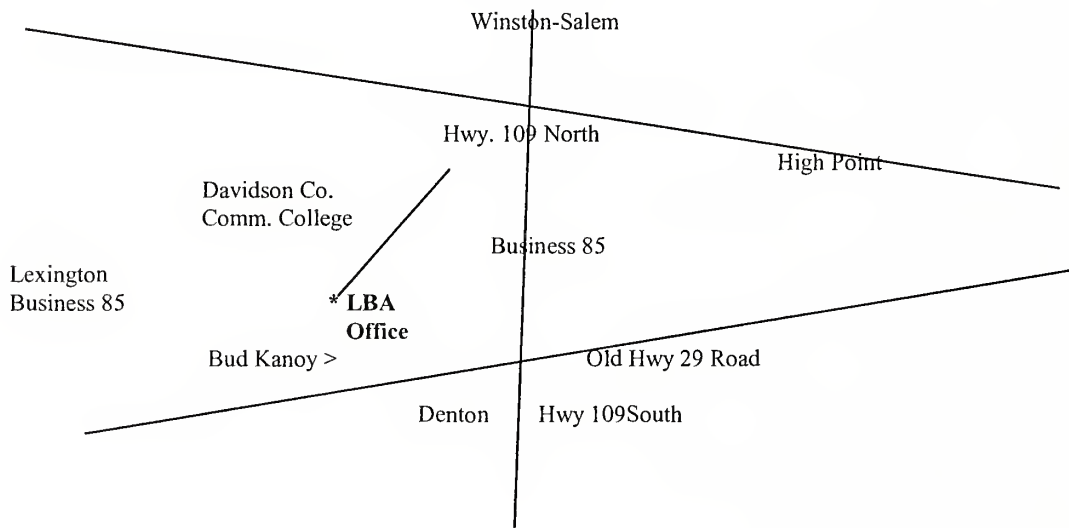

Employed Part-time Children's Director, Sandi Todd and Full-time Minister of Students, Rev. Scott Reid, this year. We have purchased 2 booths this year and if you are interested in taking a night, please let me know.

Mission Reports:

**Vacation Bible School Report**, presented by Ava Charles and accepted as printed. Please turn your reports in to the Associational Office.

**WMU Report**, by Linda Skeen, presented as printed in book. Passed by saying "I."

**Brotherhood/Baptist Men's Report**, given by John Gore as printed in book. Our Associational Mission Trip will be leaving for Honduras on the 24<sup>th</sup> of July. We still have 9 homes in Eastern North Carolina that people are not back in their homes since 2 years ago. We have trained between 9 and 10 thousand for Disaster Relief. All reports Passed by saying "I."

Our Associational Missionary Rev. Mike Ester commissioned the Associational Mission Team that is going to East St. Louis and then others teams that will be going out through individual churches. Scripture: Psalm 116:18.

**Associational Missionary report:** I am blessed to be a part of this association. Mike spoke about a great summer and how well the churches are working together in our Association. We now have 50 churches with only about 9,000 people attending in our county. We are not large by any means but it is hard to get around to all 50 of you in a year. I would like for every church to hold the last Sunday in October as High Attendance Day in our churches. The Fair is coming up the second week of September and we have paid for two booths this year because

we have so many of you that want to be a part of this. We have a pop corn machine and will purchase what you need to use. Other churches or groups can take a night to help out if you will let us know. If there is any churches that would like to begin a Satellite church or Bible Studies, let me know and we would be glad to help out with this.

Special Music was presented by the choir of Lakeview Baptist Church under the direction of the pastor, Rev. David Wooten. A special selection of "Everybody Will be Happy" and "Over There" and "I'll Fly Away" was presented. Their Quartet presented "I Can Tell You The Time" following the choir.

Our special speaker, **Rev. Chet Cantrell**, was introduced by Evva Spurgeon.

Rev. Cantrell began by thanking us for having him and for letting him come back home to be with us. Michelle and I have been through fires, floods famine, tornadoes, and everything in between and we are glad we have shared this time together. Our lives have been an adventure. He thanked his parents for their Christian life and thanked his extended family. Liberty Association has helped him out and over 500 people from this association have been to the Christian Activity Center in East St. Louis and I am grateful to you. Scripture: Isaiah 45:2-3. Chet shared what the Christian Activity Center in East St. Louis, Illinois is. It is a haven for children where most of the children were dropouts of school, crime-ridden streets, and a life of extreme poverty. Most of the factories closed down and it has never been the same. Today people think because we have a "gambling boat" we are well off, if the boat left today, we would be right back where we once was.

He shared miracles with us. He and Michelle have been at the Center for 17 ½ years. We ask what do we have to do and all they wanted us to do was to keep their children alive because 12 kids had died the year before in gun fire. The miracle that we have stayed that long is that God was already there. How do you experience God-go where people are hurting or suffering or where people are in need and God is there. As a missionary in St. Louis I can tell you the truth of this. When we first came to live there, the children were sleeping on the school bus or ducking down because they were afraid of gang shooting. One child lived on 10<sup>th</sup> street and we were picking up a child and all the children in the car said we are not suppose to be on this street because this was the bad street and our center was on 6<sup>th</sup> street. Today, after 17 years we can ride down that street without the fear that we had then. Ministry takes time. If you have faith the Bible says God will move the mountain, sometimes we have to go shovel by shovel to get the mountain moved. Right across the street was known as the red light street and Mary Ann Tavern and sometimes they would pick up children. One day Michelle and I was riding down the street and saw a beaten/bloody man and took him to the hospital. Later this man came up to me and said I appreciate what you did for me and I told him that is what neighbors do and he said let me know if there is anything I can do for you. What I didn't know at the time was that "Gerald" ran the stroll (red light street). One day I saw a 3 year old girl coming down the street and I said to him that child could be one that is beaten and raped and he said to me that is my niece. One day I said to him, this street is a problem and after a few weeks the stroll was gone off this street because God is at work. Another story is a lot of the guys smoked pot next to the building and I went to them and told them kids don't need to see this. They did move and about 9 years later he said if God can use me then I want to try and do something for him. I took him in for drug help and today he is a successful business man. Remember that 3 year old girl I told you about, she is now working at the center. These are the miracles that go on because God is there.

We have built additions to our building at no cost and then we have had help from others that have volunteered.

The Tavern-Mary Ann died and left it to Alison and now Alison has sold it to us. Mary Ann didn't want to sell the Tavern to us because a politician told her not to because the property is worth a lot and she didn't sell but later on she fell and broke her hip and was put in a rest home and later on Alison sold it to us and today we are the only missionary that owns a beautiful mahogany bar (if anyone is interested, call us). God is in it.

I have a big fat chair at the center that you can sit in and read to the children, they love to be read to and that is how they learn. Everyone of you are here because someone showed you love and prayed for you. We work with kids every day and I can tell you there are hundreds of kids in my neighborhood that I know no one is praying for. There are kids all around that need you and Kids spell love TIME and nothing else. The only thing that touches a kids life is a single adult that cares enough to spend time with them. In our country 1 out of 10 little girls and 1 out of 15 little boys are assaulted. Many of the kids only eat lunch at school and what do they do in the summer time? If churches don't care about kids, the street is going to. Churches exist to reach those kids. There is no program in the world that reaches kids, but what does reach them is people.

Test: Name the 5 programs, sermons, Bible studies that changed/transformed your lives? Name 5 relationships/people that impacted your life. What changes people's lives, (other people). You can not change a

person's life unless you are willing to have a relationship and the only way to do that is people to people. You can not discipleship anybody you have befriended. Don't tell them Jesus loves them until you are ready to love them to. If you want to love, God goes before. Keep us in your prayers. Children are waiting for our time and attention.

Mike recognized Gary Myers as our out going Moderator for the last two years and gave him a plaque.

Mike held an Installation of the New Officers for 2006-2007.

There being no further business, the Summer meeting of Liberty Baptist Association was adjourned with benediction by Rev. Gary Myers.

Gary gave a thank you for all those that set aside this time to be at the meeting.

# HISTORY OF HOST CHURCHES

## **HISTORY of First Baptist Church, Welcome**

First Baptist Church of Welcome, North Carolina, owes its beginnings largely to the efforts of Mrs. Lizzie Fritts Everhart. She helped start worship services at the old Thomas School between Midway and Welcome. The people met for approximately a year before deciding to build a church. Mrs. Everhart died before the decision was made for the permanent location. They decided to build in Welcome. The worship services were then moved to the old Welcome School on Welcome-Arcadia Road. In October 1911 Welcome Baptist Church was constituted with twelve charter members. That same month Reverend O. A. Keller of Wallburg was called to serve as the first pastor.

The twelve charter members were Guilford Beeker, Vogen Brinkley, Mr. and Mrs. John Frandlin Crotts (Essie Craver), Mr. and Mrs. Charles Sylvester Haynes (Lula Alice Byrd), Mr. and Mrs. K. Z. Hill, Gurvis Cleveland Hinkle, Mr. and Mrs. Emanuel Jackson Zimmerman (Lula Beatrice Craver), and Emory Zimmerman.

On January 7, 1912, the land selected on which to build the church was donated by Mr. and Mrs. Emanuel Jackson Zimmerman. It was located 300-400 feet west of Highway 52 on Welcome-Arcadia Road. The church was built in 1912.

In 1944 Oscar Hartman was called as pastor. Reverend Hartman's pastorate covered the longest span to this date, as he served 18 years. He served as a part-time pastor, alternating Sunday morning and Sunday night services between Welcome and Stanleyville Baptist in Winston-Salem.

On May 28, 1957, construction began on a three-story educational building adjacent to the existing building. The church decided in 1962 to go to a full-time basis and called Gerald Hewitt as pastor. A recently completed parsonage on Hinkle Lane Road was ready for the Hewitt family. The parsonage cost was \$21,061, along with free labor from church members.

September 14, 1969, Bobby Odom was licensed to preach by Welcome Baptist Church and August 12, 1973, was ordained by the church. Dean Harrold and Leonard Rollins brought the message. The church voted to relocate on April 4, 1971. The church bought 9.6 acres of land from the E. J. Zimmerman estate, located one-fourth mile from Highway 52 on Welcome-Arcadia Road. A ground-breaking ceremony was held in May 1975 with construction beginning in June by S. E. Trogdon and Sons Company.

In 1986 First Baptist Church was known as a loving, caring church. The celebration of seventy-five years as a witness for Jesus in the community gave occasion for thankfulness. We are thankful that God used others to establish a church and that He let each of us be a part of His wonderful body of believers who meet regularly in this place.

Continuing with the attitude of outreach into the community, in March 1987 there was discussion as to the possibility of beginning a daycare center. The vote in April 1987 passed, establishing Welcome Christian Daycare as a ministry of FBC, Welcome. An after-school program was added in the fall of 1987. The daycare continues to minister to the community by caring for needs of children six weeks old through 12 years.

With continued growth, a building committee was established in April 1988 to look into building needs. In September 1989 a Master Plan for Growth was presented. The church voted to proceed with Phase I of the building project. In March 1990 the church contracted with Ediface, Inc., of Charlotte to manage the construction of an Education/Fellowship Building, Administrative Building, and youth activity area, totaling 19,142 square feet at a cost of \$964,607. In May a groundbreaking ceremony was held for the addition of the new facility. The staff moved into the offices in October 1990. The congregation enjoyed their first Sunday in the addition January 13, 1991, and a Building Dedication was held in February.

Ministry and outreach has always been one of the main goals of the church. Another ministry opportunity presented itself in July 1992. The church began a deaf ministry led by Jane McCann. The ministry has grown through the years and continues to be a source of outreach.

In August 1999 Mark Blair was called as pastor and continues to lead the church as he preaches the Word and guides the church to accomplish more for our Lord and to recognize the potential for outreach and growth in the North Davidson area.

