Covenant

We do now in the presence of Almighty God, and in the faith of the gospel, and by the help of Divine grace, unreservedly and unitedly give up ourselves to God the Father and His Son Jesus Christ, and to the Holy Ghost, to be for Him and no other; freely submitting ourselves to Him, to be at His disposal for His glory, taking Him as our true guide and only portion, promising by the help of Divine grace to watch against sin, temptation, and corruption; and to hold a continual warfare with the same, looking to Christ who is the author and finisher of our faith, and the only hope and surety of His people.

Under His covenant of grace, we do now freely and joyfully give ourselves to one another by the will of God, freely covenanting and engaging to and with each other, to bear one another's burdens in the gospel and so fulfill the law of Christ unto obedience, promising to watch over one another in love and to hold communion together in the ordinances of the gospel, submitting ourselves in this, which we trust a part of His mystical body, according as we shall be directed by His spirit in His word; and by the help of divine Grace to still pray for more light from the Lord believing that He will further and more gloriously open to us His word and the mysteries of His kingdom, and to our Lord Jesus Christ, our only Savior, to whom be glory forever and forever. Amen.

RULES OF DECORUM

Article 1.—The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches in our district duly sent in their associated capacity whom they judge best qualified; and by producing letters from their respective churches certifying their appointments shall be entitled to seats. In letters from the different churches shall be expressed their number in fellowship, those received by experience and by letters and restored; those dismissed by letter, excluded and dead since the last report.

Article 2.—The number thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord it over God's heritage.

Article 3.—The Association when convened shall be governed by a proper and regular Decorum.

Article 4.—The Association shall have a moderator and clerk, who shall be chosen at each session of the Association by the sufferages of the members present.

Article 5.—New churches may be admitted into the union upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly by the moderator, giving the members the right hand of fellowship.

Article 6.—Every church in the union shall be entitled to representation in the Association not exceeding three.

Article 7.—Queries presented by a church or the committee of arrangements or any individual member may be disposed of as the Association may think proper.

Article 8.—That the Association have a fund for defraying the expenses thereof and that the churches shall send by their messengers such sums of money as they may think proper for this purpose, which when received shall be deposited in the hands of a treasurer chosen for that purpose, who shall keep an accurate account of all sums received and paid out under the direction of the Association.

Article 9.—The minutes shall be read and corrected if necessary and approved by the Association and signed by the moderator and clerk before dismission and recorded by the clerk in a suitable book for that purpose.

Article 10.—The Association shall have power:

- 1.—To provide for the general union of the churches.
- 2.—To preserve inviolate a chain of communion among the churches.
- 3.—To give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty.
- 4.—To inquire the cause why such churches as fail to represent themselves in the Association.
- 5.—To appoint any member or members by his or their consent to transact any business which may be assigned them.
- 6.—To withdraw from any church violating the rules of the Association or from the orthodox principle of religion.
- 7.—To admit any of the distant brethren in the ministry to seats if they think proper.
- 8.—To appoint the time and place for the next Association, and adjourn.
- 9.—There shall be a committee on arrangements consisting of the moderator and clerk and three other members chosen as the Association may deem best.

Articles of Faith

The following Articles of Faith were read and adopted without a dissenting voice:

- Article 1.—Of God and the Holy Family.—We believe in one only true and living God, who rules all things after the counsel of His own will; and that He who created all things is infinite in power, wisdom, knowledge and goodness; eternal, immortal, invisible and unchangeable; and that this God has revealed Himself in His word, under the character of Father, Son and Holy Ghost, and that these three are one; and that there are three that bear witness in earth: The water, the spirit and the blood, and that these agree in one.
- Article 2.—Of the Holy Scriptures.—We believe that the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the written word of God. And are a sufficient rules of faith and practice; that they are given by inspiration of God, and are profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, and for instruction in righteousness; and that they contain all things necessary to be known for the salvation of men.
- Article 3.—Of the Atonement.—We believe that Christ died and made a complete atonement for all who ever did, does now or ever will believe on His name; and that all who are finally saved were given to Christ in Covenant of the Father before the world was, that they should show forth his praise.
- Article 4.—Of Foreknowledge, Election and Predestination.—We believe that (all) whom God did foreknow He did also predestinate to be conformed to the image of His Son, that God elected, according to His foreknowledge through sanctification of the spirit, unto obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ, to an inheritance in corruptible and undefied, and that fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for all saints, and that none come to Christ, only those whom He loved with an everlasting love, and in due time calls to everlasting glory.
 - Article 5.—We believe in the doctrine of original sin.
- **Article 6.**—We believe in man's impotency to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by his own free will and ability.
- Article 7.—We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed righteousness of Christ.
- Article 8.—We believe that God's elect will be called, converted, regenerated, and sanctified by the Holy Spirit.
- **Article 9.**—We believe the saints shall be preserved in grace and never finally fall away.
- Article 10.—We believe that baptism and the Lord's supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ, and that true believers are the only

proper subjects of these ordinances, and that baptism is by immersion.

Article 11.—We believe in the resurrection of the dead and a general judgement.

Article 12.—We believe that punishment of the wicked will be eternal, and the joys of the righteous everlasting.

Article 13.—We believe that no Minister has the right to administer the ordinances only to such as are regularly called and have come under the imposition of the hands of the presbytery.

Article 14.—We believe in Predestination, as taught in the scriptures and preached by the Apostle Paul and condemn the doctrine of the absolute predestination of all things.

OBITUARY OF ELDER S. H. REID

The Upper Mayo Association in session May 19, 1951, appointed Elder J. A. Fagg and Deacon W. L. Johnson to write this article to be printed in the Association's Minutes.

Elder S. H. Reid was born August 20, 1866, the son of Henry N. and Mahaley Leamore Reid. He died May 2, 1951, at the age of eighty-four years, seven months and eighteen days.

He was united in marriage to Miss Nannie Iane Marshall, December 20, 1893, who survives together with five daughters, four sons, seventeen grand-children and a host of relatives and friends to mourn his passing.

He joined Clear Springs Primitive Baptist Church on June 8, 1912, and was baptized by Elder J. A. Fagg. He was granted liberty to speak in public on October 12, 1912.

He was a charter member of Walnut Cove Primitive Bapt'st Church. He organized Boyles Chapel Church and served as its pastor twenty-four years. He served No Creek Church for thirty years. He served Brush Creek Church, Sandy Creek Church, Stuart Creek Church, Flat Shoals Church and Holly Springs Church for several years.

He was a good pastor and loved the doctrine of Salvation by

His funeral was conducted by Elders J. A. Fagg, F. R. Moore, J. F. Manuel, A. B. Cashion and Gray Fulk and he was buried at Salem Chapel Church graveyard. There were sixteen preachers present and one of the largest crowds ever to attend a funeral in this part of the country.

In his latter days he suffered much, but as Job, he murmured not. As the potter said, "His most valuable piece of ware had passed more often through the furnace". Usually the most tried Christians are the most Christ-like. The poet said, "There is a great want about all Christians who have not suffered. Some flowers must be broken or bruised before they emit fragrance. All the wounds of Christ send out fragrance, all the sorrows of Christians do the same. Commend me to a bruised brother—a broken reed—one like the Son of Man. The man of sorrows is never far from him".

He was loved and highly respected by all who knew him.

The widow has lost a good husband; the children a good father; and Walnut Cove Primitive Baptist Church has lost an able preacher.

Let us say to Sister Reid and the children: don't weep for him, we feel that he is now resting from his labors and his good name and works will follow after him.

Asleep, blessed sleep, where the righteous never wake to weep. But some day the Dear Lord will call for his sleeping body to rise in the dear Saviour's likeness.

May the Lord bless you, Sister Reid, and the dear children, to meet him over there where there will be no death or no more parting. In love,

Covenant

We do now in the presence of Almighty God, and in the faith of the gospel, and by the help of Divine grace, unreservedly and unitedly give up ourselves to God the Father and His Son Jesus Christ, and to the Holy Ghost, to be for Him and no other; freely submitting ourselves to Him, to be at His disposal for His glory, taking Him as our true guide and only portion, promising by the help of Divine grace to watch against sin, temptation, and corruption; and to hold a continual warfare with the same, looking to Christ who is the author and finisher of our faith, and the only hope and surety of His people.

Under His covenant of grace, we do now freely and joyfully give ourselves to one another by the will of God, freely covenanting and engaging to and with each other, to bear one another's burdens in the gospel and so fulfill the law of Christ unto obedience, promising to watch over one another in love and to hold communion together in the ordinances of the gospel, submitting ourselves in this, which we trust a part of His mystical body, according as we shall be directed by His spirit in His word; and by the help of divine Grace to still pray for more light from the Lord believing that He will further and more gloriously open to us His word and the mysteries of His kingdom, and to our Lord Jesus Christ, our only Savior, to whom be glory forever and forever. Amen.

RULES OF DECORUM

Article 1.—The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches in our district duly sent in their associated capacity whom they judge best qualified; and by producing letters from their respective churches certifying their appointments shall be entitled to seats. In letters from the different churches shall be expressed their number in fellowship, those received by experience and by letters and restored; those dismissed by letter, excluded and dead since the last report.

Article 2.—The number thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord it over God's heritage.

Article 3.—The Association when convened shall be governed by a proper and regular Decorum.

