STATED MEETING

The 200th Stated Session of Wilmington Presbytery met October 15, 1957 at Pollocksville, N. C., at 10 a.m.

The worship service was led by the pastor of the retiring moderator, the Rev. R. J. Wilkins.

Presbytery stood in silent prayer in memory of Elder W. M. Dixon and the Rev. C. C. Myers who died since last meeting of Presbytery. The Rev. L. A. Taylor led the Presbytery in prayer.

The Rev. A. M. Daniel was elected moderator.

MINUTES OF WILMINGTON PRESBYTERY

Elders attending Presbytery for the first time were introduced.

Elder R. P. Bender welcomed the Presbytery to the Pollocksville Church. The host pastor, the Rev. W. F. F. Little was reported to be in the hospital.

The communications were read and referred.

The docket was adopted as amended.

The Rev. L. W. Kessler, Lexington Presbytery, and the Rev. Robert B. Rock, Orange Presbytery, were presented for membership in the Presbytery. The examination on theology was led by the Rev. Ben L. Rose. It was sustained as satisfactory.

The examination on church government was conducted by the Rev. J. W. Miller. It was sustained as satisfactory. The examinations as a whole were sustained as satisfactory and the Rev. L. W. Kessler and the Rev. Robert B. Rock were enrolled as members of Wilmington Presbytery upon the signing of the obligations.

The calls of the Burgaw Church at a salary of \$4,000.00, manse and M. A. F. participation, and of the Hopewell Church at a salary of \$900.00 and M. A. F. participation, were read, approved and ordered placed in his hands. He indicated his acceptance of the calls. The following commission was appointed to install Mr. Kessler as pastor of the Burgaw and Hopewell Churches at Burgaw on November 3 at 7:30 p.m. The Rev. W. H. Goodman, Jr., convenor, the Rev. J. A. Marrow, to preach the sermon, the Rev. P. L. Clark to charge the congregation and Ruling Elder H. McNair Johnson to charge the pastor. Elder Leon Corbett, elder alternate.

The Rev. Robert Rock will serve as Temporary Supply of the Topsail Church.

The Rev. C. W. Worth reported for the Committee on Church Extension. It was adopted as follows:

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF CHURCH EXTENSION REPORT TO WILMINGTON PRESBYTERY OCTOBER 15, 1957

In gratitude to God, and to many workers throughout our Presbytery, The Executive Committee of Church Extension submits the following report of work which has been done through and by its sub-committees.

HOME MISSIONS

The sub-committee on Home Missions, as it begins its report, wishes to call your attention to the annual report of the Treasurer of the Home Missions Committee for the year ending December 31, 1956. This is printed in the Minutes of the Presbytery of January, 1957. This will give you a detailed statement of receipts and disbursements of the Committee for the year.

MINUTES OF WILMINGTON PRESBYTERY

As of this date the Committee is disbursing salary supplements to fifteen pastors who are serving twenty-four churches. This aid amounts to an average of \$1,200 per month. In addition to the salary aid given to pastors, the Committee disburses salary supplement to two women who serve as church visitors for the Jacksonville and Trinity churches. Both the Board of Church Extension and the Synod's Committee on Church Extension share the salary aid for these workers. The Presbytery's portion of the aid amounts to \$4,300.00 per year.

Grants-In-Aid were made during the year to Jacksonville to the amount of \$1,000, and to Carolina Beach Church to the amount of \$1,250. The Committee hopes to further aid these churches by an additional gift to the Carolina Beach Church of \$500, and the receipts of Call #2 of the Church and Manse Assistance Fellowship for 1957 to the Jacksonville church. The Committee makes regular payments on money borrowed by the Committee for grants-in-aid to the Acme Church and the Chapel on the Boardwalk for sanctuaries, and for the erection of six manses. Payments on these loans amount to \$7,200 per year, plus interest, or approximately \$7,500.00.

The evangelistic record of the aid-receiving churches greatly exceeds that of the self-supporting churches in the Presbytery. During the year 1956 these churches received 109 members on profession of faith, out of a total of 452 received by all the churches. Of the 689 members received on certificate in the Presbytery, these churches received 202. These churches, with one-seventh of the membership, received one-fourth of the new members.

The Stewardship record in aid-receiving churches is poor in comparison to the self-supporting churches. Only two churches in the twenty-four came up to the level of Presbytery in per capita gifts to benevolences, and only six came up to the level of Presbytery in total per capita gifts. Various changes have been made in a number of the pastorates of our churches which you will note in the reading of your minutes of Presbytery.

NEGRO WORK

At present there is no Negro work being carried on in our Presbytery. On an Assembly-wide basis, Negro work is moving rather slowly. There are seventy-four Negro churches, with forty-eight Negro ministers, and a total membership of 5,300. The emphasis in the Assembly's Negro work is being placed on establishing new churches among the educated of the race where there are new housing projects. While this work is outstanding it has put our work with the Negro among those of the "higher level and educated." This plan is followed at the insistence of Drs. Lawrence Bottoms and Claude Pritchard who feel that the illiterate masses have their own patterns in religion. It is a challenging area in which our church is working, promising for the Negro in years to come an able leadership among its own people.