The church today has many ministry opportunities in which to be involved. The music ministry, under the leadership of Keith Brown, includes preschool, children, and adult choirs, as well as ensembles and handbells. There are many opportunities for children to grow through annual Vacation Bible School, Team Kids, and mission groups beginning with Mission Friends through GAs, RAs, and Acteens. Other mission groups, which include Women on Mission and Baptist Men, meet on a regular basis to study and pray for missions and to be involved in projects.

The church is thankful for a strong youth program, under the leadership of Jonathan Goodman, that encourages young people to, first of all, grow in their walk with the Lord, and then reach out to youth in the community showing them the love of our Savior. Pastor Blair continues to lead members in learning to share their faith and reach prospects for Sunday School, as well as lead the lost to a saving knowledge of our Lord.

In May 2001 the church voted to renovate the sanctuary for an approximate cost of \$100,000. The renovation included enlarging the platform, adding choir chairs, and raising the organ/piano, painting, new lighting, new pews and carpet. The church is thankful and feels blessed that through this project we can continue reaching out to the community and inviting those around us into a beautiful worship center where we can praise God and bring glory to Him.

In 2002 the church purchased a Rodgers 797 organ, which was dedicated in April 2003 in memory of Gloria Carrick, who served as organist for more than twenty-five years.

May 2004 a Feasibility Committee was formed to guide the church in determining future goals, including a building program, financial campaigns, additional worship services, property issues and other improvements. A projection system was installed in the sanctuary in June 2004. The church approved a recommendation to renovate the fellowship hall and purchase equipment in order to begin a contemporary worship service and have the pastor's message presented through video.

In August 2004 the church celebrated a note-burning ceremony to retire the debt of \$965,000 for the construction of the education/fellowship building and youth activity area.

November 2004 a contemporary worship service, CHRYSALIS, which offers praise bands and the pastor's message by video, began.

In December 2004 the church gave \$10,850 to Lottie Moon Christmas Offering – the largest amount given to date.

In August 2005 the church installed an elevator and built a garage/storage building. The church purchased a 2005 Chevrolet 40-passenger bus.

First Baptist Church continues as a missions-minded church within North Carolina, other states, and foreign lands. Mission trips in 2004 until the summer of 2006 include October 2004 and 2005 Jim and Jean Smith participating in a trip to the Dominican Republic; a team going to Atlantic, North Carolina, to work in hurricane damaged areas in May 2005 and again in August 2006. Eric Mendenhall traveled to India May 25-June 24, 2005. August 2005 Ed and Elizabeth Dawson were involved in a trip to the Philippines where they worked in an orphanage trying to help improve the quality of life for the children. Ed went to India in July 2006. David Goodman was in Peru December 2005. Tiffany Brown and Emily Peedin participated in hurricane relief work in New Orleans in December 2005.

First Baptist has partnered with Dennis Conner who has begun a church start in Buckeye, Arizona – Crosspointe Church at Tartesso. Dennis is a former member of First Baptist, Welcome, and pastored a church in eastern North Carolina.

In March 2006 the church was honored to have Bobby Welch, President of the Southern Baptist Convention, speak at the church as part of Crossover Triad, an effort held each year in the host city of the SBC. Several members of our church were part of Crossover Triad, which gave opportunity to canvass neighborhoods, pass out surveys, and solicit opinions on what SBC churches can do to more effectively help people.

In June 2006 the church was again privileged to have as guest preacher Dr. Richard Land, President of SBC Ethics and Religious Liberty Commission. The purpose of Dr. Land's message was to compel local members to take an active role in furthering the denomination's many political interests. Messengers from First Baptist traveled to Greensboro to attend the SBC which met in June. The SBC has not met in North Carolina in ninety years.

The church received 30 new members and added 47 new Sunday School members in the 2005-2006 church year. We praise God for His continued blessings on us in our 95 years of service. We look to the future as we remain steadfast in our commitment to spread the gospel of Jesus both near and far away. The church will continue to obey Him in all things, trusting in His Word and walking in His steps.

## HISTORY OF LAKEVIEW BAPTIST CHURCH

Lakeview was constituted as a church in 1944. It was started in a garage on highway 150. Land was later purchased on what is now Lakeview Church road where we are still located today.

The associational meeting was last held here in October, 1996.

The following is an update of happenings since October, 1996. Rev. Allen Lefler resigned on May 25, 1997, for a Pastoral position in Cramerton, NC. Rev. Dearl Eunce was called as Interim Pastor on August 10, 1997, and served in this position until August of 1998. Rev. Chris Hawks was called as Pastor on February 14, 1999. His first sermon was preached on April 14, 1999. During Rev. Hawks ministry, a new P.A. system was installed. On October 15, 2000, Rev. Hawks resigned as Pastor to accept a position at Miami Baptist in Mt. Pleasant, NC. Rev. Leonard Rollins was called as Interim Pastor on June 10, 2000, and served in this position until his sudden death. In October, 2000, we took part in the revival Missions project held by the association. Rev. Tim Flint was called as Pastor on March 3, 2002 from Wrightsville Baptist Church, and served in this position until resigning on June 15, 2003. During this time a new porch and handicap ramp was installed in the front of the church. Rev. Jimmy Hinson was called as Interim Pastor on August 3, 2003. On October 26, 2003, the Rev. David Wooten from Forest Hill Baptist Church in Winston Salem, NC was called as Pastor, and still remains in that position today. During Rev. Wooten's time we have made many improvements at the church, including adding a much needed cover over the front of the church in 2005.

## HISTORY OF ABBOTT'S CREEK MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH

### AN UPDATED HISTORY OF ABBOTT'S CREEK MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH HIGH POINT

James Younger was leading worship services in the Abbott's Creek community and was the first to preach in Piedmont, NC from 1755-1758. Feeling inadequate to do this, Younger urged the people to seek out a pastor who could be their spiritual leader. A group from the unorganized congregation, including Younger, went to the Sandy Creek Baptist Church where Elder Shubal Stearns was preaching and a great spirit of revival prevailed. Stearns' brother-in-law, Daniel Marshall heard the request and accepted the challenge to become the first pastor at Abbott's Creek. Abbott's Creek was the first arm of Sandy Creek Association, which was organized between November 22, 1756 and June 1758.

Abbott's Creek has had many histories written in minutes of the association and have held meetings at their church in the years of 1834, 1838, 1844, 1847, 1853, 1856, 1862, 1866, 1868, 1878, 1886, 1899, 1911, 1923, 1930, 1942, 1954, 1965, 1977, 1982, 1992, 2000, and this year 2006.

The following is a continuation of updates since 2000. The years between 2000 and 2006 have been very eventful years for Abbott's Creek.

The year 2001 was a big history year for Abbott's Creek. After 2 years of serving as Intentional Interim Pastor, Rev. Lee Stocks left and a full time pastor, Rev. Mark Hollar, was called on June 1. A digital camera was purchased for the clerk to take pictures of new members when they join the church. Several members of the church were helped with handicap ramps built by Baptist Men. During the year some 41 people helped with mission endeavors. We had 16 to go to Alaska, 6 to West Virginia, three to South Africa, and 6 helped with the clean-up in eastern North Carolina, and several went to West Virginia with a truck load of supplies for the flood victims. The Labor of Love Ministry continued to be open two times per month during 2001 with several families being fed through this mission ministry.

2002 was the same story with many mission trips planned and saw more people than ever before doing missions with some 60 to 90 people going/doing some mission work. 13 went to Alaska, 3 to South Africa, 18 to New York, several to West Virginia, and many helping with the Labor of Love that continues to open twice each month. Along with all the other missions, a one-day Blitz of Operation-In-As-Much was held at our church with many helping in and around the neighborhood, and our church supported three members, Matthew Dunn, Walter and Dot Dills, as they served as short-term missionaries in Keniya, Alaska. After having an Interim Music Director for 18 months, we hired Rebecca Barnes to be our Part-time Music Director and she remained with us until the end of 2002 when she departed for a larger church. For the first time, 10 children and 8 youth participated in Associational and State Bible Drills with many being winners. A new organ was purchased and dedicated with money given by the Charles E. Hayworth family. Abbott's Creek hosted the Baptist Medical/Dental Bus in August of 2002. An "Old Fashioned Day" combined with "Note Burning", making the church debt free was held on September 29, 2002. Began pictures for our Pictorial Directory.

In January 2003, a Pictorial Directory of "Our Church Family" was received. Early in the year of 2003, Baptist Men held a special day with Dr. Roger Nix from Raleigh as speaker and the ladies held WMU day in March with Jean Phillips, missionary from Zimbabwe as speaker. In March of

that year a Rock-A-Thon for children and youth was held to raise money for Annie Armstrong Offering. In April Observance of "Operation Iraqi Freedom" Prayer services were held, letters and newsletters were sent to soldiers like in the 1940's when the "Attention" letter was sent to WWII soldiers. VBS was held at Blackwolf, Virginia; Queensbury, NY, a Campground in the mountains of NC, and a mission team to Honduras completed the first phase of building a new church and a former summer youth worker, Drew Rorex, went on a mission trip to Czech Republic. Missions are always a large part of Abbott's Creek Church. The year 2003, our church participated in the On Mission Celebration from October 27-30 where we held concerts and different speakers each night at the church. Two important speakers that came to our church were our own Chet Cantrell, who is missionary in East St. Louis, and Missionary James Joseph who was in Grenada when a group from our church went there. In the year of 2003, we called Rev. David Mills as our Minister of Students. A combined Thanksgiving meal and prayer service was held with Shady Grove, Springhill and Abbott's Creek at Shady Grove Methodist Church. Both the children and adults held a Christmas Cantata that year.

2004 brought Bible Drills and Bible Buddies to Abbott's Creek. WMU again had a special day and speaker with Windy Minton Edwards from the Baptist State Convention speaking. During February our church took a special Love Offering for the "Jesus" Video collection. The Edith Hood General Scholarship Fund gave away its first scholarship and recipients were Zach Ritchie and Charles Myers. Our church began its first Video Ministry on 3/28/04 in our church by Steve Gibson. We held a special Memorial Day Service with the Rev. Ben Rowe, Pastor in Hickory, who was a former staff member. We had two part time missionaries, Walter and Dot Dills spent the months of June, July and August in Alaska. Had mission trips in Spruce Pine, NC; Grifton, NC; Palmer, Alaska; and West Virginia. Our church voted Aaron Moore, Minister of Music into our church, and accepted the resignation of David Mills, Minister of Students the same year. During the year and a half of looking for a new Minister of Music, Kim Moss had served as Interim Music Director and a love offering was taken for her. Held another Old Fashioned Day and church meal in October of 2004. Held a combined Thanksgiving meal/service with Shady Grove, and Clifton Grove in November of 2004.

2005 again brought mission trips to various places like Wyoming, Caswell, West Virginia, Vermont, Western NC, Eastern NC, and East St. Louis, Illinois. A new Iron Archway was added to our beautiful Prayer Garden by money left from the Edith Hood Estate. Our church went through the 40 Days of Purpose this year. Daphne Motsinger, who had made the bread for each of our Lord Supper Days, was given a Certificate of Appreciation for her service for 30 years. Voted in our April Business Meeting to begin a Labor of Love Building Fund. A former Interim Pastor, Rev. Jimmy Hinson came back to the church and preached our third Sunday in May, Memorial Day Service. Jimmy once baptized 32 people in a Revival at Abbott's Creek. In October a first was established, we hired Sandi Todd to become Director of our Pre-school/Children and hired Scott Reid to be Minister of Students in November. Dewey Linville was recognized as having perfect attendance in Sunday School for 47 years straight. Had a combined Thanksgiving meal/service with Clifton Grove, Springhill Methodist, and Abbott's Creek at Abbott's Creek in November of 2005. Both the Children and Adult Choirs held Christmas Cantata's. George Sechrest, a member of the choir for 54 years was honored for being in the choir all those years, became ill and was unable to be a part of the Christmas Cantata in 2005 and succumbed to death in January 2006.

