New Programs presented to the Program Team:


- 1. Recycling: Elizabeth Bookhout and Tom Coble are looking at ways in which the church can become more involved
- 2. Africa University Library Fund Project: Omar Fink will order samples of Christmas cards which he will sell as a benefit
- 3. Monthly after-church luncheons: Lois Funderburk was given \$300.00 to support this program. The Program Team will ask Staff-Parish to find a hostess to make this possible and will ask Administrative Board "classes" to take turns as hosts.

Habitat for Humanity: *Tom Adkinson is chairman of the Task Force and members are being recruited

Evaluation: The Program Team evaluation was held on June 10. The consensus was that the concept is good and the process for programming for our church is excellent. It was felt that there is more enthusiasm, less structure, freedom to choose, and generally positive results activities.

Program Overview: See attached report which gives a breakdown by areas formerly covered by COM as to accomplishments for the year to date Upon a motion from the Program Team, the Board VOTED TO CONTINUE THE PROGRAM TEAM CONCEPT FOR ANOTHER ADMINISTRATIVE YEAR.

STAFF-PARISH RELATIONS COMMITTEE - Anne Clark:

- Welcomed John Semingson as our new Music Director/Organist. Mr. Semingson began his duties on September 9, 1990, and already has exciting plans for all ages in the congregation.
- announced that Omar Fink is filling in on the staff to handle nurturing care, newcomers and shut-ins. He will be on staff until January 1991, at which time we hope to have a permanent person on board.

FINANCE COMMITTEE - Ed Hammond:

- presented the Preliminary Budget for 1991 and MOVED ON BEHALF OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE THAT IT BE ACCEPTED AS A WORKING BUDGET. PASSED. (attached)

- Every Member Canvas: Tom and Nancy Stark, Co-Chairmen: Mr. Stark reported that the Circuit Ride Campaign will be October 21 and that there are 450 giving units in the church. This year will not be high pressured but does require everybody's participation. He asked every Board member to increase his/her commitment by at least 22% over 1990.



TREASURER'S REPORT - Jim Long stated that although there was a \$10,000 deficit the end of August, it was a good report and that most all expenses are down (see attached)

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN - to date has a total pledge of \$776,873 with only \$271,397 paid. Church members are urged to keep their payments up to date so that we can continue with our projected plans. To date we have spent \$353,621 (\$130,000 from the endowment) with a cash balance on hand as of 8/31/90 of \$55,365.

<u>RENEWAL COMMITTEE</u> - Edith Toms reported that the bills are still coming in on the roof and outside cleaning and that the architect is working on the elevator and office renovation plans.

Ann Stallings reported:


- two new sitters hired and two new classrooms begun
