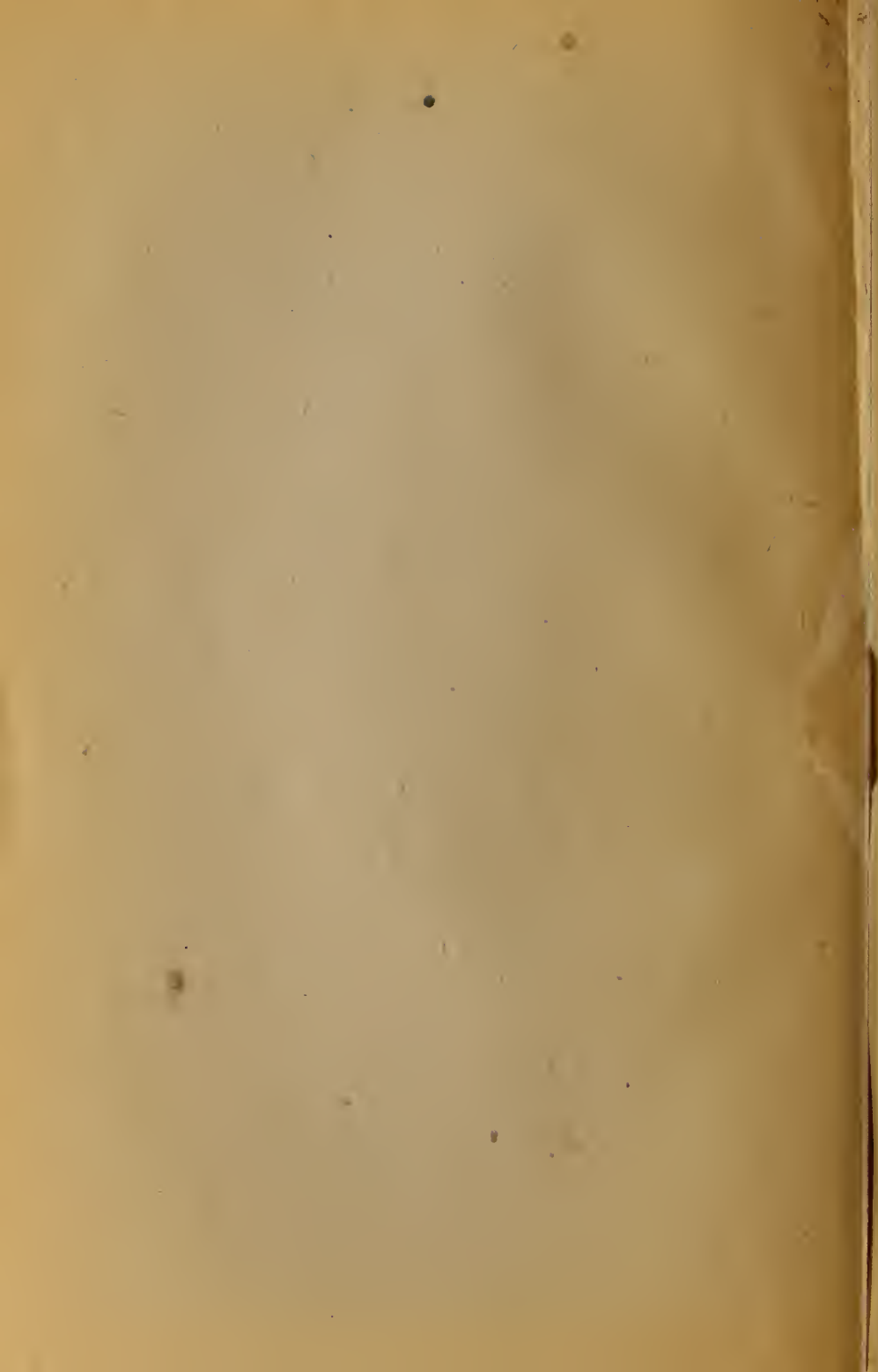

THE RIVER VIEW CHURCH,

Ashe County, N. C., on Friday, Saturday and Sunday,

September 14, 15, and 16,

1900.

PROCEEDINGS.

1. The Introductory Sermon was delivered by Elder D. S. Webb, transient, from the New River Association, from Paul's letter to the Ephesians, 5th Chapter, 9th, 10th, and 11th verses: "For the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness and righteousness and truth." Etc.

2. After a short intermission the messengers assembled in the church house and were called to order by Elder E. A. Long, Correspondent from the Roaring River Association.

3. Received and read letters from all the churches in our Union except New River. And on motion the letters were received and the messengers seated for the transaction of business,

4 Organized the Association by electing Elder T. H. Kilby, Moderator and J. M. Dickson, Clerk, and W. G. Sheppard, Assistant Clerk.

5 Then, on motion. invited correspondents from sister Associations to seats with us, when the following came forward: From Roaring River, Elder E. A. Long and Bro. W. Vannoy with file of minutes; from the Mountain, Bro. J. M. Williams with minutes; from the Washington, letter and minutes by the hand of Elder T. H.

Kilby; Bear Creek, file of minutes: New River, minutes by the hand of Elder D. S. Webb; Silver Creek, Elder E. H. Billings with minutes; Fishers' River, Elder J. M. Royal All of whom were seated with the body and aided in counsel.

6. Then, called for transient ministers and members of our faith and order from sister Associations to seats us, when the following came forward: From the New River, Elder D. S. Webb; from the Roaring River, Brethren J. F. Hutchinson and George Brown, received the right hand of fellowship and seated with the body.

7. On motion, the Moderator was authorized to make all temporary appointments during the session.

8. The Moderator appointed a committee to arrange the ministry during the session as follows, to-wit: W. A. Stuart, C. J. Taylor with the messengers from River View Church, who reported as follows: Saturday, 1st, E. A. Long, 2nd, E. H. Billings, 3rd, A. J. Taylor; Sunday, 1st, J. M. Royal, 2nd, D. S. Webb, 3rd, T. H. Kilby.

9. Called on correspondents who were appointed last year to visit sister Associations to report. Report received and the brethren discharged.

10. Proceeded to appoint correspondents to sister Associations as follows: Fishers' River, T. H. Kilby, A. J. Taylor; Washington, Elisha Roup, R. J. Fender; Silver Creek, J. A. Cave A. J. Taylor; Roaring River, T. H. Kilby, C. C. Davis; New River, R. J. Fender C. J. Taylor; Mountain, A. J. Taylor, R. J. Fender. Agreed to correspond with Kehukee, Bear Creek and Indian Creek by minutes.

11. Appointed a committee on finance as follows: W. A. Stuart, F. L. Colvard and David May. Received from the churches the sum of twenty-two dollars and

80 cents (\$22.80). Left in hands of Clerk for printing minutes, and postage, \$10 80. Distributed to Correspondents \$12.00

12 Appointed committee of arrangements to-wit: C C Davis. A. J. Taylor and J. H. Cave. with the Moderator and Clerk. Correspondents and transients invited to sit with them.

13. Then, on motion, adjourned until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock Prayer by Elder J. M. Royal.

SATURDAY, SEPT. 12th, 1900.

The Association met pursuant to adjournment of yesterday and was opened with prayer by Elder D. S. Webb.

1. Called the names of messengers and marked absentees.

2. Called on committee of arrangements to report. Report received and committee discharged:

3. Agreed to dispense with reading the Constitution and rules of decorum at this time -

4. Agreed to change the time of holding our next Association. Same to commence on Friday before the first Sunday in Oct. 1901. To be held with the Pleasant Grove Church. 18 miles west of Jefferson, N. C.