Article 4.—The Association shall have a moderator and clerk, who shall be chosen at each session of the Association by the sufferages of the members present.

Article 5.—New churches may be admitted into the union upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly by the moderator, giving the members the right hand of fellowship.

Article 6.—Every church in the union shall be entitled to representation in the Association not exceeding three.

Article 7.—Queries presented by a church or the committee of arrangements or any individual member may be disposed of as the Association may think proper.

Article 8.—That the Association have a fund for defraying the expenses thereof and that the churches shall send by their messengers such sums of money as they may think proper for this purpose, which when received shall be deposited in the hands of a treasurer chosen for that purpose, who shall keep an accurate account of all sums received and paid out under the direction of the Association.

Article 9.—The minutes shall be read and corrected if necessary and approved by the Association and signed by the moderator and clerk before dismission and recorded by the clerk in a suitable book for that purpose.

Article 10.—The Association shall have power:

- 1.—To provide for the general union of the churches.
- 2.—To preserve inviolate a chain of communion among the churches.
- 3.—To give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty.
- 4.—To inquire the cause why such churches as fail to represent themselves in the Association.
 - 5.—To appoint any member or members by his or their consent to transact any business which may be assigned them.
 - 6.—To withdraw from any church violating the rules of the Association or from the orthodox principle of religion.
 - 7.—To admit any of the distant brethren in the ministry to seats if they think proper.
- 8.—To appoint the time and place for the next Association, and adjourn.
- 9.—There shall be a committee on arrangements consisting of the moderator and clerk and three other members chosen as the Association may deem best.

Articles of Faith

The following Articles of Faith were read and adopted without a dissenting voice:

- Article 1.—Of God and the Holy Family.—We believe in one only true and living God, who rules all things after the counsel of His own will; and that He who created all things is infinite in power, wisdom, knowledge and goodness; eternal, immortal, invisible and unchangeable; and that this God has revealed Himself in His word, under the character of Father, Son and Holy Ghost, and that these three are one; and that there are three that bear witness in earth: The water, the spirit and the blood, and that these agree in one.
- Article 2.—Of the Holy Scriptures.—We believe that the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the written word of God. And are a sufficient rules of faith and practice; that they are given by inspiration of God, and are profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, and for instruction in righteousness; and that they contain all things necessary to be known for the salvation of men.
- Article 3.—Of the Atonement.—We believe that Christ died and made a complete atonement for all who ever did, does now or ever will believe on His name; and that all who are finally saved were given to Christ in Covenant of the Father before the world was, that they should show forth his praise.
- Article 4.—Of Foreknowledge, Election and Predestination.—We believe that (all) whom God did foreknow He did also predestinate to be conformed to the image of His Son, that God elected, according to His foreknowledge through sanctification of the spirit, unto obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ, to an inheritance in corruptible and undefied, and that fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for all saints, and that none come to Christ, only those whom He loved with an everlasting love, and in due time calls to everlasting glory.
 - Article 5.—We believe in the doctrine of original sin.
- Article 6.—We believe in man's impotency to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by his own free will and ability.
- Article 7.—We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed righteousness of Christ.
- Article 8.—We believe that God's elect will be called, converted, regenerated, and sanctified by the Holy Spirit.
- Article 9.—We believe the saints shall be preserved in grace and never finally fall away.
- Article 10.—We believe that baptism and the Lord's supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ, and that true believers are the only

proper subjects of these ordinances, and that baptism is by immersion.

Article 11.—We believe in the resurrection of the dead and a general judgement.

Article 12.—We believe that punishment of the wicked will be eternal, and the joys of the righteous everlasting.

Article 13.—We believe that no Minister has the right to administer the ordinances only to such as are regularly called and have come under the imposition of the hands of the presbytery.

Article 14.—We believe in Predestination, as taught in the scriptures and preached by the Apostle Paul and condemn the doctrine of the absolute predestination of all things.



Covenant

We do now in the presence of Almighty God, and in the faith of the gospel, and by the help of Divine grace, unreservedly and unitedly give up ourselves to God the Father and His Son Jesus Christ, and to the Holy Ghost, to be for Him and no other; freely submitting ourselves to Him, to be at His disposal for His glory, taking Him as our true guide and only portion, promising by the help of Divine grace to watch against sin, temptation, and corruption; and to hold a continual warfare with the same, looking to Christ who is the author and finisher of our faith, and the only hope and surety of His people.

