### WHY DO YOU - OR WHY DON'T YOU?

Do you know Toni Brown? I don't; but I am even so indebted to her. I commend to your reading a short statement she made in the May 1981 Reader's Digest (pp. 110-112). It is a simple accounting of why she goes to church. Those of us who do attend church services can profit from that statement; those who don't can, at the least, ponder it!

In the same week that I read this article by Toni Brown, I read also a church newsletter from one of the larger congregations in our Conference. The pastor of that church was wondering where, on a given Sunday, the "other two-thirds" of their members are. Across the United States, United Methodist Churches average about 35% of their membership being present in a worship service. The pastor who wrote about it spoke for many of us. It happens that many churches are significantly below that national average and Duke Memorial is one of them.

Out of the coinciding of these two statements, I began to wonder how many of us could - and would - write a statement of why they attend church. Rather than a printed homily or exhortation from me on this subject, I now invite members of Duke Memorial to compose their own short statements of why they attend Church services and send them to me. Some of them may be used, in part or in whole, from time to time in the Messenger. On the "equal time" doctrine, those who don't come to church are invited also to make their statements and send them to me. We will not publish them; but it is possible that this would be a learning experience for both the writer and the reader. It might even help to resolve some of the impasses in which we find ourselves now and again!

One of the factors that made me ready to receive the Gospel was the realization of how far away from the Church - and more important, from Jesus - I had drifted simply because I had been working about a hundred hours weekly. A young friend who declared himself an atheist was an ardent evangelist for his position and worked very hard to get me to join him. I found with some horror that it would require very little for me to get there. Reflection on that whole context of experiences made me far more ready to hear and receive the Gospel than I had ever been before. In God's good time, it came. I have been thankful ever since, and thankful even for Paul Bowling who was the apostle of atheism. Often I wonder where he is and what has happened to him. He helped me realize where I had drifted.

So, sharpen your pencils (and wits if need be) and share with all of us why you do attend church, or, if you don't, share that with me! Who can know the good that may come for many of us?