5 Appointed the Clerk Treasurer and to have one thousand copies of the minutes printed and distributed as usual.

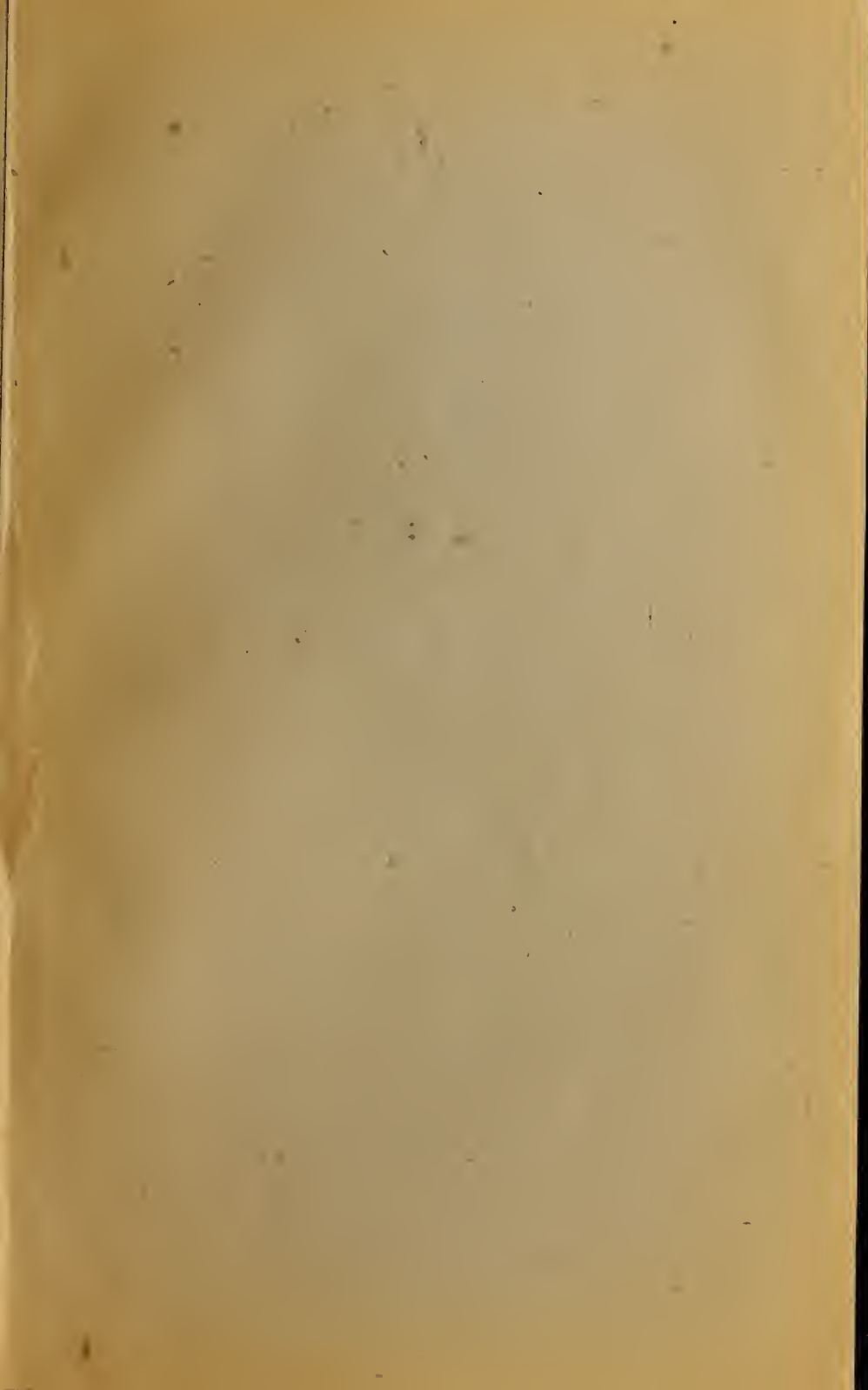
6. Resolved, That we now return thanks to the brethren, sisters and friends for their kindness to us during this session.

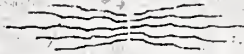

PROCEEDINGS.

The Association met pursuant to adjournment of last year.

1. The introductory sermon was delivered by Eld. A. J. Taylor, from the 1st chapter and part of 21st verse of Mathew: "And thou shalt call his name Jesus."

2. After a short intermission the messengers assembled in the church house and were called to order by singing and prayer by Eld. J. M. Crouse, correspondent from the Roaring River Association.

3. Received messengers and letters from all the churches in our union except Bear Creek and on motion the letters were received and the messengers seated for the transaction of business.

4. Then proceeded to organize the association by appointing Eld. T. H. Kilby, Moderator, J. M. Dickson, Clerk and W. G. Sheppard, Assistant Clerk.

5. Then on motion called for correspondents from sister associations when the following came forward: From the Washington, letter and minutes by the hands H. B. Scott and L. M. Cisco; Roaring River, Eld. J. M. Crouse; Silver Creek, William Draughan with minutes; From Kahukee and Bear Creek, minutes by Eld. A. J. Taylor.

6. Then on motion invited transient brethren of our faith and order to seat with us, when Eld. H. B. Miller and brethren H. B. Scott and L. M. Cisco, from the Washington, accepted, were given the right hand of fellowship and seated with the body.

7. Then on motion authorized the Moderator to make all temporary appointments during the session.

8. The Moderator appointed a committee to arrange the preaching during the session as follows, to wit: Brethren C. J. Taylor, Alex Dickson with the messengers from Pleasant Grove church, who reported for Saturday, 1st J. M. Crouse, 2nd. A. J. Taylor, 3rd. H. B. Miller. For Sunday, 1st. H. B. Miller, 2nd. T. H. Kilby, 3rd. A. J. Taylor.

SENTER PRIMITIVE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

9. Then on motion called on correspondents who were appointed last year to visit sister associations to report, who reported satisfactory and were discharged.

