## PROCEEDINGS.

---

The Eighth Annual Session of the Cape Fear Annual Conference of the A. M. E. Zion church held with St. John's A. M. E. Zion Church, Wilson, N. C., Dec. 3rd, 1919. Conference opened with devotional exercises. Bishop A. J. Warner presiding.

Presiding Elders Dr. J. H. Mosely, P. W. Lawrence and C. D. Hazel, assisted in devotional exercises. The 223 hymn was lined by the Bishop and sung by Conference led by the choir.

The Bishop read the first Scripture lesson from the 4th chapter of St. James and commented upon the same. Dr. P. W. Lawrence addressed the Throne of Grace in a very fervent manner. The choir chanted Sweet Hour of Prayer. He stated that according to the program Rev. F. Simms is to preach the opening sermon. The speaker selected his text from the 7th chapter of St. John 37. Jesus said on the last day of the feast: If any man thirst let him come unto me and drink. After describing the manner of the feast and the way it was held, the speaker proceeded to outline the aim and objects of the ancient feast and showed the necessity of us celebrating his Sacramental feast of today, viz: The last supper instituted by the Saviour of mankind, yea the Son of the living God. The speaker greatly emphasized the necessity of every man accepting the salvation of God. Listen! If any man thirst let him come unto Christ and drink. The greater the thirst the more a man needs to drink. To say the least it was a splendid sermon earnestly and intensely delivered. After the sermon the Conference partook of the Lord's supper. 126 in number. A collection was lifted. The next was the election of officers of the Conference as follows: Rev. H. P. Walker, Chief Secretary; Rev. J. R. Davis Recorder; Rev. E. S. Burney and C. Hudson were nominated for Statistical Secretaries. Rev. Hudson received the majority of votes and was declared by the Bishop Statistical Secretary; Marshals, Bro. J. A. Quince, D. J. George, Rev. T. F. Shepard; elected reporter to the Star, Rev. B. G. Coward; P. O. Messenger, Rev. C. C. Williams.

The Committee on Rules made their report. (See report.)

On motion the report was adopted.

After a few remarks from the Bishop Conference took recess until 3:30 o'clock.

## FIRST DAY—AFTERNOON SESSION.

Conference re-convened at 3:35. "Up unto Thee, our Living Head," was sung and the Bishop led in repeating the Lord's prayer. He then announced the session open and ready for business. The following general officers and visiting ministers were introduced as follows: Rev. C. C. Williams, Dr. E. D. W. Jones, C. H. Moore, Dr. Wadkins, Rev. S. J. Walls, J. T. Tillman, Rev. Atwood, Dr. M. D. Smith, C. S. Whitted, Dr. W. H. Goler, Rev. N. D. King, Prof. D. C. Suggs, Prof. Aaron Brown, J. W. Martin, B. W. Swain, Dr. J. C. Dancy, Dr. J. H. Anderson, and others. Prof. C. H. Moore was called upon to say a few words in regards to his work in rural schools. He urged the necessity of helping ourselves while we had some one to help us in the person of Mr. Rosinwald, that is furnishing the money that we so much need. Dr. J. C. Dancy was asked to lift a collection which amounted to \$15.00. Dr. B. W. Swain, of Boston, Mass., was introduced to the Conference and made a very pleasing speech, giving some brief reminiscences of his early start in the ministry and his present success. After which the Bishop sang, "And are we yet alive," &c. Dr. Madison spoke very eloquently as to the positiveness of Dr. Swain's purely moral life. Dr. O. L. W. Smith made some very pointed remarks in regards to Dr. Swain's early days and after a few remarks from the Bishop Conference adjourned to 7:30 p. m.

## FIRST DAY—NIGHT SESSION.

Opened with devotional services conducted by Rev. A. E. Hudson and A. M. Martin. Rev. Hudson lined No. 442, "Oh it is hard to work for God," etc. Rev. Hudson read the Scripture lesson from the 4th chapter of Hebrews. Rev. A. M. Martin addressed the Throne of Grace, after which Rev. Hudson lined hymn No. 495: "From every stormy wind that blows," &c. The same was sung by the choir and congregation. The Bishop introduced as speaker of the hour to preach the annual sermon the Rev. G. P. H. Anderson, Pastor of the Rehoboth Circuit. He selected a text from the 4th chapter of Hebrews and 3rd verse, We which believe do enter into rest. He spoke intently upon the subject, Rest. He spoke first as to the unrest of the world of today. How much we

should do in order to enter into that perfect rest. The speaker was very enthusiastic. After the sermon the Bishop led in singing, "Jesus Lover of my soul," the refrain Prof. D. C. Suggs and Aaron Brown were requested to raise the collection. Dr. E. L. Madison, a member of the Finance Committee also assisted in the collection which amounted to \$50.27. After this the Hon. Mr. Swindell was introduced as proxy for the Mayor of the City to deliver the welcome address on behalf of the city. After speaking a few humorous words as to the success of a minister in raising money, the speaking launched out into another field of thought bearing upon the supreme critical conditions that the country is now facing and insisted that each one present prepare themselves to meet the situation in a sane manner. He laid great stress upon the power of Christianity, and that it would be at last conquerer. He sat down in the midst of storm of applause. Dr. Mitchner delivered a welcome on behalf of the Sunday schools. A welcome address on behalf of the city churches by Rev. H. B. Taylor of the Presbyterian Church; a welcome on behalf of the City Graded School by Prof. M. D. Coly, Principal; On behalf of the Medical Profession by Dr. F. S. Hargrave. A welcome on behalf of the business interests by Prof. S. H. Vick. The responses were delivered by Dr. J. C. Dancy, E. L. Madison and others. All of the above gentlemen played their part well. It was a splendid array of literary talent that was very helpful to all present.

Conference adjourned to meet at 10 o'clock to-morrow. Benediction by Dr. O. L. W. Smith.

## SECOND DAY—MORNING SESSION.

Opened by singing "How happy every child of grace," &c. Dr. Brown addressed the Throne of Grace in a most fervent manner. Dr. Jones led in singing: "Are you washed in the Blood?" The Bishop made some explanation as to his inability to meet some of his appointments. Rev. A. J. Gorham fraternal delegate from the Albemarle Conference, and Rev. A. H. Hatwood were introduced to the Conference with other visitors.

The roll was called and corrected and the minutes were read and approved. Bro. S. J. Walls of the Center Conference, delivered his fraternal message which was listened to



with attentive ears. Bro. J. T. Tarboro, of the West North Carolina Conference, also delivered his fraternal message. Rev. Tillman, of the Central Conference, made an inspiring talk.

Bro. R. McN. Williams, representing part of the Wilmington District, reported that the Southern part of which he represented all the churches asked the return of the pastors and Presiding Elder.

Bro. J. C. L. Robinson, of the Northern part of the Wilmington District, all asked the return of the same Pastors and Presiding Elder.

Bro. J. C. Kornegay, of the Goldsboro District, representing the Northern part of his district made his report. All of the churches asked the return of the pastors and Presiding Elder.

Mr. M. Hobbs, representing the Southern portion of the Goldsboro District, reported that all the churches asked the return of the same pastors and Presiding Elder.

Mrs. M. E. Nelson, special delegate from Paynes Temple church, Mount Olive, made her report, setting forth the wonderful progress made under the pastorate of Rev. E. A. Hudson asked especially the return of Rev. Hudson for another year.

Bro. E. D. Peace, of the Hallsboro Church, special delegate, made his report asking the return of Rev. E. W. Smith for another year.

Bro. C. B. Turner, representing the Western part of the Clarkton District, made his report. All the churches asked the return of the same pastors and Presiding Elder.

Bro. D. D. McKeathren, representing the Eastern part of the Clarkton District, made his report. All the churches asked the return of the same pastors and Presiding Elder, with the exception of the Clarkton Circuit they left the appointment to the Godly judgment of the Bishop.

A resolution was offered asking the return of Bishop A. J. Warner as Bishop of the Cape Fear Conference for another ensuing term of four years. Revs. A. A. Croke and A. McCallum and others spoke complimentary to the resolution. The motion was carried.

Dr. E. D. W. Jones made some very important remarks concerning the Bishop and other General Conference matters.

Dr. P. A. Wallace, of the New York Conference, was called to speak a word to the brethren. Dr. Wallace said that he was not here as a transfer, but just walking about in Zion

as a means of rest, because of the arduous task of raising the amount of \$8,000.00 paying the Fleet Church of Brooklyn entirely out of debt. Dr. Wallace made a grand impression on the Conference and sat down in the midst of a strong applause.

Dr. Hughes, a Government Representative, was allowed to speak as to the Social Evil diseases. He gave a vivid explanation of the deceitfulness of men's diseases that are eating the very vitals of the human race, regardless of rank or title.

After which Conference took recess until 3:30 p. m.

---

## SECOND DAY—AFTERNOON SESSION.

Opened by singing, "Am I a Soldier of the Cross?" Rev. J. L. Ham addressed the Throne of Grace. Dr. E. D. W. Jones led in singing, "Leaning on his everlasting arms." The Presiding Elder Dr. C. D. Hazell of the Wilmington District, made a partial report. (See report.) Rev. A. H. Hatwood was called upon to speak on the subject of the Ter-Centenary Campaign of our Church. After the speech a subscription was opened for the Ter-Centenary Drive which amounted to \$376.00. Bro. R. L. Lee was elected Treasurer of the Ter-Centenary Fund for the Conference.