Beginning again in 2006 we are again having many mission trips planned. Two have already gone to Mississippi and one down to Grifton, NC. There are several others planned to Mississippi, West Virginia and East St. Louis, Illinois, and to Honduras.

Our oldest member, Kara Dean, who was 97 years old died in February of 2006.

We are in the midst of planning for our 250<sup>th</sup> year celebration. We have begun by electing a history committee with an extended committee to gather together the history since our beginning in 1756 through the split in 1832 and continue until today. There are plans to write a History book about all of this and have it published. This will be the first book about our history.

Pastors that have led since 2000 are: Rev. Lee Stocks who was with us from March 1999 to May 2001, Rev. Jack Rose has been our Associate Pastor since 1992 and continues to be with us today. Our Pastor since June 1, 2001 has been the Rev. Mark Hollar and he continues to be with us today and has plans of leading us into the future.

### **A BRIEF HISTORY OF FAITH BAPTIST CHURCH, DENTON**

Faith Baptist Church is a church that was built and continues on its name (Faith). The first meeting was held at the home of Wayne and Essie Mae Tysinger on February 3, 1973, by a group of dedicated Christians. At that meeting, 24 people were in attendance seeking God's will and an offering of \$220.00 was collected. The decision was made to start a new church and they began meeting in an old store building. The following week they had 37 people in attendance and Rev. Jack Alexander was called to be their first pastor.

The next step for the new church was to find land on which to build. This proved to be more difficult than they had anticipated. A couple of times the church found land and attempted to purchase it, but the attempts always failed. Then a call came from Gene and Lillie Curry who offered to give land on which to build a church. On October 20, 1974, the church held a groundbreaking ceremony in which the oldest charter member, Mrs. Etta Frank, turned the first shovel of dirt.

On October 5, 1975, the church was dedicated and had its first service in the new building. The church had only 33 members when the building was built. Just ten years later, the church needed more classrooms, so an educational building and fellowship hall were built. Reverend Charles W. Dickens began the pastorate February 1, 1983. During his 16 ½ years of service, the church enjoyed continued growth in which the Sunday School membership climbed to 119 with a record attendance of 104. In 1995 a puppet and drama team was started, a van purchased and it all was dedicated to the Lord. 1998 was another banner year for Faith when the first member of the church was called to the ministry. In 2001, the driveway and parking lot was expanded to accommodate more cars. In 2004, we installed a new sound system, added new chandeliers to the sanctuary, repainted and updated three Sunday School classrooms.

The year 2005 brought the church tremendous growth once again, especially in the children and youth departments. Because the Lord has blessed, we are creating new Sunday School Classes and looking at ways to build additional classrooms.

The church has undergone several changes in its more than thirty years of existence but now we are completely debt-free. The members are excited to see what God has in store for them in the future. The church that was built on faith in the Lord Jesus Christ is still living up to its name.

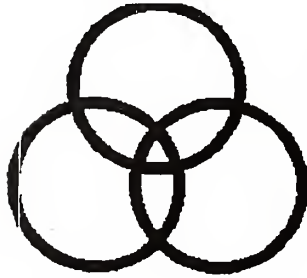

(July 2005-July 2006)

*Many Voices, One Story.* . . North Carolina Baptists attending the Baptist State Convention Tuesday evening, November 15, 2005, sat as the lights in the Joel Coliseum in Winston-Salem dimmed. Messengers and guests arrived anticipating the night's report from Baptist Children's Homes (BCH). Every five years, the Institution presents a 30-minute expanded report, which many people view as the highlight of the convention.

The crowd present this night leaned forward as the first child stepped to the microphone to tell her story. Children and residents representing BCH's four campuses, wilderness camping program, group homes and developmental disabilities ministry filled the stage area. The 2005 meeting was BCH's opportunity to share the ministry through children's testimonies and songs while highlighting the Institution's 120th anniversary.

BCH president Michael C. Blackwell enthusiastically addressed the group declaring, "We are uniquely, proudly, passionately, and incurably a part of the North Carolina Baptist family."

To close the presentation, Broyhill Home resident Jennifer and developmental disabilities resident Marcie sang "Jesus Loves Me."

"These are God's miracle children..." Blackwell said. "I want you to see in those eyes the eyes of our God who loves children."

But the true pinnacle of the evening for one special child occurred away from the eyes of messengers.

"We were all saying goodbye when I looked down and saw Jennifer crying," said Lou Arnsdorff, Jennifer's child care worker. (Jennifer had just sung on stage.)

A tearful Jennifer told Arnsdorff, "I just want to ask Jesus into my heart." In a crowded hallway outside the auditorium, Jennifer accepted Christ as her Savior.

*Show you love.* . . This year's Baptist Children's Homes' offering theme, "Show You Love," represents the pivotal role individuals and churches play in the lives of hurting children.

North Carolina Baptists show their love through their prayer and financial support. It is only through this commitment that BCH can continue to make a difference. This year's statewide offering goal is \$1,375,000. This represents a \$25,000 increase from last year. Challenge your church to participate in the 2006 Offering Campaign.

*Biography Unveiled.* . . The biography of BCH president Michael C. Blackwell was published and officially unveiled to the public in April. *Just Call Me Mickey: From Mill Village to Mills Home, The Journey of Michael C. Blackwell* was written by the late Wint Capel, former editor of the *Thomasville Times*. The book chronicles Blackwell's life from his humble beginnings as a boy living in the mill village town of Gastonia to

becoming president of one of the largest private children's homes in the southeast United States.

***New PMG members named.*** . . Baptist Children's Homes president Michael C. Blackwell announced several key administrative appointments in June. Nancy McNeill was named BCH's Executive Vice President (EVP) of Operations overseeing the statewide Institution's day-to-day operations. Jim Edminson was appointed as BCH's Institutional Director for Communications directing the agency's statewide communications. Shane Nixon has been named BCH's Institutional Director of Information Services directing BCH's technology services and broadening his role of service. McNeill, Edminson and Nixon will serve on Blackwell's President's Management Group (PMG).

Former resident, BCH child care worker, and administrative office manager Jennifer Shore was appointed Executive Assistant to the President and longtime staff member Ron Richardson was named Manager, Institutional Support Services.

***Dedicated to the Glory of God.*** . . Baptist Children's Homes set its sights towards the future expanding its services to children and families.

- The Alverta Bolick Home in Asheville was dedicated in May. The facility is home to developmentally disabled adults in the Asheville area.
- The campaign to build two similar facilities for special needs adults in the Sanford community began in August 2005.
- A state-of-the-art education center in Kinston was dedicated in July. The new Reverend Kenneth E. Haigler & William "Bill" Overcash Education Center offers an on-campus school to residents at BCH's Kennedy Home.
- The Winifred Lindsay and Three Forks Homes for developmentally disabled adults were dedicated August 27 in Boone.
- Groundbreaking for DDM homes in Sanford and Asheboro will take place September 10 and October 14 respectively.

## *2005 Annual Report*

The mission of the North Carolina Baptist Foundation since its inception in 1920 has been to assist the Convention and its institutions and agencies in increasing an awareness among North Carolina Baptists of Christian estate stewardship principles as a means of financially undergirding churches, institutions and mission endeavors on a permanent basis. The uniqueness of the ministries and services provided by the institutions and General Board staff merits increased financial support. The Foundation accomplishes these objectives by offering assistance in estate planning counsel, Will preparation, planned giving, charitable remainder trusts, endowment funds and church fund management.

During 2005, the Foundation assisted individuals in establishing 49 endowment funds and 12 charitable remainder trusts totaling \$1.8 million and received \$7.1 million in contributions to existing endowments all of which will ultimately benefit countless Baptist causes on a permanent basis. Programs were provided for churches and associations during the year to promote Make Your Will Month, Christian estate stewardship, and church fund management. Over \$1.5 million from churches and institutions came under management to enhance

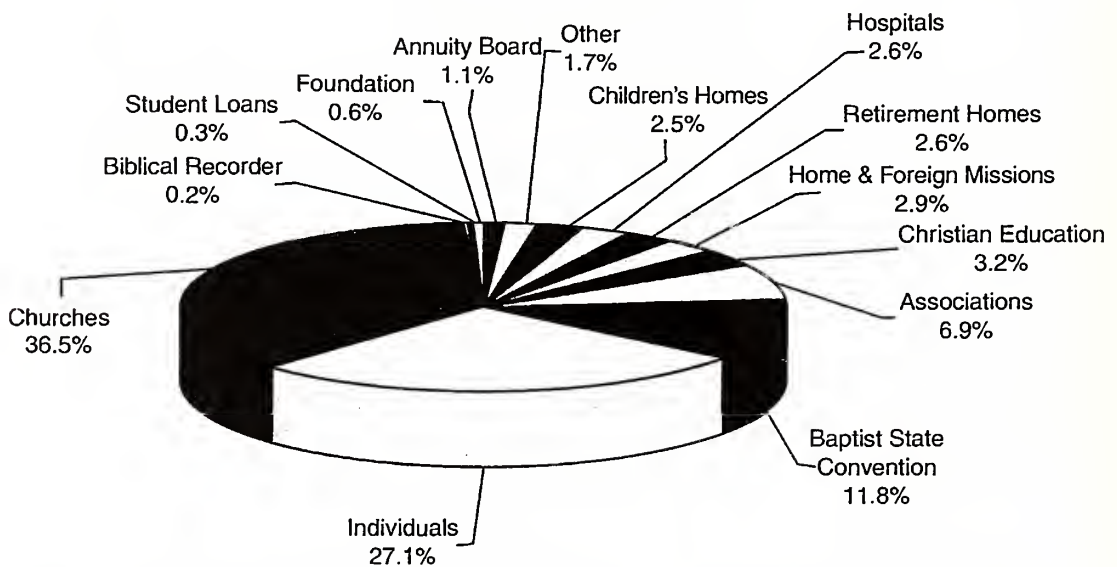
numerous ministries including scholarships, building funds, cemetery funds, benevolence funds, general operating funds and other various mission causes. Overall, the Foundation received \$10.6 million in contributions during 2005 for Christian causes.

The Foundation employs professional money managers to invest these funds according to an investment policy adopted by its Board. Four investment pools are offered: a growth fund, a balanced fund, an income fund and a fixed income fund. The Foundation uses the services of Salomon Smith Barney to help select top money managers and evaluate performance. As of December 31, 2005, the Foundation held \$136.1 million under management.

During 2005, our distributions totaled \$7.8 million, with charity receiving \$5.7 million and individuals, through trusts, receiving \$2.1 million. During the 85-year history of The North Carolina Baptist Foundation, Inc., \$29.1 million has been distributed to individuals and \$53.3 million to Baptist churches, institutions and mission causes for a grand historical total of \$82.4 million. ☺

## Report for 2006 Book of Reports

Office of Guide Stone Financial Resources for the Baptist State Convention of NC, Inc.

During the past year significant strides have been made to provide the very best service to employees of our churches and agencies who are active participants in the retirement plan, jointly administered by Guide Stone Financial Resources, SBC, and the Baptist Convention of NC, Inc., and to those who have purchased insurance products from Guide Stone. Through a contractual agreement with Morningstar Associates, LLC, a registered investment advisor, retirement participants now have access online to a leading innovator in offering retirement advice. Specifically, Morningstar Retirement Manager offers objective, expert recommendations and resources to help participants make clear decisions about their retirement plans. Never before have we been able to offer this incredible service at no cost to our retirement participants.

