DOES IT WORK?

Many of us are more concerned about practice than theory. Few would be in the position of a certain college president who said, "I know it works; but is the theory sound?" We are often pragmatists and with good reason.

Sometimes people come to the Gospel and the Church and wonder, even aloud, "Do they work?" Such questioning is not new and is known in the Scriptures. The book we call First John is a book designed to give some very clear understanding on whether a person has saving faith or not; on whether a person is the real thing, or more like a hollow shell.

For St. John or whoever wrote the book, the question is of the love of God in human life and experience. I know of few statements, in Scripture or out of it, where the questions are put in a blumter form, than in St. John's writings. John does not hesitate to use rather strong language, to call a man a liar, if indeed his life and his claims do not come together.

For the next two Sundays, we are going to be examining two particularly pointed sections of I John. If you are interested in some "home work" that can be useful to you for understanding and for orientation as we come to these hours together, read the whole short book several times. Read it preferably in a version in contemporary speech. Read it in terms of "Does it work?" Who knows -- if it hasn't already worked for you, this might be the time of beginning!
