

Directions to Northwest Nazarene College

From North: - Franklin Road (This is I-84 exit 36 and by **Shilo Mini Suites**). South on Franklin to 11th Avenue, turn right on 11th Avenue to Third Street (one way east), turn left to 12th Avenue, turn right (south) on 12th to Amity (second stop light), left to Juniper (third street east), turn left, 1 block to Dewey. Wiley Learning Center is at the corner of Juniper and Dewey.

From South: - Highway 45 to Amity Avenue, turn right to Juniper (third street east), turn left, 1 block to Dewey. Wiley Learning Center is at the corner of Juniper and Dewey.

From East: - I-84, take exit 38 (Garrity Blvd), exit is on right side of I-84. Turn left on Garrity (back under I-84) approximately 2 miles, turn left on 16th Avenue. Approximately 2 miles south, at a 4-way stop, 16th Avenue becomes Holly Street. Continue south on Holly 5 blocks to Dewey, turn right, WLC is one block west (corner of Juniper and Dewey).

From West: - Exit 35 (Nampa Blvd), south on Nampa Blvd past **Shilo Inn**, at second stop light Nampa Blvd becomes Yale and as Yale curves east it becomes 7th Street, follow to 12th Avenue (stop light by Albertsons), turn right to first light, turn left onto Amity, to Juniper (third street east), turn left, 1 block to Dewey. Wiley Learning Center is at the corner of Juniper and Dewey.

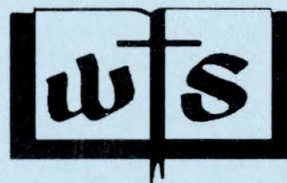
