, and those in convalescent homes, jails, correctional institutions, blind centers, and other benevolent institutions. We strongly recommend that our ladies also get involved in local volunteer services such as hospitals, meals on wheels, Red Cross, school volunteer programs, Hospice, etc. and to encourage our Senior Citizens to become involved as volunteers.
7. Realizing the rising number of suicides among children and teenagers, we encourage women to be sensitive to the emotional and spiritual needs of the youth and to make themselves available in meeting these needs.
8. That women teach our young people the Christian concept of sex education in the home, church (in GA groups, Lifeliners, etc.). Good books are available in Christian Book Stores.
9. That women observe the World Day of Prayer, the P.F.N.A. Day of Prayer, and the National Shut-In Day, and where possible, each to organize a community prayer group for these days.

10. We suggest the use of the services of the American Bible Society and Advocate Press in securing printed materials for distribution in our churches, homes, and public places such as libraries, bus stations, doctors' offices, etc.

G. A. COMMITTEE REPORT

1. That the Conference WA Board appoint a Conference GA Director, Assistant Conference GA Director, Secretary-Treasurer and Historian.
2. That GA District Directors be appointed by the WA and GA Conference Boards. It is recommended that the GA District Directors be a local GA Advisor.
3. That each local GA send a report to the Conference GA Director and a report and monies to the Conference GA Secretary-Treasurer.
 - a. Reports should cover the period: January-March; April-June; July-September; and October-December.
 - b. Close books December 31 and mail annual reports by January 31.
 - c. Local Girl's Auxiliaries shall tithe all monies received into the GA except Special Funds for Missions, Falcon Children's Home, Education (Feast of Ingathering), Blanche L. King Scholarship Fund, Conference Project and General Project.
 - d. General Project funds of \$1.00 per month shall be paid to the Conference GA Treasury quarterly.
 - e. Conference Project funds of \$.10 per active GA member shall be paid to the Conference GA Treasury annually in March.
4. That \$100.00 per quarter be paid to the Conference GA Director for period ending June 30, 1986.
5. That \$75.00 per quarter be paid to the Assistant Conference GA Director for period ending June 30, 1986.
6. That \$75.00 per quarter be paid to the Conference GA Secretary-Treasurer for period ending June 30, 1986.
7. That mileage be paid to GA Officials and District Directors for travel expenses as adopted by the General WA.
8. That each local GA inviting GA Officials present a gift of appreciation for services rendered.
9. That the NCWA Board and NCGA Board plan an annual GA Retreat and Convention and that each local WA and GA encourage girls to attend.
10. That each GA District Director plan and implement at least one District GA Rally annually.
11. That the following appropriations be made at the GA Retreat and Convention:
 - a. Convention Speaker and/or other special speakers, \$200.00.
 - b. Conference GA Director, \$50.00.
 - c. Assistant Conference GA Director, \$50.00.
 - d. Conference GA Secretary-Treasurer, \$50.00.
12. That each local GA be encouraged to use the GA Standard as a guide.
13. That all GA groups be encouraged to use the Achievement Program, starting as early an age as possible.
14. That the GA girls be encouraged to correspond with the missionary children, by securing the names of missionary children and corresponding with them regularly as pen pals.

15. That each local GA observe annual GA Day in April or other suitable date.
16. That the conference GA Director or Assistant Conference GA Director in organizing any GA group be authorized to give the local Advisor a GA Advisor Handbook and quarterly and annual report forms.
17. That local Girl's Auxiliaries report newsworthy activities, articles, pictures, etc., to Conference GA Historian for scrapbook and conference publication.
