The meeting was opened with prayer by the pastor, after which Mr. Jones made his report showing a balance of \$5,051.36 in the church treasury as of June 30, 1962. He further stated that approximately \$9,000.00 had been collected to date on current year's pledges and that payments on the Building Fund were being received at a satisfactory rate.

The treasurer also called to the attention of those present the fact that he had received a letter from Alfred Williams of the Home Insurance Agency. The letter called to our attention the fact that the Air Conditioning equipment does not now carry adequate protection, with particular respect to explosion coverage. After discussion, the Committee requested that Mr. Barton make proper investigation and report the advisability of adding explosion damage protection to our Air Conditioning Equipment.

In closing his remarks, Mr. Jones mentioned a need for additional office equipment for the Reverend Mr. Bishop's office. Upon motion of Mr. Spears, seconded by Mrs Borland, the Committee authorized that an electric typewriter be purchased at approximate cost of \$450.00.

Reporting for the Building Committee, Mr. Coman stated that two meetings had been held - during which preliminary plans had been formulated and that Mrs Dozier had sent them to the architect. In addition, proper representatives from all classes had been called in for discussion and were taking an active part in the program. It was his opinion that active work on the project might start by early spring.