Benediction by Rev. E. S. Burney.

## NIGHT SESSION.

Conference opened at 7:30. The choir sang a selection, "O how lovely is Zion," &c. Dr. Orton lined hymn No. 208, "I love Thy Kingdom, Lord," &c., which was sung by the choir and congregation. Dr. Smith read as Scripture lesson the 23rd chapter of Genesis. Rev. J. S. Bell, of the North Carolina Conference, addressed the Throne of Grace in a most humble manner. The choir chanted a selection, "Abide with me," &c. Dr. ——— lined hymn No. 390, "Joy awake my soul," &c., which was sung by the choir. The Bishop then arose and introduced Dr. E. L. Madison, of St. Luke's Church, Wilmington, who would preach at this hour. Dr. Madison arose and led in a short prayer and sang a selection, "I heard my Savior say," &c. He then took for a text the 40th chapter of the Prophecy of the Prophet Isaiah, 16th verse: And Lebanon is not sufficient to burn, nor the beasts thereof for a burnt offering. After picturing the beauties of

Lebanon and the sanctuary, and its grandeur, he said that the priest of the temple looked to Lebanon for the gold and silver that would beautify the sanctuary. He said the people and the Priest all depended on Lebanon but if you go into the forest and get all the timber and into the quarry and get all the stones, if you would go into the mines and get all the gold and silver it would not be sufficient to atone for the sin of man, but when the blood of the bullock and of doves could no longer atone for man, Jesus came and said, Lo I come to do thy will, O God. The speaker portrayed the fact that the blood of Jesus was the only sufficiency to save, and to face sin. It is putting it very mildly when we say that Dr. Madison preached a most noble sermon and sat down amidst many amens. The Bishop then arose and led in singing, "I will trust in the Lord," &c. He then opened the doors of the church. Dr. Coward, the pastor, in well chosen words introduced Mr. Bruton, the President of the First National Bank of Wilson, who had consented to come and deliver an address to the Conference, which he did to the delight of all present. The Bishop then arose and introduced Prof. Suggs, the President of Livingston College, who arose in his might and cheered the souls of the audience with his splendid oratorical eloquence. After which Bishop Blackwell and Dr. E. L. Madison were asked to lift the collection, which they did to the amount of \$111.10. Bishop made some announcements. The Rev. A. H. Hatwood made his Centenarian report which showed \$625.50 subscribed and cash paid \$300.55. Bishop then introduced to the Conference Bishop Blackwell and other ministers of the Virginia Conference. Bishop Blackwell made a short and inspiring talk as to the effort being made in the drive. Announcement was made.

Conference adjourned. Benediction by E. L. Madison.

---

### THIRD DAY—MORNING SESSION.

Opened with devotional services conducted by Rev. R. G. Smith and J. Nelson, after which Bishop Warner introduced Prof. Brown, of Howard University, who delivered a grand address on the subject of Ministerial Education, and especially to the young men who are now expecting to fill the pulpits of the present and coming ages.

The Bishop said because Rev. A. A. Crook would have to



leave in a short while that he would now have the privilege of speaking to the Conference. This he did in a very enthusiastic manner especially that part of it pertaining to a stationed Bishop in Africa, and that Dr. Crook is a candidate for that very important mission. His speech was as nails driven in a sure place. Next the Presiding Elder of the Goldsboro District was called to make his report. (See report.) Total amount collected for all purposes \$53,636.24.

Dr. C. D. Hazel, Presiding Elder of the Wilmington District finished his report. (See report.) Total collected in the district for all purposes \$26,376.86.

The ministers of the Goldsboro district presented to the Bishop a purse of \$25.00 part payment on a gold watch. Also Dr. B. P. Coward presented to Dr. J. H. Mosely from the ministers of Goldsboro a handsome suit of clothes at a cost of \$70.00. Dr. C. D. Hazell was presented a suit of clothes and money to the amount of one hundred dollars by Dr. E. L. Madison.

The characters of the Ministers of the Wilmington District passed.

The characters of the ministers of the Goldsboro District passed.

Dr. P. W. Lawrence of the Clarkton District made his report. (See report.) Total collected for all purposes \$32,359.70.

The characters of the ministers of the Clarkton District passed.

A collection amounting to \$9.30 was taken to erect a monument over the grave of Rev. E. S. W. Simmons at Tomahawk, N. C. Benediction by the Bishop.

---

### THIRD DAY—AFTERNOON SESSION.

Conference reconvened at 3:30 o'clock. The Bishop led in singing, "Up unto Thee our living Head." Rev. R. O. Spaulding led in prayer. The Bishop requested that Dr. J. W. Martin, Educational Secretary, make his report. (See report.) Report is as follows:

The report was adopted.

