SUMMER TIME

School is out - gardens are in - vacation time is here - lawn mowers and hedge clippers beckon - some folks come and some go. Light clothes are in order; jackets and neckties ought to be banished for the duration of warm weather. Gasoline continues to get more costly and is accordingly valued the more dearly - and away we go!

In some areas of New England, summer is a dull time for church life. Sunday Schools are suspended for the period. Some churches simply close up entirely for July and August. The pastors take half the period for vacation and the remainder for "reading" - I've never figured how one can profitably do a year's reading in one month!

That sounds like a dismal way for Christians to respond to the love and provision of our heavenly Father. He gives the beauty and privilege of the season and we turn as if it is of no concern to us from where come the blessings we so enjoy. I doubt that any member of Duke Memorial would support a proposal to close the church during the vacation season; I certainly would vigorously oppose it myself. Yet, do not many of us in effect so vote?

The number of persons out of town for vacations has never disturbed me. The number in town who suspend church life for the summer without any visible reason does profoundly disturb me. The weather will be warm in the summer of 1979 and part of the time it will be downright torrid. It is the kind of weather which is ideal for outings, for shopping, for going to work, for sports events. Often we go about our regular schedule of activity with only slight rearrangement because of the heat. But is it too hot for worship and for Sunday School?

No one will vote to close up - God forbid. But by our actions, do we vote to continue to be a loving, concerned, caring congregation, aware in some measure of the needs of people in our community as in the whole world? The empty place when it is easily in our power to fill that place is a kind of witness to our opinion of the worth of the whole matter. I invite all of you to join together in expression of your own faith in Christ and in sharing your love for Him and His Body, the Church and all His people right through the months of the summer as at all other seasons. You all come!