10. Then on motion proceeded to appoint correspondents to sister associations as follows, towit: Washington, T. H. Kilby and R. J. Fender; Silver Creek, A. J. Taylor, J. A. Cave and C. C. Davis; New River, A. J. Taylor and T. H. Kilby; Mountain, J. A. Cave and R. J. Fender. Fishers River agreed to correspond by letter and minutes. Bro. L. S. Jones appointed to prepare the same. Agreed to correspond with Kahukee, Bear Creek and Indian Creek by minutes.

11. Then appointed a Committee of Finance as follows: Brethren J. B. McMillan, J. K. Francis and J. F. Hartzog, who reported as follows: Received from the churches \$21.55; allowed for printing minutes and postage \$8.80; allowed Clerk for services \$2.00; distributed to correspondents \$10.75.

12. Appointed Committee of Arrangements as follows: Brethren C. J. Taylor, William A. Stuart and Eld. J. A. Cave with Moderator and Clerk. Correspondents and transients invited to seat with them.

13. On motion adjourned until 9 o'clock tomorrow morning.

SATURDAY MORNING, OCT. 5, 1901.

The association met pursuant to adjournment of yesterday and was called to order by singing and prayer by Eld. J. A. Cave.

1. Called the names of messengers and marked absentees.

2. On motion agreed to dispense with the reading of the Constitution and Rules of Decorum at this time.

3. Called on the Committee of Arrangements to report, who reported and were discharged.

4. We advise the respective churches in our union to set apart their regular meeting days during the month of November next as days of fasting and prayer.

5. Agreed to send a friendly letter of correspondence to Roaring River Association. Bro. C. J. Taylor appointed to bear the same.

6. Appointed the Clerk Treasurer, to superintend the printing of the minutes; to have 800 copies printed and distributed.

7. On motion appointed a committee to visit Bear Creek church and learn the cause of their failing to represent in the association, as follows: Elds. C. C. Davis, R. J. Fender and Bro. John H. Wagoner, and report to our next association.

9. Appointed the next association to be held with the Roans Creek church, 8 miles east of Jefferson, commencing Friday before the 1st Sunday in October 1902.

10. Resolved that we now return thanks to God, the brethren and sisters and friends of this vicinity for their kindness to us during this session.

11. Resolved that we now adjourn to the time and place of our next meeting,

OBITUARY.

The subject of this notice was born in Ashe county, N.C., Sept. 12th, 1813. Died December the 16th, 1900. Aged, 87 years and 4 days. Bro Phipps joined the Primitive Baptist church in early life at Elk Creek, remaining with the Elk Creek church until his removal to Watauga county, N. C., where he joined the Baptist Valley church by letter, where he remained a devoted and consistent member until he fell asleep in Jesus. Bro. Phipps' home about 18 years ago and taken from his embrace a lovely christian wife and mother. 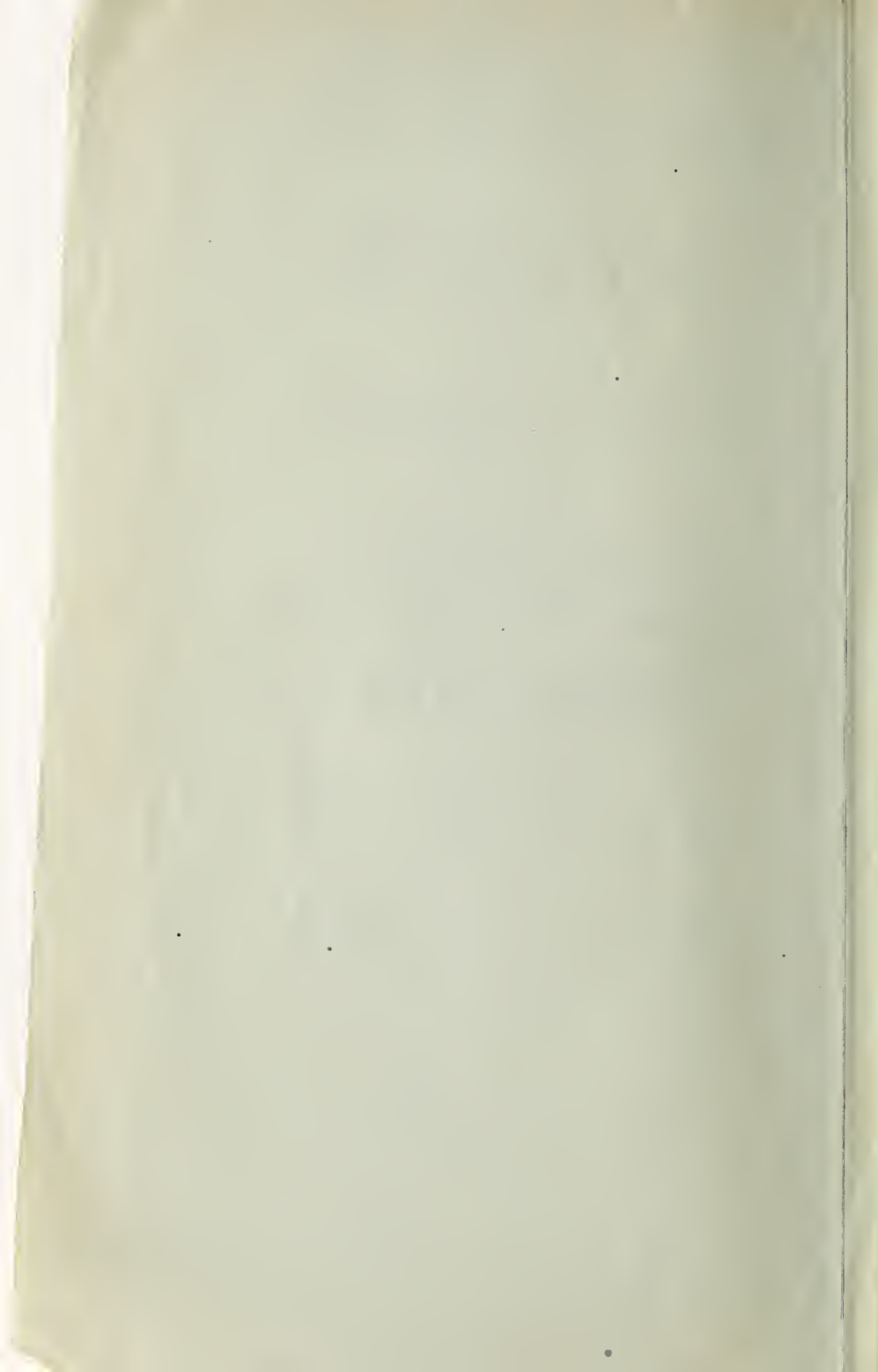