The next was election of delegates to the General Conference of 1920: B. P. Coward, P. W. Lawrence, J. R. Davis, W. S. Foster, S. P. Hill, E. W. Smith.

The above were declared elected delegates and the following were elected Alternates: A. E. Lomax, G. R. Richardson, P. B. Peacock, E. M. Green, Anderson, Hudson.

Lay Delegates elected as follows: Mrs. D. D. McKiever, R. McN. Williams. Alternates, R. L. Lee, C. B. Toomer.

Dr. S. P. Cook, Fraternal Delegate from the Virginia Conference, made his report, which was grand in every particular and very encouraging and especially that part referring to Zion's success in Richmond, Va., and Petersburg, and Norfolk. Total amount collected for the two Conferences \$1,010.

Dr. C. T. Alexander, of Petersburg, was introduced and spoke a few words of encouragement to the Conference. This he did much to the satisfaction of all present.

Rev. A. J. Gorham was called to speak as he is to leave to-night. He also made a speech pertaining to his candidacy for the Missionary Secretary. This being Missionary night the ladies of the Home and Foreign Mission Department, with Dr. Wood presiding took charge of the meeting. Dr. Gorham was endorsed for Foreign Missionary Secretary.

---

### NIGHT SESSION.

Service began at 8:35 o'clock. It being Missionary night Mrs. Annie Warner presided. The choir sang a selection. Scripture lesson was read by Mrs. Mosely from the 62nd chapter of the prophecy of Isaiah. Mrs. Cassie Moore, District President of the Wilmington District, addressed the Throne of Grace. Miss Dorson, of the Presbyterian Church, sang a solo. Paper was read by Mrs. Sarah Kemp. Splendid recitation, quartette and solo was rendered by others. The literary exercises were in every way a splendid treat lifting the hearts of every one to heights of literary enjoyment.

Dr. J. W. Wood, the Secretary of Foreign Missions, was introduced to deliver the missionary address. Dr. Wood came forward and in a most eloquent manner delivered a splendid address to the delight of all concerning the mission work in Africa. He closed his speech by singing, "There were ninety and nine that safely lay." &c., and sit down amidst a great shout. The Bishop arose and led in singing

the Old Commission song, "Go preach my gospel saith the Lord," &c., at which time a collection was taken up to the amount of \$153.60. Program was continued. After being completed the Bishop made announcements. Different committees were called. Conference adjourned. Benediction by Bishop Blackwell.

---

#### FOURTH DAY—MORNING SESSION.

Conference convened at 10:55 o'clock, Bishop A. J. Warner presiding, who opened the Conference by singing, "Am I a Soldier of the Cross," &c. Rev. W. H. Flowers addressed the Throne of Grace. Minutes were read and on motion adopted with the necessary corrections. The special delegates Miss Virginia Speight, G. S. Spaulding and G. W. Jones made their report asking the return of pastor and some changes be made on the Rehoboth Circuit. Dr. C. S. Whitted made his report. The question pertaining to the slab for Dr. E. S. W. Simmons' grave arose and was explained by Dr. E. L. Madison and a collection was taken up for this purposes to the amount of \$6.50.

Dr. Kinkad, fraternal delegate of the Alleghany Conference, delivered his fraternal message. Dr. E. L. Madison arose and responded to the words of greetings.

Bishop Blackwell having to leave Dr. Madison sit down to allow Bishop Blackwell to give his parting words which he did in a most acceptable manner. Dr. Madison resumed the floor and continued his speech. Miss Eva Speight read a resolution from the Goldsboro District Conference asking the return of Rev. J. H. Mosely to the Goldsboro District.

The Committee on Admission made their report and recommended that Bros. A. G. Cromartie, Willie Lasane, J. C. Smith and E. D. Pierce be received on probation. Bros. Edward Fields, R. J. Young, C. C. Miller and W. B. McCoy from the Baptist church, be received on their credentials, and that K. B. Bennett, Luther Wells and J. H. C. Simms return to their studies.

By request of the Presiding Elder J. H. Mosely, Bro. J. T. Miller was received.

The Committee on Devotion, made their report.

Conference took recess. Benediction by Bishop.

## FIFTH DAY—SUNDAY NIGHT SESSION.

Conference reconvened at 7:30 o'clock. Dr. J. W. Wood lined hymn No. 497, "Prayer is the souls sincere desire." Next Dr. Orten read the 9th chapter of Daniel as the Scripture lesson. Dr. J. H. Anderson addressed the Throne of Grace in a very pathetic manner that made our hearts burn. Dr. J. W. Wood read second hymn No. 495, "From every stormy wind that blows," C. M. ## PRESIDING ELDERS' REPORTS

---

### GOLDSBORO DISTRICT.

Hon. Presiding Bishop, Associate Bishop and General Officers and Members of the Cape Fear Annual Conference—Greeting:

I am indeed grateful to our Heavenly Father for having spared me to be permitted to meet in the sixth session of the Cape Fear Annual Conference and the 10th year of my administration as Presiding Elder of the Goldsboro District, to attempt to give an account of my labor as Presiding Elder for the past 12 months.

