Participation in the UMW Reading Program was encouraged. A list of current books is available from Ann Marie.

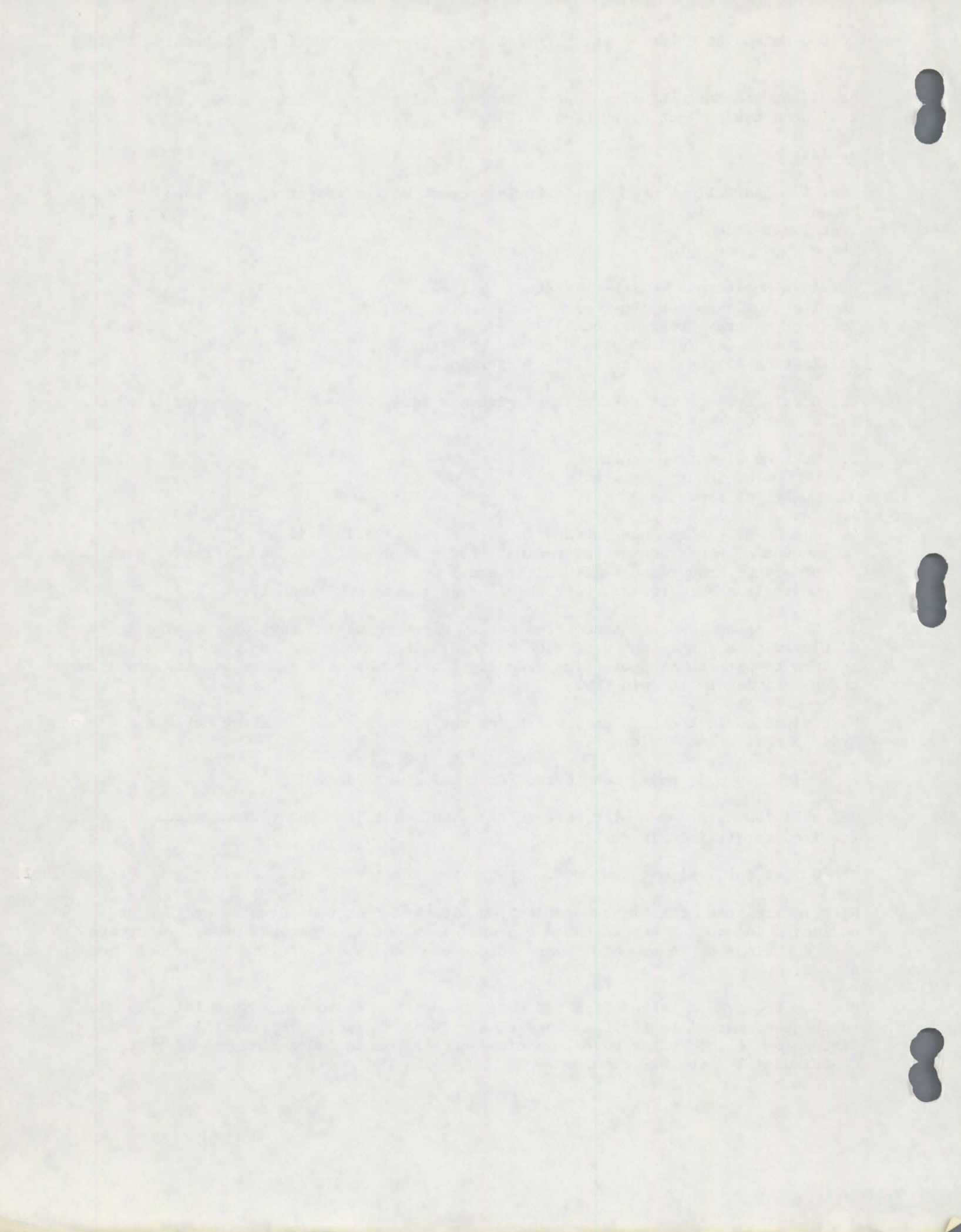
A mission study is being considered for the Fall of 1991.
