Who has not now and again wondered as to the effectiveness of a lot of the things we do all the time? There is in the work of the church a necessary structure and program sequence that sometimes may lull us off into thinking it is all a routine and that it goes on, care or not. Then comes an experience that reminds us of what it is all about.

Last week I received from the Division of Missions of the Methodist Church two tangible reminders of the way we participate in the life of the Church. One was marked "Missional Priority -- Hunger -- \$400.00". The other was marked "USA national disaster Bsp appeal southeast USA -- \$755.45". This was our response to the special "flood and mud" appeal of our bishops for churches and for people in West Virginia, Tennessee and Kentucky to help deal with the consequences of a "natural" disaster.

Each morning a van load (the van provided by a member of the church) of children and counselors leaves for day camp. Each day, some of us work in the Lyon Park recreation project. To my certain knowledge, the sick and those shut-in are visited, not as often as we and they would like, but they do know that a lot of people care. The Garrisons are at work in Brazil; the Valenzuelas in Chile continue their lifelong witness and work there. In addition, the large dimensions of "regular" work go along day by day.

All this - and every thing else we do - is possible because you, the members of Duke Memorial, give of your time, your money, your strength, your love, your concern. This little paragraph is a simple word of grateful acknowledgement for all that is here mentioned and for the far greater unmentioned body of things and activities in which we engage in witness to our faith. All is being done unto the Lord and there is evident a sense of joyful participation.

I rejoice to be part of it and believe and trust that you do too! Thank you.
