YOU CAN HELP -- WILL YOU?

United Methodist Women has accepted the privilege of Christian service in Duke Memorial in the semi-annual Church World Service clothing appeal. The call is for the things that are needed by those who are refugees or those who have suddenly lost everything they possessed by natural or man-made disasters. Needed is childrens' clothing, for both sexes, all sizes, all seasons; layettes (for babies do get born even in such circumstances); towels and soap (in original wrapper for safe travel); new and good used blankets (no electric blankets); youth and adult clothing, again, both sexes, all sizes, all seasons. Not needed are handbags, womens' dress shoes with high heels or anything in severely worn condition.

United Methodist Women invites your attention to your closets, packing cases and whereever you store clothing. Children do outgrow things with no sibling along to profit from
the size changes. Adults do gain or lose weight so that excellent clothing is no longer
serviceable. Some of us are influenced by style changes but the needs of refugees know
nothing of being up to the minute in tailoring. Sometimes we have garments that we have
worn regularly until we simply do not want to wear them any more. Other categories in the
way we live and dress may influence us in the choice of the garments we can give in a time
of severe need.

Television news and documentary reports bring the world and its suffering into our homes in a graphic way. One redeeming feature of the often deplorable TV industry is the possibility that such presentations can stir us to respond. Does it take much imagination to fit yourself into a situation of sudden and total need, with all the usual devices by which you have provided these necessities removed? There are in our congregation some folks who have been refugees - it is not really a pleasant experience! One way to thank God for His mercies by which thus far many of us have been spared such dreadful events is to share our largesse with persons in great and immediate need.

Bring clean clothing and related articles to Whitford Hall. Place your gifts on the stage. Monday, 20 August, volunteers will begin packing boxes of these gifts for pickup by Church World Service during the following week. Gifts of money to help process clothing will be welcomed. If you need a receipt for income tax purposes, contact the Church Office. It's up to you - and you - and me!