In the life and health areas enhancements continue to be made to provide additional flexibility in plan options, deductibles and competitive rates. Taking advantage of significant discounts through Highmark Blue Cross Blue Shield, medical plan rates have been stabilized. While over 40% of personal plan participants received a decrease in rates in 2005, over 57% of personal plan medical participants received a decrease in rates for 2006. Additionally, the two Medicare supplement plans offered to retirees also received rate decreases in 2006. The 31 day open enrollment period for new students in our divinity schools, Bible institute, and seminary continues to be an attractive option for that target group.

During the past year the importance of the protection benefits (disability and survivor), which come free to those who are active participants in the Church Retirement Plan and who are serving an eligible church, was magnified with 100 participants receiving disability protection benefits and 40 families receiving survivor benefits because of that many deaths among our church employees. One widow, whose pastor/husband in his early 50's suffered a stroke and died within ten days, received a survivor benefit check in the amount of \$50,000 in addition to the money in his retirement account. The survivor check of \$50,000 came quickly (also tax free) and proved to be a "life saver" to this widow. As in previous years, the great challenge is to educate our church employees and key lay leaders in our churches about these great benefits **provided at no cost** to those church employees who meet the eligibility requirements.

Furthermore, we gladly cooperate with the Endowment ministry at Guide Stone to provide ongoing and one-time financial assistance to retired ministers and widows of ministers who are living in poverty. As of June 30, we have 222 North Carolinians, who have met the very strict guidelines, receiving financial assistance from Guide Stone Financial Resources. Unfortunately, others could be assisted if we only knew who they were.

In conclusion, it is our strong desire to increase the level of retirement participation and to serve all of our churches and their employees with the appropriate information/products to meet their needs. **2005 Annual Report**

*The Christian Action League of North Carolina is a Christian public policy organization that addresses public policy and legislative issues from a Christian worldview. The Christian Action League has a full-time presence in the General Assembly of North Carolina and has garnered considerable respect from both the Republican and Democratic parties. The League's purpose is to assist the church in fulfilling Christ's command to be the "salt" and the "light" of the earth. The following report contains highlights from this year's ministry.*

**Advancing Kingdom Principles**

*In 2004, the North Carolina General Assembly passed legislation for a specialty license plate with the Nation's motto, "In God We Trust" and a yellow ribbon with the phrase, "Support Our Troops" on it. Three hundred applications were necessary to launch the plates. This year, CAL fulfilled its promise to help garner the applications needed. In fact, on October 10th, Rev. Mark Creech, Executive Director of the CAL, was the three hundredth person to make application.*

*CAL provides critical information regarding social and moral issues via its interactive website [www.christianactionleague.net](http://www.christianactionleague.net). The website seeks to keep the church abreast of the latest developments in the culture war – both from a national and statewide perspective. The website also provides educational materials, guest commentaries from some of the best columnists in North Carolina and a nationally syndicated editorial by CAL's Executive Director. Since June of 2003, CAL has had over 30,000 hits on its website.*

*Each week CAL publishes a "Weekly Email Issues Alert." This alert is essentially an Email Magazine, which is quite comprehensive in covering issues of moral import in the State legislature, politics, and other concerns. It covers matters of great social consequence to Judeo-Christian values in the following categories: N.C. General Assembly, N.C. Politics, N.C. News, U.S. Congress, Courts, Christianity/Pro-family/Religion, Abortion/Pro-Life, Alcohol/Drugs/Health, Education/Sex-Ed/Children, God and Country/National Security/ Politics, Pornography/Homosexuality/Immorality, and Gambling. Currently, over 2500 persons in North Carolina have subscribed to this service. Mark Creech, Executive Director of the CAL, has advanced Christian principles throughout North Carolina and the nation in numerous speaking engagements that included denominational meetings, church worship services, political rallies, revival meetings, legislative chapel services, press conferences, conventions and seminars.*

**Lobbying Activity**

*Whenever an urgent legislative issue arises in the General Assembly of North Carolina, CAL typically responds by sending out an "Urgent Action Alert." These alerts are designed not simply to inform Christians, but to mobilize them at the grassroots level. Their purpose is to get constituents to put pressure on their lawmakers to vote on legislation a certain way. CAL's "Urgent Action Alerts" have been responsible for the success and failure of a number of pieces of legislation considered by members of the N.C. House and Senate. Persons receiving the "Weekly Email Issues Alert" will also receive "Urgent Action Alerts."*

This year CAL worked tirelessly to get State legislators to approve legislation for a Constitutional Amendment that would ban same-sex marriage in the Tar Heel State. Rev. Mark Creech, CAL's Executive Director, lead in a Pastor's briefing at the General Assembly on the subject. He also spoke at a rally of hundreds of people at the Halifax Mall in support of the amendment. The North Carolina Family Policy Council hosted both meetings. Despite the fact that two pieces of legislation, one in the House and one in the Senate, (HB 55 – Defense of Marriage and SB 8 – Defense of Marriage) were introduced that would have defined marriage as "one man and one woman" in North Carolina's Constitution, the House and Senate leadership would not allow either measure to be heard in Committee.

CAL has also been at the forefront of a push for a Federal Marriage Amendment to the U.S. Constitution by North Carolinians.

After successfully beating back lottery legislation for 23 years, CAL was unable to stop the passage of a lottery measure that succeeded by one vote in each chamber. This year's efforts by CAL to defeat lottery legislation were reported widely by the press. Reports noted Rev. Mark Creech was the last person in the line of defense against the lottery. Creech drove over 200 miles on the day of the Senate vote to visit with Sen. John Garwood (R-North Wilkesboro), who was at home sick and the deciding vote on the measure. During that visit, CAL's Director convinced Sen. Garwood to pair his vote while absent from the General Assembly, keeping the lottery at bay with a one-vote margin of 25-24. But in the eleventh hour, influenced by the phone calls of high-powered legislative leaders and the myths of lottery promises, Sen. Garwood reversed his position to pair. The result was a 24 – 24 tie that Lieutenant Governor Beverly Perdue voted to break in favor of State-sponsored gambling. Governor Mike Easley wasted no time in signing HB 1023 – North Carolina State Lottery Act the very next day.

CAL hosted a group of twenty-five pastors, who came from across the State, to hold a press conference and meet with members of the General Assembly. Their purpose was to voice their opposition to a state-lottery and explain the reasons it would produce negative social and economic consequences. Associate Pastor Phillip Addison from Stony Point Baptist Church in Stony Point, N.C. summarized the sentiments of all the Pastors when he said, "The State should definitely not be in the business of promoting covetousness and greed. America was founded on Judeo-Christian values and citizens have a responsibility to act when elected officials are promoting immoral legislation."

CAL was successful this year in pushing back legislation that would have allowed pari-mutuel gambling on horse racing at the Carolina Horse Park in Hoke County. The legislation, SB 9 – Economic Development Horse Race was withdrawn from the Senate's Calendar twice and ultimately died in the Senate Commerce Committee.

CAL continues to support legislation that would ban video poker in the State. This year, CAL lobbied for the passage of SB 6 – Ban Video Poker/All But Reservations and HB 29, the companion bill in the House. Neither of these bills saw any action and an identical provision included in the Senate version of the budget was stripped out by the House.

Except for its efforts to defeat the lottery, no battle was as tough as the one waged this year by CAL to prevent the alcohol content in beer from being raised from 6% to 15%. HB 392 – Amend Definition of a Malt Beverage in ABC Law passed the House by a large margin, 68 – 46. Rev. Mark Creech, CAL's Executive Director, did extensive research on the measure, pointing out its potential problems to lawmakers. He testified before two House Committees and one Senate Committee. After weeks of having to fight the measure single handedly, CAL's arguments convinced Sen. John Kerr (D-Pitt), Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, to pull the bill off the Senate floor and refer it to the Senate Finance Committee for further study. The legislation remained in the Senate Finance Committee for two weeks and was never considered. Nevertheless, the Senate leadership instructed Sen. Kerr to place the bill back on the Senate floor for consideration. Kerr refused, but Sen. David Hoyle (D-Gaston), also a Finance Committee Chairman, placed the bill back on the Senate floor and it passed 21-27. Rev. Creech pleaded with the Governor's office to veto the bill. Instead the Governor signed the legislation on August 13, 2005. CAL strongly opposed a measure to amend the alcoholic beverage control election law to allow towns or cities where a railroad passenger terminus exists to be eligible to hold malt beverage elections. CAL's Executive Director testified against HB 1416 – An Act to Amend the Alcoholic Beverage Control Election Law in both the House ABC Committee and the Senate Commerce Committee. Rev. Mark Creech argued CAL was very much in favor of local option alcohol referenda. However, the proposed legislation was unconstitutional because it was a local act (local law) that sought to regulate the trade of alcohol that couldn't be applied statewide. Its application was meant for

and limited to Dillsboro, North Carolina, a small town with approximately 200 persons. Unfortunately, the bill passed in the House 79 – 39 and in the Senate 33 – 16.

This year's efforts by CAL to raise taxes on cigarettes were successful. On August 4, budget conferees reached an agreement on a cigarette tax increase that calls for a 25 cents increase (to 30 cents per pack) on September 1. An additional 5 cents increase (to a total tax of 35 cents per pack) will take effect July 1, 2007. The CAL pushed for a 75 cents tax increase as proposed in HB 286 – Increase Cigarette Tax. However, 25 cents increase will result in a 5.2 percent decrease in the youth smoking rate in North Carolina and will save 33,800 kids alive today from a lifetime of smoking and disease.

CAL was the only faith-organization opposed to legislation calling for a two-year moratorium on executions in North Carolina. In July, the House Judiciary I Committee approved a Proposed Committee Substitute for HB 529 – Suspend Executions for Two Years and changed its title to Study Death Penalty. The legislation supposedly was a compromise on the previously proposed death-penalty moratorium in North Carolina. Instead of calling for a blanket moratorium, the legislation essentially allowed for a condemned inmate to ask a trial court judge to postpone his execution until a study on the death penalty in North Carolina was concluded. In order to win a stay of execution, an inmate would have had to cite one of seven factors being examined by the death penalty study as affecting his/her own case. CAL's Executive Director, Rev. Mark Creech vigorously opposed the so-called compromise as well, saying it was deceptive. The problem with the measure, he told lawmakers, was it represented an "open season" on every death penalty case, no matter how carefully it had been decided in the courts. It was essentially a "de-facto moratorium." Proponents of the measure could never find enough votes in the House necessary for passage. The bill was withdrawn from the House Calendar three times and postponed four times. The legislation is eligible to be considered in 2006.

CAL was rather ambivalent regarding legislation introduced by Sen. Julia Boseman (D-New Hanover) that would have banned obscene video games to minors. Rev. Mark Creech, CAL's Executive Director, testified before the Senate Commerce Committee that he was supportive of the bill's concept. Nevertheless, he had been in contact with the American Family Association's Law Center and had been informed that the way the legislation was crafted it would never meet constitutional muster. Creech later explained he was reluctant to support SB 2 – No Violent/Obscene Video Game Sales to Minors for that reason. "I'm not sure it advances our cause for decency to support legislation that will likely fail in the courts," Creech told certain lawmakers. "That only makes such legislation more difficult to pass afterward," he said. The bill passed the Senate, but failed to make it through the House before adjournment. The legislation remains eligible for the 2006 session.

CAL supported legislation that would have directed local boards of education to adopt policies to: (1) require the display of the U.S. and N.C. flags in all public school classrooms; (2) require the daily recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance; (3) provide for age-appropriate instruction on the meaning and historical significance of the U.S. flag and the Pledge of Allegiance and the values they represent, and (4) require instruction on the meaning and historical origins of the N.C. flag, the State motto and other State symbols. SB 1096 – Flag, Pledge, and Symbols Taught in Schools passed unanimously in the Senate, but was never considered by the House.