The sub-committees on Radio and Christian Relation have no report to make.

In lieu of a written report from the sub-committee on Evangelism, we request that the Reverend Horace Hilton, chairman of this sub-committee be heard for five minutes as he makes a verbal report.

MINUTES OF WILMINGTON PRESBYTERY

The Rev. J. C. McCann presented the report of the Committee on Homes. It was adopted as follows:

Your Committee on Homes calls your attention to the reports of the Boards of Trustees of Barium Springs Orphanage, Presbyterian Homes Inc., and the William Black Home which were made to the 1957 meeting of the Synod of North Carolina, noting that since the making of these reports the new church at Barium Springs has been dedicated. Your committee makes the following recommendations:

1. That it be called to the attention of the churches of the Presbytery that the Thanksgiving Offering last year was a little lower than in previous years, and the churches be urged to observe the Sunday prior to Thanksgiving as Presbyterian Orphans' Home Sunday and take a special offering for Barium Springs at that time.

2. That the churches of the Presbytery be urged to inform their members about the work of the Presbyterian Home for the Aged at High Point and give their members an opportunity to give to the work especially during the Mother's Day season in the Spring.

Mr. William Beery III reported for the Stewardship Committee. The report was received as information.

The Rev. B. L. Rose gave a verbal report on Christian Relations which was received as information.

MINUTES OF WILMINGTON PRESBYTERY

The minutes of the Commission on the Minister and His Work were read by the acting chairman, the Rev. J. W. Miller, and were admitted to record as follows:

The Commission on the Minister and His Work of Wilmington Presbytery met in the church of Acme, Friday evening August 29, at 7:30 o'clock. Members present: Ministers—J. W. Miller, Charles W. Worth, Samuel N. Thomas; Ruling Elders—H. M. Johnson and W. C. Scoggins. Ex-Officio member L. A. Taylor. Rev. Samuel N. Thomas, Chairman, presided. Ruling Elder H. M. Johnson, Moderator of Presbytery, reported to the Commission that he had appointed Rev. Robert J. Wilkins to serve in the place of Rev. Charles L. Kirby until the next meeting of Presbytery. Mr. Wilkins was enrolled as a member of the Commission, until the next meeting of Presbytery.

The meeting was opened with prayer by the chairman.

Prospective pastors were approved for contact as follows:

For First Church, Wilmington, for Chinquapin and for Faison-Calypto.

Candidate Adolf Otersen was approved to serve as student supply of the Rocky Point and Pike Churches until September 1, 1958.

At the request of the chairman, Rev. Charles W. Worth took the chair and presided for the remainder of the meeting.

Rev. Samuel N. Thomas requested the Commission to dissolve the pastoral relation between him and the Acme Church and grant him a letter of dismissal to the Presbytery of Orange in order that he may accept the call of the Session of the First Church, High Point, to serve as Minister of Education and Assistant Pastor. Mr. O. A. Marrow, a member of the Acme Church, reported that at a regularly constituted meeting of the congregation of the Acme Church, the congregation voted to concur in the request. The request was granted effective September 15, 1957.

THE COMMISSION ON THE MINISTER AND HIS WORK

September 19, 1957

The Commission on the Minister and His Work, of Wilmington Presbytery, met in the St. Andrews-Covenant Church on Thursday, September 19, 1957, at 5:00 p.m. Members present: Miller, Worth, Wilkins, Scoggins and ex-officio member L. A. Taylor. Rev. J. W. Miller, temporary Chairman of the Commission called the meeting to order. Rev. C. W. Worth led in prayer.

MINUTES OF WILMINGTON PRESBYTERY

The request was heard from the Pulpit Nominating Committee of the First Church Wilmington for permission to extend a Call to Rev. John R. McKinnon, of the Presbytery of Pee Dee, for his pastoral services. The terms of the proposed call were heard and approved and approval was given the Church for the issuing of a call.

The request was heard from Rev. Joseph B. MacLeod for the dissolution of the pastoral relationships between himself and the churches of Southport and New Hope in order that he may accept the call of the Westminster church of Beaumont, Texas to serve as Assistant Pastor. He reported that the congregation of Southport had concurred in the request. Mr. T. E. Rabon representing the New Hope church reported that his congregation also concurred in the request. The request for the dissolution of pastoral relationships was granted and the Stated Clerk of the Presbytery was authorized to grant a letter of dismissal to Mr. MacLeod to the Presbytery of Brazos.

The Commission approved the minutes and adjourned with prayer.