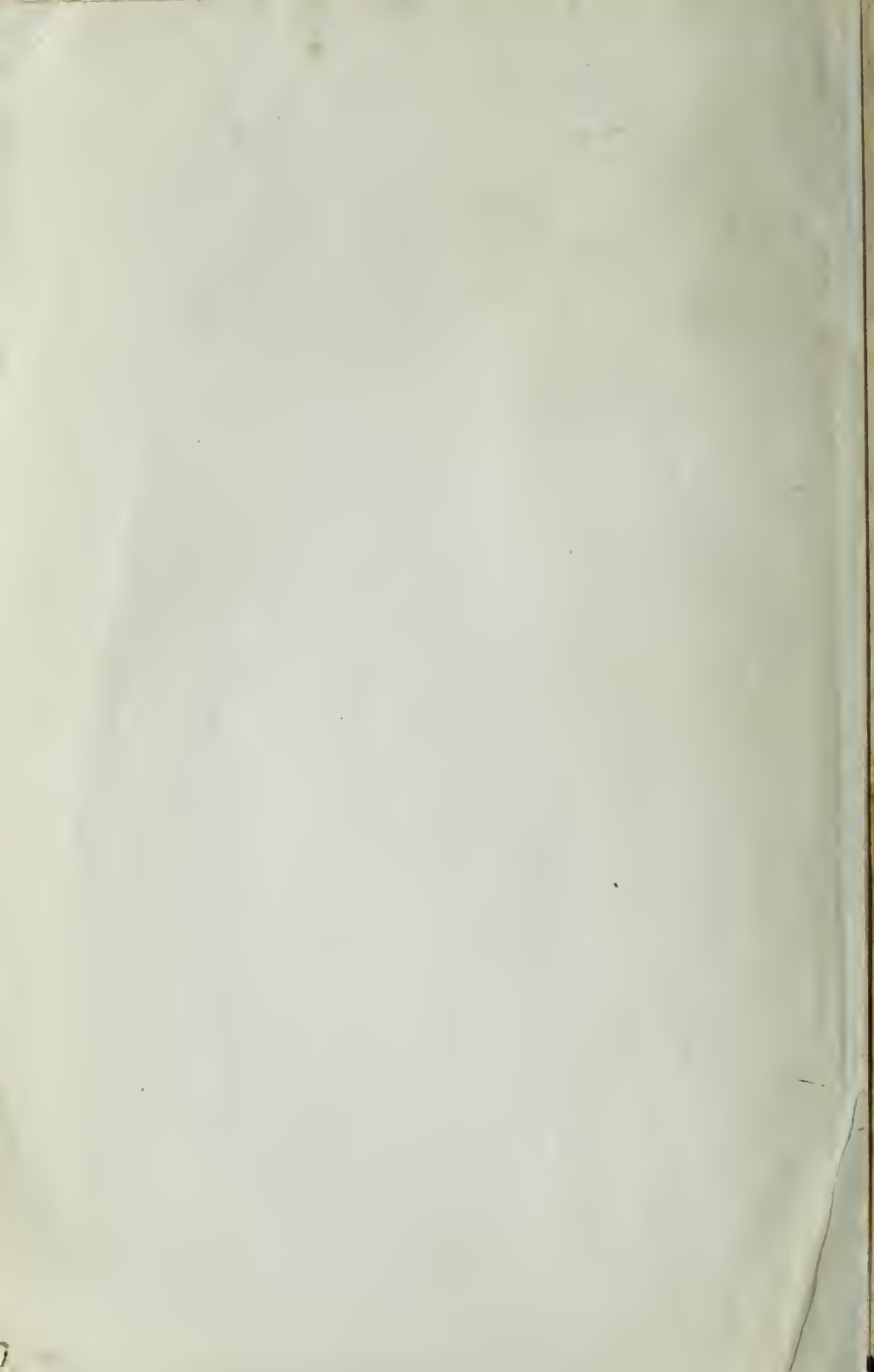

4. We believe in the doctrine of original sin.
5. We believe in man's impotency to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by nature by his own free will or ability.
6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God, only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.
7. We believe that God's elect shall be called, converted, regenerated and sanctified by the Holy Ghost.
8. We believe that the Saints shall persevere in Grace and never fall finally away.
9. We believe that Baptism, the Lord's Supper and Feet-Washing are ordinances of Jesus Christ and the only true mode of Baptism is by immersion.
10. We believe in the resurrection of the dead and a general judgment.
11. We believe that the joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked will be eternal.
12. We believe that no minister has a right to the administration of the ordinances except such as are regularly called and come under the hands of a Presbytery.
13. We believe it to be disorder for members of the church to unite with any of the secret institutions of the day.

Senter Church, Ashe Co., N. C., Sept. 12, 1919.

The Association met pursuant to adjournment of last year.

The Introductory sermon was delivered by Eld. P. K. Roberts, a visitor from the Mountain association. Text: Hebrews 10 Chapt. 10 and 11 verses, "By the which will we are sanctified etc."

CONSTITUTION

The Churches from the Mountain Association, Cranberry, Senter, South Fork, Silas Creek and Big Helton, and also from the Three Fork Association, Beaver Creek, Bear Creek, North Fork and Horse Creek, having been dismissed from the Mountain and Three Fork Association, at their annual meetings in A. D. 1853, to form a new Association, met by their respective delegates in Convention, with the Senter Church, 21st, October, 1853, formed and adopted the present Constitution of the Senter Association.

Article 1.—This Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different Churches in our union and duly sent to represent them in the association.

2.—Who in producing letters from their respective Churches certifying their appointments, shall be entitled to their seats. Each church shall be entitled to three delegates. In their letters is to be expressed their No., in full fellowship, those baptized, received by letter, excluded, and dead, since the last Association.

3.—The members thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord it over the God's heritage, nor shall they have any classical

power over the Churches, nor shall they infringe any internal right over any church in the Union.

4.—The Association shall be governed and ruled by a regular Decorum.

5.—The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk, who shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.

6.—New Churches are any regular Baptist Church of Jesus Christ, of our faith and order, being legally dismissed by letter from any Sister Association upon application by letter and Delegates shall be admitted into our union.

7.—Every Church in the union shall be entitled to representation in the Association.

8.—Every query first being delegated in the church and then presented in the association shall be read and debated and answered, unless it be withdrawn by the member who presents it.

9.—Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the association, except it be withdrawn by the member who made it.

10.—The association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with the number of the proceedings, the best method for accomplishing this purpose, shall be at the discretion of the future Association.

11.—We think it necessary to have an Association fund to defray the expenses of the same, and it is the duty of each Church in the Union to contribute such sums as they think proper to the Association, and those monies shall be deposited in the hands of a Treasurer, who shall be accountable to the Association for the same.

12.—There shall be an Association book wherein the proceeding of the Association shall be regularly recorded by a secretary, appointed by the Association, who shall receive a compensation yearly for his trouble.

13.—The minutes of the Association shall be read and corrected, if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association rises.

