Young writers often ask advice of authors who have established themselves as craftsmen of real ability. The advice that I have most often heard repeated is this: "Don't wait until you feel in the mood to write. If you think you are a writer, prove it. Set yourself a regular and demanding schedule and go to it. You will soon find out whether you can write or not."

Most of us now and then feel ourselves overloaded. This can engender a feeling of being under-appreciated and then we are really in a downward spiral that can lead only to real difficulties. During these hot and humid days of August and early September, many of us think with yearning of a tree with deep shade, a moderate breeze, a pitcher of cool lemonade, a good book and no responsibility! Idle dream! At the end of such a day (which for most is purely fiction), the book is read, the lemonade gone, the heat is still on hand and nothing has been done. That sense of an irreplaceable day being gone forever with nothing to show for it is also a pessimism producer.

Blessed be schedules and commitments! We tend to make engagements and commit our time when we are feeling able and willing. Fulfilment of these activities can come at a time when lassitude lays a heavy hand on us. But, having committed ourselves, we get on with the task — and at least for me, there is inevitably a sense of thanksgiving that it has taken place. I hope it is that way with you. Were most of us to wait for the moment of inspiration to write an "appropriate" letter to a dear person, few letters would get written. Take the few moments you have and share with that person what your life and love are today. All of us can squeeze in ten minutes for a note to another but who finds time for a formal letter? Send the note! If you can't find time to bake a cake, make some cookies! If you would like to run ten miles but cannot, walk the block or two that is possible for you.

St. Paul long ago told friends of his that he counted his life as of no value save that it afforded him the opportunity to complete the task to which Jesus Christ had assigned him. God gives to all of us some things to do - and time to do them if we will use the scraps and bits of time and energy available. Praise the Lord for schedule, and commitment - enjoy them!
