The Building Committee and the Canvass Committee for our proposed new Sunday School Building are making a statement to the congregation today in which it is brought to our attention that a considerable sum of money must be raised before we can proceed with construction, the cost of which complete will be, according to bids received, \$48,566.15. It will be remembered that the Quarterly Conference ordered that \$20,000 in cash should be raised, with good subscriptions covering the balance needed, before work should be begun. Of having this sum we lack \$3,563.65. The following paragraphs from this report containing items of great interest to all are presented to members of the congregation. The proposals made in them will arouse feelings of profound gratitude and appreciation and should call forth the best effort of which we are capable.

"Four members of this Church, Mr. W. W. Flowers, Mr. C. W. Toms, Mrs. B. N. Duke, and Mrs. Mary Duke Biddle, who have often proved their loyalty and devotion in the past, have again given evidence of their interest and support in the following manner:

"They will each contribute \$5,000, in addition to all former gifts; that is, a total of \$20,000, provided that the \$20,000 which they propose to give, in addition to contributions from the congregation at large, will complete the building and prepare it for the use of the congregation free from debt.

"It will be seen that immediate payment of all subscriptions, so far as subscribers find it possible, is desirable, since only upon receipt of sufficient money, or upon guarantees endorsed and accepted by the Duke Memorial Church. Fund, Incorporated, can we begin work upon the proposed building, in accordance with the generous offer named above. Therefore, we urge all who can possibly do so to pay the remainder due on their subscriptions so that no further delay may be necessary.

"We desire to record our appreciation of the loyalty and assistance, and in many instances the sacrifice, of our membership in making possible the equipment needed for our Sunday School and other organizations of our Church. And we especially desire to express our gratitude to Mr. Flowers, Mr. Toms, Mrs. Duke, and Mrs. Biddle for this renewed and substantial expression of their concern for the progress of the work of Christian training among us."

Now is the time to make a subscription for our new building project, if you have not already done so, and to pay if you have subscribed. Memorial Church expects every member to do his duty. When that is done, this work can be done, and we shall have prepared ourselves adequately, so far as physical equipment goes, to take our full part .n the work of Christian Education in our city.

Come to Church tonight! There will be a good musical program. The pastor's sermon will continue the series on "Things We Know in Religion."

The flowers in the Church today are the gift of Mrs. J. C. Angier, and are presented in memory of her husband.