14.—Amendments to their plan or form of government may be made at any time by a majority of the Association, when they may deem it necessary by giving the Churches twelve months notice.

15.—The Association shall have power to provide for the general Union of the Churches to endeavor to preserve a chain of Communion amongst the Churches, to give the Church the necessary advice in matters of difficulty.

16.—To inquire into the cause if any Churches fail to represent themselves at any time in the Association.

17.—To appropriate those monies contributed by the Churches for an Association fund, to any purpose they may think proper.

18.—The Association shall have power to withdraw from any Church in this Union which shall violate the rules of this Constitution, or deviate from the orthodox principles of the Gospel.

19.—The Association may correspond with Sister Associations.

20.—To invite any distant brother in the ministry of our Faith and Order to a seat in the Association who may be present at the time of their sitting.

21.—The Association shall have power to adjourn themselves to any future time or place they may think proper.

OBITUARY

By request of the children I will write a short obituary of Sister Sibbie Ham, who was born December 11th, 1822, died December the 28th, 1917, making her stay on Earth 95 years 17 days. She was married to Brother John Ham, date not known by the writer, to this union was born 7 children, two died in infancy and the eldest son died about one year ago in California, which leaves two sons and two daughters to mourn the loss of a dear mother. 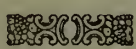

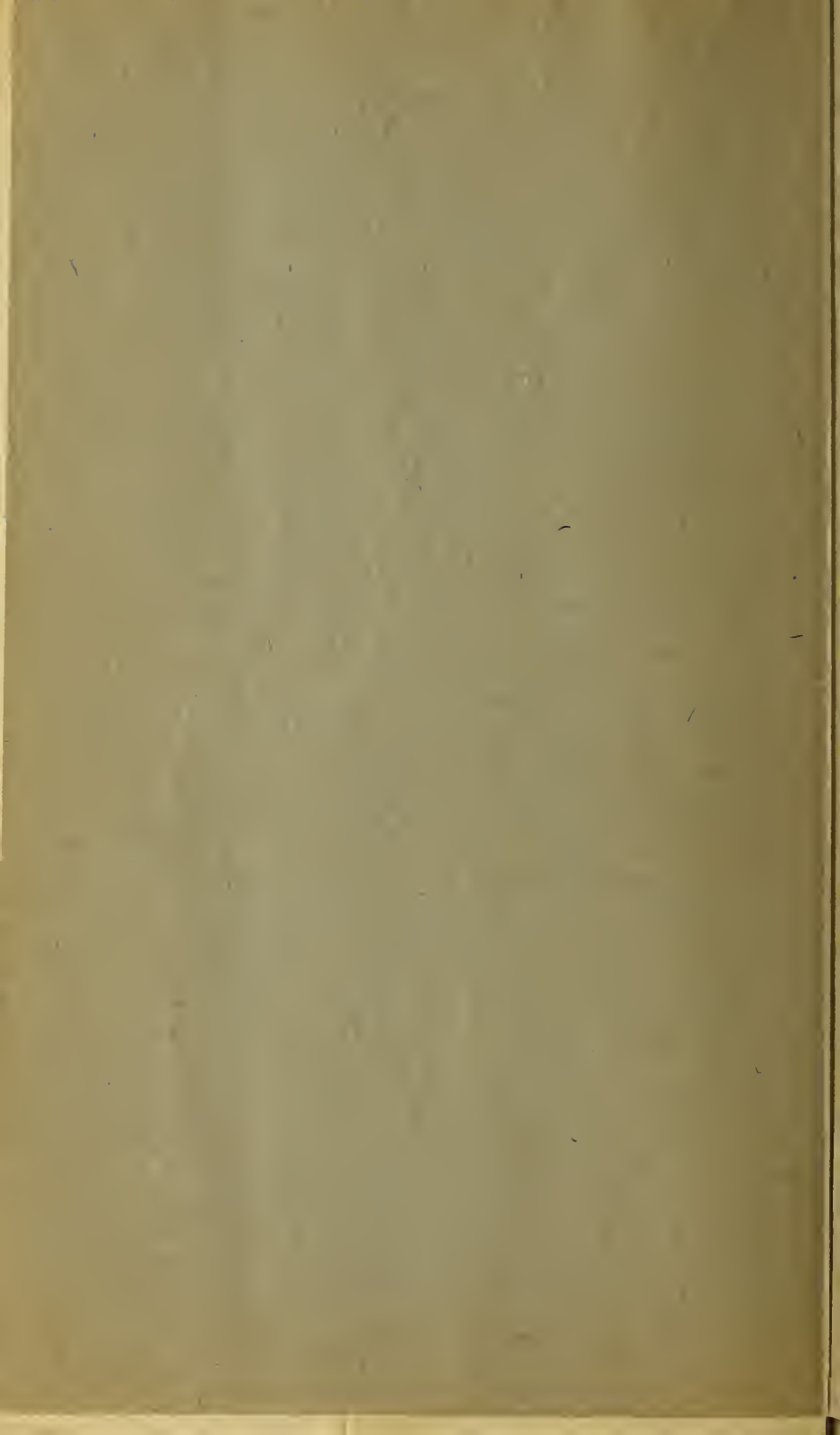

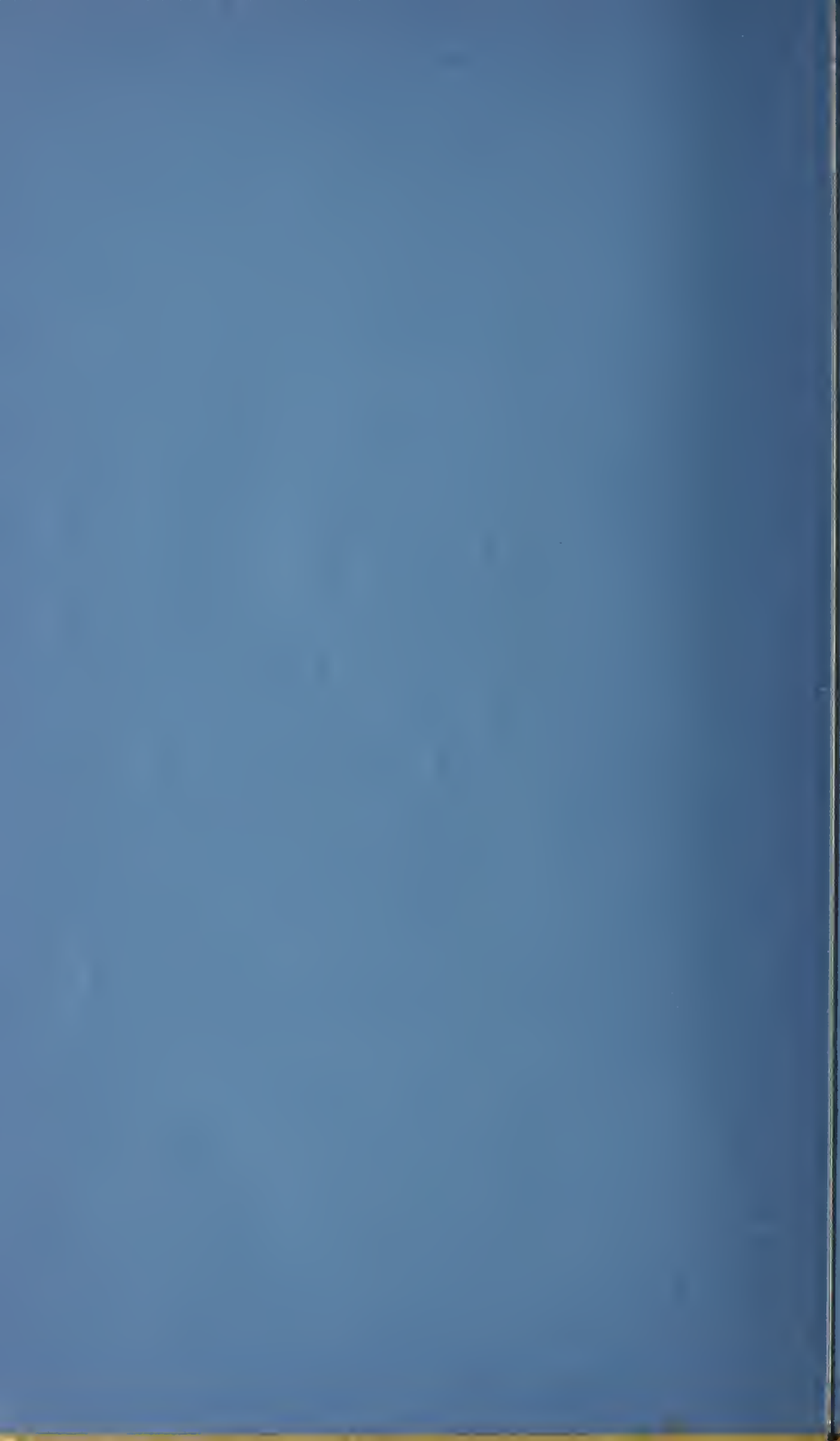
