The Rev. William S. Smythe, Jr., Presbytery of Potomac, was introduced to Presbytery and invited to sit as a visiting brother. Elders attending Presbytery for the first time were introduced and welcomed to Presbytery.

The Rev. Charles S. McChesney was elected moderator of presbytery.

Communications were read. The report of Chaplain Preston C. Oliver was read. The Stated Clerk was instructed to write Chaplain Oliver expressing the prayers and interest of Presbytery. Presbytery was led in a prayer in behalf of the chaplains of our church by the Rev. N. H. Flowers.

The Rev. Reid Erwin, host pastor, welcomed the Presbytery to the Bethel Church.

Miss Dot Lynch, Area Director of Christian Education, was introduced to Presbytery.

The docket was adopted as amended.

The Rev. N. P. Farrior presented the report on World Missions. It was adopted as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON WORLD MISSIONS TO

WILMINGTON PRESBYTERY, JAN. 15, 1957

We remind ourselves that the responsibility for the evangelization of forty million people, accepted by our Church, is still with us.

The note of emphasis which we would present is one of urgency.

Our Board of World Missions tells us that "The most significant feature of the New Day in Missions is that virile and enthusiastic indigenous churches now exist in many lands."

They tell us also that "The New Day in Missions confronts us with new and greater opportunities."

Looking quickly, we can see only minute glimpses of the work of our church outside our own country. Let us call their names, and look for one characteristic thing in each field of work:

Africa. Africa, even at its heart in the Congo basin, is no longer the quiet and isolated country that it used to be. It is experiencing the unrest that is moving the world today. That means politically, economically, and religiously. Education has been largely in the hands of Catholic and Protestant Missions. These schools once trained youth with a view to their serving the Church primarily. Now the graduates find much better paying jobs with Government and industry. 1955 was a year of marked progress.

The first dental school in the Congo was formed at Lubonai, one of our stations. A new work was begun at Leopoldville, the capital city. More opportunities call for more personnel.

Brazil. The Presbyterian Church in Brazil is characterized by fervor and a forward look, and is recognized as a spiritual influence in the Country. In 1949 it began its hundredth year. A ten year plan with the objective of doubling its membership in ten years has kept up with schedule, and grows. In our two Latin American fields, Brazil and Mexico, Presbyterians are strongest in these two countries, and when the Pan-Presbyterian Latin American Conference was held in July, 1955, the Moderator of the Brazilian Church and the Mexican Church were elected President and Vice-President, respectively, of the conference. The expanding western frontier of Brazil is still an expanding field for, and of, our work.

China-Taiwan. Taiwan (Formosa) is much in the world's eye today. There is centered a struggle between American and Asiatic Communism, between Red China and Nationalist China, between Christ on one hand and ancient Asiatic paganism and modern Asiatic philosophy on the other. Our work there grows, and shows signs of fruitfulness. 12 campaigns of evangelism in 1955 were attended by 177,160 persons, with a list of 2,813 who signed cards indicating that they believed in or were interested in Christianity.

Japan. Christian missionary work in Japan is nearly a hundred years old. Japan has always been a difficult field. The spiritual situation today is still complex. But there is now in Japan a strong native church. And progress characterizes the present day. The Yodogawa Hospital is now functioning, and serving a vast number of people. Our schools and colleges are well attended, and the seminary is doing a good work.

Korea. For the first time since the war, (Korean War) this mission operated at full strength in 1955. The Korean Church is described as "truly a self-supporting, self-governing, and self-propagating Church." Work here is shared in its relief ministry with several other bodies, and so, accomplished more than it could have done alone. Medical work is especially stressed in the treating of the tubercular and leprous patients. The Gospel goes out on the air from station HLKY, as it has been doing since 1954.

Mexico. Two sentences from the World Mission Board's report gives a significant light on our work in Mexico. "Our Mission in Mexico, in common with others in our several fields, finds itself dealing more and more with a new and happy factor in our work. This is the presence alongside itself of a growing and vigorous national church." Our work is still concerned with the evangelistic, the medical, and the educational fields. During the last ten years our mission force there has had a net increase of 6 persons.

Portugal. In Portugal we are associated with other bodies. We are represented in the theological seminary by Rev. Herbert Meza, who worked for a while in our Presbytery, at Jacksonville. Mrs. T. A. Turner, of the Pink Hill Church, called at his home while she was in Portugal a year or two ago, and also visited the Seminary. The Presbyterian Church in Portugal suffers the usual handicaps of Protestant work in Catholic lands; but is vigorous and growing.

Ecuador. We work with three other churches in this field, the Presbyterian, U.S.A., the Evangelical and Reformed, and the Evangelical United Brethren. From the beginning the approach has been through agricultural, medical and education activities along with the evangelistic. This field is difficult, but rewarding.

Overseas Relief. We need scarcely mention this activity. It is an important function of our church in relieving distress among suffering people of the world. We work through the Church World Service organization. This agency was the first on the scene with relief for the Hungarian refugees.

Iraq. In 1956 our church began work in Iraq with other Presbyterian and Reformed Churches. The activities and results in this field await another year for reporting.

Urgency is the note. In many areas of the world, and some of our fields the limitation of present activities is threatened. More personnel is needed badly.

Last year our Presbytery presented the World Mission appeal in local churches in the following ways as reported by 30 pastors: 20 missionary addresses, 32 sermons, 9 schools of missions, 29 reading books, etc., and by films and slides. The Women of the Presbytery sponsored an itinerary through the Presbytery of a missionary from Brazil.

In 1954 Wilmington Presbytery gave \$26,946 to World Missions; in 1955, \$31,485; a gain of \$4,539.

Attention is called to the film, "With One Accord," now being booked for showing in the Presbytery from January 20 to March 3.

The committee recommends that the churches of the Presbytery observe the season of special study, prayer, and self-denial for World Missions as the Assembly has called for, from February 3 to March 3, making the best possible use of means and materials for information, inspiration, and commitment to this phase of our Lord's work.

The report of Women's Work was docketed for the spring meeting of Presbytery.

The Rev. L. A. Taylor presented the reports of the treasurers of Presbytery. These were adopted with the recommendation that these reports be turned over to the committee on audits and that their report be the official report to Presbytery.