We feel no higher honor could have been thrust upon this conference and Episcopal District, by the last General Conference than to be presided over by the Rt. Rev. Andrew Jackson Warner, A. M., D. D., who is a natural born leader of men,—wise counsellor, great Missionary hero, educator, prophet and evangelist and to my mind, and perhaps to all who know of him one of the greatest original pulpit orators of the 20th century. We regard him as a book of experience. He is a source of inspiration wherever he chances to preach or speak. Great crowds of people flock to hear him. No trouble in collecting claims wherever Bishop Warner visits. He is a king and affectionate captain; yet he commands his host with ease.

I also desire to congratulate myself upon having the distinguished honor of presiding over such a loyal, intelligent and christian set of men and women as compose the Goldsboro District.

The pastors for the most part are a class of hard working, sacrificing, business-like and honest set of men. Our supernumeraries as a rule work in harmony with their pastors and Presiding Elders; our Missionary women, both district and locals have crowned themselves this year with honors as never before. As their reports will show. The Missionary Convocation at Asbury Park, N. J., managed by our noble women and the officers of the Woman's Home and Foreign Missionary Department, was indeed an epoch in the history of the church. Our good Mrs. Bishop Warner wrote me to notify the District officers to get busy, and in the mean time I received a letter and circulars from our brilliant Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Annie W. Blackwell.

zMrs. Lizzie Brock, President of the W. H. & F. M. Society, Mrs. S. A. Cook, Secretary Y. W., attended the meeting, reporting \$70. Mrs. Sarah Olierv, President of the Budds of Promise, did not attend, but sent \$25.00 from her department. Sister Oliver has traveled very extensively on the district, and organized societies. Sister Brock has kept pace with the pastors, and Sister Cook held entertainments, made quilts and sold them and has a report that we will have reason to be proud.

The Daughters of Conference in the persons of Mrs. Hannah Best, Winnie Sherard, Miss Ea Sypeight and our loyal missionaries have done well in our local work. They will also report to the Bishop's table.

Mrs. Mollie Kornegay, Mrs. C. A. Smith, Mrs. Hannah Best and Rev. Mrs. B. P. Coward, Mrs. C. A. Cook and others filled banks, \$500 each, and reported to Mrs. Ida V. Smith.

The pastors have made marked success in reporting General Claims to our business-like and economical financial Secretary, Dr. W. H. Goler. Every man settled in full with our prompt-in-answering church extension Secretary, Dr. J. C. Dancy.

The educational assessment or children money has been raised



in full and remittance made to Dr. J. W. Martin our hustling educational Secretary or to the Presiding Elder. Also our Foreign Mission Assessment and Brotherhood monies are all paid in and remittance made to Drs. J. W. Wood and C. S. Whitted.

Our African Mission School money (\$36), our V. C. E. money (25), and our S. S. Union Money (\$17), were all raised in our S. S. Convention and turned over to the district officers, Prof. R. L. Lee President of the V. C. E. Union; Rev. H. P. Walker, Supt of the S. S.; and to the P. E., and remittance made to Prof. Aaron Brown, J. W. Eichelberger, A.M.; and Dr. J. W. Wood. They are business-like men and never fail to send receipts and return thanks for prompt remittance.

This is a great district, though not from large churches with flowing membership, while it is true we have 40 or more churches, including 15 mission points or churches with membership from 25 down to 6; yet there are great possibilities for our Zion in this territory. We have an intelligent membership, scores of professional men and women; up-to-date and progressive farmers; industrious and economizing housewives.

The Missionaries and Free-Will denominations are very strong; have good churches and several good demonational schools in the territory of our district, but the men of our district manage to have splendid congregations on their preaching days.

We have organized several missions with no friction and yet there is room for as many more churches as we now have. Our good and far-seeing Bishop Rt. Rev. A. J. Warner, recommended a "Drive" for local purposes and emergency of \$1,000 to the District—\$3,000 for the conference. The meeting was held in March at Wilmington, the second in May and the third in July, at which time nearly one-half of the \$3,000 for the conference was raised. We are looking forward for a full settlement from each district as I am satisfied will come from the Goldsboro; and if so the local interest and emergency of the conference will be well provided for.

#### MISSION POINTS.

Brothr A. Hopkins has charge of Brown Town Mission. This mission is in the midst of a flourishing community of colored people. It has only three members but Brother Hopkins has raised over \$200.00 with the assistance of Rev. J. T. Jackson. The mortgage of long standing to C. W. Dunn discounted by him "50 per cent" has been paid from the Mission funds.