A bill that would have permitted stem cell research under limited circumstances in North Carolina was heard in the House Health Committee, but was not acted upon. CAL's Executive Director testified against HB 632 – Stem Cell Research Health and Wellness Act, saying, "Certainly a society's moral compass is largely determined by its respect for the sanctity of human life. Every life is sacred, a precious and inviolable gift from our Creator, beginning at conception. It is one of the most profound signs of depravity in a culture when its government officials and leaders in the medical community sanction the practice of destroying pre-born life for the purpose of scientific experimentation."

HB 505 – WCR Study Sunday Hunting, which the CAL opposed this year, would have directed the North Carolina Wildlife Resources Committee to study whether the State should lift its ban on Sunday hunting. The bill passed a House Committee, but lost momentum and stalled in the House. The measure was ultimately included in HB 1269 – The Studies Act of 2005, which failed to pass the General Assembly before it adjourned.

CAL supported SB 972 – Break Into Place of Worship, which was enacted by the Legislature this year. The bill creates a new Class G felony for "any person who wrongfully breaks or enters any building that is a place of religious worship with intent to commit any felony or larceny therein." The legislation was in response to a rash of break-ins and robberies in houses of worship across the State.

One of the members of CAL's own Board of Directors serves in the N.C. House, Rep. Russel Capps (R-Wake). This year, Capps put forward two measures that CAL supported, one, which failed, and the other succeeded. HB 681 – Religious Freedom Restoration Act would have protected an individual's right to the free exercise of religion from coercion by the government, unless government can demonstrate a compelling interest to do otherwise, and even when government must use the least restrictive means of furthering that interest. The legislation would have allowed persons who believe their religious freedoms are burdened to seek legal remedy and, if successful in court, to recover legal costs. The legislation was referred to the House Judiciary I Committee and was never taken up for consideration. However, HB 829 – Display of Official Governmental Flags, also introduced by Capps and supported by the CAL, did succeed. Circumstances have arisen where flying the American flag or other governmental flags; have been prohibited by some towns, cities, and counties by certain ordinances. The legislation guarantees the flying of such flags on private property.

#### **Local Option Alcohol Referenda**

In 2005, CAL assisted one community in their efforts to defeat an ABC, Beer-Wine, and Liquor-By-The-Drink referendum. Unfortunately, the effort was a loss (the referendum succeeded), but by small margins.

Our Ministry to seafarers at the Port of Morehead City has continued its outreach to foreign seamen during the year of 2005.

The ships are visited on a regular basis to welcome them and apprise them of services available through our Center. These services continue to include free Bibles, Gospel tapes, devotional literature, free coffee, snacks, transportation for shopping, telephone and mailing services, internet services, magazines, books, and a game room. In addition, we supply a cell phone and phone cards for those seamen who are confined to the ship which occurs fairly frequently. We arrange for worship services and maintain a prayer room for their private use, or meetings with them for prayer and Bible meditation.

Last year during Christmastime we delivered 179 bags to the seamen and we delivered the first for 2006 just today and last night. These were supplied by a local Presbyterian Church. The Atlantic Baptist Association churches supply gifts every year and their's will be arriving very soon. Generally we distribute 200 or more gifts during the Christmas period and many more items throughout the year.

To date we have recorded 1,757 contacts with our staff and volunteers; also recorded 99 Bible gifts, and 201 Gospel tapes were shared. A great number of pieces of devotional literature, tracts, etc., were distributed but not counted. We continue to use our van for shopping when drivers are available. The number of telephone calls made by seamen are not recorded. They all use telephone cards which provide them a lot of minutes at very low rates. We have three telephone lines which they use at no charge, as well as internet services.

My wife, who has served with me as Associate Director, volunteer coordinator, and Center Manager for 19 years and before that as a volunteer for many years, went to be with the Lord in September following a long bout with cancer. For the time being I am continuing carrying out both our responsibilities.

Your prayers and your continued support of the Ministry are greatly appreciated.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION  
OF  
LIBERTY BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

Pursuant to §55A-2-02 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, the undersigned corporation does hereby submit these Articles of Incorporation for the purpose of forming a nonprofit corporation.

ARTICLE I  
NAME

The name of the corporation is *LIBERTY BAPTIST ASSOCIATION*

ARTICLE II  
DESIGNATION

The corporation is a charitable or religious corporation within the meaning of N. C. G. S. §55A-1-40(4).

ARTICLE III  
REGISTERED OFFICE AND AGENT

The street address of the initial registered office of the corporation is *Route 8, Box 610, Bud Kanoy Road, Thomasville, Davidson County, North Carolina, 27360-7839*, and the initial registered agent at that office is *Dr. Richard H. Capps, Director of Missions*.

ARTICLE IV  
INCORPORATORS

The names and addresses of the incorporators, acting as representatives of the members of Liberty Baptist Association are as follows:

ARTICLE V  
MEMBERS

The corporation shall have one class of members as provided in the bylaws. Members shall be received, rejected, withdrawn as set forth in the bylaws. The Baptist churches which are members of Liberty Baptist Association immediately prior to the incorporation thereof automatically shall become members of the corporation.

ARTICLE VI  
DISSOLUTION

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, the board of directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for religious purposes as shall qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue law) as the board of directors shall determine. Any such assets not disposed of shall be disposed of by the District Court of the County in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE VII  
PURPOSE

The purposes for which the corporation is organized are:

- A. to assist the churches of Liberty Baptist Association in their divinely appointed mission and in cooperative relationships with the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina, the Southern Baptist Convention, and other Baptist entities to promote and provide opportunities for individual and collective participation in missions, evangelism, ministry, education, social services, and distribution of the Bible;
- B. to engage in any lawful act or activities for which corporations may be organized under N.C. General Statutes Chapter 55A;
- C. to engage in any lawful activity within the purposes for which the corporation may be organized which is incidental to and in furtherance of the exempt purposes of the corporation;  
to operate exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and recreational purposes, including for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3)

of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

**ARTICLE VIII**  
**INITIAL DIRECTORS**

The number of initial directors shall be One Hundred and Thirty-Four (134), and the initial directors shall be the duly-elected representatives from each member church of Liberty Baptist Association.

**ARTICLE IX**  
**GOVERNMENT**

- A. The government of this corporation is vested in its members who are represented in the manner set out in its bylaws. The members retain the right of self-government in all phases of the spiritual and temporal life of the association.
- B. Churches received as members of this corporation as set out in the bylaws shall constitute the membership ("the members"). The members shall be represented by messengers as provided in the bylaws and shall have the sole authority to adopt and amend the charter and bylaws, approve budgets, receive and discharge members, govern and conduct the affairs of this corporation.
- C. All internal groups, committees, directors, officers, agents, and/or employees created and empowered by the association ultimately shall report to and be accountable to the members and shall have such powers and duties as set out in the bylaws.
- D. This association is autonomous and independent and is a sovereign and democratic association of Baptist churches under the Lordship of Jesus Christ. As such, the association is subject to the control of no other ecclesiastical body and does not claim and will never attempt to exercise any authority over any member church, auxiliary organization, or other Baptist body.

**ARTICLE X**  
**ELECTION AS 501(c)(3) CORPORATION**

No part of the net earnings or receipts of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes as set forth in these Articles of Incorporation.

No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), or (b) by a corporations, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

**ARTICLE XI**

**PERSONAL LIABILITY**

Personal liability for all directors for monetary damages arising out of an action or actions, whether by or in the right of the corporation or otherwise for breach of any duty as a director is eliminated except with respect to acts, omissions, liabilities and/or transactions described and defined in North Carolina General Statutes §55A-2-02 (b),(4)(i),(ii),(iii), and (iv).

**ARTICLE XII**  
**EFFECTIVE DATE**

These articles will be effective upon filing.

**LAWS OF LIBERTY BAPTIST ASSOCIATION**

**ARTICLE I**

**NAME AND LOCATION**

- A. The corporate name of this nonprofit corporation shall be "Liberty Baptist Association" The principal and registered office of the Corporation shall be at 259 Bud Kanoy Road, Thomasville, 27360-0810, Davidson County, North Carolina.
- B. All reference to "Association" or "Corporation" in the Articles of Incorporation, in the Bylaws, in Amendments, or other official action of the Association, shall signify the legal organization of Liberty Baptist Association as established in the Articles of Incorporation. Liberty Baptist Association as it has existed heretofore, for all legal and administrative purposes fully is incorporated into Liberty Baptist Association, a nonprofit corporation. References to votes of the membership shall have reference to a vote of the members of this Association as prescribed in Article VII F of these Bylaws.

**ARTICLE II**  
**PURPOSE**

The purposes for which the Corporation is organized are:

- A. to assist the churches of Liberty Baptist Association in their divinely appointed mission and in cooperative relationships with the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina, the Southern Baptist Convention, and other Baptist entities to promote and provide opportunities for individual and collective participation in missions, evangelism, ministry, education, social services, and distribution of the Bible;
- B. to engage in any lawful act or activities for which corporations may be organized under N.C. General Statutes Chapter 55A;
- C. to engage in any lawful activity within the purposes for which the Corporation may be organized which is incidental to and in furtherance of the exempt purposes of the Corporation;  
to operate exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and recreational purposes, including for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

**ARTICLE III**  
**ELECTION AS A 501(C)(3) CORPORATION**

- A. The Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and recreational purposes, including for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law).
- B. No part of the net earnings or receipts of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes as set forth in the Articles.
- C. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or the corresponding provision of any future U.S. Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future U.S. Internal Revenue Law).

**ARTICLE IV**  
**GOVERNMENT**

- A. The government of this Association is vested in its members who are represented in the manner set out in its Bylaws. The members retain the right of self-government in all phases of the spiritual and temporal life of the association. Churches received as members of this Association, as herein provided, shall constitute the membership ("the members"). The members shall be represented by messengers duly elected by each member church and certified to

*the Association in its Annual Church Profile (Church Letter), and the number of messengers shall be determined as follows:*

- a. Six messengers from each church for its first one hundred members or fraction thereof;*
- b. One additional messenger from each church for each additional fifty members or fraction thereof above 100 and up to 1,000 members;*
- c. One additional messenger from each church for each additional one hundred members or major fraction thereof above 1,000 members;*

*The members represented by messengers as aforesaid shall have the sole authority to adopt and amend the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws, approve budgets, receive and discharge members, govern and conduct the affairs of this Corporation. In the event of death or resignation of a messenger, the member shall elect a successor messenger to fill the vacancy. The name of the messenger being replaced and the elected successor shall be furnished to the Clerk of the Association, in writing, and shall be presented at the next regular meeting of the Association.*

- C. All internal groups, committees, directors, officers, agents, and/or employees created and empowered by the Association ultimately shall report to and be accountable to the Association and shall have such powers and duties as hereinafter set out.*
- D. This Association is autonomous and independent and is a sovereign and democratic association of Baptist churches under the Lordship of Jesus Christ. As such, the Association is subject to the control of no other ecclesiastical body and does not claim and will never attempt to exercise any authority over any member church, auxiliary organization, or other Baptist body.*

#### ARTICLE V PROPERTY

- A. The title to all property shall be in the Association.*
- B. The securing and maintaining of real, personal, and mixed property by this association shall be for the express purpose of providing facilities for and the engagement upon the missionary, educational, and benevolent interests of this association as historically have been espoused and practiced thereby and as are expressed in its charter and bylaws, which practices and documents are deemed the standard for uses and practices upon and with regard to such property.*
- C. Real property shall not be mortgaged, conveyed, transferred, or encumbered without the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the "Individuals entitled to vote," as hereinafter defined in Article VII, G., at an annual meeting or a regular meeting duly called for such purpose and stated in the meeting notice.*
- D. This article shall not be amended, altered, or repealed except by a three fourths vote of the "Individuals entitled to vote," as hereinafter defined in Article VII, G., at an annual or regular meeting duly called and then only in the event that such proposed amendment, alteration, or repeal has been given in writing to the Moderator and Executive Board and has lain on the table for a period of twelve months, and no article shall be voted upon until the period aforementioned has elapsed, any other provisions herein to the contrary notwithstanding.*

