SAINTS VALENTINES DAY

Sunday, 14 February, is Valentine's Day. I hope you know more about it than I do! Even the Brittanicca has little on the subject. I knew that there were a number of saints in the Catholic tradition with the name of Valentine (in several forms and languages). But how did we get from the imperial sport of beheading bishops in the third century to the kind of observances we have today? Let me hasten to say that in this instance, I do believe the change has been positive and progress!

It appears likely that our festival activities have much more to do with the ancient Roman customs connected with the festival called Lupercalia which came each year on 15 February than with the religious meaning of the day. That festival honoured the pagan gods, Juno, Roman goddess of women and marriage, and Pan, the god of nature. As Christianity spread, church leaders tried to give Christian meaning and content to the day. The Sts. Valentine who were martyred on the day were considered to have died for their love, not of women, but of Jesus, their Lord. One aspect of the original festival was that young men and women in a group would place all names in boxes, divided by sex; each drew a name and the couple so paired remained together for the duration of the festival. One writer says, "they usually continued to enjoy one another's company long after the festival. Many such courtships ended in marriage." So, what's new?

The custom of exchanging valentines originated among English speaking people with the poet, Geoffrey Chaucer (the Canterbury writer). He mentioned that birds begin pairing off on this day; one supposes that he felt mankind should emulate the birds. The observances nowadays seem to turn more on merchants' promotions for the sale of about everything of which one can think than habits of birds.

Anything that encourages us to love each other and to make some expression of that love can only be good in the kind of world in which we live. All adults can remember the excitement of childhood Valentine boxes, and many of us know of Valentine suppers and like occasions. As with the Romans long ago, undoubtedly many such pairings do at least occasionally work out to longer relationships and now and then even to marriage.

In the way that fits you best, let this be a day of expressing your love to several persons beginning with family members. Only God knows how many hearts will be warmed as only He knows how many are lonely and need some loving care. So, take what began as a blending of pagan custom and religious rememberance and do good to God's people!
