WHAT MAKES IT GROW?

About a year ago, a kind person sent a plant to be placed in the office where I spend some hours every day. To this day I do not know the name of the plant. Not only am I ignorant of the name; I have no knowledge at all of what the plant requires by way of moisture, temperature, fertilization and the like. It takes a good imagination to think of any one who could know less about this plant than I do. Yet, I've enjoyed it for the whole year. Located where it is, others have shared in enjoyment of it. So far as I can tell, the total care it has received is a good watering when I find that the soil has become really quite dry. The only way I can think to account for its excellent health is that the person who gave this plant to us knew in detail about where it would be placed and selected a plant that would thrive on what Daniel Moynihan called "benign neglect".

When I look at this plant, many things come to mind. One of course is real gratitude for the gift and the giver who means much to me. Then I get to thinking of how plants can be moved and transplanted; from that, I go on to people moving about in our world. This leads me to thought of people who come to our town. Few people thrive on benign neglect, Moynihan notwithstanding. And so on I go to the concern as to what we do to help newcomers in our community find the sort of framework of life in which they can be happiest and most productive.

Nearly every Sunday, there are visitors and/or newcomers in our congregation. All of us share the opportunity of making them welcome so that we become part of each other and all of us together make up the Body of Christ here. I may not know what makes the plant grow; but I do know what makes the Body of Christ grow. It is His love manifested through His servants. What are you doing to make this Body grow?