#### ARTICLE VI MEMBERS

- A. Record of Members: The members of this Association shall be composed of the Baptist churches who are members of Liberty Baptist Association on the date these Bylaws are adopted. The Clerk shall attach hereto a list of such present members which shall remain a part of the official records of the Association maintained at all times in the office of the Association. A current list of members shall be maintained at all times in the office of the Association.*
- B. Organization of New Work Missions/Churches: The Association by its nature and definition is an organization whose primary purpose is missions. In furtherance of these functions, the Association will attempt to develop and foster new work missions/churches and will remain available and will be resourceful in assisting groups or churches in their own development respectively of and as Baptist churches. The Association is mindful and responsive to the autonomous nature of the structure of its members and desires to inculcate in watch-care groups and churches their own independence while utilizing, without compulsion, the well-intended and well-respected practices of existing Baptist churches in historical Baptist precedence, all of which can be helpful during the organizational phases. To those ends and to effect these purposes, the Association will consider, promulgate, and maintain suggested guidelines for establishing and assisting new work missions/churches in their efforts. These guidelines shall be developed by the Missions Development Committee and approved by the Association. At such time as a group comes under watch care of the Association, a sponsoring church (member of the Association) shall be recommended by the Missions Development Committee in consultation with the Director of Missions and actively shall support such mission/church with any resource assistance required. The sponsoring church will work in cooperation with the Missions Developme,*

*Committee and a Liaison Committee shall be formulated and shall be comprised of the following: Two persons from the sponsoring church; Two persons from the new mission/church; One person from the Missions Development Committee; and, Ex-officio, the Mission Pastor, Sponsoring Church Pastor, and Director of missions.*

*The Liaison Committee shall meet monthly and no less than bi-monthly during the formation period of the mission/church and shall assist in every reasonable manner with the development of the mission/church on behalf of the Association. In the event a sponsoring church cannot be secured, the Missions Development Committee shall be responsible for the sponsoring thereof on behalf of the Association. The mission/church shall remain under watch care of the Association until such mission/church is ready to constitute a self-supporting church and has fulfilled watch-care requirements.*

C. *Admission of New Churches: Any church seeking admission to the membership of the Association shall petition the Association in writing at least three months prior to the annual meeting of the Association. Such petition shall be referred to the Missions Development Committee for its study of the petitioning church's covenant, articles of faith, history, practices, cooperative spirit, its relations to other churches of the Association, and its willingness to abide by the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Association. A written report setting out its findings and recommendations for action at the next annual meeting of the Association shall be submitted by the Missions Development Committee to the Executive Board and the Association. Final approval for membership shall be contingent upon a one-year period under a watch-care relationship after which determination will be made by a three-fourths vote of "Individuals entitled to vote," as defined in VII, G., in annual meeting.*

D. *Privileges of Membership: Members through their messengers ("Individuals entitled to vote," as defined in Article VII, G.), and members through their messengers ("Individuals entitled to vote," as defined in Article VII, G.) only, are entitled to vote in all elections and all questions submitted to the Association. Recognizing the value of voluntary association among churches of like faith and practice, members are afforded opportunity to work in mutual, cooperative fellowship with other churches, especially those of Baptist faith, to advance the gospel of Christ, to promote Christian principles of justice and righteousness in personal, social, and community life, to promote the spiritual welfare of all persons, to disseminate the work of God to the people of all nations through evangelistic, educational, and charitable missions.*

E. *Requirements of Membership: All members reasonably are required to submit a completed Annual Church Profile (Church Letter) to the Annual Meeting; send messengers to the annual meeting; and, contribute to the financial program of the Association. Only members of the Association shall determine whether member churches have fulfilled requirements for membership.*

F. *Termination of Membership: The membership status of any member shall be terminated by written request of the member seeking termination addressed to the Association. Failure reasonably to meet requirements of membership as set out in paragraph E above for a period of two consecutive years after contact by the Missions Development Committee to ascertain the desire of the member church shall subject any member church to termination. No member may be expelled or suspended, and no membership may be terminated or suspended, except in a manner that is fair and reasonable and is carried out in good faith, and in compliance with the following procedures:*

1. *The Executive Board, by a three-fourths (3/4) vote of members present at a special meeting, duly called, must recommend termination of the subject member church.*
2. *Such recommendation, in writing, must be mailed to the subject member church and each member church sixty (60) days in advance of a special meeting of members.*
3. *The subject church shall have full and ample opportunity to present its position at such meeting.*
4. *Termination of membership shall occur only upon a three-fourths (3/4) vote of individuals entitled to vote.*

G. *Watch-care Affiliation: Watch-care affiliation for a period of one year shall be required for each church applying for membership in the Association. Each church under watch-care affiliation shall submit a quarterly report and an Annual Church Profile (Church Letter) to the Association.*

#### ARTICLE VII

#### MEETINGS OF MEMBERS

A. *Annual Meeting: The annual meeting of the Association shall be held on Monday following the first Sunday in October for the following purposes: to elect officers of the Association, standing committees, and special committees; to receive annual reports; to approve budgets; to conduct any other business matters which properly may come before the annual meeting; and, to share in worship and fellowship.*

*Regular Meetings: Regular meetings shall be held in January, April, and July to receive reports, to conduct business matters which properly come before the meeting, and to share in worship and fellowship.*

- C. *Special Meetings: Special meetings for the transaction of business may be called by the Executive Board provided sufficient notice is given members to allow for two Sundays between the call and the meeting.*
- D. *Emergencies: In emergencies, any change in the time and/or place of meetings shall be determined by a vote of two-thirds of the Executive Board present when the vote is taken.*
- E. *Presiding Officer: The Moderator shall preside at all meetings of members. In the absence of the Moderator, the Vice Moderator shall preside. In the absence of the Moderator and Vice Moderator, the Clerk shall preside. In the absence of the aforementioned officers, the Treasurer shall preside. In the absence of all officers, the body may elect an acting moderator.*
- F. *Quorum: Seventy-five (75) "Individuals entitled to vote," as hereinafter defined in Article VII, G., shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any annual or special meeting of members.*
- G. *Voting: Messengers who have been duly elected by a member, have been certified in its annual report to the Association, and are duly registered and present shall be collectively referred to as "Individuals entitled to vote" and shall be entitled to one vote at any meeting of members. No proxy or absentee voting shall be permitted. All voting shall be by show of hands, standing vote or voice vote except when there are contested matters in which case the vote shall be by ballot. Parliamentary procedure utilizing Robert's Rules of Order shall be followed.*

#### ARTICLE VIII

##### EXECUTIVE BOARD

- A. *Board of Directors: All reference to "Executive Board" or "Board of Directors" in the Articles of Incorporation, in the Bylaws, in Amendments, or other official action of the Association shall be synonymous with and shall include conferring of powers as are provided by the Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, and the North Carolina Nonprofit Corporation Act.*
- B. *Membership: The Executive Board membership shall consist of the following:*
  - 1. *Officers duly elected by the Association, to-wit: Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer.*
  - 2. *Standing Committee Chairpersons, Special Standing Committee Chairpersons, and Representatives, Director and Team Leaders as named in Article XI A and XI B.*
- C. *Officers: The officers of the Executive Board shall be the same persons elected by the Association as Moderator (President), Vice Moderator (Vice President), Clerk (Secretary), and Treasurer.*
- D. *Meetings: Regular meetings of the Executive Board shall be held at least quarterly. The first meeting, which shall be designated as the annual meeting, shall be held as soon as possible after the annual meeting of the Association, and the last meeting shall be held as nearly as possible to the next annual meeting of the Association for approval/endorsement of various Reports of the Association for the annual meeting. Special meetings may be called by the Moderator whenever the need arises and the Moderator shall call a special meeting when requested in writing by ten (10) members of the Executive Board.*
- E. *Quorum: Eighteen (18) members of the Executive Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.*
- F. *Duties: Except as restricted by the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws or other official action of the Association, the Executive Board shall manage the general business and activities of the Association between meetings of members; and shall call special meetings of the Association. Executive Board shall plan and correlate the activities of the Association and make recommendations to the Association. The Executive Board shall present a written report of action taken to the Association at its next regular or annual meeting for ratification and approval of action so taken between meetings.*
- G. *Contracts: As instructed and authorized by the Association, the Executive Board may authorize officers to enter into contracts or execute and deliver instruments on behalf of the Association, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances subject only to limitations provided herein.*
- H. *Loans: No loans shall be contracted on behalf of the Association and no evidence of indebtedness shall be issued in its name unless authorized by a resolution of the Executive Board pursuant to specific authority of the Association. Such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.*
- I. *Depository: The Executive Board shall have the power to (a) select one or more banks to act as depositories of the funds of the Association; (b) determine the manner of receiving, depositing, and disbursing the funds of the Association; (c) designate the person or persons authorized to draw on the bank accounts of the Association; (d) approve the form of checks to be used in drawing on such bank accounts; and, (e) change such banks, the person or persons drawing on such accounts, and the form of checks at will.*

- J. *Removal: Board members, as well as officers of the Association, may be removed by majority vote of the Association at a properly called business meeting, with written notice to members setting out the specific purpose of the meeting.*
- K. *Death, Resignation or Termination: In the event a Board member shall expire, resign, or for any reason be removed from the Executive Board, the Association shall fill the vacancy for the unexpired term.*

**ARTICLE IX**  
**OFFICERS**

A. *Officers Generally: There shall be a Moderator who shall also serve as Moderator and Chairman of the Executive Board and President of the Corporation. There shall be a Vice Moderator who shall also serve as Vice Moderator of the Executive Board and Vice President of the Corporation. There shall be a Clerk who shall also serve as Clerk of the Executive Board and Secretary of the Corporation. There shall be a Treasurer who shall also serve as Treasurer of the Association and of the Corporation. Whenever used in the Articles of Incorporation, in the Bylaws, in Amendments, or in other official action of the Association, the words "Moderator or "President;" "Vice Moderator" or "Vice President;" or "Clerk" or "Secretary" shall be synonymous.*

B. *Moderator:*

1. *Election and Term: The Moderator shall be elected annually at the annual meeting of the Association for a term of one year and may be re-elected for a one-year term. The Moderator shall be ineligible for re-election as Moderator for a period of two years after having served two one-year terms. The term of office shall begin at the close of the annual meeting and shall continue through the close of the next annual meeting or until a successor is elected.*

2. *Duties: The Moderator shall*

- a. *preside at the annual meeting, regular meetings, and any special meeting of the Association;*
- b. *serve as President of the Corporation;*
- c. *preside at all meetings of the Executive Board;*
- d. *perform such other duties as are specifically prescribed in these Bylaws and as may be delegated by the Association;*
- e. *serve with other officers to recommend a Committee on Nominations to the Association for election at its July meeting;*
- f. *appoint other committees when so directed by the Association or Executive Board; and*
- g. *serve as ex officio member of all committees except the Committee on Nominations.*

*Vice Moderator*

1. *Election and Term: The Vice Moderator shall be elected annually at the annual meeting for a term of one year and may be re-elected for a one-year term. The Vice Moderator shall be ineligible for re-election as Vice Moderator for a period of two years after having served two one-year terms. The term of office shall begin at the close of the annual meeting in which such election is held and shall continue through the close of the next annual meeting or until his successor is elected.*

2. *Duties: The Vice Moderator shall*

- a. *preside at meetings of the Association and Executive Board in the absence of the Moderator or at the pleasure of the Moderator;*
- b. *serve as Vice President of the Corporation;*
- c. *serve with other officers to recommend a Committee on Nominations to the Association for election at its July meeting; and*
- d. *perform such other duties as may be specifically prescribed in these Bylaws and as may be delegated by the members.*

D. *Clerk*

1. *Election and Term: The Clerk shall be elected annually at the annual meeting for a term of one year.*

2. *Duties: The Clerk shall*

- a. *serve as Secretary of the Corporation and of the Executive Board;*
- b. *maintain at all times a current list of members of the Association;*
- c. *maintain and preserve the files, records, and documents of the Association in proper order at all times for examination by the Executive Board;*
- d. *send report forms to members at least one month before the annual meeting of the Association;*
- e. *prepare a composite record of the member information included in the annual report submitted to the Association and distribute copies thereof at the annual meeting;*

- f. supervise the printing of minutes of the Association and distribute to the members as soon as possible after the annual meeting;
- g. preserve the files, records, and documents of the Association and, upon election of a successor, relinquish such files, records, documents, and other property belonging to the Association and in the possession and control of the Clerk to the duly elected successor; and
- h. preside at meetings in the absence of the Moderator and Vice Moderator at the pleasure of the moderator.

**E. Treasurer**

1. **Election and Term:** The Treasurer shall be elected annually at the annual meeting for a term of one year.
2. **Duties:** The Treasurer shall
  - a. serve as Treasurer of the Corporation;
  - b. have custody of all funds of the Association;
  - c. maintain at all times up-to-date, orderly records of all receipts and disbursements;
  - d. disburse funds by check in accordance with the budget and direction of the Association or Executive Board;
  - e. prepare quarterly financial reports and distribute copies to the Finance Committee and the Executive Board;
  - f. prepare a financial report and distribute copies at the annual meeting;
  - g. serve as a member of the Finance Committee;
  - h. cooperate with the firm making the annual audit; and
  - i. serve with other officers to recommend a Committee on Nominations to the Association for election at its July meeting.
  - j. preside at meetings in the absence of the Moderator, Vice Moderator and Clerk at the pleasure of the moderator.

**F. Assistant Treasurer**

1. **Election and Term:** The Assistant Treasurer shall be elected annually at the annual meeting for a term of one year.
2. **Duties:** The Assistant Treasurer shall, during periods of incapacity or absence of the Treasurer, perform the duties assigned to the Treasurer in paragraph E. 2 as required and shall assist the Treasurer as directed and required by the Treasurer.

**ARTICLE X**  
**STAFF**

- A. **Staff Positions:** The staff of the Association shall be composed of the Associational Missionary, Office Manager, and such other persons who shall fill staff positions as may be created by the Association. The Personnel Committee shall make recommendation for the creation of any staff position. A current list of staff positions shall be maintained by the Personnel Committee. A job description for each staff position shall be prepared and shall be revised periodically by the Personnel Committee, approved by the Executive Board, and furnished to all candidates considered for the position and the person filling the position. Staff positions may be combined from time to time at the discretion of the Personnel Committee and the Executive Board and the combined position held by one person.
- B. **Election/Employment:** Except in the case of the Associational Missionary, the staff members from time to time shall be employed for indeterminate terms by the Association or Executive Board at a regular meeting upon recommendation of the Personnel Committee.
- C. **Termination:** With the exception of the Associational Missionary, termination of the relationship between a staff member and the Association shall occur within a reasonable and announced period after written notice of termination delivered to the staff member on behalf of the Association and to the Personnel Committee and the Executive Board on behalf of the staff member. Termination of the staff member by the Association shall be initiated and acted upon by the Executive Board upon recommendation of the Personnel Committee.
- D. **Vacation and Leave:** Requirements for vacation and leaves, record-keeping, expense reimbursement, work schedules, and other employment matters shall be outlined in the Policy Manual and Benefit Plans. Such manual shall be prepared, reviewed, monitored, and amended from time to time by recommendation of the Personnel Committee to the Executive Board; and the staff shall be subject to the provisions thereof from time to time; provided, nothing therein contained shall be interpreted to be in derivation or in violation of the provisions of the Bylaws, and such Policy Manual and Benefit Plans must remain consistent with the purposes and intent requirements thereof.
- E. **Associational Missionary**

1. *Search Committee Procedure:* When a vacancy occurs in the position of Associational Missionary or the Associational Missionary furnishes notice of intent to vacate the position, a Search Committee composed of the officers of the Association and five members of the Missions Development Committee elected by the Association shall meet as soon as possible, determine their procedure, establish a profile, prepare application forms and reference questionnaires, and shall diligently seek to find an Associational Missionary who, by calling, training, and ability, is qualified spiritually, mentally, and physically to lead the work of the Association. The Moderator shall serve as Chairperson of the Search Committee. Members of the committee may be reimbursed by the Treasurer for any necessary and reasonable travel and subsistence expenses which are incurred in the performance of their duties. The candidate to be recommended by the Search Committee may be interviewed by the Missions Development Committee/Executive Board before presenting the candidate to the Association in annual meeting.

2. *Election/Employment:* When the Search Committee has selected a potential employee and is ready to make a report and recommendation to the Association, such recommendation shall be made to the Association at its next meeting. Upon a vote being taken, the Associational Missionary presented must receive at least three-fourths of all votes cast. If the Associational Missionary fails to receive the required three-fourths vote, the Moderator shall declare the nominee not elected/employed and shall refer the matter, without debate, to the Search Committee for further investigation and further recommendation under the foregoing procedure.

3. *Duties:* The Associational Missionary shall

- a. fulfill all duties under the direction of the Personnel Committee and the Executive Board;
- b. serve ex officio in a supervisory capacity on all committees of the Association unless otherwise provided in these Bylaws;
- c. promote the work of the Association and denomination;
- d. cooperate with members, their pastors, officers, and committees of the Association;
- e. present oral reports to the Missions Development Committee, the Executive Board and Association meetings;
- f. present a written report to the annual meeting of the Association;
- g. assist the Clerk in preparation of the composite record of members from information submitted in their annual report to the Association;
- h. assist the Clerk in preparing the annual minutes of the Association.

4. *Termination:* The Associational Missionary shall be employed for an indeterminate term. The Associational Missionary shall give reasonable notice of intent to resign or retire to the Personnel Committee and the Executive Board. The Associational Missionary may be removed by an affirmative vote of three-fourths of the "Individuals entitled to vote," as heretofore defined in Article VII, G., at a meeting properly called with ten days written notice to the Associational Missionary and written notice of the meeting to the members as required by the Bylaws.

5. *Interim Associational Missionary:* The Executive Board, in consultation with the Personnel Committee, shall be responsible for recommending to the Association the employment of an Interim Associational Missionary when the Association is without an Associational Missionary.

6. *Extended Leave or Absence:* During any extended leave or absence of the Associational Missionary for medical or other appropriate reasons and with advice of the Personnel Committee, the Executive Board shall make such necessary, temporary or emergency decisions as reasonably shall be required.

#### ARTICLE XI

#### COMMITTEES

##### A. Standing Committees:

Except as hereinafter provided, Standing Committees of the Association shall be as follows: Audit Committee, Building and Grounds Committee; Bylaws Committee; Ethnic Ministries Committee; Evangelism Committee; Finance Committee; Historical Committee; Memorials Committee; Meeting Program Committee; Missions Development Committee; Music Committee; Nominating Committee; Ordination Examining Committee; Pastoral Ministries Committee; Personnel Committee; Place and Preacher Committee; Resolutions Committee; Scholarship Committee; Senior Adult Committee; Sunday School Committee; Volunteer Missions/Partnership Committee and Youth Ministries Committee shall have membership of not less than three persons and general responsibilities respectively as follows:

1. *Audit Committee:* The Audit Committee shall make an audit or review of the records and receipts of the Association on a regular basis. A report shall be made to the Finance Committee in writing as to findings, needed adjustments and suggestions. The committee will meet at least two times a year with the Treasurer as ex-officio member to review the quarterly updated finance reports and records. The annual audit report or review shall be completed by September 30 and presented in writing in the Book of Reports as part of the

- Finance Committee report. The Audit Committee shall have the option of recommending a review of the financial records or a complete audit of the financial records. The Audit Committee shall recommend to the appropriate Executive Board and Association meeting, prior to the Annual Session, whether a review or complete audit of the Financial Records is needed. The Audit Committee is responsible for doing the necessary research to answer any questions concerning Financial Records that may be raised by member churches, messengers, or Executive Board members within a reasonable period.*
2. *Building and Grounds Committee: The Building and Grounds Committee shall plan for adequate maintenance, repairs, alterations, improvement, and housekeeping of the physical properties of the Association; upon request of the Associational Missionary, assist in considering approval for special use of the facilities of the Association; and, prepare and submit an appropriate budget request for consideration and inclusion in the proposed budget.*
  3. *Bylaws Committee: The Bylaws Committee shall consider requests for amendments, alterations, or revisions of the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws and shall make recommendations to the Association with respect thereto; and, periodically review and make recommendations for amendments, alterations, or revisions of the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws.*
  4. *Ethnic Ministries Committee: The Ethnic Ministries Committee will encourage cooperation among the churches to minister to the international groups in the area. This will involve various ministries including but not limited to: (1) computer opportunities; (2) medical/dental bus; (3) English as a second language; (4) literacy classes; (5) migrant ministries; (6) resource information for ethnic ministries (food banks, medical assistance, locations of ESL classes, etc.); (7) conversational Spanish classes, and (8) international population incorporation into a new culture.*
  5. *Evangelism Committee: The Evangelism Committee will lead the Association (churches and programs) to address the priority of evangelism in its area and will include in its program: life-style evangelism; church evangelism committee development; evangelism strategy development; mass evangelism; personal evangelism; rural and small church evangelism; metropolitan evangelism; specialized evangelism; renewal evangelism, and evangelism prospect discovery. The committee will coordinate with other committees and member churches the festival ministries and special event ministries for evangelistic outreach in the Association.*
  6. *Finance Committee: The Finance Committee shall consist of the Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer and four persons. The Finance Committee shall study, formulate, and recommend a budget adequate to support the program of the Association; formulate plans for promotion of the budget and cooperation of members in meeting budget needs; review the quarterly and annual financial reports of the Treasurer; review and monitor budget line item expenses; present periodical reports of contributions to members of the Association; and, present a written report to the quarterly and annual meeting of the Association. The Finance Committee shall study all financial matters which may be presented at an Association or Executive Board Meeting and report its findings before action is taken.*
  7. *Historical Committee: The Historical Committee shall consist of the Historian and two other persons. The Historical Committee shall collect and preserve historical data of the association, encourage and promote the preservation of historical data by member churches, and present oral and written reports to meetings of the Association.*
  8. *Memorials Committee: The Memorials Committee shall prepare a report of individuals who have expired since the last annual meeting as reflected in the Annual Church Profile (Church Letter) to the Association furnished by the members and shall conduct a brief, appropriate Memorial Service for such individuals during the Annual Meeting.*
  9. *Meeting Program Committee: The Meeting Program Committee shall consist of the elected chairman, the Moderator, Clerk, Place and Preacher Committee chairman, Associational Music Director, and the Pastors of host churches for the annual and regular meetings of the Association. The Meeting Program Committee shall plan the annual and regular meetings of the Association, prepare a printed program for each of these meetings, and send a copy of the printed program to all persons on the program and members at least ten days prior to the meeting. This committee shall present the printed program for adoption at the opening of each meeting and serve through all meetings when adjustments of the program are necessary.*
  10. *Missions Development Committee: The Missions Development Committee will lead the association (churches and programs) to address the priority missions frontiers in their area through work with church mission development committees, missions survey and analysis, church extension, language missions, church an.*

*community ministries, volunteer chaplaincy ministries, interfaith witness, black church relations, and special ministries.*

*The Missions Development committee will be responsible for assisting in the organization and admission of new churches as more specifically set out in Article VI B and C. The Missions Development Committee shall coordinate mission ministry projects in consultation with other committees of the Association as needed.*