Revs. Edward Fields and J. E. Martin deserve great credit for the erection of the building and putting in windows, etc.

2nd. Rev. B. P. Coward, D.D., has taken Bro. John L. Moore and organized a mission at Simms, eight miles from Wilson on the N.-S. R. R. They have purchased two lots containing a building for \$500. \$160 cash and three years for the balance. With the assistance of \$100 from the Drive, they are meeting the obligations; and with the support of Brother McPhail, a residen member, as well as others. Brother Moore is succeeding nicely, having raised \$250 and paid \$5.00 on claims.

3rd. Teachey Mission under Brother W. T. Miller, has taken on new life and is destined to be a promising point. He has raised \$158, paid \$5.00 claims. Bro. Jas. Powell, Sister Dora Johnson and Bro. D. Hayes are strong supports. With a little support from the Mission funds this will be a good point.

Institute Mission, organized by J. T. Jackson; Faison, under Rev.

J. S. Jackson, and a new mission near Turkey organized by Bro. W. D. Watford are also promising points.

### PASTORS AND THEIR WORK.

**GOLDSBORO STATION, Rev. W. S. Foster, Pastor.** Elder Foster has rounded out four years of successful pastoring at this old historic station. Under his pastorate the old mortgage against the church of 17 years standing has been cancelled. The debt on a building bought for a parsonage; a lot 60 by 200 feet, containing other buildings all valued at about \$1500.00; he has paid for the same in full. This building being too small for a large family like Elder Foster's this year he launched a rally raising about \$700 for a larger building. Hence the old parsonage has been moved back a little space, and a two-story, 6-room building is being erected at a cost of \$3,000, making 10 rooms in all with the old one attached. His board realizing his worth as a business man has given him the management of the work.

He is an intelligent gospel preacher, a business pastor, in fact any man who can make it in Goldsboro four successful years or four years in succession is indeed a success, and need to be commended. He has a business-like board, one of the best Sunday schools I know of in Zion. Brother B. H. Hagans, U. S. Mail Carrier, is the Superintendent. Three stewardess boards, Mrs. C. A. Smith, Mrs. S. A. Graham, and Mrs. Cathrine Jordan, President, have kept the parsonage well supplied, &c.

WILSON STATION, Rev. B. P. Coward, Pastor. Dr. Coward has served this charge eight years with wonderful success. He has towered in strength as a Pastor, Preacher and Leader of his people each year; as an evidence of his ability his excellent and business-like board after the 1st quarterly conference in January, raised his salary from \$1,000 to \$1200 per annum.

We have strong, business-like and well prepared men as pastors in our Zion, but I doubt any man could have excelled Dr. Coward in the business-like and economizing manner in which he has managed the affairs in building such a magnificent brick edifice in this flourishing town. It is indeed a modern church as you will see. Valued at \$80,000.00, with only about \$6,500 due. He has had several good rallies. It was my good pleasure the 2nd Sunday in April to see him pull off a four weeks "drive" (40 captains) all women, realizing over \$2,000. Over \$1800 piled upon the table here. Sunday night.

He has a business-like trustee board, most excellent set of leaders, three boards of stwardess that are indeed mindful of their duty. The Sunday school with Dr. W. H. Mitchner, M.D., Supt., is indeed a blessing to the church. This year completed the bell-tower, put in toilet works, completed the basement, pastor's study, S. S., primary department, chair vesture-room, ladies' parlor, covered the parsonage, installed lights with other improvements on the inside, &c. Bought a bell for \$500. Interest paid up to date on notes, premium paid on insurance. This year he has taken Bro. Johnny L. Moore one of our young men and has gone up to Simms, a little place on the N. & S. R. R., about 8 miles from Wilson, organized a mission and purchased a lot and building for \$500, by paying \$160 and 3 years time to pay the balance.

This church has donated about \$100 to the same. See report in full in my report on Missions. Mrs. Coward has her neck in the yoke in the interest of the church. She brought in \$150 in the April rally. Next to her was Mrs. C. L. Dordan, reporting \$160. They all did well.