Under His covenant of grace, we do now freely and joyfully give ourselves to one another by the will of God, freely covenanting and engaging to and with each other, to bear one another's burdens in the gospel and so fulfill the law of Christ unto obedience, promising to watch over one another in love and to hold communion together in the ordinances of the gospel, submitting ourselves in this, which we trust a part of His mystical body, according as we shall be directed by His spirit in His word; and by the help of divine Grace to still pray for more light from the Lord believing that He will further and more gloriously open to us His word and the mysteries of His kingdom, and to our Lord Jesus Christ, our only Savior, to whom be glory forever and forever. Amen.

RULES OF DECORUM

Article 1.—The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches in our district duly sent in their associated capacity whom they judge best qualified; and by producing letters from their respective churches certifying their appointments shall be entitled to seats. In letters from the different churches shall be expressed their number in fellowship, those received by experience and by letters and restored; those dismissed by letter, excluded and dead since the last report.

Article 2.—The number thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord it over God's heritage.

Article 3.—The Association when convened shall be governed by a proper and regular Decorum.

Article 4.—The Association shall have a moderator and clerk, who shall be chosen at each session of the Association by the sufferages of the members present.

Article 5.—New churches may be admitted into the union upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly by the moderator, giving the members the right hand of fellowship.

Article 6.—Every church in the union shall be entitled to representation in the Association not exceeding three.

Article 7.—Queries presented by a church or the committee of arrangements or any individual member may be disposed of as the Association may think proper.

Article 8.—That the Association have a fund for defraying the expenses thereof and that the churches shall send by their messengers such sums of money as they may think proper for this purpose, which when received shall be deposited in the hands of a treasurer chosen for that purpose, who shall keep an accurate account of all sums received and paid out under the direction of the Association.

Article 9.—The minutes shall be read and corrected if necessary and approved by the Association and signed by the moderator and clerk before dismission and recorded by the clerk in a suitable book for that purpose.

Article 10.—The Association shall have power:

- 1.—To provide for the general union of the churches.
- 2.—To preserve inviolate a chain of communion among the churches.
- 3.—To give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty.
- 4.—To inquire the cause why such churches as fail to represent themselves in the Association.
- 5.—To appoint any member or members by his or their consent to transact any business which may be assigned them.
- 6.—To withdraw from any church violating the rules of the Association or from the orthodox principle of religion.
- 7.—To admit any of the distant brethren in the ministry to seats if they think proper.
- 8.—To appoint the time and place for the next Association, and adjourn.
- 9.—There shall be a committee on arrangements consisting of the moderator and clerk and three other members chosen as the Association may deem best.

Articles of Faith

The following Articles of Faith were read and adopted without a dissenting voice:

- Article 1.—Of God and the Holy Family.—We believe in one only true and living God, who rules all things after the counsel of His own will; and that He who created all things is infinite in power, wisdom, knowledge and goodness; eternal, immortal, invisible and unchangeable; and that this God has revealed Himself in His word, under the character of Father, Son and Holy Ghost, and that these three are one; and that there are three that bear witness in earth: The water, the spirit and the blood, and that these agree in one.
- Article 2.—Of the Holy Scriptures.—We believe that the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the written word of God. And are a sufficient rules of faith and practice; that they are given by inspiration of God, and are profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, and for instruction in righteousness; and that they contain all things necessary to be known for the salvation of men.
- Article 3.—Of the Atonement.—We believe that Christ died and made a complete atonement for all who ever did, does now or ever will believe on His name; and that all who are finally saved were given to Christ in Covenant of the Father before the world was, that they should show forth his praise.
- Article 4.—Of Foreknowledge, Election and Predestination.—We believe that (all) whom God did foreknow He did also predestinate to be conformed to the image of His Son, that God elected, according to His foreknowledge through sanctification of the spirit, unto obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ, to an inheritance in corruptible and undefied, and that fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for all saints, and that none come to Christ, only those whom He loved with an everlasting love, and in due time calls to everlasting glory.
 - Article 5.—We believe in the doctrine of original sin.
- Article 6.—We believe in man's impotency to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by his own free will and ability.
- Article 7.—We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed righteousness of Christ.
- Article 8.—We believe that God's elect will be called, converted, regenerated, and sanctified by the Holy Spirit.
- Article 9.—We believe the saints shall be preserved in grace and never finally fall away.
 - Article 10.—We believe that baptism and the Lord's supper are

ordinances of Jesus Christ, and that true believers are the only proper subjects of these ordinances, and that baptism is by immersion.

Article 11.—We believe in the resurrection of the dead and a general judgement.

Article 12.—We believe that punishment of the wicked will be eternal, and the joys of the righteous everlasting.

Article 13.—We believe that no Minister has the right to administer the ordinances only to such as are regularly called and have come under the imposition of the hands of the presbytery.

Article 14.—We believe in Predestination, as taught in the scriptures and preached by the Apostle Paul and condemn the doctrine of the absolute predestination of all things.