11. *Music Committee: The Music Director elected by the Association shall serve as chairman of the Music Committee. Other members of the committee will be the music directors of each of the churches hosting the meetings of members. Music directors who served for the previous year will be ex officio members of the committee. The Music Committee will seek to enhance the redemptive mission of churches through establishing, conducting, enlarging, and improving their music ministries. It will provide musical experiences in congregational services; develop musical skills, attitudes, and understandings; witness and minister through music; interpret and undergird the work of the church and the denomination.*
12. *Nominating Committee: The Nominating Committee shall consist of five individuals recommended to the annual meeting by the Committee on Nominations and shall meet as often as necessary to fill vacancies and prepare nominations for the annual meeting of the association; seek to fill all positions with the best qualified nominees, avoiding the nomination of one individual for more than one position and distributing obligations and privileges of service to member representation; contact all nominees and secure consent before making recommendations to the Association; recommend to the Association during the annual meeting the officers, chairpersons, members of each standing committee, teams, and representatives, unless otherwise provided in these Bylaws; recommend to the Association individuals to fill vacancies which may occur between annual meetings of the Association.*
13. *Ordination Examining Committee: Each church of the Association shall have the exclusive right to ordain for the ministry without Associational involvement. However, member churches shall have the option to utilize the Associational Ordination Examining Committee as hereinafter set out. The Ordination Examining Committee shall consist of five persons. The Ordination Examining Committee shall receive requests from churches within the Association who wish to examine a candidate for ordination to the Gospel ministry; cooperate with the church requesting examination in setting a mutually satisfactory date for examination; question the candidate for ordination; report its findings to the church making such request for examination; approve for ordination only the candidate who has received a call to serve in an ordained Christian ministry of any kind including, but not limited to that of a member church of the Association, or Baptist churches outside the Association; to serve on the mission field, or to serve as a chaplain in the armed forces or a public institution; and, shall have the option to summons pastors and one lay person from any or all cooperating member churches of the Liberty Baptist Association.*
14. *Pastoral Ministries Committee: The Pastoral Ministries Committee will assist pastors and staff by being a friend and resource. The committee will offer help and wisdom to ministers in planning new ideas, implementation, and how to bring about change within their congregation. This committee will visit and welcome new ministers and help them establish a good foundation in their new work.*
15. *Personnel Committee: The Personnel Committee shall consist of five persons. Except as otherwise provided in Article X, E., the Personnel Committee shall receive applications, interview applicants, contact references, and carefully investigate those being considered for staff positions; and shall recommend the prospective employee. They shall make recommendation to the Association the need for any new staff position; shall prepare, periodically review, revise, and recommend changes in job descriptions to the Executive Board; shall prepare, periodically review, revise and recommend changes to Personnel Policy Manual and Benefits Plan; periodically evaluate personnel performance and make necessary recommendations to the staff; consult with and perform duties as set out in Article X of these Bylaws. The Personnel Committee shall establish a salary plan and prepare budget requests and submit such budget requests to the Finance Committee of the Association.*
16. *Place and Preacher Committee: The Place and Preacher Committee shall solicit and receive invitations from churches to host the meetings of the members. The committee shall recommend the preacher and an alternate preacher for the meetings of the members. Recommendations for meeting places and the preacher and alternate preacher shall be made to the members at the annual meeting.*
17. *Resolutions Committee: The Resolutions Committee shall consist of five persons. The Resolutions Committee shall review all properly submitted resolutions which may be reworded for clarity, combined with like issues*

into one resolution, or rejected if previously addressed or are inappropriate; present all appropriate resolutions to the Association for consideration; prepare and present resolutions of appreciation and other resolutions deemed appropriate; and, notify persons submitting resolutions of the disposition thereof.

18. **Scholarship Committee:** *The Scholarship Committee shall carry out the duties and obligations set out in the Guidelines for the Scholarship Committee of the Randall M. and Callie Sue Leonard Michael Scholarship as amended from time to time.*
  19. **Senior Adult Committee:** *The Senior Adult Committee will plan activities and ministry projects for member church senior adults and will communicate any appropriate state and national conferences and Chautauguas to member churches.*
  20. **Sunday School Committee:** *(Also known as ACTeam, Associational Consultant Team Training) The Sunday School Committee will assist and challenge churches to improve and enlarge all areas of their Sunday School through planning, training, administration activities, consultation, program interpretation, and cooperative projects. It will encourage and assist churches to understand that the Sunday School is the foundational strategy in a local church for leading people to faith in the Lord Jesus Christ and for the building of Great Commission Christians through Bible study groups that engage people in evangelism, discipleship, fellowship, ministry and worship.*
  21. **Volunteer Missions/Partnership Committee:** *Volunteer Missions/Partnership Committee (Foreign, Home, State, Association Missions) shall receive information, work with the Missions Development Committee, provide leadership and orientation for partnership project participants as needed. They will prepare a report for the annual meeting of the Association of work accomplished.*
  22. **Youth Ministries Committee:** *The Youth Ministries Committee shall plan youth related ministries for the Association including retreats, rallies, and volunteer training.*
- B. **Election and Term:** *The Standing Committees listed in Section A of this Article and the chairperson respectively thereof shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee and elected at the July meeting of the Association. The term of office shall be from September 1 to August 31. Vote was taken on April 2, 2006 and motion was made by the Bylaws Committee at the Spring Quarterly Meeting.*
- C. **Other Committees and Councils:** *The Association may create such other committees ~~and councils~~, not inconsistent with the Articles of Incorporation and these Bylaws, as may from time to time be required.*
- D. **Special Standing Committees, Auxiliary, Teams, & Representatives:** *Special Standing Committees, Auxiliary, Teams and Representatives of the Association are Brotherhood/Baptist Men Committee/Leadership Team, the Committee on Nominations, Woman's Missionary Union, and Representatives as from time to time needed as determined by the Association upon recommendation of the Executive Board. Unless otherwise set out herein, nominations shall be made by the Nominating Committee for election at the annual meeting of the association for a term of one year beginning at the adjournment of the annual meeting in which the election was held. Each such standing committee, auxiliary, team, and representative shall furnish a written report for inclusion in the Book of Reports at the annual meeting and their other specific responsibilities are as follows:*
1. **Brotherhood/Baptist Men Committee/Leadership Team:** *The Brotherhood/Baptist Men Committee/Leadership Team will assist churches in involving men and boys in missions; helping churches engage men and boys in missions activities; helping churches prepare to teach missions to men and boys; helping churches lead men and boys to pray for and give to missions; helping churches lead men and boys to develop personal ministry; and helping churches interpret and undergird the work of the church and the denomination.*
  2. **Committee on Nominations:** *The Committee on Nominations shall consist of three persons who shall be nominated by the officers and elected by the Association at the July meeting. The Committee on Nominations shall serve until the annual meeting when its report is made to the Association. The duty of the Committee on Nominations shall be to nominate the Nominating Committee at the Annual Meeting and to recommend to the Association individuals to fill any Nominating Committee vacancies during the year.*
  3. **Woman's Missionary Union:** *The Woman's Missionary Union of Liberty Baptist Association is an auxiliary of Liberty Baptist Association. The Woman's Missionary Union is governed by its Constitution and Bylaws and elects its director, officers, and leadership team and are included for information in the Book of Reports of the Association. The Director of Woman's Missionary Union serves on the Missions Development Committee and Executive Board with full voting privileges.*
  4. **Bi-Vocational Ministers Representative:** *A Bi-Vocational minister (active or retired) shall be elected to address needs of the Bi-Vocational ministerial staff.*

5. *Christian Life and Public Affairs Representative: A Christian Life and Public Affairs Representative will assist churches in awareness of critical moral and social issues and in leading in Christian action to meet these needs; in applying the gospel to all areas of life, in demonstrating responsible concern for society; in broadening cooperative efforts and emphases; and, in mobilizing and equipping the constituency to be on mission in regard to moral and ethical concerns. Areas of involvement include family life, race relations, citizenship, hunger, and other special moral concerns.*
6. *Discipleship Training Representative: A Discipleship Representative will assist churches in starting, improving, and expanding Christian discipleship through Discipleship Training to help churches equip church members for discipleship and personal ministry; teach Christian theology and Baptist doctrine, Christian ethics, Christian history, and church polity and organization; equip church leaders for service; and interpret and undergird the work of the church and Association.*
7. *Hunger Awareness Representative: A Hunger Awareness Representative will keep abreast of hunger needs throughout the world and apprise the Association of these needs. Upon request, the representative will assist churches in projects within the Association to meet specific needs.*
8. *Seminary Extension Representative: The Seminary Extension Representative will seek to provide college-level theological education to ministers and laypersons and basic theological education to ministers who lack formal education. The representative will assist in securing necessary curriculum materials, administrative services, promotional materials, training materials for teachers, academic records, and certification of centers and teachers.*
9. *Stewardship Representative: The Stewardship Representative will assist churches in development of individual and corporate stewardship, interpretation of Biblical teachings on stewardship, and elevation of individual giving and corporate mission giving in light of Biblical teachings.*

#### ARTICLE XII

##### ADOPTION AND AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS AND CORPORATE DOCUMENTS

- A. *Adoption:*  
*These Bylaws shall be considered adopted and in immediate effect when a majority of the "Individuals entitled to vote," as defined in Article VII, G., at an annual meeting or a regular meeting shall vote in favor thereof. This vote shall be taken not less than thirty days after mailing a copy of these Bylaws to each member.*
- B. *Amendment:*  
*These Bylaws, the Articles of Incorporation, or any parts thereof may be amended, altered, or repealed only by a majority vote of "Individuals entitled to vote," as defined in Article VII, G., at the annual meeting or a regular meeting of the Association.*
- C. *Preservation:*  
*A copy of all original corporate records, including but not limited to the Articles of Incorporation, the Bylaws, and Personnel Policies, shall be maintained at all times by the Clerk in the office of the Association; and copies of the same shall be kept in separate locations. All amendments to said documents or to any provisions thereof shall be prepared promptly after adoption by the Association; and the Secretary shall cause the same and copies to be typed or printed in proper form and attached to the originals of respective documents and kept as above stated.*

#### ARTICLE XIII

##### GENERAL AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- A. *Fiscal Year:*  
*The fiscal year of the Association shall be from September 1 to August 31.*
- B. *Reports:*  
*Reports of officers, committees, auxiliary, teams, representatives, and church letters to the annual meeting of the Association shall cover the period from September 1 to August 31. All reports for the annual meeting shall be in writing for inclusion in the published Book of Reports and shall be limited to 250 words.*
- C. *Audit:*  
*An annual audit or review of the financial records of the Association shall be conducted by an independent accounting firm elected by the Association upon recommendation of the Audit Committee and the Executive Board.*
- D. *Records:*  
*The membership rolls, minutes of meetings, and annual reports shall be available at all reasonable times for all reasonable purposes.*

- E. **Policy Manual:**  
*The Policy Manual shall contain documents of procedure and the adopted Budget and Nominations Report not inconsistent with the Articles of Incorporation and these Bylaws from various committees and councils that have been recommended to and approved by the Association. These policies will be governing rules and procedures of the respective committees and councils of the Association. They may be amended by the Association upon recommendation of the Executive Board.*
- F. **Seal:**  
*There shall appear within the center of the Corporate Seal of the Association the words "Corporate Seal," around which shall appear two concentric circles within which will be inscribed Liberty Baptist Association of North Carolina, 1832. Such seal, as impressed on the margin hereof, is hereby adopted as the corporate seal of the Corporation.*
- G. **Gender:**  
*The use of terms in these Bylaws that may in other contexts tend to denote gender is intended to be neutral as to gender. The masculine shall be deemed to include the feminine and the feminine deemed to include the masculine.*
- H. **Majority:**  
*Unless these Bylaws or The General Statutes of North Carolina otherwise require a different number, a majority of those in attendance at any meeting of members or the Executive Board with a quorum present shall be required to effect any action.*
