VAN DAY CARNIVAL

Duke Memorial has been trying, for about two years, to raise enough funds to purchase a <u>VAN</u> to use in a multitude of church related activities. Anticipated uses range from providing transportation to services on Sunday for those in need; visits to shut-ins; providing transportation to special groups such as the Choir, the Methodist Youth Fellowship, methodist men, methodist women and selected Sunday school classes on outings; educational activities and special projects.... just to mention a few. The funds currently available, are less than <u>one-third</u> of the amount needed to purchase the VAN, and most of these funds have been raised by the teenagers and young people in the church.

The Council on Ministries, in order to expedite the earliest possible purchase of this VAN, appointed a Task Force to that end. The group is composed of Nick Fagan — chairman; Tom Coble — vice chairman; Ed Hammond, Bob Weynand, David McConnell, Ed Smith, Bob Wallace, Bill Coman, Pat Coman, Margaret Ann Biddle, Ben Mixon, Ella Glasson, Bob Pifer, and Mike Herman. Their recommendations have been presented to the Council and are as follows:

A ONE DAY FUND RAISING EVENT

A goal has been established to raise \$6,000 in a one-day fund raising event which has been named the "VAN DAY CARNIVAL". It is scheduled for AUGUST 20 -- SATURDAY, from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. or until the people go away. The event will take place rain or shine. 
TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE
