# PROCEEDINGS.

FRIDAY, OCT. 22, 1909.

Introductory service, Song, "Am I a Soldier of the Cross." Prayer offered by Eld. A. McKnight. Sermon by Eld. Wm. Miles, text, St. John, 19:36, "My Kingdom is not of this World." Adjournment 20 minutes. The delegates reassembled in the church. Opening services, song, "Brethren, we have met again." Prayer offered by Eld. F. M. Osborn.

Called for Associational letters when 13 were handed in and read and the delegates seated.

On motion invited newly constituted churches of our faith and order to unite with us. No one accepted.

On motion elected officers by private ballot and appointed Elders A. McKnight, W. A. J. Fowlkes and F. M. Osborn tellers who reported Eld. J. M. Owens, Moderator and L. D. Lowe, Secretary. Report received and brethren discharged.

On motion invited correspondents of our faith and order when Elder W. A. J. Fowlkes, Elder M. C. Powers and Bro. Avery Powers from the Mt. Union Association. Blue Ridge reported by letter. Elders A. McKnight, W. M. Andrews, F. M. Osborn, E. A. Long and Bros. Wyly Combs, S. M. Edwards and W. R. Bauguss from Little River accepted seats, and Eld-W. F. Gregory from Mitchels River.

On motion invited transients and visitors of our faith and order when Joseph Powers from Mt. Union Association accepted seat.

On motion authorized the Moderator to make all temporary appointments during this session.

The following committees were appointed: On ministry—T. P. Hanks, A. Felts and R. M. Huie with the delegates of this church who reported for tomorrow, 1st, Elder E. A. Long, 2nd, Elder F. M. Osborn, 3rd, Eld. M. C. Powers.

Finance—F. M. Adams, C. E. Dimmette, and W. A. Adams. Arrangements—A. Caudill, Wm. McGrady, H. E. Harrald, J. M. Brown, W. R. Handy and invited Moderator, Secretary and correspondents to sit with committee of arrangements.

Sabba h Schools-H. H. Jennings, H. A. Adams and Wm. Cothren.

Resolutions—J. W. Brooks, R. C. Cothren and Pate Wood. Temperance—W. L. Wyatt, G. W. Brown and G. W. Miles.

Obituaries-The Clerks of the churches.

Appointed C. L. Cheek to write a corresponding letter to the Mt. Union Association, G. W. Brown to the B ue Ridge, H. H. Jennings to the Little River, F. M. Adams to Mitchels River and have said letters ready for inspection to-morrow.

On motion adjourned till 9:30 A. M. tomorrow; song, "Amazing Grace, etc." Prayer by the Moderator. Benediction by A. McKnight.

## SATURDAY, OCT. 23rd, 1909.

Met persuant to adjournment of yesterday. Spent 30 minutes in devotional exercise.

Called on committee on Arrangements to report who reported and were discharged.

Agreed to dispose of items as they appear on bill of arrangements.

Read the Constitution, Rules of Decorum and Articles of Faith.

Extended an invitation to transients and visitors of same faith and order. No one accepted.

Called roll of delegates and marked absentees.

Read and received minutes of yesterday.

Called on Committee on Sabbath Schools to report, who reported, viz:

"We advise all the churches in our bounds to organize Sunday Schools for the purpose of teaching the Word of God." We also advise parents to go with children and encourage the work for we believe it to be a good help to the worship of God.

Called on Committee on Resolutions to report, who reported viz:

That we ask our churches to earnestly contend for the Faith once delivered to the Saints. 2nd; That our ministers visit the different churches in our bounds as often as possible and strictly adhere to the teachings of God's Word. 3rd, That churches look after and aid scriptural objects of charity. 4th. That we strictly adhere to the word order. 5th, That we return our thanks to the brethren and sisters of this community for their kind hospitality shown us during this session.

Called on Committee on Temperance to report, who reported, viz:

We suggest that our ministers teach and preach temperance and urge our layety to adhere to this Bible teaching and deal with any member who may persistently drink to excess.

Robertson; to Mitchels River at Center View Church, 2 miles below Dobson, J. W. Byrd, Eli Sebastian and J. O. Wood.

Called for Obituaries to be spread on these minutes when eight were reported and ordered printed.

Appointed L. D. Lowe Treasurer and that he superintend the printing and distribution of 500 copies of these minutes and allow him \$4.00 for his services,

Authorized the Treasurer to hand to the Moderator the residue of the minute fund after the Secretary and printers are paid.

By request we submit the following preamble, viz:

We are willing for our members to visit any denomidation who will endorse our principles, practice our doctrine and aid if they see proper in carrying out any gospel ordinance, and what we grant to our people we are willing to extend to others.

Appointed our next session to convene with Round Mountain church eight miles east of Wilkesboro, N. C., commencing on Friday before the fourth Lord's day in Oct. 1919. Elder William Walker to preach introductory sermon, Elder J. O. Wood, alternate.

On motion dispensed with reading of minutes of to-day.

On motion adjourned to time and place of our next session. Song, "Blessed be the tie that binds," etc. Prayer offered by Eld. F. M. Osborn. Benediction by the Moderator.