#### PRESIDING ELDER'S REPORT OF THE CLARKTON DISTRICT.

Dear Bishop and Conference: It is with much gratitude and praise to the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ that we are here in another Annual Conference, and that with unbroken ranks All the pastors of the district have enjoyed good health with but few exceptions. We went out from Mount Olive at the close of our last session mindful of the fact that this year's work would bring us into our next Quadrennial session, therefore all the arrears of our Conference should be brought up, and now our district is ready to report in full, with the others in order that our good Bishop, of this the sixth Episcopal District may sit in the Council of Bishops in Knoxville, Tenn, next May with a cheerful heart and smiling face. Well, this has been a year of great prosperity, so no one need speak of hard times. It is He that is hard up. Should we have another year like this one, we will have great difficulty in passing the streets and roads, for every other fellow will be driving a motor car. I rejoice in the fact that the Districts and most of the charges have raised the salaries of Presiding Elders and Pastors. This is as it should be. For the very high cost of living is on now. The Tercentenary Campaign is on in full, and to my mind it is the best spiritual and financial move that the Church has ever made. We note with much pleasure the spirit of rivalry among the pastors. Each of them has gone far beyond my expectation in repairing and building churches and parsonages. Indeed they have a mind to build. The yare calling the Bishop very often to dedicate or lay corner stones. The White as

well as Colored are asking that the General Conference return Bishop Warner to us again. I am glad to say that the Sunday schools are improving each year. The Superintendents are meeting with their Convention much better than they did a few years ago. Last but not least the good ladies in charge of the W. H. & F. M. Societies of the District and the Daughters of Conference have done the best they could possibly. But their report is not as full as we had hoped.

CLARKTON CIRCUIT, Rev. B. D. McIver, Pastor. He held this charge one year and was transferred to the N. C. Conference. Returning to our Conference the Bishop sent him to this charge. Suffice it to say, that he being one of our old regulars has taken hold of this splendid work as an old workman should, and succeeded splendidly. He got more salary than any of his predecessors. He had the Church and parsonage recovered and has left in hand \$126.62 for further improvement on parsonage. At Savannah Temple the lumber is being put on the ground for the remodelling of that church with \$350.00 in hand.

BLADENBOTO CIRCUIT, Rev. J. L. Ham, Pastor. He is another one who wears well and long on any charge yet held by him. He is now in the bloom of life. He began right and by following that line, he is a success today. All of his churches love him. He leads all in sending in large amounts of collections early in the year. The Bishop asked our district to look about and get up \$1,000 and catch up some back money due the Connection on General Claims and use the other for local Missions and Conference school. Rev. Ham raised his part, \$85.00, at the first meeting.

LUMBERTON CIRCUIT, Rev. R. F. Butler, B.D., Pastor. The Bishop used his Godly judgment to perfection in this appointment. Dr. Butler, too, is one of Zion's hustling pastors. He too received more salary than any one preceding him. He finished and painted the steeple on Providence Church. It was erected by Rev. Dr. A. E. Lomax. The Circuit has in hand \$250 to secure a much needed lot and a better location for our church. I think we should have an attractive church in the beautiful town of Lumberton, the County seat of Robeson, which is growing faster than any town on the Seaboard Railway from Wilmington to Charlotte.

LAKE WACCAMAW CIRCUIT, Rev. A. M. Martin, D.D., Pastor. He is a Christian gentleman and a real good preacher. He doesn't try to be a Spiritual fire-brand, but get him in the pulpit and he becomes electrified at once, and thereby moves his people at once. He always brings a full report. He has raised this year \$1,000 at the small church at Lee's Chapel. The workmen are now erecting an up-to-date church. Now Bishop, they are looking for him on the first train Monday as their pastor.

WHITEVILLE CIRCUIT, E. W. Smith, Pastor. He has held this charge with wonderful success. This is his second year and second time that he has served these good people. His first appointment here was when he built the splendid brick church. After two years the Bishop sent him back there in order for him to pay off the remaining debt. Now many had their doubts as to the possibility of him doing so. But he is here smiling with the mortgage burned. There is a cozy parsonage on same charge and beautiful lot, Church parsonage and the street is electric lighted. He also has a full report.

**SHADY GROVE CIRCUIT**, Rev. R. O. Spaulding, Pastor. This is the church that the Bishop took from Rehoboth Circuit and Rev. Spaulding sent as pastor. I was very fearful about this charge on the circuit, but the people came out and fell in line with their new pastor, and made it possible for him to get the \$250 in gold for General Claims early in the year, heading all pastors on the District. He brings a full report on all lines.

**PHOENIX CIRCUIT**. Rev. G. T. Richardson has pastored this charge the fourth year with great success. He is beloved by all his people. Now they don't see how they can do without him. He ranks easily with the head men of the Conference. He repairs or builds churches or parsonages on any charge he is sent. But I think that he came near being a match this year. The old Summerville Church being now far from the settlement of our members, he has secured a site very suitable and bought a church from the white folks very near the new site and it is now being placed upon it. Some of the older people were soon to get in line. That splendid new building erected by Elder Ham (Evergreen Church) has been ceiled and plastered this year. He has made further improvements on his new parsonage.