A proposed change in the manual was docketed for the January meeting as follows:

The Records Committee of Wilmington Presbytery, desiring to amend Presbytery's Manual, submits the following proposed change and respectfully asks that the proposed revision be docketed for the next stated meeting at which time action can be taken upon it.

The proposed amendment deals with the section outlining the duties of the Records Committee, specifically the last paragraph of section "I" on page twelve. This paragraph now reads as follows:

"The Committee shall be composed of five persons, at least two of whom shall be lay persons, and shall report to Presbytery at the January meeting."

We propose that this paragraph shall be worded as follows:

"The Committee shall be composed of five persons, at least two of whom shall be lay persons. This committee shall undertake the examination of sessional records at the January meeting and may report to Presbytery at the April meeting."

It is impossible for the Record's Committee to undertake the examination of sessional records and to make a thorough report of such an examination in one day. The proposed amendment will allow ample time for a suitable and acceptable report.

MINUTES OF WILMINGTON PRESBYTERY

Jerry C. McCann, of Wrightsville Beach, N. C., such funds as he may have on hand or may receive for the cause of the Camp and Conference Center.

The Ad Interim Committee on Christian Baptism was dissolved with thanks.

The Rev. W. H. Allison reported on the Every Family Plan now being promoted by the Presbyterian Survey and urged members of the Presbytery to give consideration to the use of this plan in their respective churches. The report was received as information.

Rev. Edward Connette reported for the Leave of Absence and recommended that:

MINUTES OF WILMINGTON PRESBYTERY

The Rev. W. S. Smythe, Jr. reported for the Standing Committee on Time and Place of next meeting. The invitation of the Oak Grove Presbyterian Church was accepted as the meeting place on January 21, 1958.

The Rev. H. J. Kaylor read the report of the President of the Women of the Church of Wilmington Presbyterial. It was adopted as follows:

ANNUAL REPORT, WOMEN OF THE CHURCH
WILMINGTON PRESBYTERY

During the third year of the General Assembly's "Forward With Christ" program, the Women of the Church of Wilmington Presbytery have tried to discover and understand the demands and meaning of "Christian Citizenship." The Chairmen of Causes, District Chairmen, Officers and Local groups have emphasized this theme throughout the year. We believe the women have been aroused to their responsibility as a Christian Citizen.

We have 5,098 members in 74 groups. 17 of our women attended Synodical Training School in Raleigh, 24 women, 4 children and 1 man the Woman's Conference at Montreat, 2 the World Mission Conference and 1 Church Extension Conference. 36 of our Young People attended the Sixth Quadrennial Youth Conference in December at Lexington, Ky. Twelve Negro women attended the Negro Woman's Conference at Winston-Salem.

Dr. Balmer Kelly was in our Presbytery in March for our special Bible Study of the Minor Prophets. The Rev. Ludwig Dewitz, of the Emmanuel Center in Baltimore, spoke in eleven churches in September, on the work he is doing among the Jews. He was a real inspiration to all that heard him and we are beginning to realize how we have fallen short in ministering to those living next door to many of us.

We have had encouraging reports of the interest of the women in Bible Study, Prayer Groups, Family Altars, Visitation Evangelism, work with the shut-ins and older adults. Encouraging the Young people to attend Conferences and taking groups to the Vocational Guidance Clinic at Flora Macdonald. Working with the handicapped children and Alcoholics, sending warm clothing for Overseas Relief, aiding the needy in our communities, working in the Church Schools and Vacation Bible Schools. Much has been accomplished for which we are grateful to God and give Him the Glory. We are concerned that we are so low in Benevolent giving as compared with other Presbyteries, that it took 33 of us to win one person for Christ last year—that no new Missionaries have gone from our Presbytery since 1954 and that no new churches have been organized. We realize from this that we have not been good stewards of our time, talents or gifts. As we look forward to our emphasis for 1958 "The Nature and Mission of the Church," we would like the following objectives to permeate the whole work for the year and in every phase of the work:

1. To lead persons to a more complete understanding of the nature and mission of the Church as a fellowship of all believers, instituted by God, in which He confronts man and seeks a response of acceptance and obedience.

2. To help church members understand that their local church is a part of this fellowship and endeavor to make it a fellowship through which the Gospel is proclaimed, an atmosphere created conducive to Christian Growth and experiences are provided for the development of its members in Christlikeness.

3. To help each accept his responsibility in the local Church as a part of the Universal Church. And thus help make the Church what our Lord and Saviour meant it to be.

Section VI, Paragraph 3. Add to the end of the paragraph on Permanent Committees the words, "The Committee on Nominations shall designate a convener for each permanent committee and the committee shall elect its own chairman."

Section VI, Paragraph 3, Subparagraph K. Following the words "into the Presbytery" add the following. "The Chairman shall conduct the examination as a whole calling upon members of the committee to conduct the examinations in their particular areas of responsibility. If the chairman cannot be present he shall designate another member of the committee to conduct the examination as a whole in his place."
