OFFICIAL BOARD MINUTES OF JANUARY 7, 1969

The regular monthly meeting of the Official Board of Duke Memorial United Methodist Church was held January 7, 1969, at 7:45 p.m. in the Bradshaw Room. Mr. Marshall Spears, Jr., chairman, presided.

Mr. M. L. Husted, Associate Pastor, gave the devotional.

The minutes of the December meeting were approved.

Mr. Bailey Reade, church treasurer, gave the following report for the six months ending December 31, 1968: total receipts \$73,604.41, total disbursements \$65,278.62, excess receipts of \$8,325.79, total cash on hand \$9,323.77 including funds brought forward July 1, 1968; \$24,500 has been paid on our \$42,000 Conference pledge. Our College Fund debt has been paid in full.

Commission on Membership & Evangelism, Mr. Jack Cliff, chairman, reported that he hoped soon to have some new members joining our church as a result of the visitation that has been done by members of this commission.

Mr. Nicholas Fagan reported that regular meetings were being held by the Methodist Men and interesting programs have been well planned.

Members of the Church Property were asked to meet with Mr. W. K. Howard immediately following the Board Meeting.

The question arose for discussion concerning the possibility of some changes that might be made in the procedure of our communion services.

Mr. Petteway explained that the procedure being followed is the one adopted by the General Conference. He stated that he is aware of the length of time it takes to complete the ritual of the Lord's Supper. It was suggested that perhaps these moments could be spent in prayer and meditation. Following the discussion it was moved and carried that we continue with the same procedure for administering the elements for the Communion Service as we have in the past.

In his remarks to the Board Mr. Petteway expressed his appreciation that individuals would bring such matters as we have just discussed before the Board. He stated that this is the place where we should be able to have clearer understandings concerning our Lord's work.

The following announcements were made by the Pastor:

- 1. The church was able to care for some thirty families at Christmas time due to the contributions received from various organizations in the church and from individual contributions. He expressed his gratitude for this cooperation.
- 2. Delegates from Duke Memorial will attend the Durham District meeting January 26, at 2:30 p.m. at Parkwood United Methodist Church.
- 3. The Bible Study on the Book of John, which Dr. James E. Efird from Duke Divinity School has been conducting, will be held at seven o'clock, Sunday evening in the Fellowship Hall. This meeting will conclude the Study.
- 4. During the month of February a mission study is to be held. Further announcements will be made at a later date concerning these meetings.