**GRAHAM CHAPEL CIRCUIT**, Rev. J. E. Quince, Pastor. He has rounded out another year's work with continued success. His people love him and they work lovingly together. The building, the spacious yard and cemetery are a thing of beauty. Rev. Quince delights in making improvements. One of his churches was taken from the Circuit, but he and his good people went right on with but little change in the assessment. During the visit of the Bishop they gave him a reception that made him feel that he was among friends. But on his return home that large coop of fine birds that followed him was the best kind of proof of friendship. They are asking for visits from all over the district. The new churches that are being built and the hope that the Bishop can dedicate them before the General Conference. Mount Pleasant Church will be ready for him in early Spring. Elder Quince is an all round pastor and a lively preacher. A splendid report he has. Paid drive money in full.

**REHOBOTH CIRCUIT**, Rev. G. H. P. Anderson, Pastor. He has held this charge two years with great success. One strong church was taken from the work this year, but he has gone right on with the work successfully. It is admitted by all that he is a good man, very scholarly and high class Christian gentleman, and a real good preacher. He has been selected by the General Board of the Conference school as its Principal teacher, at Clarkton, N. C. He brings a full report as usual. He has raised \$160 for the painting of Rehoboth Church and the money to insure the church. Has purchased a bell for Peirce Chapel.

**FTEEMAN CIRCUIT**, Rev. E. M. Green, Pastor. The Bishop sent him to this new arranged and small Circuit this year in order that he might build it up, knowing that he would not have to depend upon the small membership for his support. Now to make bad matters worse he found that a members meeting had been held, and they had desired to have no pastor this year, on account of the change made in the Circuit, but Rev. Green before closing the service announced that he would fill all appointments during the year, the Lord aiding. On Quarterly Conference day the Presiding Elder reminded them of their request, that the Bishop have their charge detached for the for-



mer Circuit and it was done. They fell in line Now they are asking through their delegate for his return without fail. St. Paul Church has been greatly improved by ceiling and painting. Rev. Green may not look like a spiritual preacher, but get him into the pulpit and he will prove it every time. He always makes full reports.

**CARVER'S CREEK CIRCUIT.** Rev. E. S. Burney is one among our best pastors. A splendid preacher, an excellent financier, and thereby never fails in rounding up his report. He has carpeted the very large and beautiful Carvers Creek Church. His Council Mission Church has been framed up and being inclosed. It is a splendid model. Large and a beautiful situation. They have \$250 in hand and success is assured.

**ELIZABETHTOWN CIRCUIT,** Rev. E. A. Lomax, B.S.L., Pastor. He has succeeded wonderfully well. He did what few can do, raised all the claims for each department, and did it long before Conference. He had great success in his revivals. Painted the beautiful parsonage that was erected by Dr. Butler. He raised lots of money for seating and finishing Mount Olive church. Dr. Lomax is a successful pastor and an excellent preacher. The people greatly enjoy his preaching. The delegate says that he must return. His drive money was paid in full.

**BAKERS CREEK CIRCUIT,** Rev. T. H. Herring. Pastor. I was very glad when the Bishop placed him on our district, for he is the great church builder in our Conference, but he will have to hold up some now, and learn to raise his Claims first. **CHADBORN MISSION,** Rev. E. Z. Toper, Pastor. He has only two members, but his report shows that he is up with any of the pastors. We have a splendid lot in a prominent part of the town and with the aid given him from the Conference we will have a building up by the next Annual Conference. Rev. Roper is very untiring in the work of the Church. He is a real good preacher too and a Christian gentleman.

## REPORT ON STATE OF THE COUNTRY.

To the Rev. Bishop A. J. Warner, D.D., members and friends of the Cape Fear Conference:

We, your Committee on the State of the Country beg leave to submit the following report: Never in the history of the world has the spirit of unrest been more marked than it is today. The prolonged war between labor and capital which results in strikes and the high cost of living, the failure of our Government to ratify the peace treaty, the coming Presidential election, the problem of immigration, the growling and rude behavior of Mexico which resulted in a sort of gorilla warfare on American citizens right at our door, the unsolved racial problem with its race riots, lynchings, burnings, assaults, electrocutions, woman suffrage, etc., seem to be the underlying causes of unrest.

Despite the united efforts of the State and Federal governments to handle the present situation and consequently restoring things to their normal conditions, this colossal task of re-adjustment to pre-war conditions, seems to be beyond them.

There is also to be noticed the economic question. The country seems to have reached the very zenith of prosperity. With such a splendid financial outlook, the churches are putting forth their greatest efforts in the raising of large sums of money for missionary activities and educational purposes.

The State is not less active. With its splendid efforts of the reduction of the percentage of illiteracy, and the production of a better class of teachers by a raise of the standard of education, our Schools and colleges are filled to their utmost capacity.

We pray and we hope that this awful state of the country as briefly described by our committee, may in the near future be changed for the better by the wise ruling of Divine Providence.

To this end may the united prayers of the churches of God's grace ascend.
